## ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Daulat Ram College, a distinguished name in women's education, stands as a beacon of academic brilliance and empowerment. Founded in 1960 as Pramila College under the visionary leadership of the late Shri Daulat Ram Gupta, it moved to Delhi University's North Campus in 1964, adopting its current name. From humble beginnings with 350 students, 13 faculty members, and 6 departments, the college has blossomed into a vibrant, multidisciplinary hub with over 4,300 students from around the globe, 188 teaching staff, 86 non-teaching staff, and 19 dynamic departments offering an impressive range of 27 programs and 2,300 courses.

This premier institution is dedicated to fostering inclusive growth through excellence in the humanities, sciences, and commerce, with value-based education at its core. A testament to its innovation, the Department of Biotechnology (DBT), Government of India, has awarded the college "Star Status" for its pioneering methods. The college is a research powerhouse, undertaking ambitious projects supported by ICSSR, UGC, CSIR, and DRDO. With cutting-edge facilities like the Drosophila Resource Centre, Zebrafish Lab, and Psychology Resource Centre, students and faculty alike are empowered to push the boundaries of knowledge. The library, a haven of learning, boasts an impressive collection of over a million resources, including a specialized Braille section.

As a nodal college for Northern Cluster colleges, it actively contributes to research and innovation through projects like Navdhara. On campus, state-of-the-art venues like Sadbhavana Bhawan, with its 1,000+ seating capacity, Sports Complex, and the Rangshala amphitheater are vibrant hubs for academic and cultural events, including the much-anticipated annual festival, "Manjari." ## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

It is a matter of immense pride and honour to extend a warm welcome to our esteemed Chief Guest, Ms. Bansuri Swaraj, Hon'ble Member of Parliament, Lok Sabha, our distinguished Guests of Honour, Shri Sourav Kumar Shah, I.P.S, honourable Executive Director, Power Finance Corporation Limited, New Delhi, and Shri Shrikant Namdev, Hon'ble director in Department of financial services, Ministry of finance along with our notable alumna, Ms. Tanisha Jetly, who is a trainee for the Indian Railway Management Service (IRMS). Tanisha graduated with Honors in Botany in 2020 and joined the Indian Civil Services in 2022.

I would be remiss if I did not highlight another illustrious alumna, Mrs. Rekha Gupta, who graduated in 1995 and has taken over as the Chief Minister of the National Capital Territory of Delhi.

On this momentous occasion of our 63rd Annual Day, I would like to express my heartfelt gratitude to our visionary Chairperson, Shri Mukul Gupta, along with the members of the Governing Body, faculty, and staff whose dedication continues to bring laurels to our college.

Today, as we commemorate our Annual Day, we reaffirm our steadfast commitment to advancing women's education and empowering changemakers for society and beyond. It is with great pleasure that I present the 63rd Annual Report for the academic year 2024–25, the details of which are highlighted in the subsequent pages.

College admitted 1569 students against sanctioned strength of 1465. Thus, the total number of students on rolls are 4626 out of which 80% students hail from states other than NCT of Delhi covering nearly all states of India. DRC campus is enriched by the presence of 47 international students from 15 countries, which adds vibrancy to our diverse community.

College offers part-time Certificate, Diploma, and Advanced Diploma courses in seven foreign languages, with 496 students currently enrolled in the Centre for Foreign Languages. Additionally, thirty students have completed their certificate course under the Legal Literacy Awareness and Aid program, running in collaboration with the Delhi State Legal Services Authority (DSLISA). Around 800 students from School of Open learning attend PCP classes on Sundays and Gazetted holidays in the college.



The pass percentage of students studying in various programs ranges from 96% to 99%. The award for All-Round Best Student of the Year 2024-25 is presented to Ms. Vidushi Srivastava of B.Sc. (H) Zoology, third year. Professor Madan Mohan Prasad Memorial Prize is awarded to Cadet Diya Rana of B.Sc. (H) Biochemistry, third year who represented our college as part of the NCC squad for a pre-Everest expedition. Cadet Diya Rana successfully climbed Mount Abu Gamin, which is at altitude of 24,131 feet. We are immensely proud of her.

Thirty-two students from the Science stream were given meritorious awards by the University of Delhi. The University of Delhi, under its project e-Drishti, has provided tablets to 12 visually impaired students of our college to aid their academic pursuits. Additionally, students have earned 107 Proficiency Prizes, 39 instituted prizes and scholarships. Many congratulations to all the prize winners.

The college facilitated the distribution of Braille books to visually impaired (VI) students from seven different DU colleges. This initiative was made possible through the support of the *Rotary Club of Shahdara, Saksham Rozgar, and Saksham Bharti*. Furthermore, Rotary Club, Shahdara supported the distribution of 133 white smart canes to VI students belonging to more than 15 DU colleges ably coordinated by Convenor of enabling unit Dr. Anjali Bennet.

Our students have not only excelled in academics but also in sports under the guidance of Ms. Kaushambi and Mr. Azad. Ms. Manu participated in the Khelo India Senior Women Kho-Kho League, securing 1st position, and in the National Championships, where she secured 3rd position. Ms. Ishu excelled in Kabaddi, Ms. Khushi in Shooting Ball and Volleyball, Ms. Himani in Gymnastics, and Ms. Tanvi Katal in Taekwondo secured first position in their respective state-level competitions. Our Kho-Kho team, consisting of 15 girls, secured second position in the Inter-College Kho-Kho competition organized by the University of Delhi. Congratulations to all!

The college acknowledges and appreciates the contribution of its non-teaching staff, who are the backbone of the institution. The Principal's Award for the Best Employee for the year goes to Shri A.N. Singh from the Department of Nutrition and Health Education and Mr. Vinod Sharma from Administration.

Daulat Ram College Hostel, under its Warden Dr. Vidhi Choudhry, is a prestigious residential facility accommodating approximately 166 undergraduate students. This hostel serves as a home away from home, fostering a safe, inclusive, and conducive environment for both academic and personal growth. The hostel has been recognized for its well-maintained environment and has won prizes for Best Lawn and Best Maintained Environment at the Delhi University Flower Show 2025.

The NSS Unit, guided by the motto "Not Me, But You," organized various initiatives including Blood Donation Camps, Organ Donation Awareness Drives, Cleanliness Campaigns, Self-Defence Training Sessions, the Nasha Mukti Abhiyaan, International Yoga Day, Swachhata Hi Seva Campaign, and many more under the guidance of its program officer Dr. Sharda Gautam. Ms. Sarika from NSS proudly represented India at the India-Bhutan Youth Summit, fostering cross-cultural ties and mutual understanding.



The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the college organized 29 academic programs that included Faculty Development Programs, Skill Development Programs, Seminars/Webinars, Workshops, and Conferences for both students and teachers under the able supervision of Prof. Padmshree Mudgal, Coordinator of IQAC.

Our students are under the proficient care of 188 teaching faculty. The College faculty has published 87 research papers, supervising 23 Ph.D. scholars, organised more than 60 seminars, talks and workshops for students and received 13 awards from various agencies. Dr. Meenakshi Thakur, Dr. Jyoti Taneja and Dr. Pooja Sharma who have bagged three major projects worth 72 Lakhs for the College. Dr. Arti Jain has filed one patent.

The college continued its initiative to support Navdhara projects of faculty for the second consecutive year. In the current academic year, 26 projects were received by the college, of which 15 were shortlisted for funding after external expert review. Under the Navdhara project, students will have the opportunity to work with professors of their choice. This initiative will help the college identify budding research scientists and entrepreneurs.

During the year, the college signed nine Memorandum of Understanding (MoUs), which will aid in research, outreach and extension activities, and skill development programs. The college also signed a Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) with Talf to ensure an uninterrupted power supply and to generate solar energy of 240KW on campus. This initiative has reduced the college's electricity bill by one-third.

