



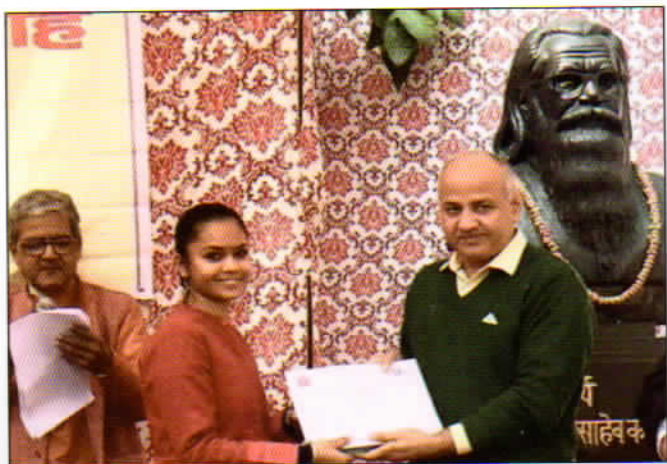

ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Daulat Ram College is a premier educational institution in Delhi founded by an educationist late Shri Daulat Ram Gupta in 1960. It is a prestigious women's college engaged in imparting liberal education to women. The college, a large constituent college engaged in imparting liberal education to women. The college, a large constituent college of the University of Delhi, originally started as "Pramila College" at 22, Tilak Marg with thirteen members of teaching and two non-teaching staff with about 350 students. In 1964, the college shifted to its present premises in North Delhi University campus and was renamed as Daulat Ram College. The institution has since grown into a full-fledged extended college of University of Delhi. The college has acquired a strong identity and has evolved into a prestigious women's college with its own distinct culture and traditions. It imparts education towards degrees at the bachelor's level in arts, commerce and science and Masters level in arts.

The courses in science were introduced in 1968 which led to the construction of the science block and well-equipped science laboratories. The commerce and M.A. courses in many subjects, as well as new courses in B.A. (H) and B.A. (Pass) were added subsequently. Further expansion of the college took place with the introduction of B.Sc. (H) in Biochemistry, Chemistry and Mathematics, addition of Nutrition and Health Education (NHE) and Office Management and secretarial practice (OMSP) and subjects in B.A. (Pass). The college building which was constructed in 1960s was further expanded to cater to the growing needs of the students. A new block of tutorial rooms, a modern seminar hall, new class rooms and science laboratories for Physics, NHE and Biochemistry were added. Subsequently, computer lab open to all students with internet facility were added. Currently the college has add-on courses in foreign languages. At present there are 19 departments with about 4000 students on rolls, about 180 teaching staff and 75 nonteaching staff. The college has a well-equipped computerized library, facility for gymnastics, table tennis, athletics and other games and holds leading position both in academics and sports. Recently a well-equipped Conference Hall with a capacity of 200 students has been built.

The college provides hostel facilities with an intake capacity of 200 students. It caters mainly to outstation students. Due to limited number of seats, only meritorious students are selected for admission to the hostel.

The college is proud to have a well-equipped modern auditorium "Sadbhavana Bhavan" with capacity of about 1200 persons.

Hon'ble Smt Mridula Sinha held the position of Governor of Goa from August 2014 to October 2019. She is a well-known litterateur and an intellectual person. She has authored 46 books in various branches of literature like Novels, Biography, Story Collections, Essays and columns in National and Regional Newspapers, magazines and periodicals. She has also featured in short featured films based on her authored books.

She has been a recipient of several awards -- Sahitya Bhushan Samman by Uttar Pradesh Hindi Sansthan; Honoured

by Vishwantara Hindi Sammiti, New York (1999); Rashtriya Shikhar Samman; Pt. DeenDayal Upadhyaya Samman by Uttar Pradesh Hindi Sansthan(2001); KalpataruSamman, Delhi (1989); Ojaswini Shikhar Samman; and Sahitya Shri Samman. 21 Scholars were awarded PhD degree for their thesis on her literary works.

She is a well-travelled personality who has attended and presented papers in International Conferences in countries like Germany, Manila, New York, England, Surinam, South Africa, Mauritius over a period of many years. We are indeed very privileged and feel honored to have you amongst us today Madam.

Our Guest of Honour is a young IPS officer of batch 2008 who is an alumni of Delhi University. Daughter of Police Inspector who hails from Haryana and service of nation is in her blood. She had served as Suptd. of Police in Karaikal District of Puduchery and now deputed in most challenging area of Delhi as Deputy Commissioner of Police, North Delhi District. Her male colleagues consider her brave officer and many are looking towards her for giving inspiration to young girls in India and transforming police service.

I am very pleased to welcome amongst us our alumna Dr. Sunita Singh, an eminent old student of Daulat Ram College.

Ms. Sunita Singh is an officer of Indian Forest Services, 1987 batch, Maharashtra Cadre. She has been involved in protection and management of forests, and community based programs at both policy and implementation level. Apart from that she has worked for Persons with Disabilities in Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, GOI. As Chief Conservator of Forest, Dhule, she tried to institutionalize 'Payment of Ecosystem Services mechanism' in selected pockets of the forests, particularly through Ecotourism. The quest for knowledge as also the emerging need to address the concerns of climate change through forest management motivated her to take study leave in the year 2009 and register for doctoral program at TERI University, New Delhi. Some parts of her research on Forest-Water relationships and cost-effectiveness of 'Payments for Watershed Services' are published in reputed international journals.

Dr. Sunita Singh was awarded Gold medal for best Forest Management by the Maharashtra Government in the year 2000. She also won IDRC Graduate Research Awards on Climate Change and Water for her PhD research. Presently she is CVO of REC posted in New Delhi.

I welcome once again to your alma mater.

