Daulat Ram College

Daulat Ram College has established a niche for itself by becoming a pioneer institution that signifies academic excellence for women. Founded in 1960 by the late Shri Daulat Ram Gupta as 'Pramila College' (at Tilak Marg), the college was shifted to North Campus in the heart of University of Delhi and was renamed 'Daulat Ram College' in 1964.

Shri Daulat Ram Gupta, an educationist, conceived the college as an institution aiming to impart inclusive education to women. Starting with around 350 students and 13 teachers in 6 departments, the college has now evolved into a versatile and dynamic institution with more than 4000 students coming from across the world, around 188 teaching and 130 non-teaching staff and 19 departments offering a diverse range of courses. The institution envisages to provide value-based education focusing on holistic growth and development by enhancing higher learning in Science, Commerce, and Humanities. It also offers several courses at the Masters level in Humanities.

The college has been widely acclaimed for its academic achievements and co-curricular initiatives. As a premier institution, it was awarded 'Star Status' by the Department of Biotechnology (DBT), Government of India (GOI) for undertaking innovative practices in various science departments. It has received accreditation with a CGPA Score of 3.36 and has been awarded 'A+' Grade by the NAAC. It has been consistently securing 26th rank in the NIRF since 2020. As per India Today's ranking, our college ranks 7th in Science, 13th in Commerce and 15th in Humanities.

The college has a beautiful green campus with multiple facilities that support a viable, diversified and integrated culture for the development and growth of our cohort. With a distinguished faculty, our college remains at the forefront of delivering high quality education. The college has well equipped and technologically advanced laboratories such as Zebrafish Lab Facility, Drosophila Resource Centre, and Psychology Resource Centre, facilitating major research projects sponsored by ICSSR, ICPR, UGC, CSIR and DRDO. As a leading institution, it envisages ICT facilities and has well equipped computer labs, besides Wi-Fi enabled lecture theatres/classrooms with LCD projectors. The Innovation Projects and Star Innovation Projects funded by the University of Delhi and other cross-cultural research projects in collaboration with USA, Canada, France, Finland and Poland have contributed in significant ways to the institution's academic infrastructure. The Psychology Resource Centre provides various resources to students and staff through the Counselling Centre, Mental Health Centre, Positive Psychology Centre, Capacity Building Centre and Value Education Centre. The college has pioneered several Value Engagement Programmes for inculcating values pertaining to higher education, health and wellbeing.

The IQAC is an integral part of our pedagogy that sustains and enhances the quality of our academic pursuits. The 'academic calendar' pertaining to various events such as international and national conferences, seminars, symposiums, colloquiums and curricular development initiatives ensures active participation of students, providing an immersive and inspiring environment of holistic teaching, learning, and research. The state-of-the-art conference hall, specially designed for academic interaction and professional engagements is a venue for organising such events.

The Library, an integral part of academic pursuits, boasts of a renowned collection of more than one lakh volumes, journals, periodicals, books, newspapers, alongside a digital database. We also take pride in the rich Braille Section possessed by our library. With a commitment to build and enrich the spirit of achievement and excellence in academics, various Proficiency Prizes, Instituted Prizes, and Merit Scholarships are awarded annually to students. The in-house skill development programs with an interdisciplinary approach, aim to provide training to students promoting life skills, learning abilities and healthy development along with learning ICT tools. The Cyber Cell creates awareness to judiciously use and explore the challenges and opportunities offered by cyber space. The Placement Cell works with dedication and enthusiasm to provide top internship and recruitment opportunities to students.

Department associations and various societies and cells annually publish magazines and journals such as *Expressions* (the English department's annual publication), *Mansi* (Hindi department's hand-written magazine), *Shreshtha* (Women Development Cell's annual publication), *Psytrack* (Psychology department's magazine), *Math Punch* (Mathematics department's magazine), *Naissance* (Placement Cell's magazine), *Optima* (Economics department's magazine) and so on, with scholarly contributions from students as well as

teachers. In addition to these, the college publishes *Pramila*, its annual magazine, with three language components - English, Hindi and Sanskrit.

The Centre for Foreign Languages established in 2005 offers part time certificate/diploma/advance diploma courses in several languages such as French, German, Spanish, Italian, Chinese, Japanese and Korean to students across colleges. The courses are conducted in collaboration with the Department of Germanic and Romance Studies and the Department of South Asian Studies, University of Delhi. In addition to this, add-on certificate courses in association with various institutions provide a platform to students to engage with multidisciplinary subjects for a comprehensive understanding on vital issues. Our college has collaborated with Government College, Chouhnan and Government Girls College, Magra Punjala, in Barmer and Jodhpur respectively, in Rajasthan under the Vidya Vistar Scheme, to facilitate sharing of academic resources which is imperative for the development of collective teaching and learning in higher education.

As a quintessence of inclusive education, our hostel, established in 1974, is a resource, dedicated to sharing and preserving integrated learning and growth of students across diverse cultures. The Sadbhavana Bhawan, a centre for sports, art and culture is one of the best auditoriums in the campus which hosts various events such as theatre, cultural performances, international integration programmes, conferences, annual day programmes, *Manjari* (the annual inter-college festival) and many more. An open-air amphitheatre, located at the centre of the college building, which after renovation came to be known as '*Rangshala*', encourages students to organise and participate in a wide variety of theatrical, musical and cultural events.

The multipurpose sports complex cum fitness centre offers facilities for various sports events and has produced several athletes and players at the state, regional and national levels. The college also organises Paralympics which have been instrumental in providing opportunities to specially-abled students to participate and compete at inter-college level. The infrastructure of the college is sensitised to the needs of specially abled students and staff. The Equal Opportunity Cell and Enabling Unit create a socially conducive environment that facilitates inclusive interpersonal and academic interactions. The Recycling Unit has paper recycling machines and lead shredder machines to make the college a zero-discharge campus. The Environment Club (Dhara) generates awareness regarding practices of keeping the college green and clean.

The college's societies under Extra Curricular Activities Committee such as Debating Society (*Debsoc*), Dramatics (*Memesis*), Fine Arts Society (*Spectra*), Film and Photography (*Magic Lantern and Sepia*), Music and Dance (Indian - *Alahyaa*, *Annhad*, and Western- *Encore*, *Zenith*), Quiz (*Tajagna*), Poetry (*Imagism*), and Fashion (*Debonair*) contribute in many ways to the continued endeavour in enhancing talent. To maintain the legacy of excellence, our dedicated teachers and students work hard to organise and participate in a plethora of curricular and extracurricular activities, with the Youth Parliament, MUNs and the College Play being the most distinct genres. The annual Daulat Ram Gupta Memorial Debate, a tribute to our legendary founder, plays a key role in stimulating and cultivating critical thinking among students across colleges.

The Gandhi Study Circle actively engages in comprehending and contemplating the different facets of the life of Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi to inculcate Gandhian values among the college fraternity. The Women Development Cell (Pragati) educates and empowers students by building awareness about gender-based discriminations and develops their understanding of women's rights. The Gender Champion Cell also plays a significant role in creating positive social norms to improve the well-being of women and achieving long-term and sustainable social change. To inspire young minds cultivate the values embedded in Indian heritage and culture, the SPIC MACAY programmes have remained a regular feature of Daulat Ram College since 1984. The institution has incorporated diverse cultural programmes and expanded the North East Cell, which initiates celebration of the rich cultural traditions of North East India. The Social Outreach Programmes form a significant part of NSS and NCC. The NSS involves students in various activities of social service and national development and the NCC works towards moulding students to become active citizens and future leaders.

The core ethos of the college is to inculcate knowledge by virtue of creative thinking and democratic values fostering academic freedom. Thus, the college aims at empowering students with a comprehensive understanding of their contributions to academic research and community outreach services.



Chairperson's Message

Daulat Ram College is a premier educational institution in Delhi founded by an educationist the late Shri Daulat Ram Gupta in 1960. It is a prestigious women's college engaged in imparting liberal education to women. The college, a large constituent college of the University of Delhi, originally started as "Pramila College" at 22, Tilak Marg with 13 members of teaching staff, 2 non-teaching staff and about 350 students. In 1964, the college shifted to its present premises in Delhi University campus and was renamed as Daulat Ram College. The institution has since grown into a full-fledged extended college of University of Delhi. The college has acquired a strong identity and has evolved into a prestigious women's college with its own distinct culture and traditions. It imparts education towards degrees at the Bachelor's level in Arts, Commerce and Science and Masters level in Arts.

The courses in science were introduced in 1968 which led to the construction of the science block and well-equipped science laboratories. The Commerce and M.A. courses in many subjects, as well as new courses in B.A. (Honours) and B.A. (Pass) were added subsequently. Further expansion of the college took place with the introduction of B.Sc. (Honours) in Biochemistry, Chemistry and Mathematics, and addition of Nutrition and Health Education (NHE) and Office Management and Secretarial Practice (OMSP) subjects in B.A. (Pass). OMSP was later replaced by Entrepreneurship and Small Business (ESB). The college building which was constructed in the 1960s was further expanded to cater to the growing needs of the students. A new block of tutorial rooms, a modern seminar hall, new class rooms and science laboratories for Physics, NHE and Biochemistry were added. Subsequently, a computer lab open to all students with an internet facility was added. Currently the college has add-on diploma and certificate courses in Foreign Languages, Data Analytics with 'R' and Legal Literacy, Awareness and Aid. At present there are 19 departments with about 4200 students on rolls, about 180 teaching staff and 75 non-teaching staff. The college has a well- equipped computerized library, facilities for gymnastics, table tennis, athletics and other games and holds leading positions both in academics and sports. Recently, a well-equipped conference hall with a capacity of 200 students has been built.