The Placement Cell, Vriddhi, achieved remarkable milestones in 2023-2024 under its Convenor Dr. Dipika Jindal. More than 85 students were placed, with an average package of ₹7 LPA and the highest package reaching ₹23.05 LPA. Additionally, over 200 students secured internships, with the highest stipend amounting to ₹15,000. In the current academic year, as of February 2025, over 40 companies have facilitated 150 internships and 46 placements, with packages up to ₹9 LPA, resulting in a total gross package of ₹2.37 crores. The ongoing placements and internships are expected to surpass last year's records. More than 2,500 students have received fee concessions and free ships from various government organizations, private bodies, and college resources itself.

The college librarian, Shri Pawan Tripathi, continues to upgrade and modernise the library, which now includes more than 100,000 books, featuring 500 rare titles, as well as subscriptions to 27 magazines and 11 newspapers. Highlights of the collection include the Shrimad Bhagwat Geeta in 13 Indian languages and a dedicated section titled "Shri Ramalaya," which features a rich selection of literature on Lord Shri Ram and his life. Upholding the principles of inclusive education, the library subscribes to Braille magazines such as *Jigyasa*, *Mahila Manch*, and *Braille Digest*. Additionally, it offers a Braille edition of the *Constitution of India* and a 9-volume Braille edition of the *Ram Charit Manas*. The College library has also subscribed to advanced KIBO software, which supports text translation and audio conversion in over 100 languages, thereby facilitating seamless access to study materials for Divyaang (differently-abled) students.

The college's state-of-the-art existing facilities, such as the Psychology Resource Centre, Zebrafish Lab, and Drosophila Resource Centre, have been supplemented by the inauguration of the Centre for Happiness, with the financial support of Rs 25 Lakh from Rekhi Foundation. The



Cell for propagating the Indian Knowledge System (IKS), mandated by the Ministry of Education, conducted impactful events such as the Sundarkanda Path, the initiation of Ramalaya (housing writings on the life of Lord Rama), celebrating the 300th birth anniversary of Rani Ahilyabai Holkar, and a talk by an internationally acclaimed scientist that integrated Indian knowledge techniques with science, focusing on gut damage and HIV. These efforts bridge India's heritage with contemporary student engagement, fostering cultural pride and intellectual growth.

Various associations, societies, and cells organized at least one talk/seminar/webinar, or workshop as part of their co-curricular activities. Many eminent professors, lawmakers, entrepreneurs, and scientists enlightened the students during these sessions. The college societies, including Anhad, Alahya, Memesis, Sepia, Spic Macay, and Magic Lantern, participated in numerous competitions across India and secured various prizes.

The year saw promotion of 71 Assistant Professors from Academic Level 10 to Academic Level 11 and 07 Associate Professors were promoted to Professors. The college has appointed four coaches for Kabaddi, Kho-Kho, Fencing, and Handball, along with a Gym Trainer for students.

The institutions are not made in a day. Here, I acknowledge the valuable services rendered by the staff which retired during the academic year. Prof. Sarita Nanda, Dr. Sangeeta Gupta, Dr. Kavita Sharma, and Dr. Kalpana Vaish have each dedicated more than three decades of their career to the college. Four support staff members—Ms. Usha Choudhary, Mr. Chiragi Lal, Mrs. Prateeksha, and Mr. Lalit Kumar Dixit—also superannuated during the year after a long service to the college.

I extend my gratitude to Ex-Bursar Mrs. Pooja Jain, Bursar Dr. Gurmeet Kaur, Admission Committee convenors Dr. Darshan and Dr. Vandana Tripathi, the Discipline Committee headed by Dr. Narendra Kumar, the Teaching Programme Committee led by Dr. Ritu Garg and Dr. Rita Rani, the Student Advisory Board convenor Dr. Poonam Lakhotia, the College Development and Maintenance Committee convenor Dr. Rama Pasricha, The Alumni association convenor, Dr. Sonia Mehta, Staff Council Secretary Dr. Seema Khurana, ECA in-charge Dr. Manish Choudhary and ERP Coordinator Ms Haritha as well as the teachers in charge of various departments and convenors of various committees for their active support and commitment in organizing activities for the students in the college. I will be failing in my duty if I do not acknowledge the unflinching support of Ms. Vijeta Rana, SPA, and Ms. Babita, Assistant in the principal office.

### IQAC Report

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Daulat Ram College works with the vision and mission of planning, guiding, monitoring Quality Assurance (QA) and Quality Enhancement (QE) activities of the College. The IQAC works with the aim to channelize and systematize all efforts of the institution towards academic excellence. The IQAC strives to be a driving force for ushering in quality by responding to feed backs and rankings and strategizing to remove deficiencies and gaps, resolving grievances and taking action for moving towards the path of progress.

**The agenda for the new academic session** is set with a call for academic events to be organized by the faculty during the Academic session. The academic events include the Skill Development programs (SPDs) for students of college, faculty Development programs (FDPs) for faculty members and Capacity building programs for non- teaching staff to upgrade skills and



capacity building. Faculty members are also encouraged to organize National and International Conferences, Seminars and workshops. Academic events were selected on the basis of quality of content and the Academic Calendar for the year 2024-25 was made.

The college adopted the **ERP (Enterprise Resource Planning) modules** from the session 2024-25 for the management of student related data including, Attendance, AEC/ GE/ VAC/ SEC courses allotment, internal Assessment (IA) and time-tables. Training sessions for faculty and non-teaching staff were organized to familiarize them with the system.

IQAC worked towards establishment of more **Skill Development Centres** in Daulat Ram College to impart skills for career advancement and provide entrepreneurship avenues to students.

**Results of the previous year were analyzed** for all departments and remedial steps were suggested. The Course outcomes (**COs**) and program outcomes (**POs**) attainments of Humanities, Commerce and Science courses were determined and analyzed for further improvements in academic standards. Faculty members were asked to submit lesson plans for the courses taught with the inclusion of various teaching learning pedagogies including experiential learning, group discussions, blended learning, role play, blended learning etc. To aim at inclusive learning for students from diverse backgrounds, remedial classes and bridge classes were organized for students.

To **promote Research environment** and collaborative interactions in the college, the College continued to fund research projects under the second round of **DRC Navdhara Projects 2024**. Faculty was invited to submit interdisciplinary projects under the scheme. After thorough screening of the projects by external experts, 15 projects in all, 2 from the humanities, 2 from Commerce and economics and 11 from the science stream were shortlisted to be funded under the scheme.

Working towards **timely career enhancement of faculty members**, screening of 71 forms for promotion of Assistant Professors from Academic level 10 to Academic level 11, and 8 forms for promotion from Associate Professor to Professor was completed by IQAC. The faculty members have been promoted to their respective Academic levels hence forth. To actively engage and promote **Extension Activities** in the College, the IQAC team visited a village in Murthal, Sonipat in Delhi NCR region, to initiate village adoption under Unnat Bharat Abhiyaan.

The IQAC continuously strives for academic excellence, improvement of sustainable infrastructure, facilities and scholastic environment for students to excel and achieve their goals.

## CENTRES

### 1. Centre for Foreign Languages

The college offers part time Certificate/ Diploma/Advance Diploma Courses in Foreign Languages to women and men who wish to develop their skills and fluency in both speaking and writing in a language of their choice. The College offers add-on courses in French, German, Spanish, Italian, Chinese, Japanese and Korean languages.

Advance Diploma Courses are offered only to those who have qualified the Diploma Course in the relevant language and Diploma Courses are open to those who have qualified the Certificate Course in the concerned language. Students who are seeking admissions in Advance Diploma in German/Spanish/French/Italian language and have passed the Certificate/Diploma Course from Institutions other than Delhi University/Gap year cases are required to clear the entrance test conducted by the Department of Germanic and Romance Studies, Delhi University.