Daulat Ram College has undergraduate courses in 18 subjects and postgraduate courses in 7 subjects. In addition, it has a Centre for foreign languages wherein students are enrolled for certificate, diploma and advanced diploma in foreign languages viz Japanese, Korean, Chinese, German, Spanish, French and Italian. These are Add-on courses and our students derive maximum benefit out of these courses. In the session 2019-20, College has admitted 3631 students at the undergraduate level and 360 at the post graduate level. The overall strength of students in the college is 3991 in regular degree courses which makes it the biggest women college. Intake percentage in various courses were in the range of 91% to 98%. It has been noted that more than 65% students take admission in the college are from states other than Delhi NCR. 11 foreign students are enrolled in the college and they are from different countries including Afghanistan, Nepal, Romania, Sri Lanka etc. The college has admitted 20 PWD students this year strictly as per merit.

I take this opportunity to briefly present the highlights of the College Performance in different spheres. A more detailed presentation of the achievements and activities of the College are given in the subsequent pages of this report.

At Daulat Ram College, we believe in imparting holistic education. In addition to formal education that we impart

within existing University frame work, we engage students in connecting themselves to their grass root. Our students have done commendable work with Seva Bharati and Palna. The students are working under the guidance of experienced Professors and are trained in life skills. The efforts of dedicated faculty are reflected in the University examination results and accolades students have won in extra- curricular field. The pass percentage in different courses was in the range of 94-99%. We are proud of Ekta Chopra for securing 1st position in M.A. (Prev.) Psychology in North Campus and Nupur Singh for securing 1st position in M.A. (Final) in Delhi University(North Campus). College selects all round best student taking into account academic performance, participation and involvement in co-circular and extra-curricular activities. This year's prize for all round best student goes to Muskan Garg, B.Com (Hons) IIIrd year. The college has instituted Prof Madan Mohan Prasad memorial prize which is for a student having attained International recognition in Academics/Extracurricular/Sports. This special prize goes to Ms Nasreen of B.A. (Prog) IIIrd year for bringing laurels to the country and College when she and her team bagged gold medal in the XIIIth South Asian Games held in Kathmandu, Nepal.

The Placement Cell of College under the guidance of Dr. Indu Jain organized internship and Career fair "Incrementum 3.0" for the third consecutive year which saw participation of more than 70 companies and a number of college students were offered placement in various companies. In addition, 72 students of IIIrd year are already placed through Central Placement Cell of University of Delhi.

Dr. Sarita Nanda and her team has acquired Plastic Vending Machine for plastic bottle disposal on campus and have taken steps to reduce plastic usage by using paper cups for beverages in the canteen. The team is trying to achieve a status of zero waste discharge unit.

The college has approximately 2200 students enrolled for National Service Scheme (NSS). The aim of NSS is to work among and with people, to develop a desire to serve the weaker sections of the Community and to gain skills in democratic leadership. With this objective, NSS Centre of Daulat Ram College under the able guidance of Dr. Sarita Jain and Ms. Preeti Singh have organized Yoga training camp in collaboration with Bhartiya Yoga Sansthan, actively participated in Swachta Pakhwata, No Tobacco drive, Self Defence Workshop and many other events. This unit collaborates with Students Union and other Societies for its activities. They helped visually challenged students organize blindfold walk. A team of 4 volunteers each visited 'Bachchon ka Ghar', 'Bachiyon ka Ghar' and 'Kilkari' orphanage for children with stationery and toiletries donated by the college students. Blood Donation Drive, a talk on Detoxification of Stress, Best out of waste workshop were other initiatives undertaken.

The National Sports Organization of DRC wing has been educating youth through sports and physical training. The sports board along with the Students' Union organized the Fresher's Sports spark hunt Week for the first year students on 20th September 2019. Around 600 students of 1st year participated in different events such as kabbadi, kho-kho, lawn tennis and other athletic events. The differently abled students also participated in the games. The event was organized by Sports Board under the convenorship of Dr. Anju Jain. The students were motivated and encouraged by Ms Shreyasi Singh who was chief guest for the day. She is a shooter who won a gold medal in the Shooting at the 2018 Commonwealth Games and is recipient of Arjuna award in 2018.

The NCC students, under the supervision of its Caretaker Dr Suparna Jain, participated in combined Annual Training Camps (CATC-2019), Advanced Learning Camp (ALC-2019) and Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat (EBSB-2019). Six of our cadets were selected for PM Rally three were selected for prestigious Thal Sainik Camp. NCC festival organized by College on 3rd February, 2020 saw participation of 30 colleges with 1000 Cadets across India. It was the most successful NCC festival in the history of Delhi University.


Associations and Cells had organized at least one talk as Co curricular activity. Nearly 40 eminent Professors, Law-makers and Scientists visited College during the year. To name few, Bhikkani Thong Niem (Canada), Prof. Ajay K. Ghatak (MghnadSaha Fellow of INSA) Dr. Mehua Paul (ISID), Dr. Surajit Das (CESP, JNU), Dr. Indrani Gupta (IEG), Dr. Anjena Sharma (DU), Prof. Kavita Sharma (DU), Dr. Poornima Prabhakaran, Deputy Director, Centre for Environmental Health, Public Health Foundation of India, Dr. Tanvi Jain (Indian Statistical Institute) etc.

Under the aegis of Internal Quality Assurance Cell, College had organized 6 Skill Development Programs, workshops, value engaged programs and seminars for students and staff. Sanskrit Department had organized National Seminar on "Paryavaren Chintan: Bharatiya Drishti" on 28th September sponsored by UGC. Physics Department in collaboration with National Academy of Sciences India – Delhi Chapter organized one day workshop on "Quantum Mechanism and its Application" with participation of 200 students from all over NCR. The Economic Association ECLAT in collaboration with United Nations Information Centre of India and Bhutan has organized 5th edition of DRC Model United Nations Conference. The Societies of the College viz Annhad, Alahaya, memesis, Sepia and Magic Lantern etc have been participating and winning prizes all over India

I will fail in my duty if I do not acknowledge the rich contributions made by the Staff who superannuated after serving the College during the year. Dr. Gurprinder Chopra and Ms. Sarita Jain gave more than 40 years for building the College. The contributions of Administrative Officer Mr. P.L. Nair to the corporate life of the college is invaluable. The contributions of non-teaching staff such as Sr. Assistant Mrs. Jaya Chaudhary, Chowkidar Mr. Ramnivas, Library Attendant Mr. Bhola Dutt, Safai Karamchari Mr. Ram Pal are commendable. The college also saw appointment of 14 multi task staff (Lab Attendants) and one Sr. Technical Assistant and promotion of eight staff at various level after a gap of more than a decade.