The college holds a leading position both in academics as well as in co-curricular activities such as dramatics, music, debates and sports. Students can participate in various societies, including NSS, Sports and NCC. To help the students cope with the new environment of the college and many other contemporary issues and problems, the Psychology Department runs a Counselling Centre. The In-house Skill Development Programmes being offered by the college equip the students to deal with daily challenges and create an identity for themselves.

The highly qualified and experienced teaching faculty of the college is not just limited to classroom teaching but also in taking up various prestigious research projects from organizations like DRDO, ICSSR, UGC, University of Delhi, etc. where the students also get an opportunity to work. The college students' hostel capacity of nearly 204 students is one of the best maintained in the University of Delhi. The college boasts of a modern auditorium named Sadbhavana Bhawan, which is ideally suited for theatre activities with a large cast. All-in-all, the college provides a holistic experience to its students, by working on their intellectual, emotional and spiritual development.

Principal's Message

I congratulate and welcome you all as fraternity of Daulat Ram College for the next four years. As part of the Centenary Batch of the University of Delhi, you will play a valued role in its year-long celebrations. Our college has attained a 'Star' status and is accredited with an 'A+' grade by the NAAC. The college is placed at 29th rank by MHRD in the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF). It is ranked among the top 20 colleges by the India Today survey. The college is located in the heart of University of Delhi's North Campus and is known for its wide-ranging and multifarious academic practices as well as vibrant extracurricular activities. The Under Graduate Curriculum Framework (UGCF) 2022 envisions to achieve the objective of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, providing space for creative thinking and research on critical areas of study. The courses in discipline specific core, discipline specific elective, generic elective, ability enhancement, skill enhancement, and value addition leads to enhancement of theoretical and practical knowledge. I hope that students will enjoy their college life and will be able to pursue a successful career in future.

This year the college is offering nearly 1500 seats at the first year undergraduate level and additionally, more than 200 supernumerary seats for students falling under different categories such as PwBD, Sports, ECA, Children of War Widows, Kashmiri migrants and Sikkimese, other foreign nationals, etc. Daulat Ram College offers undergraduate courses in 18 subjects in all three fields viz Humanities, Commerce and Sciences and postgraduate courses in 7 subjects in Humanities. In addition, the college has a Centre for Foreign Languages where certificate, diploma and advanced diploma are offered in 7 foreign languages viz. Japanese, Korean, Chinese, German, Spanish, French and Italian. Foreign students from different countries such as Afghanistan, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Tibet, Uzbekistan, Mauritius, Bangladesh, etc., are enrolled in the college. The college offers add-on courses on Data Analytics with 'R' and Legal Literacy, Awareness and Aid, which are interdisciplinary in nature. The former enables you to develop scientific and analytical methodology and the latter helps you acquire basic knowledge on the legal system and legal processes. We have academic collaborations with the Government College, Chouhantan and Government Girls College, Magra Punjala, located in remote areas of Barmer and Jodhpur respectively in Rajasthan, under the Vidya Vistar Scheme.

The college has 188 teaching staff supported by 130 non-teaching staff. The faculty is actively engaged in research and publications in addition to their regular teaching and evaluation work. The senior faculty members are also engaged in supervising Ph.D students. In the last academic year, they have published more than 100 research articles. The college has an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) which formulates the academic calendar and is responsible for monitoring academic events. Several eminent professors, scientists, speakers, judges and administrators visit the college for different programs during the academic year and enrich the students with their wisdom.

We believe in imparting holistic education along with formal education within the existing University framework. The college organizes numerous extracurricular activities for students. Events like Miss DRC, Talent Hunt, Manjari, Hostel Night, Sports Meet, and societies like Annhad, Alahyaa, Zenith, Spectra, Sepia etc. provide a platform where students can participate and showcase their talent. Self-

Defense training camps and Yoga training camps are organized regularly for physical and mental well-being of students. The Equal Opportunity Cell facilitates academic and extracurricular activities for specially abled students. The North East Cell has been active in sensitizing students on the culture and traditions of North East. The Cell has been working closely with the local police and DCW to help the students. The college aims at making the campus a zero-waste discharge unit with active participation of students. It has a Recycling Unit on campus which recycles paper and other organic waste. The students are trained to keep the campus clean and green by following the 3R initiative - Reduce, Reuse and Recycle Programme by Eco Club (Dhara), Recycling Unit, NSS and NCC. The college has an NCC unit consisting of 165 cadets. The NSS organises Self Defence Workshop, Senior Citizen Day, National Unity Day, Swachta Pakhwada, Blood Donation Drive, and Voters Forum Campaign. The students render their services in the Youth for Seva Movement, Bharat Uday Abhiyan, Plantation Drive, Swachata Abhiyan etc. We also connect our students to grass roots level programs.

The college regularly conducts several summer programs such as in-house skill development programs, life skill programs and exchange programs. Each student will be given an institutional ID with *dr.du.ac.in* domain to access various study materials/resources and to attend webinars, conferences and classes in hybrid mode. A number of students from our college have been awarded the University Meritorious Award 2020-21 by University of Delhi. In addition to this, the college has instituted 100 proficiency prizes, 51 instituted prizes, 36 merit scholarships and 8 instituted scholarships for its meritorious students. The college offers 100 per cent scholarship to all specially abled students including visually impaired students. Students who need financial support, are helped through the student aid fund and other resources arranged by the college. In the last academic session nearly 644 students were beneficiaries of this aid. After completing their graduation at Daulat Ram College, several students are pursuing higher education in IITs, AIIMS and foreign universities. The college has a very strong alumni base comprising of Scientists, Psychologists, Judges, Civil servants, Vice Chancellors, Professors etc.

The Placement Cell of the college is very active. Students across disciplines are encouraged to get themselves enrolled in the cell through their coordinators. The profiles offered by companies provide opportunities to students possessing diverse skill sets across all courses. The notable recruiters offering placement opportunities to our students are Deloitte, GDS, KPMG India, Teach for India, NIIT, Trevista, Finedge, CVENT, Genpact, S & P Global, Elements HR Service Pvt Ltd., Willis Towers Watson (WTW), RSA Insurance Group Ltd., Accenture, eigo Paathshala, Nation With Namu, Jaro Education, Merilytics, The Oberoi Group, Z1 Media etc. Nearly 300 students have got placement/internship in these companies. Many students are offered internships in various Government and semi Government organizations as well. An Internship fair organized by the Placement Cell exposes thousands of students to various career opportunities and openings/internships in various industries. This year, the Placement Cell also offered a wide range of internship opportunities with organizations like Hindustan Times, Zomato, Vivo India, ED Times, Urban Clap, Qversity, Mazars etc. There were over 45 companies which participated in the fair. The companies offering recruitment included Teach for India, Dhvani RIS, My First Boss, Outlook, Toplurn, Young Engine, IGIA, Lakshay Consultants, Atex Consulting Pvt. Ltd. A few not for profit organizations like Umeed, Sharp NGO, and Feeding India also took part in the fair.

The college boasts of a well-stacked library, including a braille section, the science laboratories and their museums, computer labs, state of art gymnasium, conference hall, amphitheatre, hostel etc. The entire campus is Wi-Fi enabled and under CCTV surveillance. Our commitment is to provide a safe, positive and intellectual learning environment that will empower students to become creative thinkers, learners and problem solvers prepared to embark upon the 21st century. This booklet provides information that is key to your successful navigation of the undergraduate program that you have chosen. We want you to thrive and succeed in achieving your lives' goals.

Vice Principal's Message

Students, rest assured that Daulat Ram College, one of the renowned affiliated colleges of the University of Delhi, is the right place for you all. The college imparts holistic education to female students in education course work as well as in co-curricular and extracurricular activities. The college also gives a chance to acquire additional skills for students' further career progression by providing them the opportunity to participate in Skill Development Programs (SDPs) which are conducted by the college faculty, during summer and winter breaks. These SDPs can provide students training in various progressive fields like digital literacy, bioinformatics, music, cyber security and many more areas of interest. Students can enroll themselves in any of these courses which are conducted from time to time by various departments. They can also enroll in the National Service Scheme (NSS), for community services like blood donation, and in the National Cadet Corp (NCC) for advanced physical training like trekking, which will foster a sense of discipline, compassion and integrity.

The college has an active placement cell which conducts sessions/workshops regularly to help students in writing concise resumes, and appraises them of off-campus internships and career opportunities. Students can also get on-campus placements in the final year through these opportunities. The college has taken a proactive role in keeping its environment neat and clean by recycling the college campus' waste. Students can participate in this venture and become aware of the environmental sustainability of the campus which is one of the sustainable goals of the United Nations.

In case students are interested in research, the college can help them to acquire necessary skill sets. The college has maintained several resource centres like Zebrafish Facility, Drosophila Facility, and Environment Lab where students can participate in Internships and also undertake small research projects. If students are facing any mental anxieties, they can approach the Psychology Resource Centre to get counselling about how to enhance their positive mental health. The college also has a well-equipped sports complex and a big sports ground where students can train themselves in Gym and other sports activities. Students will also have a chance to be the part of the Students' Union to inculcate leadership skills. They will have the chance to upgrade and showcase their talent and organize events which can help other students to do the same.