All these Certificate, Diploma & Advance Diploma Courses are conducted in collaboration with the Department of Germanic and Romance Studies, Department of South Asian Studies, University of Delhi.

## 2. Psychology Resource Centre

The Psychology Resource Centre at Daulat Ram College comprises four specialized centres: the Mental Health Centre, Capacity Building Centre, Value Engagement Centre, and the Centre for Well-Being and Flourishing. These centres aim to foster emotional well-being, intellectual growth, inclusivity, and mindfulness through a variety of innovative programs and initiatives, enriching the academic and personal lives of students, faculty, and staff.

**The Mental Health Centre of The Psychology Department organized a talk on “Naturopathic Selfcare”** held on 12th August 2024 by Dr. Mami Yanai, specialising in Naturopathic medicine. This session, attended by 175 participants, emphasized the integration of traditional Japanese healing practices into self-care routines. The event commenced with a traditional lamp-lighting ceremony, followed by an introduction of the speaker by Dr. Meetu Khosla. Dr. Yanai’s session was deeply reflective, focusing on healing as an experiential process rather than a theoretical concept. She introduced concepts like Amae psychology, mindfulness, and the art of savoring life’s “delicious moments,” concluding with an immersive Japanese tea ceremony that symbolized peace and simplicity.



**The Capacity Building Centre organised a workshop on “Campus Connect”** on 24th September, 2024. The workshop, under the guidance of Dr. Suparna Jain Thakur, provided a roadmap for navigating academic expectations, extracurricular opportunities, and personal well-being. Seniors and mentors shared their experiences, offering guidance on time management, building a social network, and making the most of college resources. Interactive discussions allowed freshers to ask questions about academics, internships, and student life, creating a supportive environment. By the end of the workshop, students left with a sense of direction, feeling more confident about their journey in college.

**The Psychology department organized a visit to “MUSKAAN-PAEPID” NGO** on 9th October, 2024 under the supervision of Dr. Rajni Sahni and Dr. Sandhya Rani Hawbam, where students engaged directly alongside adults with intellectual disabilities and witnessed the various vocational training programs they are equipped with. The tour concluded with a brief Question and Answer session with the faculty members, about the NGO’s broader impact. This visit highlighted the importance of inclusive support systems, offering students a profound understanding of empowerment through compassionate care.

**Mental Health Day Celebrations (Manotsav) were organised by the Mental Health Centre of the Psychology Department** on 15th October 2024 benefitting more than 500 students of Daulat Ram College with Prof. Rajni Sahni and Prof. Meetu Khosla serving as the convenors of the event. Various events were organized to spread awareness on mental health issues and how to improve it. In the inaugural session renowned experts, including Prof. Nand Kumar from AIIMS, Prof. Vibha Sharma from IHBAS, and Dr. Reema Gupta, a distinguished private practitioner, served as panellists for the discussion on “Mental Health at the Workplace.” Dr. Rajni Sahni moderated the discussion, which focused on raising awareness about mental health issues in professional settings, reducing stigma, and promoting supportive work environments. This event provided students with practical strategies to address workplace stress and foster mental well-being. The department also hosted “Art Therapy Workshop”, led by Prof. Meetu Khosla, allowing participants to explore their emotions through creative expression, fostering self-reflection and emotional relief. Following this, the “Dance Therapy Workshop” was conducted by Ms. Nainika Mukherjee, a certified Dance Movement Therapy Practitioner from TISS. This session focused on enhancing self-awareness and emotional expression through movement, helping participants connect with their emotions in a supportive environment. As part of the event, Mental Health Showcases and Booths were organized in collaboration with Chaaya Organization and Youth for Mental Health. These featured interactive stalls and engaging activities designed to raise awareness about mental health, provide valuable resources, and encourage open discussions on well-being. Additionally, an Open Stage session was held, offering students a vibrant and inclusive platform to showcase their talents and express themselves freely.

**The Capacity Building Centre (Psychology Resource Centre) held a workshop on “Samwaad: Conversations Beyond the Binary”** on 6th November, 2024. Attended by 120 participants, “Samwaad” was a thought-provoking session led by Chitvan, the founder of the Queer Education



Initiative Foundation. This event explored gender diversity, the spectrum of identities, and the importance of inclusivity and allyship within the campus community. The event concluded with a Question-and-Answer session, tackling the common misconceptions centred around the non-binary community.

**Value Engagement Centre and Mental Health Centre organised the IV Awareness, De-stigmatization and Seeking Help (ADS IV) mental health awareness program** for 300 students was organised in three sessions on 12<sup>th</sup>, 19<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> February. The students from Psychology Honors III year were trained by Prof. Meetu Khosla to take these awareness sessions online and share meaningful information about signs and symptoms of mental illness, being aware about various disorders, developing empathy and compassion towards those displaying deviant behaviors and finally helping them realize to take help from counsellors for mental health problems. A directory of mental health professionals was also mailed to all the participants for any reference. The students feedback was collected and it reflected a better understanding about mental health issues, value of good health and options for seeking treatment.

**The Centre for Well-Being and Flourishing** organized the event 'Mindphool: The Bloom of Mindfulness' on 25<sup>th</sup> February under the guidance of Prof. Pooja V. Anand. The event featured a sharing circle where students shared their experiences and learnings from the week-long intervention on mindfulness. There was an interactive board in which the college students could rate their level of mindfulness, and students also wrote what they were mindful about. There was a display board which showcased pictures clicked by the students during the intervention week about anything that they liked or found novel or interesting. A table display consisted of various copies of the brochure created by the students about various ways to be mindful, flower badges saying I'm mindful worn by the students, bookmarks on mindfulness, and a gratitude jar to write and put in what one is grateful for. The event was an overwhelming success and drew participation of students and teachers of various departments of the college as well as the non-teaching staff.

The Keynote Address was delivered by the distinguished Prof. Balaganapathi Devarakonda, who holds the ICCR Chair for Indology at The University of the West Indies in Mania. The event was presided over by Prof. Savita Roy, the esteemed Principal of Daulat Ram College.

Following its launch, the Centre for Philosophical Counselling, Values and Well-being initiated a pioneering two-day workshop that took place on July 22 and 23, 2024, aptly focused on "Philosophical Counselling." Coordinated by the knowledgeable Prof. (Dr.) Sonia Mehta, this workshop showcased a panel of experts from the field of philosophy, including Prof. Balaganapathi Devarakonda, Dr. Navneet Chopra, and Prof. Hari Shankar Prasad. ## b. Drosophila Resource Centre

**Centre Coordinator:** Dr. Neeru Dhamija

**Centre Co-coordinator:** Dr. Anita Goel

The Drosophila Resource Centre was established in the Department of Biochemistry in 2012 with funding from the DBT Star College Project. The Centre is dedicated to teaching the fundamental principles of genetics using Drosophila as a model organism. Since its inception, the Centre has successfully trained more than 450 students from various life science streams such as Botany, Biochemistry, Life Sciences, and Zoology from the University of Delhi and Punjab University. The training imparted at the Centre has significantly benefited students, as reflected in their selection for higher education programs in genetics at prestigious institutions.

The lab manual titled “Rediscovering Genetics” first published in 2016, encompassing a range of experiments conducted by students at the Centre continues to be recognized as a key academic



resource and is included in the suggested readings for the syllabi of Delhi University, AIIMS, and Gandhi Institute of Technology and Management.

In the current academic year, Centre has published a practical lab manual on *Drosophila* and Zebrafish model organisms in biological studies. This manual serves as an accessible resource, streamlining information and simplifying the recording of data for students enrolled in the SEC course on *Drosophila* and Zebrafish model organisms in biological studies.