In all the above endeavor I am deeply indebted to Governing Body members for their support and guidance. BASICS OF BIOINFORMATICS: THEORY & PRACTICE **(11th - 17th JULY, 2019)**

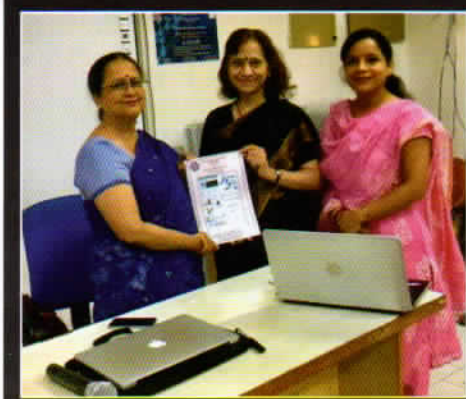

BIOINFORMATICS: Bioinformatics is a new interdisciplinary area of the science that is composed of Biology, Chemistry, Mathematics and Computer science. This SDP program provided a basic but essential training to the students for working in this cutting-edge Computer based discipline. It was one week long practical workshop that included theoretical and hands-on training in basic bioinformatics techniques. Participants learned basic of genomics and analysis of biological data using various computational tools. The course was divided into two parts: theoretical and Practical sessions on daily basis. All participants were introduced with more than 20 online and offline bioinformatics tool and trained as how to use all of them for the genomics analysis.

APPLICATIONS OF IN-HOUSE SKILL DEVELOPMENT BIOINFORMATICS PROGRAMME:

With the help of this training based programme participants became experts of bioinformatics tools to do high-capacity analysis of genes and proteins. This hand on programme improved the career prospects of the participants by developing a range of transferable skills such database-interrogating skills etc. An informative manual was also prepared and distributed to all 37 participants for further use.

SURVEY RESEARCH (5-11 March 2019) (under IQAC)

(With Partial Assistance from NORTHERN REGIONAL CENTRE, ICSSR)

The Faculty Development Programme (FDP) on Survey Research was organised by the Department of Political Science from 5 to 11 March 2019. Organised under Internal Quality Assistance Cell (IQAC) of Daulat Ram College with partial assistance from Northern Regional Centre, Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR), the FDP was informative, educative and enriching experience for the participants across disciplines.

Objectives -

The objective of the FDP was to engage with the methodologies of research in survey that move beyond the boundaries of rigidity, narrower interpretations, mutually exclusive frameworks, binaries, and dichotomies, to a broader and comprehensive understanding of survey research. Eminent scholars from various disciplines and institutions were invited as resource persons to engage with the participants from various disciplines. To make the programme interdisciplinary in nature, the resource persons from several disciplines such as Sociology, Social Anthropology, Political Science, History, Statistics, Education, and Psychology were invited to deliver lectures and each session was followed by interactions with the participants.

The participants not only learnt about the various survey methods, techniques, their merits as well as limitations, but also the steps/ways to make survey method more reliable by reducing the errors. The programme was a rigorous exercise as it traced the evolution of survey research in social science and its relevance and focused on the experiences in the field across time periods and contexts.

Resource Persons and Participants

There were seventeen sessions based on broader themes of survey research (also see Programme). We had sixteen Resource Persons to lecture on the themes which were followed by discussions with the participants. It was a privilege and honour to have amongst us Prof. VinaySrivastava, Prof. SatishDeshpande, Prof. ManoranjanMohanty, Prof. Sanjay Kumar, Prof. Madhulika Banerjee, Prof. Sunil Choudhary, Prof. Haneet Gandhi, Dr. Riaz Ahmad, Dr. ShaliniSuryanarayan, Dr. SusmitaMitra, Dr. RajniSahni, Dr. ShailajaMenon and Dr. Shahana Bhattacharya, as resource persons. There were thirtyseven participants, most of whom were Assistant Professors and Research Scholars from various disciplines and institutions.

The participants were required to make presentations on four major themes in the Technical Sessions on Quantitative and Qualitative Techniques of Research, Questionnaire and Interview Schedule, Sampling Procedure, and Data Collection in Field Work. The presentations reflected the outcome of the programme. The participants also shared their field experiences and journey of research which was an interactive and engaging session.