The Vidya Vistar Scheme facilitates the opportunity to be trained in skill sets which may be unique to colleges located away from NCR. The college has been running add-on courses in foreign languages since the last ten years. This provides education in seven foreign languages: Spanish, French, Italian, German, Chinese, Korean, and Japanese, which gives students an opportunity to learn a foreign language. Students can enroll in any one of the certificate courses in the first year itself. They can progress to Diploma and Advanced Diploma in the same language in the subsequent years. So they can earn an additional qualification during their undergraduate degree education period.

Students can enroll in any of the add-on courses like Legal Literacy, Awareness and Aid, and Data Analytics with 'R' along with their degree course. Thus, college life is going to give students a plethora of platforms where they can groom themselves for a successful life ahead. It is up to the students how much interest they can take, work with energy and passion to make the best use of campus life at Daulat Ram College. My best wishes are with you.

* Caution Money is Refundable if claimed before the end of Financial Year in which the student leaves the college.

Caution Money will be refunded through RTGS/NEFT. Student should have her own account in any bank.

University/College reserves right to revise Fee and other charges any time during the year.

Payment of Fees

All fee receipts should be preserved for scrutiny and should be produced at the time of filling up the examination forms and refund of caution money. Notice regarding payment of College/Examination fee will be put up on the notice board.

Identity Card

Every student is issued an identity card by the College. It is mandatory for students to carry it every day. In case of any kind of indiscipline, the I-card will be confiscated. In case of loss of I-card the students are advised to intimate the college office immediately. Duplicate I-card will be issued on payment of Rs. 500/- Any change of address or phone no. should also be notified by the student.

Discipline

Students will be governed as per Ordinance XV-B of the University Calendar.

Concession/Waiver of Fees for Persons with Disabilities (PwBD)

Candidates with physical disabilities pursuing various programmes of study in the Faculties, Departments, Centres, and Institutions/Colleges of the University shall be exempted from payment of fees, including examination fees and other University fees, except Admission fees, subscription towards Delhi University Students' Union and Identity Card fees (As per amendment to Ordinance X(4) of the University).

- a) PwBD Candidates who meet the cut-off for the unreserved category and will take admission in the unreserved category (UR) will pay the fee relevant for PwBD Candidate.
- b) As per the Executive Council Resolution No. 50 dated 03.11.2012, students with physical disabilities residing in different Hostels/Halls of the University are exempted from payment of all hostel fees and charges except refundable caution fees and the mess fees. Persons with Physical Disabilities who are students shall pay 50% of the Mess fees and the remaining 50% of their Mess Fees will be met by the University of Delhi. Similar norms are adopted by our college in respect of PwBD students residing in the hostel.
- c) PwBD students who are getting fellowships/financial assistance shall be exempted from payment of fees/charges/mess fees subject to the following conditions. All admitted SC/ST, OBC, EWS, PwBD students in colleges who are eligible for fellowships should submit their scholarship forms to the requisite office by February for timely processing.

Undergraduate Curriculum Framework-2022 (UGCF-2022)

Keeping in mind the underlying principles of National Education Policy 2020, the Undergraduate Curriculum Framework-2022 (UGCF-2022) of the University of Delhi has been structured to provide opportunities to students across disciplines to pursue research, innovation, apprenticeship, social outreach, entrepreneurship and many similar areas of knowledge and creativity.

Every discipline offers three categories of courses of study, viz. Discipline Specific Core courses (DSCs), Discipline Specific Electives (DSEs) and Generic Electives (GEs) with multiple exit options as per NEP 2020.

Discipline Specific Core is a mandatory course of study to be pursued by a student. For award of single discipline specific Honours degree DSCs shall be the core courses of that discipline. To pursue an Honours degree programme in a 'Field of Multidisciplinary Courses of Study' the DSCs shall comprise of core credit courses of more than one discipline. In the fourth year of such honours degree programme students will study only one discipline and hence the DSC courses in the VII and VIII semesters shall be of one discipline and not a combination of these three disciplines. Please refer to the framework given as Illustration –I in Table-6 of UGCF 2022 Based on NEP 2020.

Generic Electives shall be a pool of courses which is meant to provide multidisciplinary or interdisciplinary education to students. GEs shall consist of a pool of courses offered by various disciplines of study (excluding the GEs offered by the parent discipline), in groups of odd and even semesters, from which a student can choose. In case a student opts for DSEs beyond her discipline specific course(s) of study, such DSEs shall be treated as GEs for that student.

Ability Enhancement course (AEC), Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) & Value Addition Course (VAC) are a pool of courses offered by all the Departments in groups of odd and even semesters from which students can choose. A student who desires to make Academic Project/Entrepreneurship as Minor has to pick the appropriate combination of courses of GE, SEC, VAC, & Internship/Apprenticeship/Project/ Community (IAPC) which shall be offered in the form of various modules as specified in the scheme of studies.

A student pursuing four-year undergraduate programme in a specific discipline (Core course) shall be awarded an appropriate Honours degree with Major in a Discipline on completion of VIII Semester, if he/she secures in that Discipline at least 50% of the total credits i.e., at least 88 credits in that Discipline out of the total of 176 credits. He/she shall study 20 DSCs and at least 2 DSEs in eight semesters. A student may be awarded Minor in a discipline, on completion of VIII Semester, if he/she earns minimum 28 credits from seven GE courses in that discipline. For example, if a student pursuing B.A. (Honours) History chooses seven GE courses of Political Science out of a total of ten GE courses and writes dissertation, she shall be awarded on successful completion of VIII Semester, Major in History and Minor in Political Science.

A student pursuing four-year undergraduate programme in more than one discipline as Core Course (for example B.A. Social Sciences/ Humanities, B.Sc. Life Sciences, B.Sc. Physical Sciences, B.Sc. Mathematical Sciences, B.Com. and such other programmes) shall be awarded appropriate Honours degree with Major in a Discipline on completion of VIII Semester, if he/she secures in that Discipline 80 credits out of a total of 176 credits. He/she shall study 6 DSCs and at least 3 DSEs in that discipline in the first six semesters and 2 DSCs, 6 DSEs and write dissertation in that discipline in the VII and VIII semesters. A student may be awarded Minor in a discipline, on completion of VIII Semester, if he/she earns minimum 28 credits from six DSCs and one DSE of that discipline. For example, a student pursuing four-year B.A. (Honours) Social Sciences/Humanities with Major in History (after securing at least 80 credits in History), may be awarded Minor in Hindi if she earns 28 credits from six DSCs and one DSE of Hindi (up to VI semester), on successful completion of VIII Semester.

If a student wishes to Major in Discipline A, then he/she should earn at least 80 credits from DSCs and DSEs of Discipline A. If the sum total of the DSCs and DSEs of Discipline A is less than 80 credits, then the credits earned in the dissertation written on a topic of Discipline A shall also be taken into consideration to complete the requisite 80 credits.

Placement Cell *Vriddhi*

Vriddhi, the Placement Cell of Daulat Ram College constitutes a team of diligent and dedicated individuals who work towards providing the best possible career opportunities to students of all courses, while also taking care of their overall development for their future prospects.

The Placement Cell provides both on-campus and off-campus opportunities to the students for recruitment and internship drives. Every year various reputed companies visit the college such as Accenture, Wipro, Deloitte USI, DE Shaw, Larsen & Toubro, WTW, and many others. In the last session, 70+ students received job offer letters from prestigious companies. The highest package for the year 2021-22 was 23 LPA as compared to the previous year's 19.25 LPA and the average package went up from 4.9 LPA to 6.19 LPA.

The Placement Cell organizes Annual Career and Internship Fair called 'Incrementum'. Last year in Incrementum 5.0, a Speakers' Conclave was held on the theme "Unwinding the New Digital India". Various companies like Decathlon, WWF, Sharekhan, and DE Shaw participated in the fair and extended amazing offers to students from all years.

Vriddhi organises webinars and workshops throughout the year on topics like Share Markets, Financial Awareness, Digital Marketing, Research Methodology, Career Building after Graduation, and Opportunities Abroad for the holistic development of the students to enhance their practical knowledge about the corporate world. The Placement Cell also collaborates with reputed organizations like Global University Systems, T.I.M.E, AECC Global, Expertrons, Prep Junction, IBS (IFCAI Business School) and others for conducting various workshops and sessions. The Cell understands the need of the students to strengthen their position as potential candidates in the workforce. 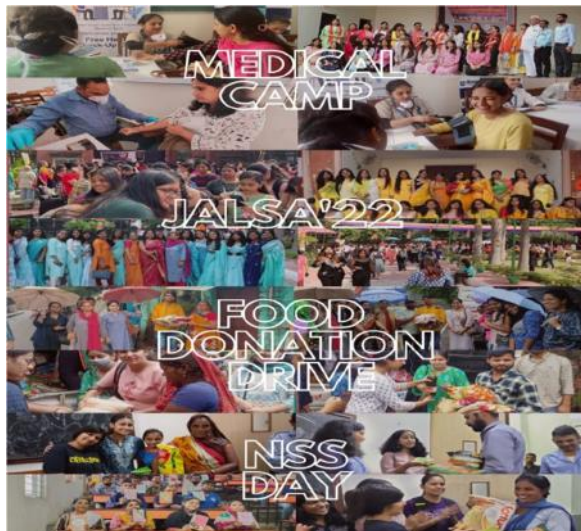