The *Drosophila* Resource Centre continues to play a pivotal role in advancing genetics education and inspiring the next generation of geneticists. The Centre extends its resources and expertise to various institutions, including colleges under Delhi University, AIIMS, Sanatan Dharm (P.G.) College, Muzaffarnagar, and MDU. The Centre provides essential stocks and technical support, enabling students to gain hands-on training in key areas such as the preparation of fly food, culturing and maintenance of *Drosophila*, male-female differentiation, mutant identification, and conducting genetic crosses to analyze principles of genetics, among others.

Since its inception, the Centre has conducted regular workshops to train students and teachers from various colleges. In November 2024, workshops were organized for the Department of Biochemistry, Shaheed Rajguru College of Applied Sciences for Women, and the Zoology Department, Deshbandhu College. During these workshops, over 40 students and four faculty members were trained in *Drosophila* genetics. Dr. Neeru Dhamija and Dr. Anita Goel, have been invited to the Department of Biotechnology, AIIMS, since 2019 to introduce MSc Biotechnology students to *Drosophila* genetics.

In pursuit of continuous learning, Dr. Neeru Dhamija and Dr. Anita Goel participated in a 7-day hands-on laboratory workshop titled “Using *Drosophila melanogaster* for Biology Classes” at National Centre for Biological Sciences (NCBS) from May 29 to June 4, 2024. This workshop aimed at equipping college teachers with new experimental techniques and updating their knowledge in the field. The Centre remains committed to fostering genetic education and collaborative learning, ensuring students and educators are well-equipped with practical skills and advanced knowledge.

## 2. Skill Development Center on Aquaculture

The Aquaculture Laboratory offers practical training under Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) to promote sustainable aquaculture and entrepreneurship.

Courses Offered:

- 1. Aquaculture Entrepreneurship:** Training in modern and traditional aquaculture techniques and sustainable water management and ornamental plant cultivation.
- 2. Ornamental Fish Culture:** Aquarium decoration, fish breeding, and nutritional observation. Gain practical knowledge on breeding and culture of various Ornamental fishes. Maintenance and management of optimum water quality for healthy fish production
- 3. Fish Feed Formulation:** Indigenous ingredient identification and optimized feeding strategies. Monitor the fishes to analyze the impact of formulated feeds on fish growth, so we can optimize feeding strategies that improve fish health.
- 4. Fish Breeding and Larviculture:** Broodstock maintenance and live feed usage for larvae survival. Breeding of the following fishes: guppy, molly, poller parrot etc.





### 3. Skill Development Center on Hydroponic and Aeroponics

Established by the Department of Botany in 2023 under the guidance of Professor Rekha Kathal, aims to promote the principles of sustainable farming through Hydroponics and Aeroponics. This year, the centre has efficiently trained 35 students from diverse science streams such as Botany, Life Sciences, and Zoology from Delhi University. The training sessions, which include hands-on experiences in media preparation, instrumentation, certification, and marketing, have proven highly beneficial, as reflected in positive student feedback.

Currently, the centre is cultivating vegetables such as lettuce and herbs like basil and brahmi using both vertical grow towers and horizontal units with Nutrient Film Technology. From February 24 to March 1, 2025, the centre conducted a Skill Development Programme titled “Hydroponics and Aeroponics – The Future of Sustainable Farming” under the coordination of Dr. Sunita George and Dr. Kamlesh Kumari. The program featured expert speakers from industrial and government sectors, providing students with technical knowledge and entrepreneurship skills. It also guided them on obtaining grants from funding agencies.



### 6. Centre for Happiness

The inaugural function of the “Centre for Happiness” and an Add-on Certificate Course on “The Science and Practice of Happiness,” was held on 31st August, 2024. The inauguration ceremony was marked by the presence of distinguished Chief Guests Professor K. Ratnabali (Dean of Academic Activities and Projects, University of Delhi), Professor Savita Roy (Principal, Daulat Ram College), Dr. Riya Vinayak (Coordinator, The Rekhi Foundation), Professor Renu Gulati (former Professor of the Department of Human Development and Childhood Studies, Institute of Home Economics, DU), along with Dr. Sandhyarani Hawbani (Coordinator, Centre for Happiness), faculties and the students. Srihari Krishna); Fixed and Growth Mindset (by Dr. Riya Vinayak), Positive Interventions (by Prof. Archana). This course stands out as an amazing testament to holistic student development, equipping participants with essential tools to cultivate happiness and well-being amongst themselves.

Adding to these efforts, the Centre for Happiness organized an Art Therapy Workshop on February 6, 2025. 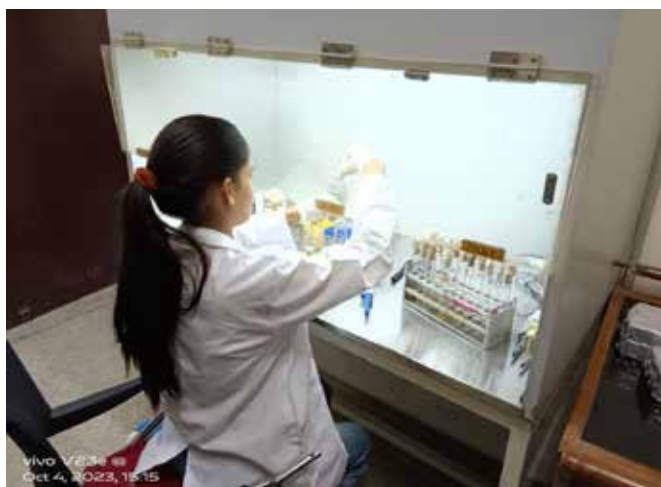

## ACADEMIC LABORATORIES OF DEPARTMENTS

The college is proud to offer well-equipped and meticulously managed laboratories to support all science courses, including Biochemistry, Botany, Chemistry, Mathematics, Physics, and Zoology. In addition, the Departments of Nutrition & Health Education, Mathematics, Commerce and Psychology maintain separate, fully equipped laboratories tailored to their specialized needs. These facilities ensure an enriching practical learning environment, fostering academic excellence and hands-on experience for students.

**Biochemistry:** The Biochemistry department, Daulat Ram College has well equipped modern laboratories. The Department has upgraded its facilities with various grants received from time to time which include, DST FIST 2003-2008, OBC Special Grant from DU 2010, Star College Project 2012 -2018, Innovation Projects 2015, Star Innovation Projects 2016, and Skill Development grant 2023. The department instrumentation room houses advance instruments such as UV visible double beam spectrophotometer, ELISA Reader, Inverted microscope with video screen, several Binocular and Stereo zoom microscopes.digital stereo microscope with LCD display, DNA and protein Electrophoresis equipment with trans- illuminators, high speed refrigerated centrifuges, ice making machine and PCR machine. The department also has a well equipped culture room with Laminar flow for Molecular Biology and Microbiology work. The department also houses Lan networked Bioinformatics lab.

**Botany:** The laboratories in Botany Department feature cutting-edge equipment such as PCR machines, spectrophotometers, horizontal gel electrophoresis units, UV transilluminators, BOD incubators, plant growth chambers, table-top centrifuges, binocular microscopes, autoclaves, pH meters, vortexers, micro and macro weighing balances, micropipette sets, glassware, permanent slides, and more. These resources enable students to perform a wide range of experiments with precision.

Among the laboratories, LAB A, LAB B, and the Hons LAB are exclusively dedicated to practical sessions in Metabolism, Plant Physiology, Plant Diversity, Biotechnology, Genetics, Reproductive Biology, Anatomy, Ecology, and other specialized topics. A significant addition to the department's infrastructure is the *Bioinformatics Laboratory*, which is equipped with computers and specialized software designed to support bioinformatics practicals. This facility empowers students to explore computational applications in biology, enhancing their research and analytical skills.

### Plant Tissue Culture Laboratory

The Tissue Culture Research Lab is mainly used for training the final year students to micro propagate species of elite trees and also for research projects based on micropropagation of rare and medicinally important plants.