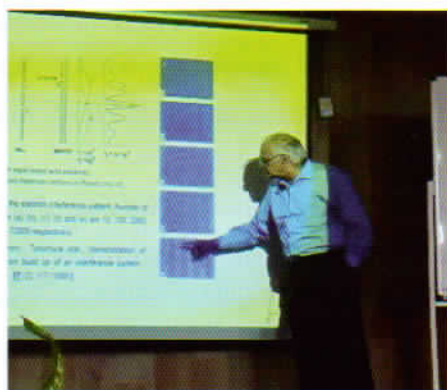

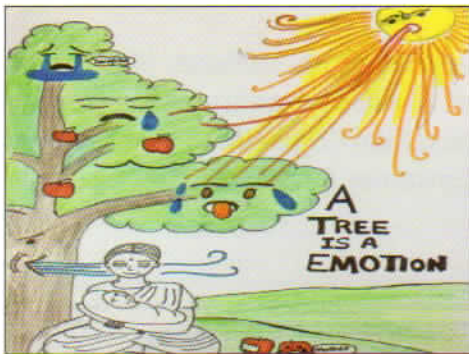

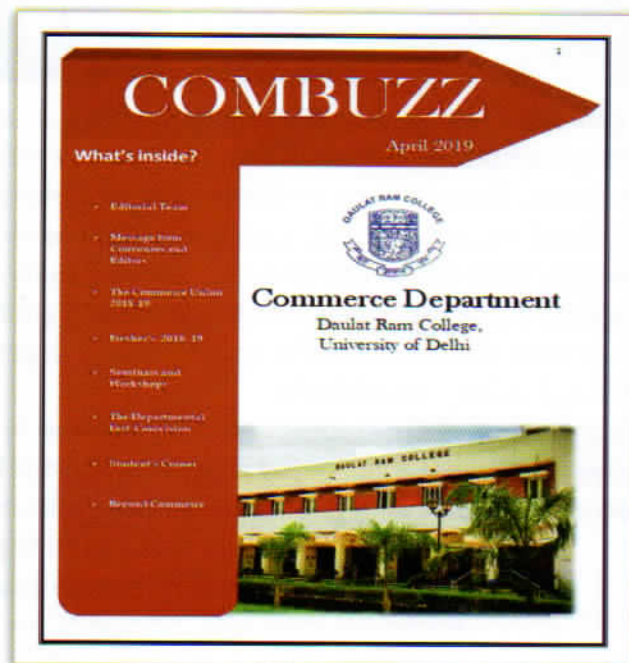
Botanical Society will come up with another volume of its magazine **LIANA** on the theme 'Conservation Biology' that will be a compilation of articles contributed by members.

Challenging the notion of male/female bifurcation of gender, she emphasized the diffused nature of such categorization. Toni Morrison's Beloved was used to further elucidate the concept. Students enthusiastically interacted with Dr. Jain leading to a fruitful discussion.

Next, we had a talk revolving around the homosexual relationships in the Indian context, titled "Pigs Can Fly: Forbidden Sex and Desire to Dissent", by Mr. Gourab Ghosh, who is an LGBTQ activist and teaches at CET University of Wisconsin India Programme. He chose *Funny Boy* by Shyam Selvadurai and connected it with a story in the film *Bombay Talkies* where the protagonists are seen cross dressing and coming to terms with their sexuality. He concluded the talk with information about different organizations in and around Delhi who help the LGBTQ community.

Dr. Dhananjay Kapse, Associate Professor, Kirorimal College delivered a talk on "Modern Indian Literature in Translation." Dr. Kapse introduced the topic by explaining the cover art of his book which served as the background to understand the idea and representation of "Indian" Literatures. Reading excerpts from Ismat Chughtai's short story "Lihaaf" (The Quilt), in both Urdu original and English translation, he further demonstrated how even silences speak, exhorting students to read between the lines.

Dr. Deboshree Sinha, Assistant Professor, Amity University gave a talk on the "Harlem Renaissance and Construction of the Black Self". The talk was aimed at discussing the development of African American identity and selfhood, vis-à-vis the history of slavery, the cultural efflorescence of the Harlem Renaissance, the Black Arts Movement, and the development of black feminism.

The department formally welcomed the new entrants to the Literati family on 3rd September, 2019. The theme for the fresher's was "Cosplay" and the first-year students thrilled everyone with their unique portrayal of people ranging from classic literary characters, to inspiring leaders and popular fiction characters. Niesha Dekawon the title of "Miss Innovative", while the title of "Miss Talented" was awarded to Shreya Chaturvedi and the title of "Miss Freshers" was bestowed upon Nayani Narayan.

"Poetics of Classical Literature: Sanskrit and Tamil" was the topic of our next talk and our guest speaker was Dr. B Mangalam, Associate Professor, Aryabhata College, University of Delhi. She gave a riveting lecture on the nuances of Sanskrit and Tamil poetics delving deep into the concepts of rasa theory, akam and puram poetry. She deliberated and problematised the treatment of Classical literature as a homogenous monolith. She also discussed the gender roles and politics of representation in classical epics. The students keenly participated in the interactive session with the speaker which helped in their critical understanding of the topic.

Visit to the National Gallery of Modern Art: Students were taken on a guided tour of NGMA on September 4, 2019 where they were introduced to the changing subject matter of the paintings across space and time. It started from Pre-Independence India's patronage paintings, the modernization of trade and the shift towards painting exemplified by that of a gardener woman. The students were introduced to different styles of various artists based on their time periods.

It was a great honour for us to hear Prof. Shirshendu Chakrabarti, who has taught at the Department of English, Delhi University, deliver a very comprehensive lecture on the "18th Century English Literature", on 6th September 2019. He deliberated upon the influence of French architecture and literature on the arts produced in England, and how it shaped the notions of nature and culture during the times. By using pictorial presentation, showing the Palace of Birmingham and the Gardens of Versailles, he charted out how the literature of the 18th century England was very artificial and constructed. Several other essays and pamphlets that were in vogue in the 18th century in England were also discussed in context.

The department organized a symposium on "Marginal Studies in India: Revisiting Dr. Ambedkar's Perspectives" in collaboration with the Political Science Department on September 17, 2019. Prof. N Sukumar, Professor Department of Political Science delivered a very comprehensive Keynote Address. Prof. Rajkumar, Head of the Department of English, DU, Dr. Tapan Basu, Associate Professor, Department of English, Dr. Ratan Lal, Associate Professor, The students were greatly benefited by this well-organized symposium.

A seminar was held on "Many Modernisms" on 26th September, 2019. The Keynote Speaker was Prof. Christel R. Devadawson, Professor and former Head, Department of English, University of Delhi. The seminar focused on exploring the realm of Modern and Postmodern era through the research papers presented by throwing light on how Modernism inherits its anxiety from the late Victorianism.

Visit to Ibsen's Play: The third-year honours students attended a session of play reading and performances of one act each of Ibsen's A Doll's House and Ghosts at Shri Ram Centre on January 29, 2020. The acts were read by Norwegian to Hindi translator Astri Ghosh. A Doll's House was directed by Nilon Roy and Ghosts by K.S. Rajendran.