National Service Schemes NSS

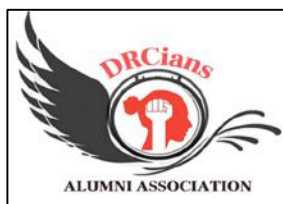

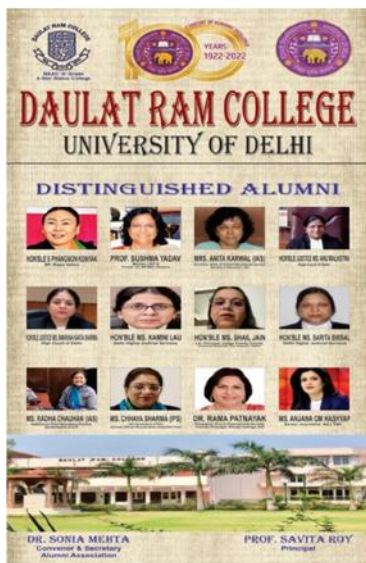

Department Profile

Department of Biochemistry

The Department of Biochemistry, established in the year 1988 offers a course in BSc (Hons) Biochemistry and is the recipient of Star Status Award by the DBT, Government of India. The BSc (Hons) Biochemistry UGCF course curriculum offers several 'core' courses (DSC) such as Proteins, Enzymes, Metabolism, Cell Biology, Molecular Biology, Immunology, Hormone Biochemistry, Physiology and Genetics, several cutting edge skill enhanced courses (SEC) such as Clinical Biochemistry, Data analytics, Bioinformatics, Medical Diagnostics, and also various allied courses of Biochemistry (DSEs) such as Molecular Diagnostics, Developmental Biology, Environmental Biochemistry, Molecular Basis of Diseases, Plant Biochemistry, Forensics, Biotechnology etc. In the fourth year, students are provided the flexibility to opt for research project or Entrepreneurship depending upon their choice and their future outlook.

The Biochemistry department, Daulat Ram College has well-equipped modern laboratories. The Department also houses Drosophila Resource Centre, Zebrafish lab facility, Recycling Unit and Bioinformatics lab to impart short term training, and research internships to the students. The Department organizes many student centric activities such as 'Meet the scientist', educational trips to Institutes of National repute and the annual Biochemistry Department Science Festival "BIOMANIA" for students to participate and expand their horizon.

The department has the distinction of having over 90% first classes as well as University positions every year. Graduates from the department have been selected for integrated Ph.D. and MSc programs through entrance exams in Biochemistry, Biotechnology, Molecular Biology, Neurosciences, Genetics and other courses in leading scientific Institutions such as IISc (Bengaluru), TIFR-NCBS, IISERs, AIIMS, JNU, IITS, UDSC as well as in International Universities in the US, UK and Germany. The department is proud of its alumni who hold faculty/ scientific positions at prestigious US universities, Cambridge (UK), JNU, DRDO, Delhi University Biochemistry Department, and many DU undergraduate Colleges.

Department of Botany

The Department of Botany has been imparting teaching to B.Sc. (Honours) and B.Sc. (Life Sciences) students since 1968. Nurtured by some of the best teachers with a varied research and teaching experience, the department is recognised for a blend of highest level of academic excellence and extra-curricular activities.

It has well equipped classrooms and laboratories, supplemented by a Museum and Tissue-culture facility and ICT tools. There are specialised labs in Bioinformatics and Biostatistics, Microbiology and Biofertilisers, Ecology and Environment, and Biotechnology and Tissue Culture. Enrichment and Skill Development Programmes such as workshops, seminars and conferences are a regular feature at the department. Several Innovation Projects have been completed in collaboration with other Departments of the College. In recognition of its infrastructure, faculty and research accomplishments in Biological Sciences, the Department of Biotechnology, Ministry of Science and Technology, Government of India, has accorded Star College status to our college.

We have a functional Botanical Garden on campus, which is an integral part of teaching and learning Botany. It is a resource for a large number of experiments. Botanical Garden is a live laboratory for the teaching of morphology, anatomy, cytology, physiology, genetics, ecology, embryology, and reproductive biology. A separate section for medicinal plants, succulents and cacti and aquatic plants has also been set up. Students get opportunities to hone their creative instincts by participating in several co-curricular activities of the Botanical Society "Vasundhara". Vasundhara holds activities and competitions like Poster Making, Rangoli, Collage making, Paper Reading, Essay Writing, Debating, Extempore and Quiz contests. The Botanical Society also organises an annual inter-college festival called "Orchidz" and publishes a magazine "Liana". Students get additional exposure through educational field trips and excursions to Research Institutes and National Laboratories. Providing career counselling for the students is a regular activity of the department.

Department of Chemistry

Chemistry is one of the leading subjects in pure sciences. It offers the students a platform to explore and learn about the fascinating world of atoms and molecules. Chemistry is often referred to as the central science because it joins together physics and mathematics, biology and medicine, and the earth and environmental sciences. The four-year Chemistry honours course is a fine balance of Inorganic, Organic and Physical Chemistry, integrated with other related disciplines. The course opens doors to a wide range of careers such as in teaching, industry and research. After graduation, students can pursue postgraduation degrees such as MSc in Chemistry, Analytical Chemistry, Polymer sciences, Forensic Sciences, Material Sciences, Biotechnology, Bioinformatics, Nanotechnology etc. They can also enrol in MBA, MCA and B.Ed. courses.

The department has a highly qualified, dedicated and experienced faculty. We have well-equipped laboratories for regular practical classes as well as research activities. The Department has been awarded star status by DBT and has successfully completed various innovation projects.

National and International conferences are regularly organized to make participants aware of new scientific developments and to provide a platform to connect with researchers to exchange ideas and establish collaborations. Faculty development programmes are organized for the benefit of faculty members to enrich their knowledge and diversify their skills. Skill development programmes for students during summer and winter breaks are organized by the department every year on topics such as personal care products, food chemistry, emerging diseases, instrumentation, clinical, analytical and computational chemistry. These programmes give extensive practical hands-on experience to our students. We have an active Chemistry Student Association named "Chemphoria" which organizes

seminars, educational trips and departmental festival. Our department is committed to providing students with a collegial, inclusive and intellectually stimulating environment where they can thrive and achieve their dreams.

Department of Commerce

The course structure prescribed under the National Education Policy 2020 provides comprehensive insights into finance, banking, investment, marketing, human resource management, law, accounting, taxation etc. The curriculum is oriented towards grooming the students to pursue careers in the ever-dynamic corporate world and various professional courses.

The department is the largest department in the college with dedicated, experienced, and research-oriented faculty members specializing in diverse areas. Even during the COVID-19 -pandemic, the department was swift to adapt to the online mode of teaching without compromising on the quality of knowledge imparted. The department has a dedicated computer lab for commerce students. The students are offered opportunities for honing their creativity and enhancing their managerial skills through participation in Skill Development Programs organised by the department, as well as activities organized by Commercial, the Commerce Association of Daulat Ram College. Department of Economics

The Department of Economics of Daulat Ram College boasts of an experienced and dedicated faculty which aims and works for the holistic development of students. The faculty has vast experience in the fields of teaching and research, with a number of research papers published in various national and international journals. The department as a whole, comprising of both, teachers and students has been one of the most proactive and innovative departments of the college.

The department members are also members of the Economics Association, 'Éclat' which organizes various co-curricular activities, conducts several seminars, national and international conferences to enlighten them about the possible future prospects. The association organises 'Mutasir', a youth conference, in which prominent economists are invited to exchange their ideas on contemporary economic issues. In the annual economics festival, 'Economania' events like debate, paper presentations, MUNs or Modelling United Nations and so on, are conducted to keep up the competitive spirit among the students. A MUN is a simulation of an actual United Nations Conference, where students are tasked with solving a global issue through research, drafting, lobbying and debate to pass a suitable 'resolution'. Over 100 plus delegates participate every year

from different colleges and schools. The association also launches the annual publication 'Optima', which is an interesting mosaic of ideas and understanding of various topics of economics, by the students and the faculty members. Recently, the department organized a national conference on "Income Inequality, Protectionism and International trade in Digital Age: with reference to India". Apart from organising activities like freshers welcome and farewell for the students of Economics, the department is extremely active in various Community and Social Service Activities like Flood Relief Operations etc.

Department of English

An Honours course in English Literature helps students engage with a range of literary texts, spanning different countries and time periods. Students are taught to read not just the surface but also the subtexts as well as silences; and are sensitized to the existence of multiple contexts and realities. This course prepares students for a career in academics, teaching, creative writing, mass communication, journalism, editing and publishing, civil services, theatre, career counseling, and other ever-emerging options.

The English Literary Association – *Literati* – regularly conducts workshops and invites eminent resource persons to address and interact with the students. We believe in an interdisciplinary pedagogical approach and encourage the students to understand the close connection of literature with paintings and sculptures, movies, theatrical performances. Interactions with authors, scholars, critics, theatre personnel and performance artists prove to be an immensely enriching experience for the students; as literature too, comes alive for them in the process.

The Department has organised several UGC-sponsored National Conferences, one National Literary Meet, Faculty Development Programme, Symposia and several Student Seminars. It conducts regular tutorials for MA students. The departmental magazine, *Expressions*, brings to the fore creative talents of the students.

During the pandemic, the Department organised several webinars, inviting a diverse range of speakers. For the present academic year, as the situation is gradually getting back to normal, the Department will organise Workshops on Poetry, Academic Reading and Writing, Orientation Programmes for the undergraduate and postgraduate students and several other enriching academic sessions.