**Culture Room** with Horizontal Laminar-air-flow cabinet to raise *in vitro* Plant Tissue Cultures under sterile conditions, Room Thermometer, Hygrometer and Culture Rack Trolleys fitted with fluorescent lights and automatic timer.

**Instrument cum Preparation Room** with basic equipments like High Precision Digital Balance, pH meters, Orbital Shakers, Hot Plates, BOD, Ultra Centrifuge machines, Double Distillation



Unit, Hot Air Oven, Vertical and Horizontal Autoclave, Refrigerator and Deep Freezer, Microtome, **Simple**, Compound, Dissection and High-Resolution Microscopes with In-built Camera, and Inverted Binocular.

**Green House Facility** with controlled conditions of light, humidity and temperature for establishment of *in vitro* grown plantlets in soil. There is always scope for further improvement of Tissue Culture Research Facilities in the near future.

**Chemistry:** The Chemistry laboratory is a well-equipped facility designed to foster academic excellence and research innovation. It features advanced analytical instruments such as UV-Vis spectrophotometer, Flame Photometer, Rotary Evaporator, muffle furnace, centrifuge machine, ice making machine, pH meters, conductivity meters, colorimeters, high-precision electronic balances, desktops, UV light chamber etc. Dedicated research spaces support both undergraduate experiments and faculty-led investigations, ensuring a seamless integration of theoretical knowledge with practical applications. A strong emphasis is placed on laboratory safety, with rigorous protocols in place to maintain a secure working environment. A Fume hood is installed to manage volatile substances. Fire extinguishers are strategically positioned for immediate accessibility. Personal protective equipment like lab coats, gloves and safety goggles is mandatory for all students to minimize exposure risks. Separate bins/containers are installed for waste glass, chemicals and paper to facilitate proper waste disposal.

## Physics

The Physics Department has three laboratories. These laboratories are the hub for the students to do the hands-on practices on the concepts of the physics they have learned through theory. PL-01 has the experiments related to the following branch of physics: Mechanics and Thermal Physics. Adjacent to PL-01, the physics department has the dark room, which is being used to do the experiments of waves and optics dealing with the measurements of different parameters of the light. PL-02 serves as a vibrant hub for exploring the intricate world of electricity, magnetism, light and matter, and modern physics. PL-03 is a well-equipped space designed to facilitate

learning in the fields of electrical circuits, waves and oscillations, analog electronics and digital electronics. This laboratory is equipped with a wide range of tools and equipment, including breadboards, wires, CROs (Cathode Ray Oscilloscopes), function generators, LEDs, and more, students can design, build, and test various circuits and systems.

**Mathematics:** The Department of Mathematics features a well-equipped computer laboratory with a total capacity of 25 desktops, all connected via the main server. The lab is furnished with essential facilities, including printers on LAN, a projector, and a whiteboard, creating an efficient environment for both teaching and learning.

The desktops are pre-installed with advanced mathematical and operational research software, such as *Mathematica XI*, the statistical open-source software *R*, *LaTeX*, and *TORA*. These tools enable students to perform complex computations, statistical analyses, and operational research simulations effectively.

To ensure the smooth functioning of the lab, the department employs dedicated lab staff. Recently, the lab underwent a significant upgrade with the addition of 10 new desktops equipped with advanced configurations and the Windows 10 operating system, further enhancing its technological infrastructure.

**Commerce:** The computer lab of the Department of Commerce is thoughtfully designed to cater to the academic and research needs of students and faculty by providing cutting-edge technology and resources to support their studies and projects.



- **Modern Workstations:** The lab is equipped with high-performance computers featuring essential software applications for commerce studies, including statistical analysis tools, financial modeling software, and accounting programs like MS-Excel, TALLY, and R.
- **High-Speed Internet:** Seamless internet connectivity enables students to access online resources, databases, and e-learning platforms without interruption.
- **Printing and Scanning:** Advanced printing and scanning facilities are readily available to meet the academic requirements of users.
- **Collaboration Spaces:** Dedicated spaces for group discussions, project collaborations, and interactive learning sessions encourage teamwork and innovation.
- **Technical Support:** A team of skilled staff provides consistent technical assistance, ensuring that all users can maximize the utility of the lab's facilities.

### Academic and Research Support

The lab plays a pivotal role in advancing the academic and research endeavors of the Department of Commerce, serving as a dynamic hub for various activities:

- **Workshops and Training Sessions:** Regularly organized workshops and training sessions keep students and faculty updated on the latest technological advancements and software tools pertinent to commerce.
- **Research Projects:** The lab provides the infrastructure necessary for conducting thorough research and analysis, empowering students to explore innovative ideas and make meaningful contributions to the field.
- **Study Groups:** Students can form study groups to prepare for exams, complete assignments, and collaborate on group projects.

**Access and Availability** The computer lab is open to all students and faculty of the Department of Commerce, operating from [Lab Hours, e.g., 8:00 AM to 5:20 PM], Monday to Saturday. This schedule ensures ample time for users to make the most of the lab's facilities.

### Neuropharmacology, Drug Delivery and Cancer Research Laboratory (NDCRL):

The Neuropharmacology, Drug Delivery and Cancer Research Laboratory (NDCRL), formerly known as the Neuropharmacology and Drug Delivery Laboratory (NDDL), was established in 2018 at Daulat Ram College (DRC), University of Delhi, under the guidance of Late Dr. Amar Jyoti, Assistant Professor, Zoology Department, who served as the Principal Investigator. Dr. Jyoti envisioned elevating the college to the level of leading research institutions in the country.



In honor of Dr. Jyoti's unwavering dedication to the college and its students, the laboratory remains committed to providing research training and internship programs. These programs, titled "Fundamental Techniques in Cancer Research," serve as an introduction to experimental research in cancer biology. The laboratory caters to undergraduate, postgraduate, and Ph.D. students, equipping them with essential skills and fostering a strong foundation in the field.

Through its initiatives, the *NDCRL* strives to inspire the Life Sciences students of Daulat Ram College to achieve new milestones in the fields of science and technology.

**Zoology:** The Department of Zoology is equipped with spacious, air-conditioned laboratories designed to foster a healthy and efficient learning environment. With two large labs and one small lab, each equipped with LCD projectors, the department provides an excellent ambience for the seamless conduct of practical sessions. The instrument room houses an array of advanced equipment, including a laminar hood, orbital shaker, centrifuges, UV transilluminator, pH meter, and homogenizer, ensuring all necessary tools for conducting basic research experiments are readily available.

The department also boasts a state-of-the-art Zoology Museum, showcasing a diverse collection of specimens and slides for the study of Chordates and Non-Chordates, along with bones for Osteological studies. To support experimental work, the Preparation Room is dedicated to storing and preparing chemicals. Additionally, the department maintains its own library, which houses an extensive collection of books, offering valuable academic resources for students and faculty alike.

Established in 1974, the hostel at Daulat Ram College is a prestigious residential facility accommodating approximately 166 undergraduate students. The hostel serves as a home away from home, fostering a safe, inclusive, and conducive environment for both academic and personal growth.

### Facilities and Amenities

- **Accommodation:** The hostel offers well-furnished air conditioned, spacious rooms with beds, study tables, chairs, and ample storage. The rooms are divided into four blocks, each with its own set of facilities.
- **Health and Wellness:** A medical room with an attendant nurse is available, along with a gymnasium to promote the physical well-being of residents.
- **Recreation:** Residents can enjoy visitor's room, reading room, gaming room, and badminton court.
- **Dining:** The dining hall serves nutritious and protein-rich meals, prepared and served hygienically to ensure a balanced diet for residents.
- **Sustainability Initiatives:** The hostel is equipped with an aerobin composting system for recycling organic materials, rainwater harvesting system, solar panels, and plastic collection unit, all aimed at achieving zero waste.
- **Greenery:** The hostel has been recognized for its well-maintained environment and has won the prizes for Best Lawn and Best Maintained Environment at the Delhi University Flower Show 2025. The hostel is surrounded by well-maintained lawns and gardens that contribute to a lush, soothing environment. Additionally, the hostel features its own kitchen and herbal gardens enhancing the natural ambience.