Novella: The Annual Departmental Fest: The Annual Fest of Literati, Department of English, Daulat Ram College was held on February 4th, titled Novella 2020. The fest was organized to celebrate the close connection between literature, art and culture as well as life. We had three very esteemed guests with us, namely Dr. Harish Naval, Associate Professor (rtd.) Hindu College, the Chief Editor of "Gangachal", a literary journal published by the Government of India, and a literary advisor at India Today. We also had amongst us Dr. Sneha Sudha Naval, who served as an Associate Professor of Hindi and also as the Acting Principal of Daulat Ram College. Dr. Ved Prakash, who teaches literature at the Department of English, Central University of Rajasthan and has taught at Delhi University and Jawaharlal Nehru University graced the Occasion as the Guest of Honour. 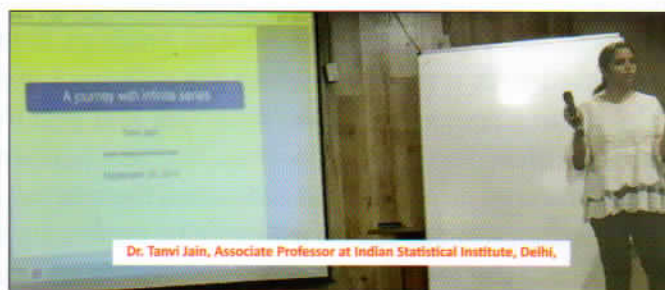

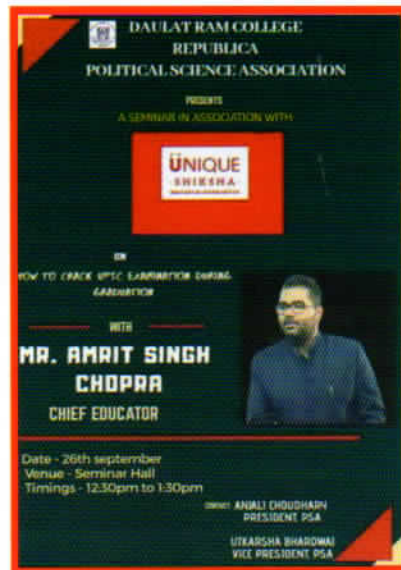
INTERACTIVE SESSION ON ACADEMIC PROSPECTS IN FOREIGN UNIVERSITY

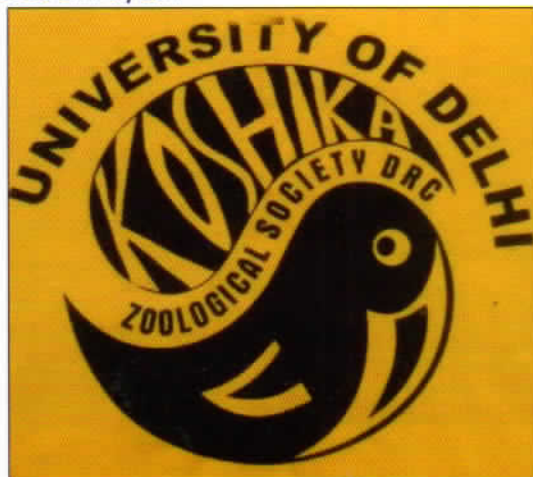
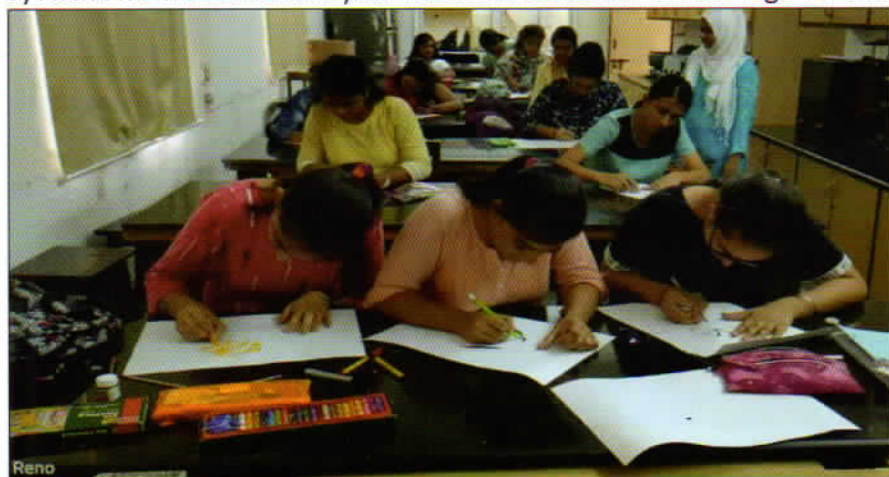

One Day Workshop

Cyber Cell, Daulat Ram College organised a one day workshop on 21st September, 2019 (Under IQAC) on the topic " Artificial Intelligence, Big Data, Data Analytics and Internet of Things". The workshop was inaugurated by chief guest, Dr. U.S. Pandey (Professor at SOL and OSD at Campus of Open Learning, University of Delhi. In the first session, Dr. U.S Pandey gave an exciting presentation and explained what is Big Data and IOT. He also gave some interesting and real life examples and implications through which students can easily connect to the topic like pet scan, drones etc. The topic for 2nd session was "Hands-on Training on Artificial Intelligence and Big Data" by Ms. Chitsimran (Executive Engineer TATA Power DDL. She started with the discussion of what is AI and how it is different from robotics. Further she postulated AI as a brain and nervous system of technologies. She discussed many interesting AI-enabled concepts like self-driven cars, topical fields in which AI is used, the contributing factors and timelines as well. She also discussed the historic Alan Turing test which is generally used to determine whether a machine is capable of thinking like a human being or not. To culminate the