Department of History

The Department of History was established in 1960, when B.A. program course. After that, it was upgraded to a full-fledged Honours course. Today the department also offers several interdisciplinary papers as General Elective (GE) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) to the students of other departments. The papers offered by the department cover both Indian and world history from ancient times to contemporary times. The department has dedicated and qualified faculty with a variety of research and teaching expertise. The teaching method is interdisciplinary with a practical approach, with an emphasis on interactive classes, group discussions, excursions and movie screenings. Students are encouraged to go beyond textbooks to complete their projects and assignments. Audio-visual media is used during lectures and tutorial classes. The department is visited every semester by a number of eminent historians and scholars, who deliver lectures and interact with the students. We also have a well-stocked library with books in English and Hindi.

The department also conducts various Skill Development Programmes (SDP) regularly. We have collaborated with institutions like INTACH, and encourage students to apply for internships at the National Collection, National Museum, Nehru Memorial Museum and Library, Archaeological Survey of India and other organizations. While research and teaching are obvious career options for history students, the curriculum also provides the foundation for other career opportunities in social work, tourism, heritage management, publishing, journalism and bureaucracy. In addition, students can also undertake highly specialized courses after graduate in history such as archaeology, numismatics, epigraphy, Indology, museology, archival studies, and art conservation, conservation, and management.

Department of Mathematics

In education system across the globe, there is one constant subject, a language that is universally spoken: Mathematics. The department of Mathematics was established in the year 1964. Initially, mathematics was offered as one of the Discipline subjects in B.A. (Programme). Later on, B.Sc. (Honours) Mathematics was introduced in the year 2006. At present, the department offers B.Sc. (Honours) Mathematics to the students of all streams under UGCF-2022 based on NEP 2020.

Besides the honours course, it is offered as a Discipline course in B.A. (Programme) and General Elective course for other B.A.(Honours) and B.Sc. (Honours) courses.

The course structure allows the students to develop conceptual understanding via the use of advanced softwares such as Mathematica, R, Latex, TORA etc. The teaching methodology lays emphasis on interactive classes, skillful problem-solving techniques and uses various available e-resources.

“Affine”, the mathematics association organizes various lectures by eminent Professors throughout the year. An inter-college annual festival “Shoonya” is organized wherein several competitions related to Mathematics are held. In addition to it, annual newsletter “Mathpunch” is launched, which brings forth the creative talent of the students.

To motivate the students to excel in academics, the college awards Proficiency Prizes (for securing highest marks in each year), Silver Jubilee Merit Scholarship (for securing I, II or III rank at university level in Ist or IInd year) and Teachers Memorial Prize (for securing I, II or III rank at university level, all three years combined). Apart from this, students can also apply for various scholarships such as NBHM scholarship, Inspire program etc. during or after their B.Sc. or M.Sc. Course in Mathematics.

A UG degree in Maths enables students to go for MCA, MBA, Actuarial Sciences and Masters in Mathematics, Statistics, Operational Research etc. Besides this, enhanced career opportunities in Accountancy and Finance, Insurance, Banking, Machine Learning and Data Science etc. are also open to students with a degree in Mathematics.

Dr. Seema Khurana (Teacher-In-Charge)

Department of Music

The Music Department was established in 1971 and since then its dedicated faculty has been working for the academic and cultural growth of the college. It offers a B.A. Programme course in Music and teaches classical music (Vocal & Instrumental- Sitar) covering different areas of Hindustani Music. The department also registers students for B.A. Honours course and M.A. Music course for which classes are held in the Faculty of Music, University of Delhi. The course familiarizes the students with the fundamentals of various ragas and talas, history of music, study of granthas and life-sketches of great musicians and musicologists. It helps them to develop their potential in music and opens up channels for entry into post-graduation, M.Phil., Ph.D. in music and a teaching career later on.

The department has a vibrant and active Music Association – “SAAZ” which regularly organises music competitions, lecture demonstrations, quiz, performances of artists, seminars and talks for the benefit of the students. It also provides a platform for the students to exhibit their talents. The department also organises skill development courses and workshops from time to time that help students learn and grow in the field of music.

Dr. Deepti Bansal (Teacher -In- Charge)

Department of Nutrition and Health Education

The Nutrition & Health Education (NHE) department was set up in 1984, the year in which University of Delhi introduced a number of restructured courses in B.A. (Pass) and B.Sc. (General). It is the oldest NHE department of the University. Under UGCF-2022 based on NEP 2020, it will be offering B.A. Programme with Nutrition and Health Education (NHE). The courses will be part of a multidisciplinary programme of study where the student studies two core disciplines.

The Core (DSC) and Elective (DSE) courses will equip the students to develop an inclusive and multidimensional understanding of the fundamentals of nutrition, food science, well-being and

lifestyle, nutritional concerns in various age groups, food safety, food hygiene and sanitation, food and nutrition security as well as other aspects of nutrition. This programme lays the foundations for appropriate skill development, academic understanding, entrepreneurship, community engagement and employment. The students can fetch jobs in nutrition based programs of the country/ NGOs/ fitness and wellness centres, and can engage in nutrition counselling, programme planning, implementation as well as monitoring and surveillance. They can be initiators of a cascade effect by being trainer of the trainers for spreading nutrition related awareness among the masses as well as in promoting capacity building of individuals and communities across segments of the society for social/ economic empowerment. In addition, the students will be equipped to set up a small scale food enterprise or can engage in writing food blogs etc. The Skill Enhancement Courses (SECs) and Generic Elective Courses (GEs) which are planned to be offered during the 4-year programme will also increase the knowledge base of students who do not have any background in Nutrition. The department has one temporary lab.

Dr. Pooja Jain (Teacher-In-Charge)

Department of Philosophy

“It is very easy to conform to what your society or your parents and teachers tell you. That is a safe and easy way of existing; but that is not living...to live is to find out for yourself the truth.” This statement by J. Krishnamurti gives an insight into the essence of Philosophy as an eternal quest for truth. In this light, the department endeavours to uphold academic excellence and train young minds with cognitive and ratiocinative abilities. Studying philosophy equips one to distinguish good reasoning from bad, to ask questions pertaining to human existence, to think, reflect, argue and speculate about life. This exploration opens a whole range of possibilities to know, understand and weave the interface of human beings with the animate and inanimate world.

During this undergraduate program, students shall be exposed to a wide array of papers designed to cultivate the minds of young scholars. These papers include a broad range of subjects, like, Logic, Indian Philosophy, Ethics, Western Philosophy, Social and Political Philosophy, Epistemology, Philosophy of Language, Philosophy of Mind, Philosophy of Law, Critical Thinking and Decision Making, Philosophy of Religion, Feminism, Media and Aesthetics, to name a few. Studying philosophy opens avenues for higher learning in the fields of philosophy, law, education, journalism and media, social work among many others. We take pride in stating that our students have joined administrative and civil services, corporate jobs, NGOs, academics, research, judiciary, copy editing and other esteemed professions.

The Philosophy Association organizes skill development courses, workshops, seminars, panel discussions and conferences to expose students to the practical aspects of the discipline with the aim to upgrade skills, enhance capabilities, and empower them with the ability to resolve personal as well as social conflicts thereby making them better ethical and logical decision makers.

Department of Physical Education and Sports Sciences

Physical education provides cognitive content and instruction designed to develop motor skills, knowledge, and behaviors for physical activity and physical fitness. It aims to develop students' physical competence and knowledge of movement, safety, and their ability to use these to perform in a wide range of activities associated with the development of an active and healthy lifestyle. It also develops students' confidence and generic skills, especially those of collaboration, communication, creativity, critical thinking and aesthetic appreciation.

The department provides sports facilities to all the students admitted to the college. The sports facilities are:- Athletics, Kabaddi, Kho-Kho, Table-Tennis, Gymnastics, Weightlifting and Badminton etc. The department has multi-gym facilities, Sauna bath, Steam bath, Jacuzzi bath, massage therapy, thermal massage therapy etc. It helps sports players to excel their respective sports disciplines and groom them to participate at university level, all India Inter-University, National and International Levels.

The department of Physical Education and Sports Sciences organizes different training programmes, workshops and student development programs (SDPs), Freshers Sports Meet/Talent Hunt for exploring the talent. Under the banner of the National Sports Organization (NSO), it organizes activities for students on fitness, wellness and training programmes.

The department also offers Sports for Life, Yoga: Philosophy and Practice & Fit India as Value Added Course (VAC) for first year students. A career in physical education can lead students to achieve the highest level of their stream/career. The wide range of career options are: Sports Psychologist, sports Bio mechanical Analyst, Physiotherapist, Journalist, Physical Education Teacher, Sports equipment Manufacturer, Gym Trainer, Yoga Expert, Aerobics Trainer etc.

Department of Physics

Physics is the base among all natural sciences. Studying physics can be personally rewarding as students begin to understand everyday objects and occurrences in terms of the concepts of physics. The Physics Department of Daulat Ram College was started in 1978, and has a well-equipped laboratory and well stocked library. The college started an Honours course in Physics in the 2017-18 academic session. The course not only provides an in-depth knowledge of core topics of physics but also integrates them with mathematics and chemistry. The course is designed to develop among students analytical, quantitative and problem-solving skills. A physicist has the ability to synthesize and analyze large quantities of data and present their analysis in an easily understandable form. The skill a physics student develops is a sense of wonder about how things work. These are valuable skills that can be applied in a range of careers. In order to nurture the skills of a Physics (H) student Department also organizes Skill Development Programs during summer and winter breaks. During these programs, students enrich their learning through hands-on experiences in various applied skills and techniques.