## Additional Features

- **Common Facilities:** The hostel provides access to a common kitchen, student counselling center and WUS health centre facilities.
- **Housekeeping:** Dedicated staff manage the daily operations, including laundry and room cleaning, ensuring the smooth functioning and cleanliness of the hostel.
- **Security:** Round-the-clock security, CCTV surveillance and controlled access are in place to ensure the safety of all residents.
- **Student Governance:** A student union actively participates in hostel management with roles including President, Vice-President, General Secretary, Cultural Secretary, Treasurer and sub-committees focusing on Discipline, Swachhta, Creative, Gardening and Dining Hall Management.

## LIBRARY AND READING ROOM

The college library serves as a dynamic knowledge centre, dedicated to disseminating information and catering to the diverse needs of its users. It remains committed to ensuring the delivery of the right information to the right individuals at the right time.

- **Collection:** The library boasts a vast collection of over one lakh books, along with subscriptions to 27 magazines and 11 newspapers, catering to varied academic and leisure interests.
- **Rare Books:** A dedicated section showcases over 500 rare books spanning diverse subjects and disciplines, drawing significant interest from users.
- **Special Collection:** A specially curated section features over 400 publications, including noteworthy works related to Daulat Ram College. Highlights include *Shrimad Bhagwat Geeta* in 13 Indian languages and illustrated Kangara paintings, enhancing the user experience.
- **E-Resources and Institutional Memberships:** The library provides access to DELNET and NLIST, INFLIBNET, enabling users to access loaned books, e-databases, e-books, and e-journals.
- **Internship Programme:** Under the Library Internship Programme, 31 students from the University of Delhi's School of Open Learning (SOL) and IGNOU have completed internships at the library, gaining valuable hands-on experience.
- **New Initiatives:** On January 22, 2025, a dedicated section titled "*Shri Ramalaya*", featuring a rich collection of literature on Lord Shri Ram and his life, was inaugurated by distinguished guests, including Shri Narendra Thakur Ji (Rashtriya Sah-Prachar Pramukh, RSS) and Shri Vijay Shankar Tiwari Ji (Akhil Bhartiya Prachar-Prasar Pramukh, VHP), alongside Principal Prof. Savita Roy.
- **RamRasaayan:** The library has announced the launch of *RamRasaayan*, an international journal focused on indigenous knowledge systems, aimed at exploring and documenting diverse fields of traditional knowledge.
- **Braille Collection:** A special addition to the collection includes a 9-volume Braille edition of the *Ram Charit Manas*, catering to Divyaang (differently-abled) students.
- **Book Discussion Hour:** A new initiative invites renowned authors to engage with readers. On February 15, 2025, a celebrated journalist and author discussed her recent publication, "*Rani Durgawati: The Forgotten Life of a Warrior Queen.*"
- **Promotion of Research:** The library actively supports research activities for students and faculty. Researchers, including external scholars working on *Ramayan*, *Ram Charit Manas*, and Shri Ram, are provided access to the *Shri Ramalaya* collection.



- **Services for Divyaang:** Upholding the principles of inclusive education, the library subscribes to Braille magazines such as *Jigyasa*, *Mahila Munch*, and *Braille Digest*. Additionally, a Braille edition of the Constitution of India is available for Divyaang students.
- **KIBO Software:** The library has subscribed to advanced KIBO software to create an audio library for Divyaang students. KIBO supports text translation and audio conversion in over 100 languages, facilitating seamless access to study materials.

With its inclusive approach and continuous innovation, the library remains a cornerstone of academic excellence and a testament to the college’s commitment to holistic education.

### NAVDHARA PROJECTS: FOSTERING INTERDISCIPLINARY RESEARCH AND INNOVATION

The Navdhara Projects are a visionary initiative spearheaded by the dynamic leadership of Principal Prof. Savita Roy, whose ability to transform challenges into opportunities has brought new heights of innovation to the institution. These projects underscore the vital role of interdisciplinary research in advancing knowledge, creating solutions, and driving progress. Aligned with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the initiative reflects a commitment to interdisciplinary research as a cornerstone of India's future education system.

Interdisciplinary research under the Navdhara Projects not only fosters academic growth but also contributes significantly to the socio-economic development of the institution. The first cycle of Navdhara Projects was launched during the academic session 2023–2024, with 9 projects being shortlisted and funded for their respective principal investigators and teams. In the second cycle, during 2024-2025, an impressive 26 project proposals were submitted, out of which 15 projects were selected following a rigorous review process.

These projects are designed to be student-driven, offering invaluable opportunities for students to hone their research skills and contribute to meaningful knowledge creation. The central focus of Navdhara Projects lies in promoting curiosity, inquiry, and critical thinking among students, equipping them with the tools needed to excel in their academic and professional journeys.

## MENTOR-MENTEE SCHEME

The Mentor-Mentee Scheme was implemented with a vision to provide career guidance and support the holistic development of mentees by enhancing their skills and performance in both academic and co-curricular activities.

In the Mentor-Mentee Scheme, each teacher is responsible for mentoring a group of 8-10 students. This initiative aims to **effectively implement the National Education Policy (NEP)** by closely tracking students' academic progress and offering them appropriate **guidance in designing their 4-year Undergraduate Curriculum Framework (UGCF)**.

This structured approach fosters a nurturing environment where students receive personalized guidance to achieve both academic and personal growth. This year, for first-year students, mentor-mentee groups were newly created to ensure personalized guidance from the very beginning of their academic journey. The groups for second and third year students continued seamlessly, as established in the previous year. Additionally, Mentor-Mentee Diaries were distributed among the first-year students to facilitate effective communication and track progress throughout the mentorship program.

## VIDYA-VISTAR SCHEME

The Vidya Vistar Yojana (VVS) is a transformative educational initiative aimed at expanding access to quality education and enhancing learning opportunities. Under this scheme, the University of Delhi shares its resources, expertise, and research capabilities with remote and resource-limited colleges and universities across the country.

In 2021, Daulat Ram College signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Government Girls College, Magra Punjala, Jodhpur, and Government College, Chauhtan. Through this collaboration, experienced professors and experts shared their knowledge and teaching materials with these colleges in remote regions. The initiative provided academic guidance and support, leading to significant improvements in educational quality.

A variety of activities, including the provision of study materials, lectures, seminars, workshops, competitions, and writing-oratory skill development programs, were organized under the scheme. These efforts benefited both students and teachers alike. Additionally, the affiliated colleges received support in research and innovation, creating new opportunities in higher education and fostering academic progress.

The initiative also facilitated interactions between teachers and students from all institutions involved, enabling them to exchange ideas and explore new teaching methodologies. This meaningful engagement exemplifies the success of Vidya Vistar Yojana in fostering collaboration, enhancing academic standards, and driving socio-educational development.

Under the Vidya Vistar Scheme of the University of Delhi, the allied colleges of Daulat Ram College—Government Girls College, Magra Punjala, Jodhpur, and Government College,



Chauhtan—successfully conducted research on the project titled “हिंदी सिनेमा : लोकसांस्कृतिक विरासत के सामाजिक सरोकार”. This collaborative effort culminated in the publication of an international journal, symbolizing the meaningful academic partnership between the institutions.