session, she conducted an interactive quiz to know whether the students reached the understanding platform or not. The topic for the third session was "Data Analytics and IOT" which was conducted by Dr. Nikhil Kumar Rajput (Assistant Professor, Department of Computer Science, Ramanujan College, DU). He circulated and made the participants live practice the KNIME software, a software with great OS used for data analytics, reporting and integration platform. He made students understand and gave a thorough review of how they can use the software with even little or no experience. The advantage was one can create visual workflows with an intuitive, drag-and-drop style graphical interface, without the need for coding. He told the students about the workbench, nodes, workflows and giving graphical representation of output. Further, he discussed other softwares and sources including Things Board, AWS and H2O. 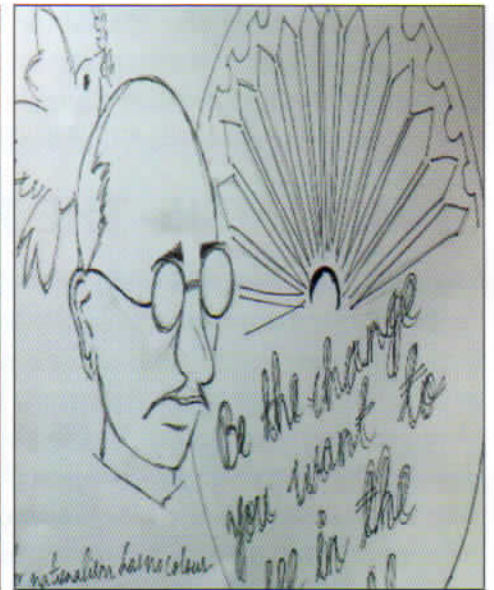
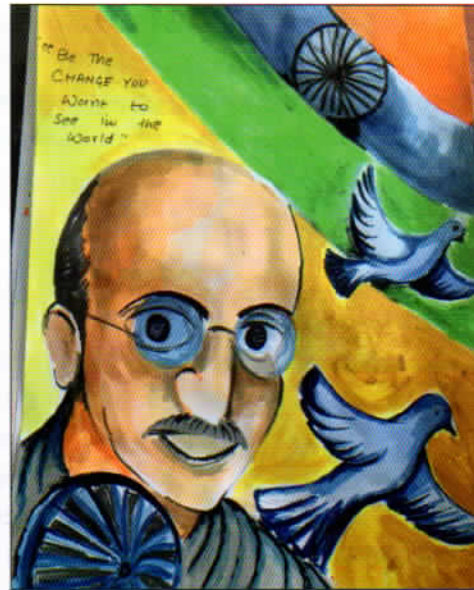
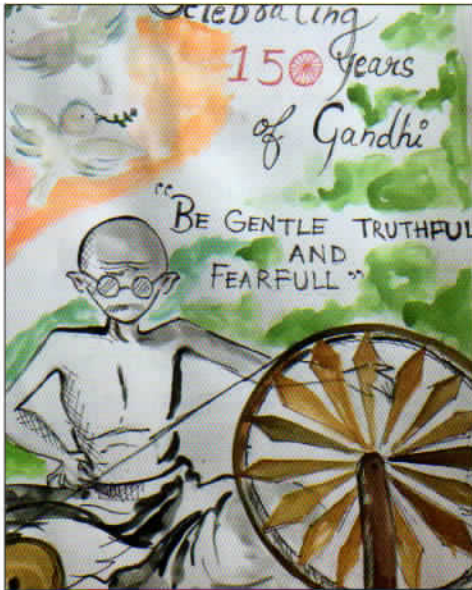
MARTYRS' DAY

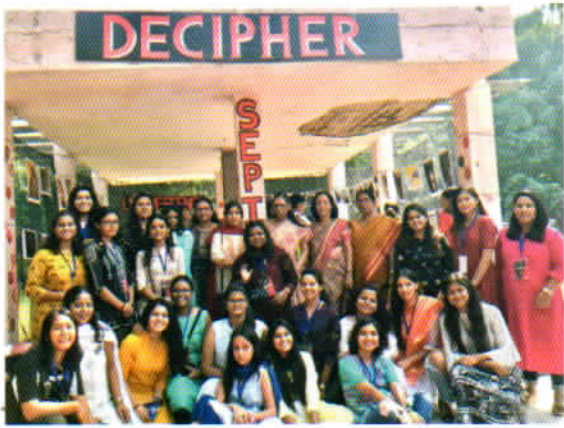
SEPIA AND MAGIC LANTERN – THE FILM AND PHOTOGRAPHY SOCIETY

JQL QUIZ

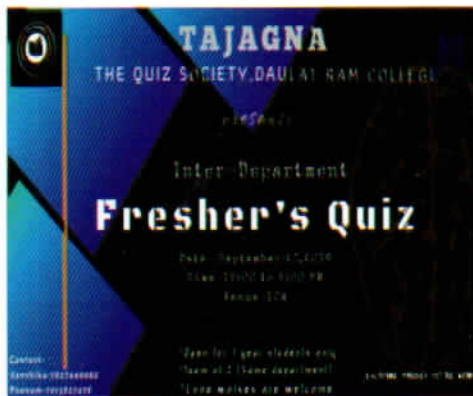

The functioning of recycling unit is improving day by day with manufacture of tons of manure which is used in house or sold outside, preparation ceramic pots with medicinal/antipollution plants, making of white and brown recycled paper, use of these papers for painting. Ceramic pots and paintings are being used as gifts for our guests in the college. Students can do their internship here and can earn NSS hours by participating in its functioning. Ever since its inception in 2016 this unit has been used to process shredded leaves into manure, recycle paper and cartons, provide potted plants for gifting and also provide folders, paintings, carry bags made from recycled paper. POSITIVE PSYCHOLOGY CENTER

(under Psychology Resource Centre, Under IQAC)

The Positive Psychology Center was established with the aim of developing the strengths of the students and teachers of the college as well as to enhance their happiness and well-being. With this aim the Center regularly organizes various activities. For this session (2018-2019), the Center aimed to carry out the activities in the form of a longitudinal framework. This framework was conceptualized as a three-step framework. In the first stage teachers from various departments were trained through a one week faculty development program on positive education. In the second stage students from various departments were given one week training on self-positive. In the third stage small teams/ dyads were formed of these teachers and students (who participated in the earlier programs in stage one and two) who worked together on a research project related to positive psychology. Hence, in the third stage a national paper presentation competition was organized in which these teams were provided the opportunity to present their research work and experiences. All the three programs were sponsored by NSDC.