After graduating in Physics student can pursue post-graduation in courses such as Physics, Geophysics, Electronics, Material Science, Nanotechnology, Biophysics, Computational Physics, Data Science etc. This further opens a plethora of career opportunities to students in Academics as teachers/professors, in research institutes as scientists, in industries such as semiconductor, electronics, analog instrumentation industries etc., and in defense and banking sectors as well. Other conventional service sectors are also open to these graduates.

Department of Political Science

Political Science, as a discipline engages students in rigorous analysis of diverse core areas of inquiry that include Political Theory, Indian Politics, Comparative Politics, Public Administration, International Relations and Indian Political Thought. Keeping in mind the quintessential principle and underlying objective of the National Education Policy, 2020, the course curriculum is devised to contribute towards a comprehensive understanding of concepts, theories, perspectives and approaches that expose students to develop critical and creative thinking and promote ethical reasoning for scholarly research. Students across genres gain solid foundations in the subject and are

equipped to explore ideas and processes that are fundamental to an inclusive and diverse scholarship. They are encouraged to take full advantage of substantive and holistic learning by participating in seminars, workshops, colloquia, skill development programmes, educational trips and field visits. Alongside, the Political Science Association, *Republica*, provides a forum to discuss and debate critical issues, and participate in various academic activities in the annual intercollege festival, 'Metamorphosis' to support a viable, diversified and integrated culture for the development and growth of our cohort.

Our distinguished faculty work extremely hard and ensure that students get the best guidance and support. Thus, our graduates go on to excel in advancing their careers in research, teaching, civil services, journalism, law, social work and other government and non-government agencies that work in areas like gender studies, human rights, rural and urban development, and public policy.

Department of Psychology

The discipline of Psychology provides an in-depth understanding of various aspects of human behaviour and personality. Psychologists are constantly developing new approaches and techniques to adapt to the changing needs of contemporary society. The NEP provides an opportunity for the students to gain inclusive education and learning experiences through comprehensive knowledge in a variety of courses such as Fundamentals of Psychology, Introduction to Social Psychology, Life Span Development, Psychology distress and well-being, Counselling Psychology, Organizational Psychology, Psychological Research, Health Psychology, HRM, Abnormal Psychology, Physiological Psychology, Positive Psychology etc. The study of Psychology opens avenues for a variety of careers in Counselling (e.g., in the Clinical and Organizational settings), teaching and research, helps to prepare for careers in Civil Services, HRM, Social Work, Advertising and Media.

The department was established in 1969. It is well-equipped with state-of-art laboratories with latest psychological tests, equipment & software. The dedicated faculty uses the latest teaching methods such as multimedia, movie analyses, role-play and experimental training. The Psychology Association actively organizes academic and co-curricular activities including talks, seminars, workshops as well as national and international conferences and annually publishes the Departmental magazine- "PsyTrack".

The department is the first in the University to have a 'Psychology Resource Centre' which organizes programs inculcating positive self-development, enhancing mental health, value engagement, capacity building, ADS awareness program (Awareness, de-stigmatization & seeking help) and Counselling services. Our faculty actively participates and mentors students in academic pursuits such as research projects, writing of research papers, presenting in conferences and supervising doctoral work. The department regularly organizes skill development programs to enhance skills pertaining to the use of psychometry, personality, happiness, statistical softwares for data analysis and value engagement programs for the students. Programs as positive conversations, mental health day celebrations and community engagement are regularly organized.

Department of Sanskrit

The Department of Sanskrit of Daulat Ram College is among the first departments of Sanskrit in the University of Delhi. It was established with an aim to promote Sanskrit – the most scientific and richest language. The department offers Sanskrit as Honours and Programme courses and also as the interdisciplinary Ability Enhancement and Generic Elective Courses in both English and Hindi mediums. Sanskrit is not merely a language but a subject as well. It is the foundation of Indian

Sciences, Culture, Philosophy, Religion, Literature and Linguistics. The department provides lectures as well as tutorials on the Vedic and Classical literature, Indian Polity and Medicine, Grammar and Linguistics, Reasoning and Ontology, Aesthetics and Indian theatre, Ayurveda, Epigraphy and Archaeology, etc. It introduces the various genres of Sanskrit Literature, be it Vedic or Classical, novels, Ghazals or Haikus. The department believes in adopting the modern ICT based approach and pedagogy to impart valuable knowledge contained in Sanskrit Literature. It is proactive in organizing events like seminars, Skill Development Programs, Workshops, Intercollege competitions, educational trips and lectures and talks of eminent speakers to promote academic as well as all round development of the students. Shreyas – the students association is highly active and aims at encouraging team spirit and instilling leadership qualities in the students. The students get essential counselling for career opportunities within the department. The various career avenues available to the students are Civil Services, Journalism, Law, Human Resource Management, Translation work, Architecture, Astrology, Epigraphy, Manuscriptology, Drama and Social Work etc. The department also holds tutorials for the Post-Graduate students which are supplementary to the lectures held in the Department of Sanskrit, University of Delhi.

Dr. Sushma Devi (Teacher-In-Charge)

Department of Zoology

The Department of Zoology at Daulat Ram College was established in 1968 and currently holds the Star Department Status recognized by the Department of Biotechnology (DBT), Government of India. The department offers undergraduate courses for B.Sc (Hons.) Zoology and B.Sc Life Science in association with the Department of Botany and the Department of Chemistry. The course covers areas in the fields of Classical Zoology, Cell Biology, Ecology, Physiology, Biochemistry, Genetics, Immunology, Molecular Biology, Evolutionary Biology, Developmental Biology, Animal Behavior and Reproductive Biology

The Department has well equipped, spacious, air-conditioned laboratories with LCD projectors, Reading Rooms, Computer Lab with Internet Facility and a state of art Zoology Museum. Department maintains its own library with a good collection of books. Department has a Drosophila Resource Center where students can learn the basics of Drosophila research.

The Zoology Department has a team of skillful and enthusiastic faculty members with diverse specializations namely Biotechnology, Molecular Biology, Reproductive Biology, Toxicology, Entomology, Behavioral biology, and Neuroendocrinology. They venture beyond the boundaries of the classroom to help and groom students to attain their maximum potential. Apart from teaching, faculty members mentor students in undergraduate research. The students are often taken on field trips, visits to research labs and excursion tours for practical learning outside the confines of the classroom.

The Zoological Society “Koshika” is an active student body that conducts a variety of academic and extracurricular activities at the National and International levels with the aim of holistic development of students.

Every year our students achieve University ranks and various scholarships. They bring laurels to the college not only in academics but also in the extra-curricular activities. Our alumni are settled in various Central and CSIR laboratories, Indian administrative services, US federal services and are also part of research teams in many International Universities. The Department’s objective is to promote a learning environment that is active, constructive, goal oriented, investigative and meaningful.

Vidya Vistar Scheme

India’s dream to be a global superpower in the coming decades depends primarily on enhancing the skills of its human resources to meet global demands and increasing innovations and start-ups to fuel the economy. The roles that the universities, colleges and other educational institutions have to play are crucial in this context. However, each University/institution will require investment of considerable amount of its resources for these activities. Being a developing country, it would be in the best interest of students and teachers to maximise the utilization of existing resources available with the Universities/academic institutions by sharing the same, through academic collaboration and cooperation amongst them, for augmenting the human resources.



The University of Delhi has initiated the Vidya Vistar Scheme (V2 Scheme) to partner with Colleges and Departments of Universities which are situated in remote areas of the country so that the Colleges and Departments of the University collaborate with them to enhance the capacity as well as development of these institutions in particular and the country in general. The Vidya Vistar Scheme is based on the principle of mutual respect, cooperation and sharing between two Colleges/Departments of both the universities as equal partners.

In the light of the objectives of the Vidya Vistar Scheme, Daulat Ram College has entered into an academic collaboration with Government College, Chouhtan and Government Girls College, Magra Punjala, in Barmer and Jodhpur respectively, in Rajasthan. The partnership aims to facilitate sharing of resources and expertise amongst the partnering institutions to enhance the academic capital of the students and the faculty.

Add-On Courses

Data Analytics with ‘R’

Daulat Ram College offers a short-term certificate course on Data Analytics with ‘R’, in collaboration with Meghnad Desai Academy of Economics, Mumbai. ‘R’ is an open-source user friendly programming language. It is freely available and can be operated easily. Being an open source, ‘R’ is covered under the GNU General Public License Agreement. In addition, developments in ‘R’ happen at a rapid scale and the community of developers is huge.

Course Timeline:

The Course will commence from 2023 (dates to be announced)

Course Duration:

Short -Term Certificate Course-30 hours (20 hours teaching and 10 hours: assignment and project)

Course Objective:

The main objective of the course is to create a better understanding of ‘R’ language for students. The course would enable a student to do data visualization and analysis using ‘R’ programming. Further, the course would enable skill and professional development of the student. A course in data analytics would be beneficial for students in their higher studies, research and projects. The course will make them more friendly with data and equip them to operate in a more scientific way, thereby meeting the present-day demands of the job market.

Course Structure:

Introduction to ‘R’ (Downloading ‘R’, working on vectors, importing data, descriptive statistics), Basic concepts, Manipulating data and extracting components, Program or script writing, Graphics with ‘R’ ,Probability distributions – Normal, Standard Normal, Binomial & Poisson , Hypothesis testing, (Z test, chi-square etc),Hypothesis testing -F and t distributions, OLS regression(Linear Modelling), Bi-variate and multivariate regression, Violation of OLS assumptions (autocorrelation, heteroscedasticity, etc)

Course Learning Outcomes:

Hands-on experience of handling and manipulating data on ‘R’, Learning of different techniques of graphically visualizing data on ‘R’. A better understanding of statistical concepts of probability distributions, hypothesis tests and regression by learning how to apply them on real data and interpret the results and modelling economic data to understand relationships.