In January 2025, the Principal of Daulat Ram College, Professor Savita Roy, along with Vidya Vistar Scheme Committee members Ms. Sneha Lata, Dr. Kusum Lata, and Dr. Nikhil Gangwar, met **Professor K. Ratnabali**, the Dean of Academic Activities, University of Delhi, at her office. They presented her with the international journal focused on “*Hindi Cinema: Socio-Cultural Concerns of Folk Legacy*” and a newsletter summarizing three years of work carried out under the scheme. Professor K. Ratnabali highly appreciated the efforts and activities undertaken by the college during the past three years for this scheme and encouraged continued participation in the upcoming years.

### In-House Skill Development Programmes

The Skill Development Programme (SDP) for the academic year 2024–2025 was launched under the theme “Skills for Promoting Self-Reliance, Employability, and Community Development.” The aim of this initiative was to provide students with training in technical, academic, and vocational skills to foster innovative thinking and creativity. The programs were carefully designed to offer active learning experiences through an interdisciplinary, hands-on approach. They facilitated the acquisition of new skills and provided opportunities to upgrade existing ones, benefiting students not only in their academic pursuits but also in equipping them with entrepreneurial ideas.



**Focus Areas for 2024–2025:** This year, the SDPs concentrated on three core areas:

**1. Skills Promoting Professional Competency:**

- Videography, academic writing, research skills,
- Career and education counselling,
- Developing innovation skills, and digital support training.

**2. Acquiring Technical Skills in the Digital Environment:**

- Computer literacy, communication skills, programming languages,
- Software skills, psychometry, artificial intelligence, and nanotechnology.

**3. Skills for Community Growth and Prosperity:**

- Community development, personality development, social/life skills,
- Lifestyle practices, and health awareness programs.

**Achievements:**

- SDP on Basic ICT Tools: Conducted by all 16 departments, this program trained 1,153 first-year students in essential ICT skills.
- Other specific SDPs were organized by the departments of Zoology, Physics, and Economics, imparting subject-related skills to 136 students.

Since its inception in 2018, Daulat Ram College has been a pioneer in implementing these programs and continues to enhance its initiatives each year. The SDPs this year reflected the college’s commitment to fostering self-reliance, employability, and community well-being.

The success of this year’s programs was made possible by the efforts of dedicated members in coordinating events, compiling reports, and managing E-certificates. Their support was instrumental in achieving the program’s objectives.

## ECO-FRIENDLY INITIATIVES:

### I. Green Ride — Last Mile Connectivity



Green Ride is a remarkable public bicycle-sharing system introduced by Daulat Ram College (DRC) as part of its commitment to sustainability and environmental responsibility. This unique initiative encourages cycling as a healthy and eco-friendly mode of transportation for students, faculty, and visitors within the Delhi University North Campus.

By reducing reliance on motorized vehicles, Green Ride actively contributes to lowering carbon emissions, promoting a cleaner and greener campus. The initiative makes commuting within the university campus seamless, allowing students to easily travel between academic buildings, libraries, and other facilities.

Bicycles can be hired for convenient use and returned to any of the five designated centres across North Campus. 12 bikes are available for hiring at the DRC centre. These centres ensure that bicycles remain easily accessible and well-maintained for consistent and hassle-free use. Green Ride exemplifies sustainable innovation, fostering both environmental awareness and healthy lifestyle practices within the university community.

#### ii. Installation of Solar Panels

In collaboration with Talf Solar India Pvt. Ltd., Daulat Ram College has successfully implemented the solarization of its campus with the installation of a 333 kWdc rooftop solar power plant. This initiative marks a significant step toward environmental sustainability and energy efficiency.



With this installation, the college is set to reduce its annual electricity expenses by 60%, contributing significantly to cost savings. Additionally, the solar power plant is expected to curb approximately 150–160 tCO<sub>2e</sub> emissions annually, demonstrating the institution's commitment to combating climate change and promoting renewable energy practices.

The excess electricity generated by solar energy is being fed into the grid. This initiative has resulted in a **remarkable reduction in electricity expenses**, bringing the monthly bill down from ₹6 lakhs to ₹2 lakhs. The transition to solar energy not only contributes to environmental protection but also demonstrates the institution's dedication to cost-effective solutions and renewable resources.

This eco-friendly initiative reflects Daulat Ram College's dedication to sustainability and sets an inspiring example for green energy adoption in educational institutions.



### iii. Recycling Unit: Advancing Zero-Discharge and Sustainability Goals

**Co-convenor:** Dr. Anita Goel

Established in 2015, the Recycling Unit at Daulat Ram College was created with the vision of achieving zero-discharge from the institution. The unit focuses on the collection, segregation, and recycling of institutional waste, including leaf litter, waste assignments, cardboard packaging materials, and plastic bottles.

**Waste Management and Recycling Practices** The unit is equipped with advanced machinery to manage and recycle waste efficiently:

- A leaf shredder machine cuts leaf litter into smaller pieces, which are then composted in bins using essential microbes. The mature compost is ready within 3–4 weeks and is used as fertilizer.



- Paper recycling machinery-including pulp makers, univats, hydraulic presses, and a calendaring machine-enables the production of white recycled paper from waste paper and brown paper from cardboard.

The recycled materials are transformed into useful resources such as biocomposts, carry bags, folders, decorative plates, and paintings. These products are sold in the market, and the proceeds are reinvested to enhance recycling activities.

### **New Initiatives and Developments**

- An aerobin was recently acquired to compost green canteen waste, turning fruit and vegetable peels into manure within 40 days.
- The unit maintains a herbal garden, cultivating medicinal and air-purifying plants like aloe vera, tulsi, and brahmi.

**Skill Development and Internships** The unit employs two workers and conducts hands-on workshops to teach recycling processes. It also offers internships for Daulat Ram College students, providing them with valuable training through skill development workshops. These programs help students learn effective recycling techniques and ways to create useful items from waste.

**Collaborations and Awareness Campaigns** In 2024, a Letter of Agreement was signed with Bisleri to raise awareness about plastic waste management. This collaboration underscores the unit's commitment to sustainability and environmental education.

Through these initiatives, the Recycling Unit continues to promote a culture of sustainability, innovation, and responsibility, setting a benchmark for zero-discharge practices within educational institutions.

#### 4. Drosophila Hands-on Workshop – Enhancing Skills in Genetic Research

From June 12–14 and June 18–20, 2024, the Drosophila Resource Centre, Department of Zoology, University of Delhi, hosted two comprehensive hands-on workshops focusing on tools and techniques for handling *Drosophila melanogaster* (fruit fly). The initiative aimed to enhance the practical skills of undergraduate students with a keen interest in genetic research and experimental biology.

**Keynote Address:** The workshop commenced with an engaging keynote by Dr. Sonika Sharma, highlighting the significance of *Drosophila* as a model organism in genetics and developmental biology.

**Workshop Highlights:** Participants were introduced to essential tools, techniques, and research methodologies:

- **Introduction to Drosophila Handling:** Preparation of fly vials and culture media, use of anesthetizing equipment and microscopes, and sterile techniques to prevent contamination.
- **Understanding the Drosophila Life Cycle:** Comprehensive insights into life stages from egg to adult and hands-on training in sorting flies based on phenotypic traits such as eye color.

**Advanced Laboratory Techniques:** Students gained valuable hands-on experience by performing a series of advanced experiments. They started with genomic DNA isolation, where they extracted and analyzed the DNA of *Drosophila*, deepening their understanding of genetic material. Thin Layer Chromatography (TLC) allowed them to separate *Drosophila* eye pigments, facilitating chemical analysis and enhancing their expertise in pigment identification. Through polytene chromosome preparation, students observed chromosomal structures within the salivary glands of *Drosophila*, gaining insight into gene mapping and expression studies. Additionally, they utilized gel electrophoresis to analyze DNA using molecular separation techniques, further refining their practical skills in advanced genetic analysis.

The workshops were attended by 19 enthusiastic students (11 in the first session and 8 in the second), offering them invaluable hands-on training and strengthening their skills in zoological research.

