Call for Abstracts

You are invited to submit abstracts for a Paper Session, Rapid paper session, Poster Session for the First International Conference On “Integrating Traditional Indian Healing Practices with Contemporary Western Health System”. All abstract submissions and presentations are to be conducted in English.

Concept Note:

There is an emerging interest in traditional healing practices in indigenous communities. This conference intends to integrate the Indian and Western perspectives on traditional healing practices and conceptual issues to bridge the gap in knowledge and practice. The aim is to bring about an awareness of indigenous healing traditions in a way that can help to bring about policy changes that can be initiated to expand the outreach programs to reach out to the indigenous communities for timely care. Traditional healing practices in India are very different from the Western traditions and health care systems in theory, techniques and practice. They view illness within the perspective of socio-cultural environment, historical roots, and rituals prevalent in the community. The nature of traditional healing is more holistic, where an attempt is made to restore the harmony between mind, body and spirit, and to bring about a balance with the nature, integrating their families and communities. Hence, to explore this, the practices of the traditional healers in indigenous communities in India and West will be explored to examine the possibility of integrating the traditional healing practices into counseling and psychotherapy to enhance well-being and mental health among people across cultural diversity. The focus will be to understand, promote, and nurture the traditional healing practices into mainstream counseling and psychotherapy so as to develop more culturally sensitive healing systems.

GUIDELINES FOR ABSTRACT AND PAPER/POSTER SUBMISSION

All abstract/paper submissions will be made online only.

Abstracts are to be presented in the following format :

1. **Title:** The title of the paper should be in lower case with the first letter being upper case. No other words should have capital letters unless they are proper nouns. Please make sure the same title is used on the submission form as on the abstract. The title of the research paper must be mentioned first, followed by the author's name, affiliation and email address. The title length should not exceed more than 12 words.
2. Please mention which **type of session** you are proposing the abstract for, such as research paper, rapid paper or poster session.
3. Also mention for which **theme** the abstract is being submitted relates to.
4. **Authors:** The authors' names should be in upper case. Each should appear in the form: Last name, (comma) initial. (full stop) (if more than one initial, run together) and should be followed immediately by the institution or other affiliation (in lower case with capital letters as appropriate). There should be a comma before the ampersand for multi-author papers or after the institution for authors from different affiliations. The principal author should be listed first. If the paper is being presented by another contributing author then this person should be indicated by the letter “P” following their name.

Email Address: Give the full email address of the principal presenting author in the usual form, using conventional lettering. There should be no full-stop at the end of the email address. Only give one email address.

5. The body of the abstract should describe what the paper is about, the research question, the sample studied, the tools used, the main results and their implication.
6. The abstracts may be typed in MS word format using font type Times New Roman, font size 12, with line spacing at 1.5. The abstract should not exceed a maximum of 250 words.
7. The decision of the selection committee will be final and only authors of selected abstracts will be contacted for submission of complete paper.

Research Paper for Publication

8. The paper may be typed in MS word format using font type Times New Roman, font size 12, with line spacing at 1.5. The paper should not exceed a maximum of 3000 words in APA format.
9. The paper will address the research question and hypothesis, the research objectives, the sample selected and the tools used as well as the methodology used. The relevance of the research findings and a critical evaluation need to be incorporated.
10. All research topics should come under either of the broad areas of Integrating Traditional Indian Healing Practices with Contemporary Western Health System”

Please be advised that each delegate may be first author/presenter on only 2 submissions total, including all types of submissions, but there is no limit on co-authorship

Posters Guideline

12. All poster abstracts should include detail information about method, analyses, and results of empirical research.
13. The submission must include the name and complete contact information for the individual responsible for the poster and a 250 word maximum abstract.

Description of Presentations : Sessions

Referred Abstracts

All abstract submissions will be refereed by members of the Scientific Program Committee.

A. Research Paper Session

Each individual paper will consist of a 15-minute presentation plus 5 minutes for questions. The abstract should describe what the paper is about, the research question, the sample studied, the tools used, the main results and the implications of the study. The submission must include the name and complete contact information for the individual responsible for the paper and a 250 word maximum abstract.

B. Rapid Paper Presentation

Each rapid paper presentation will consist of a 5 minute presentation, along with no more than 4 Powerpoint slides. Rapid paper presentations should be used for sharing information on results of pilot studies, preliminary findings, and project development and program evaluation. The submission must include the name and complete contact information for the individual responsible to present the rapid paper and a 250 word maximum abstract.

C. Poster Presentation

All poster abstracts should include detail information about method, analyses, and results of empirical research. Posters will be available for a period of time during the conference, in thematically linked sessions. Poster Dimensions are : 3'(width) X 4' (height)feet (90 X 120 cms) vertical orientation. Printing, hanging up the poster prior to the session and removing the poster on the end of the session is the responsibility of the presenter only. Each board will have adhesive tape available for presenters to secure their poster. Please hang your poster on the board number you receive prior to the conference. The posters will be viewed and discussed during the scheduled Poster sessions. Please be present near your poster at the appropriate time. The submission must include the name and complete contact information for the individual responsible for the poster and a 250 word maximum abstract.