Legal Literacy, Awareness and Aid

Daulat Ram College has established the “*Centre for Legal Literacy, Awareness and Aid*”, a first-of-its-kind centre under the umbrella of University of Delhi to impart basic knowledge and awareness about the legal framework. It aims to cultivate technical acumen and enhance skills about the processes of legal and judicial institutions, so that their services can be accessed and availed for public advocacy. With this vision in mind, the add-on courses on “Legal Literacy, Awareness and Aid” in collaboration with Delhi State Legal Services Authority (DSLISA) is coordinated by Dr. Sonia Mehta, Associate Professor, Department of Philosophy of our college and Honourable Judge, Ms. Harshita Mishra, Metropolitan Magistrate/Secretary (Litigation) Delhi State Legal Services Authority.

The courses under “**Legal Literacy, Awareness and Aid**” are as follows:

- **3 Months Certificate Course with 30 Credits**
- **3 Months Diploma Course with 30 Credits commencing in 2023**
- **3 Months Advance Diploma Course with 40 Credits commencing in 2023-24**

A learner can do all the 3 courses in a short duration of 9 months including 18 modules with 100 credits.

The courses cover highly diverse legal subjects of contemporary import such as Intellectual Property Rights, Cyber Laws, Consumer Laws, Corporate Laws, Women and Children Laws, Land Laws, Labour Laws, Human Rights Law. The Course plan includes sessions delivered by eminent members from the judicial and legal fraternity. All the three courses include specially designed modules focusing on field visits, enabling learners to have a hands-on experience and exposure of the legal system by visiting courts, related government offices, police stations and jails.

The overall rationale of these courses is to establish a clear and holistic perspective about the legal system and its applications in today's globalised, technological know-how and competitive world. They are an integral requirement in the College and University education system and the basic precept of National Education Policy 2020 which is based on skill development and sensitisation towards the multidisciplinary aspects of education.

The Centre has successfully conducted its first batch of certificate course via online mode in the academic session 2021-22, in which students from diverse fields and across ages were enrolled. We had a 100% passing result where all the students passed the course with flying colours. In this academic session, the Centre has commenced with the second batch of the certificate course in offline mode.

The certificate course is open to all candidates, with minimum eligibility being 60% marks in Senior Secondary School Examination. Students pursuing B.Com., BBA, BBS, B.B.E, M.Com., M.B.A., C.A., C.S., and employees/ professionals working in corporates, NGOs and government organizations and employees sponsored by their parent organization can apply for the course as it adds to their technical legal knowledge and skills.

On completing the above courses, the learners possess a tangible competitive advantage which opens further avenues for lucrative career opportunities in various international and national organizations related to IPRs, International trade, International Environmental law, Human rights and Human resource management, legal publisher, Nodal officer, Arbitration, Mediation and Conciliation. With this professional training, students will have an edge while applying for jobs in various industries such as food, agricultural, biotech, chemical, pharmaceutical, allied industries and research laboratories, each of which has certain mandatory legal stipulations and compliances. This course transforms students into future leaders of tomorrow.

Facilities at Daulat Ram College

Library and Reading Room

Library and Reading Room facilities are available only to the students and staff of the college. The Library remains open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on week days i.e. Monday to Friday. While the library is open for students on Saturday, the facilities for issuing and returning books are not available. The Library possesses an excellent collection of more than 1,20,000 books and journals/ periodicals. It is completely digitalized with latest soft wares. The Library boasts of a separate Braille Section with soft wares such as (Angel: Talking Digital Pocket Daisy Player, E-Book Reader, MP3 Player, Radio cum voice Recorder) for the benefit of differently-abled students, especially for the visually handicapped students.

Terms and Conditions for Issuing of Books

1. Before leaving the counter, the member should ensure that the book lent to her is in sound condition and in case it is not, she should immediately bring it to the notice of the Librarian. Otherwise she would be liable for any loss/damage and will be required to replace it with a sound/fresh copy.
2. Periodicals, Directories, Encyclopaedias, which might be difficult to be replaced and other books that are declared reference books by the Librarian would not be lent out.
3. Members are not allowed to sub-lend the books of the library.
4. Students who return books later than the due date will be liable to pay a fine as decided by the college authorities from time to time.
5. At present the fine for general section books is -Re. 1 per day for first fifteen days of delay. Thereafter, it will be Rs.5 per day for one month, after which the fine will be Rs.10 per day. Fine for Reserved Section books is Rs.2 per day for first week and thereafter it is Rs.10 per day.
6. Any infringement of the rules will deprive the member of the privilege of admission to, and of borrowing of books from the Library.
7. Each student of M.A. course is entitled to borrow six books at a time.
8. The Library membership will be valid till the student leaves the college.
9. Timings for Issue and Return of Books:
 - i. General Section: Books are issued and returned from 9.00 a.m. to 4.00 p.m.
 - ii. Reserved Section: Books are issued and returned from 12.30 p.m. to 4.00 p.m.
 - iii. Reference Section: Books are only issued for consultation in the Library against Reference Card from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.



Teachers' Study Room

The college has a well-maintained teachers' study room adjacent to library which is equipped with computer facility and lockers. The study area is Wi-Fi enabled, promoting easy access to research and study material.



Laboratories

The College has well-equipped and well-managed laboratories for all the Science Courses, viz. Bio-Chemistry, Botany, Chemistry, Physics and Zoology. The Departments of Nutrition & Health Education, Maths and Psychology also have separate well-equipped labs.



Computer Lab

The College has well-equipped Computer Labs with Pentium machines powered by the latest configuration. The Labs have connectivity with the University of Delhi intranet with access to the internet. The main computer lab has 38 computers and there is an additional computer lab for Commerce and Mathematics students which has 25 computers with internet facility. The Commerce computer lab and Maths computer lab have 40 computer terminals each.



The Maths computer lab has licensed UBUNTU version 8.1 and licensed SPSS for students and faculty.

College Auditorium-Sadbhavna Bhawan

The college auditorium, Sadbhavna Bhawan is a proscenium hall with a seating capacity of over 1,400, and a large stage, ideally suited for theatre activities and dramatics with plays having large casts. All major intra-college and inter-college events also take place in the auditorium.



Conference Hall

The Conference Hall has a seating capacity of 200. The hall is fully air-conditioned, Wi-Fi enabled with digital projection and best audio facility. Since its inception in October 2016 it has been the venue of a large number of academic workshops, seminars and conferences. The college organises various inter- college, intra- college and departmental activities in the hall.



Amphitheatre

The open-air amphitheatre, namely Rangshala, offers a stage to the young students to hone their talent, communication and performing skills. It has witnessed many famous events and has provided a forum to many burgeoning artists. It is the perfect spot for nukkad natak, practices of events for various societies, dance and music performances. It has been a venue for hoisting national flag during Republic Day and Independence Day celebrations.



Medical Room

The Medical Room with an attendant nurse and first aid facilities is available from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The students can also avail of the World University Health Service of the University of Delhi for a nominal annual fee of Rs. 5



RO Water

Cold and purified drinking water is supplied to the students through the RO system. Upgraded from bulky water coolers, the water is dispensed through a seamless junction of taps located in a clean area dedicated for this purpose. Located on the ground floor and first floors, the area is beautifully lit up by posters signifying the importance of water conservation.

Wi-Fi Connectivity

The College is fully Wi-Fi enabled. Keeping in mind the advanced technological demands of the students, the college provides this facility to all the students by sharing a secure password to be used within the college premises.

Email IDs for Educational Purpose

Being connected virtually has become the need of the hour. Hence, the college provides official email IDs to all the students and faculty members in order to facilitate a secure virtual environment for learning and growing intellectually. These are to be used strictly for educational purposes. Students are also guided and oriented through SDPs on e-learning.

CCTV Surveillance

Closed-Circuit Television Units, 50 approx. in number, are strategically installed in the college and hostel premises to ensure that proper discipline is maintained. It is also useful for safety concerns of students.

College Canteen

The College Canteen offers a varied menu at subsidized rates. It provides healthy and nutritious cooked food for the students and staff. A range of cuisines are freshly and hygienically prepared and made available for breakfast and lunch. Branded packed snacks are also available.



Nescafe Corner

Located amidst the bank and canteen, the Nescafe corner serves as a serene space for out-of-the-classrooms brainstorming sessions. The kiosk provides a range of hot and cold beverages and accompaniments.

The College has banking facilities on its premises. The University Branch of Indian Overseas Bank operates in the college. It also has an ATM facility for students.



Hostel

Established in 1974, Daulat Ram College Hostel, a home away from home, envisages an accommodation exclusively meant for 200 undergraduate girl students of the college. The hostel is situated within the sylvan greens of the college campus with easy metro and road connectivity to all parts of the city. Sports Complex and Gymnasium

The college has a state-of-the-art gym complete with latest fitness equipment and machinery including treadmills, cross- body trainer, exercising bike, weight trainer etc. Promoting a healthy and active lifestyle. It caters to the students and staff who wish to avail the facility.



Recycling Unit

The college aims to become a zero discharge campus. Thus it has set up a recycling unit on campus which houses paper recycling machines and leaves-shredder machine. These machines help to make recycled paper and the leaves-shredder machine helps to make manure. The functioning of recycling unit is improving day by day with the manufacture of tons of fertilizer, which is used in house or sold outside, preparation of ceramic pots with medicinal/antipollution plants, making of white and brown recycled paper, use of these papers for painting. Ceramic pots and paintings made here and are used as gifts for our guests at the college.