1. FACULTY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM On POSITIVE EDUCATION : Developing Skills for Teaching, Learning, and Well-Being, 22nd-28th May, 2018

Aim and Objectives of the Faculty Development Program

In the 21st century the buzz word is 'skill development'! How are we to achieve this goal in any educational setting? The answer lies in the empowerment of students and teachers through skill training. Positive Education Program as a Faculty Development Program (FDP) focussed on developing various skills in the participants, namely emotional intelligence, resilience, hope, optimism, positive relationships, grit, curiosity and the like. These aspects of positive psychology bring in the experience of engagement, flow, meaning, and a growth mind-set which contribute to thriving at work and life. Hence, the FDP focussed on teachers who are the pillars in any educational institution. It aimed to enable them to develop their skills so that they in turn help in developing the skills of their students. 27 teachers teaching in various colleges and university departments participated in the program. 18 teachers were from Daulat Ram College from the departments of English, Sanskrit, Philosophy, Botany, Economics, Biochemistry and Psychology. Nine teachers were from outside DRC. They were from CIE (Faculty of Education), DU, Indraprastha College, Ramjas College, SPM College, and Government College, Sonipat.

The inaugural function was graced by Mr. Manish Kumar, MD and CEO, National Skill Development Corporation, Dr Payal Mago, Joint Dean, Academic Activities and Project and Principal ma'am, Dr Savita Roy. The dignitaries expressed their views about the importance of skill training of teachers and students. The sessions were conducted on topics as enhancing happiness and well-being, teacher-student relationships, personality development, being an emotionally intelligent teacher, challenges of innovative pedagogies, teachers' mindset and being resilient. All sessions were conducted in workshop style rather than lectures to provide hands-on training to the participants related to all aspects of positive education. At the end of the program the participants presented their learnings from the program.

2. IN-HOUSE SKILL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM on SELF-POSITIVE: Developing Skills for Self-Development & Well-Being, 1st-7th June, 2018

Convenor: Dr. Pooja V. Anand

Objectives of the Skill Development Program: Equip the students with various key strengths and skills to effectively deal with life challenges; Empower the students through skill training so as to develop in them the competency to mentor their peers; Develop key skills for experiencing a meaningful and flourishing life; Empower students to not only be responsible about their happiness and well-being but also the happiness and well-being of others.

Thirty students from various departments of the College participated in the program. The program consisted of sessions on developing strengths for happiness and well-being, being emotionally intelligent, mentoring, effective communication for positive relationships and personal growth and development. All sessions were conducted in workshop style rather than lectures to provide hands-on training to the participants related to all aspects of developing a positive self. Two modes of assessment were employed. Participants were given the option of making a detailed presentation about their learnings from the program and how they wish to incorporate it in their personal life and as a student, or they could make a detailed presentation about a project they would undertake (with their teacher mentors who had participated in the faculty development program on Positive Education). These participants got the opportunity to present this work at the National Paper Presentation Competition which will be organized by the Positive Psychology Center on 1st November, 2018.

3. NATIONAL PAPER PRESENTATION COMPETITION ON POSITIVE PSYCHOLOGY: From What's Wrong to What's Strong, 1st November, 2018

There were five categories in the competition: Students; Students-Teachers; Movie Analysis; Ignite@DRC 1 and FDP and SDP participants. The last category was open only for faculty members who participated in the Faculty Development Program on 'Positive Education' and students who participated in the Skill Development Program on 'Self-Positive' organized by the Positive Psychology Center, Daulat Ram College. 4. WORKSHOPS ON 'POSITIVE PSYCHOLOGICAL INTERVENTIONS FOR ENHANCING HAPPINESS AND WELL-BEING'

Two workshops were conducted by Dr Pooja V. Anand on 'Positive Psychological Interventions for Enhancing Happiness and Well-being' on 16th February, and 23rd February, 2019. The workshop was conducted for Psychology students. The workshop consisted of various experiential exercises, role plays, sharing circles etc. to train the students in the latest positive psychological interventions. In all thirty students of the Psychology department participated in these workshops. In the session (2019-2020), the Center organized the following activities:

Thirty one students from various departments of the College participated in the workshop. 'Positive Conversations: Inspiring Youth Series

This event has been planned to be conducted twice in the session. The main objective is to have speakers who have displayed various strengths despite challenging life circumstances so as to inspire the youth. The first part 'Positive Conversations: Igniting the H.E.R.O within' was organized on 31st October, 2019 by the Positive Psychology Center. This event was conceptualized with the theme that who better to inspire the college students than students among themselves who have shown strengths like courage, resilience, hope etc despite facing various challenges in their life! The program had four segments. The main segment was 'Sharing inspiring stories' in which four students shared how they have coped with various life challenges by utilising their strengths of Hope, Efficacy, Resilience and Optimism. The second segment 'Wear your signature strength' involved identifying one's top strength from a list of strengths and wearing it as a badge for the entire day, third segment 'Count your blessings' was an exercise in gratitude and fourth segment consisted of posters, poems etc on strengths as well as post it notes to write positive messages for others. This event was the first of its kind and was a huge success in terms of interest, curiosity and participation from students.



ZEBRAFISH LAB FACILITY

(Under IQAC)

The zebrafish lab facility in Daulat Ram College was set up in October 2015, jointly by Biochemistry and Zoology Departments in collaboration with CSIR-IGIB, Mathura Road, Delhi, and Sansriti Foundation Delhi. The facility has been funded by Star Innovation projects DU, Star College project DBT, Govt. of India, and Innovation projects DU. It was developed with the aim of providing an alternative in vivo non –invasive model system for science education, teaching and research.

Students of Biochemistry (Hons), Zoology (Hons) and Life Sciences join the lab as interns and work on research projects during their free time and holidays. This opportunity provides students with experiences wherein they can explore and discover the nature and process of scientific research using zebrafish model system. Small internship programs are also conducted for school students.

Zebrafish lab facility organized the following training workshop and training programs:

- Hands on training workshop on “Drosophila and Zebrafish model systems” 28th -31st , 2019 May was jointly organized with Dr. ChitraBhasin of Zoology department, for science teaching faculty of Delhi University Colleges. 15 teachers participated in the workshop.
- Summer Internship Program for science undergraduate students of Delhi University was organized from 17th June – 17th July 2019, on “Zebrafish Model System” at Zebrafish facility, Daulat Ram College. 15 students participated.
- One day training program on “Zebrafish Husbandry” was organized for Zoology Hons. Students of Khalsa College, University of Delhi on 24th September, 2019. 50 students participated in the workshop.
- Hands on training workshop on “Zebrafish model system” was conducted from 17th Dec – 20th December 2019 in Zebrafish lab facility, Daulat Ram College. 15 undergraduate students of Zoology (Hons) 1st year Daulat Ram College participated in the workshop
- Two PhD Scholars from Ashoka University, Haryana, underwent training in “Zebrafish Husbandry” in January 2020.

Small research projects undertaken by faculty and students in Zebrafish lab facility have resulted in one publication in UGC approved journal and 4 poster presentations in National and International Conferences.

Zebrafish lab facility also serves as a resource center to provide zebrafish and embryos to other colleges/ departments and research institutes to support teaching and lab practicals.

DROSOPHILA RESOURCE CENTRE

(Under IQAC)

Drosophila Resource Centre was set up in Department of Biochemistry almost 9 years ago. The centre is funded by DBT Star College Project. It aims to teach the basic principles of genetics using Drosophila as model system. Almost 250 students have been trained since its inception. Students of different life science streams such as Botany, Biochemistry, Life Sciences and Zoology from DU and Punjab University have been trained at the centre. A lab manual on 'Rediscovering Genetics' has been published in 2016 that covers the range of experiments performed by the students at the centre. The students have been immensely benefited by this training which is reflected in their selection and pursual of higher education in genetics from prestigious places. The centre also provides stocks and support to many colleges of Delhi University and AIIMS.

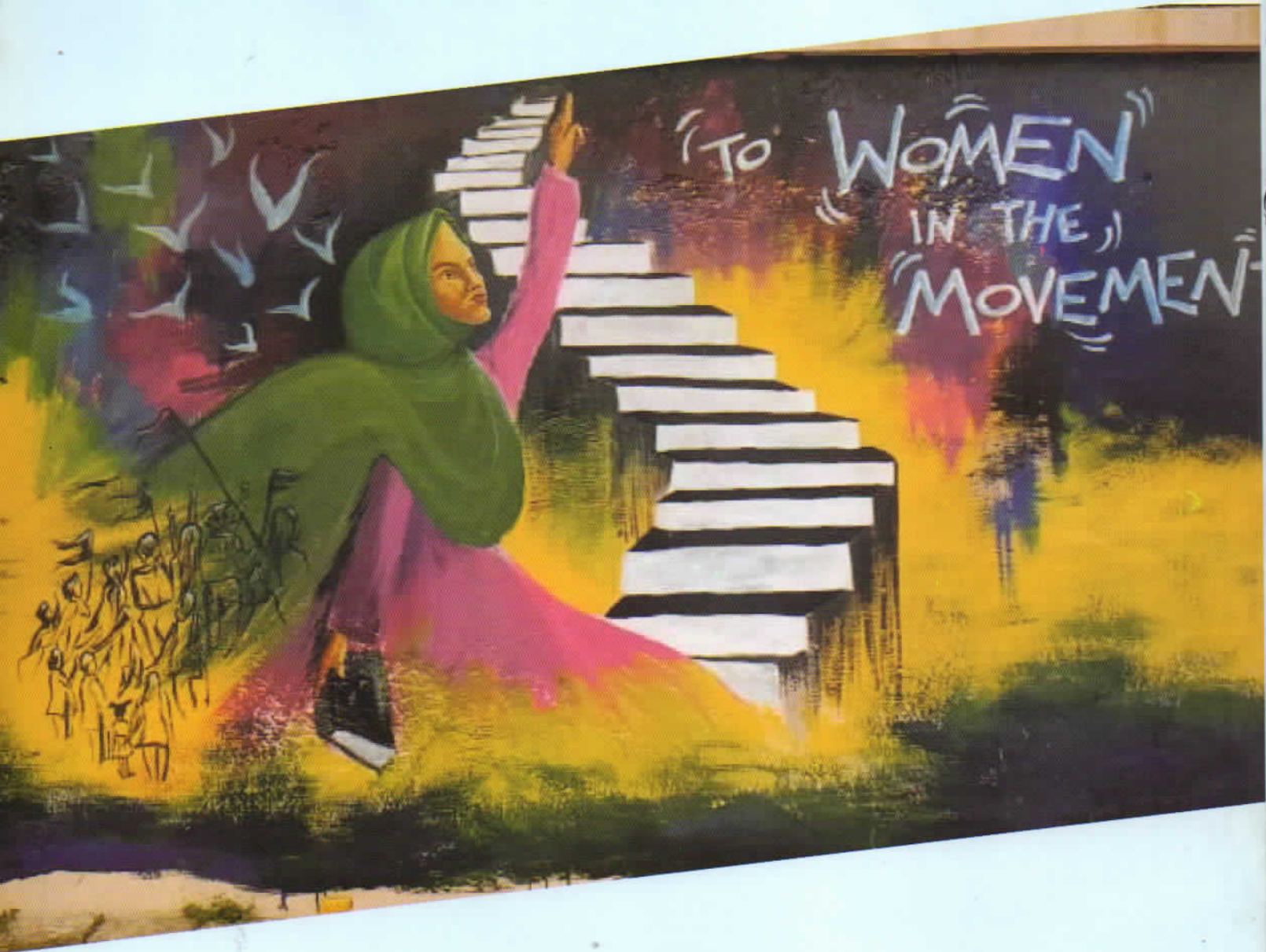