Students can do their internship here and earn NSS hours by participating in its functioning. Ever since its inception in 2016, this unit has processed tons of shredded leaves into manure, recycled paper and cartons, provided potted plants for gifting and also provided folders, paintings, carry bags

made from recycled paper. Training workshops help to train the students and community members regularly.

Botanical Garden

The botanical garden is an integral part of the department of Botany where perennial and seasonal plants are grown and maintained for hands-on practical related to B.Sc (H) and Life Science syllabus. A small green house is also available where non seasonal plants are kept to make them accessible throughout the year.

Drosophila Resource Centre

The Drosophila Resource Centre was set up in Department of Biochemistry almost 12 years ago. The centre is funded by DBT Star College Project. It aims to teach the basic principles of genetics using Drosophila as a model system. Almost 250 students have been trained since its inception. Students of different life science streams such as Botany, Biochemistry, Life Sciences and Zoology from DU and Punjab University have been trained at the centre. A lab manual on 'Rediscovering Genetics' has been published in 2016 that covers the range of experiments performed by the students at the centre. The students have been immensely benefited by this training which is reflected in their selection and

pursual of higher education in genetics at prestigious institutions. The centre also provides stocks and support to many colleges of Delhi University and AIIMS.

Students get hands-on training on preparation of fly food, culturing and maintenance of flies, male female differentiation, identification of mutants, performing crosses to analyse principles of genetics and many more. It also conducts workshops for training students and teachers of other colleges of DU since its inception.

Zebrafish Lab Facility

The zebrafish lab facility in Daulat Ram College was set up in October 2015, jointly by Biochemistry and Zoology Departments in collaboration with CSIR-IGIB, Mathura Road, Delhi, and Sansriti Foundation Delhi. The facility has been funded by Star Innovation projects DU, Star College project DBT, Govt. of India, and Innovation projects DU. It was developed with the aim of providing an alternative *in vivo* non –invasive model system for science education, teaching and research.

The Zebrafish lab facility is a state of the art temperature and photo-period controlled facility, houses automated re-circulatory fish habitat system, RO water plant, stereo-microscopes, inverted microscope with digital display screen (Evos) and fluorescent microscope (Nikon).

The facility provides training in zebrafish model system to faculty and students. Till date, 150 faculty members and 800 students from various science streams from different Delhi University Colleges and other Universities in Delhi NCR region have participated in various workshops, training programs conducted by the zebrafish lab facility.



Students join the lab as research interns and work on research projects. This opportunity provides students with hands on experience wherein they can explore and discover the nature and process of scientific research using zebrafish model system.

Zebrafish lab facility is also involved in collaborative research projects other institutions such as Hindu College, Delhi University, Jamia Hamdard University, Jamia Millia Islamia University and Amity University.

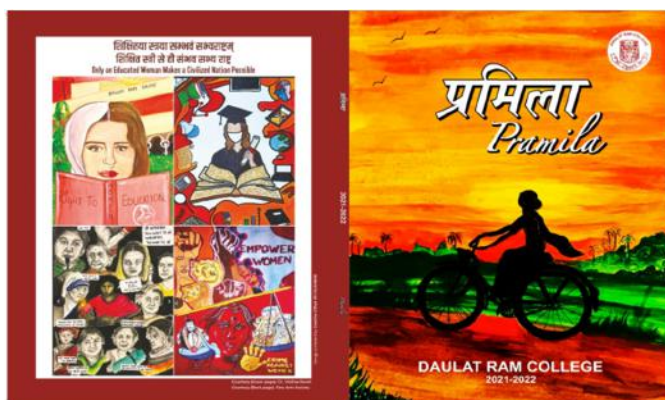

The Ministry of women and Child Development, Government of India has also published a "Handbook on Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace" which describes the issues like what is workplace sexual harassment, its prevention, prohibition and redressal along with the global norms and good practices following in this regard.

With reference to UGC letter No.F.91/9/2015 (GS/MHRD) dated 5th July 2016, College has constituted an Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) through a written order under the above Regulations.

Relevant University Ordinances

Successful Candidates will be required to abide by the Ordinances of the University and will be required to provide a written undertaking to this effect at the time of admission. A few extracts of important ordinances are reproduced here.

ORDINANCE XV-B: Maintenance of discipline among Students of the University

1. All powers relating to discipline and disciplinary action are vested in the Vice-Chancellor.
2. The Vice-Chancellor may delegate all or such powers as he/she deems proper to the Proctor and to such other persons as he/she may specify in this behalf.
3. Without prejudice to the generality of power to enforce discipline under the Ordinance the following shall amount to acts of gross indiscipline:
 - a. Physical assault, or threat to use physical force, against any member of the teaching and non-teaching staff of any Institution/Department and against any student within the University of Delhi
 - b. Carrying of, use of or threat to use of any weapons
 - c. Any violation of the provisions of the Civil Rights Protection Act, 1976
 - d. Violation of the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes
 - e. Any practice-whether verbal or otherwise-derogatory of women
 - f. Any attempt at bribing or corruption in any manner
 - g. Wilful destruction of institutional property
 - h. Creating ill-will or intolerance on religious or communal grounds
 - i. Causing disruption in any manner of the academic functioning of the University system;
 - j. Prohibition of Ragging as per Ordinance XV-C.
4. Without prejudice to the generality of his / her powers relating to the maintenance of discipline and taking such action in the interest of maintaining discipline as may seem to him/her appropriate, the Vice-Chancellor, may in the exercise of his / her powers aforesaid order or direct that any student or students -
 - (a) be expelled; or
 - (b) be, for a stated period rusticated; or
 - (c) be not for a stated period, admitted to a programme or programmes of study in a College, Department or Institution of the University; or
 - (d) be fined with a sum of rupees that may be specified; or
 - (e) be debarred from taking a University or College or Departmental Examination or Examinations for one or more years; or that the result of the student or students concerned in the Examination or Examinations in which he /she or they have appeared be cancelled.
5. Institutions, Halls and teaching in the concerned Departments may exercise their authority through, or delegate authority to such of the teachers in their Colleges, Institutions or Departments as they may specify for these purposes.
6. Without prejudice to the powers of the Vice-Chancellor and the Proctor as aforesaid, detailed rules of discipline and proper conduct shall be framed. These rules may be supplemented, where necessary, by the Principals of Colleges, Heads of Halls, Deans of Faculties and Heads of Teaching Departments in this University. Each student shall be expected to provide himself / herself with a copy of these rules. At the time of admission, every student shall be required to sign a declaration that on admission he /she submits himself / herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice-Chancellor and several authorities of the University who may be vested with the authority to exercise discipline under the Acts, the Statutes, the Ordinances and the rules that have been framed therein by the University.

ORDINANCE XV-C: Prohibition and Punishment for Ragging

1. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, within the premises of College/ Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.
2. Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
3. Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students; and includes individual or collective acts or practices which:
 - a. Involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force.
 - b. Violate the status, dignity and honour of women students.
 - c. Violate the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled caste and tribe.
 - d. Expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem.
 - e. Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behaviour.
4. The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department or an Institution, the authorities of College, or University Hostel or Halls of Residence shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
5. Notwithstanding anything in Clause above, the Proctor may also suo motu enquire into any incident of ragging and make a report to the Vice-Chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.
6. The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.
7. If the Principal of a College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an enquiry, he/ she may so advise the Vice-Chancellor accordingly.
8. When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his/her decision shall be final.
9. On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3(a), (b) and (c), the Vice-Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a student or students for a specific number of years.
10. The Vice-chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not for a stated period, admitted to a programme of study in a college, departmental examination for one or more years or that the results of the student or students concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared be cancelled.
11. In case any students who have obtained degrees or diplomas of the University of Delhi are found guilty; under this Ordinance, appropriate action will be taken under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees or diploma conferred by the University.
12. For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging whether by way of any act, practice or incitement of ragging will also amount to ragging.
13. All Institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instructions / directions issued under this Ordinance, and to give aid assistance to the Vice-Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance.

Order of the Vice-Chancellor in pursuance of Ordinance XV-C: Where incident(s) of ragging are reported to the Vice-Chancellor by any authority under this Ordinance, the student(s) involved in ragging, shall be expelled for a specified term, designated in the order. Non-students involved in reports of ragging will be proceeded with under the criminal law of India; they will also be rendered ineligible for a period of five years from seeking enrolment in any of the institutions of the University of Delhi. Students against whom necessary action is taken under this note, will be given post decisional hearing, with strict adherence to the rules of natural justice.

**ORDINANCE XV-D/The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace
(Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013
(MINISTRY OF LAW AND JUSTICE)**

An Act to provide protection against sexual harassment of women at work place and for the prevention and redressal of complaints of sexual harassment and for matters connected there with incidental thereto.

WHEREAS sexual harassment results in violation of the fundamental rights of a woman to equality under articles 14 and 15 of the Constitution of India and her right to life and to live with dignity under article 21 of the Constitution and right to practice any profession or to carry on any occupation, trade or business which includes a right to a safe environment free from sexual harassment;

AND WHEREAS the protection against sexual harassment and the right to work with dignity are universally recognized human rights by international conventions and instruments such as Convention on the Elimination of all forms of discrimination against Women, which has been ratified on the 25th June, 1993 by the Government of India.

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to make provisions for giving effect to the said Convention for protection of women against sexual harassment at workplace. For details, please see the website