**Outcomes:** This intensive training enhanced participants' understanding of genetic research methodologies and fostered a deeper appreciation for *Drosophila* as a model organism. The experience equipped students with the confidence and technical skills necessary for future scientific endeavors.

These workshops showcased the Drosophila Resource Centre's dedication to advancing education in genetic research and promoting innovation within the field of experimental biology.

## **6. Lecture and Free Preventive Health Check-Up Program for Young Girls**

**Expert Lectures on Women's Health:** Dr. Nishi Makhija delivered an impactful lecture on "Health Awareness and Well-Being," shedding light on crucial topics such as cervical cancer prevention, safe sex practices, safe abortion guidelines, and maintaining a healthy lifestyle. Additionally, Dr. Payal Modi enriched the audience with valuable insights into anaemia, Polycystic Ovarian Disease (PCOD), menstrual hygiene, and reproductive health. The sessions were highly engaging and informative, leaving a meaningful and lasting impression on the participants.

**Free Preventive Health Check-Up:** After the lectures, a comprehensive health check-up was organized, providing free medical tests that included screenings for anaemia, PCOD, and thalassemia, as well as tests for RH incompatibility, HbA1C levels, hyperthyroidism, serum insulin, cervical cancer, and menstrual health assessments. This initiative ensured a thorough evaluation of participants' health.

A total of 435 students participated in this thorough health screening program. A follow-up consultation was arranged on December 19, 2024, during which students received their health reports and had the opportunity to discuss their concerns with doctors.

This initiative was a resounding success, fostering health awareness and ensuring young girls had access to essential healthcare resources. The event empowered students with knowledge and preventive care, significantly contributing to their overall well-being.

## ADD-ON CERTIFICATE COURSE ON “LEGAL LITERACY, AWARENESS AND AID”

Daulat Ram College, in collaboration with the Delhi State Legal Services Authority (DSLISA), offers an Add-On Course on Legal Literacy, Awareness, and Aid, under the supervision of Course Coordinators Prof. Sonia Mehta (Professor, Department of Philosophy, Daulat Ram College) and Honourable Judge Sh. Tushar Gupta (Delhi Judicial Services, Secretary, West Delhi Legal Services Authority).

**Course Objective and Vision:** This course is thoughtfully designed to educate learners and young professionals from non-law fields about both the theoretical and practical aspects of the legal framework. Its objectives include:

- Developing an understanding of the interdisciplinary nature of law and its relations with parent disciplines,
- Establishing a clear and holistic perspective on the legal system and its applications in today’s globalized, technological, and competitive world,
- Cultivating technical acumen and skills to access and utilize legal services for public advocacy, and
- Creating awareness about the functioning of one of the world’s largest democracies.

Such courses align with the *National Education Policy 2020* and serve as an integral requirement in college and university education systems.

**Accomplishments:** Since its launch in 2021, the college has successfully conducted three batches of the Certificate Add-On Course. In the academic session 2021–22, 32 students enrolled, followed by 31 students in 2022–23, and an increased enrolment of 42 students in 2023–24.

The course covers key modules including Know Your Rights/Remedies, Legal Procedure, Women-Related Laws, and Legal Services in India. It has received overwhelmingly positive feedback, with students appreciating the insightful and interactive sessions featuring practical cases shared by eminent members of the Judicial and Legal Fraternity. Additionally, the course has achieved a remarkable 100% passing result, with students excelling.

**Current Batch (2024–25):** The fourth batch, which commenced on February 1, 2025, has enrolled students from diverse backgrounds, including undergraduate, postgraduate, and professional fields. So far, five insightful sessions have been conducted by esteemed resource persons. Honourable Sh. Ankur Panghal (Delhi Judicial Services, Secretary North DLSA) delivered a session on Fundamental Rights and Duties, while Honourable Sh. Abhinav Singh (Ld. Secretary, Delhi Judicial Services, South East DLSA) spoke on Constitutional Remedies. Sh. K B Rai, Former Advisor of the Administrative Reforms Department, shared his expertise on the Right to Information (RTI). Additionally, Honourable Ms. Richika Tyagi (Delhi Judicial Services, Secretary, Central-II DLSA) conducted a session on the First Information Report, and Honourable



Sh. Lalit Kumar (Delhi Judicial Services, Ld. Secretary, East DLSA) addressed the topic of Human Rights Laws.

**Field Visit Module:** To enhance experiential learning, students will participate in two field visits in March 2025. These visits will include Kakardooma Court, DLSA Shahdara Office, Tihar Jail, and Police Station Anand Vihar. Highlights of the field visits:

- Observing live sessions at Family and Civil Courts,
- Visiting the Vulnerable Witness Room and Mediation Centre,
- Exploring the front office of DLSA,
- Interacting with eminent members of the Delhi Judicial Services, and
- Witnessing police operations firsthand.

The Add-On Certificate Course on Legal Literacy, Awareness, and Aid continues to empower students by equipping them with legal insights and practical skills. This initiative builds awareness, fosters interdisciplinary learning, and strengthens their ability to navigate the processes of legal and judicial institutions effectively.

SGTB Khalsa College, University of Delhi organised a one-week Interdisciplinary Faculty Development Programme on ICT Based Classroom Teaching: Digital Pedagogy specifically for its faculty from July 22, 2024 to July 27, 2024. With the inspiration from Mr. Mukul Gupta, Chairman, Governing Body of the College, the FDP was conducted under the convenorship of Prof. Savita Roy, Principal of the College and Prof. Vimal Rarh, Programme Director, UGC MMTTC, MoE. The Cyber Cell at Daulat Ram College serves as the leading hub for digital safety and cybersecurity initiatives. Powered by a team of dedicated and skilled student experts, it is committed to empowering the college community with the knowledge, skills, and best practices essential for confidently navigating the digital world. Through an extensive range of interactive workshops, engaging seminars, and impactful awareness campaigns, the Cyber Cell fosters a culture of cybersecurity consciousness. Its mission is to equip individuals with the tools needed to actively protect themselves and the broader college community from emerging cyber threats.

The Cyber Cell of Daulat Ram College organized a wide array of events spanning business, finance, cybersecurity, and technology, aimed at providing students with valuable insights and career guidance.

- 1. Cyber Connect Workshop** (September–October 2024): A three-week online event that explored emerging cybersecurity topics such as 5G security risks, digital safety, AI privacy concerns, and the Microsoft-CrowdStrike glitch. Each session, attended by 40–50 participants, featured detailed case studies, real-world examples, and interactive discussions, fostering a deeper understanding of contemporary cyber challenges.
- 2. Interns Elite Webinar** (September 20, 2024): Led by ethical hacker Yash Kumar, this session introduced participants to cyber threats, cryptography, and key certifications essential for launching a career in cybersecurity.

11. **Masterclass on “AI and Machine Learning in Business”** (February 20, 2024): Hosted by the University of Maryland’s Smith School of Business, this masterclass featured Dr. Balaji Padmanabhan, who discussed AI applications in finance, marketing, and supply chain management, emphasizing its role as a collaborative tool rather than a replacement for human expertise.

These initiatives collectively enhanced participants’ knowledge across multiple domains, offering hands-on learning experiences, career-oriented discussions, and expert insights into the evolving landscapes of cybersecurity, data analytics, and business.

Vriddhi, the Placement Cell of Daulat Ram College, continued its mission of “Maximizing Stellar Growth” during the 2024–25 academic year under the leadership of its core team, which included Anjali Maurya (President), Anshika Suri (Co-President), Mugdha Singh (Vice-President), Khushi Gangwani (General Secretary), Smridhi Ahuja (General Secretary), Aastha Soin (Treasurer), Anhad Bains (Treasurer), Manaswi Mishra (Joint Secretary), and Versha Singh (Joint Secretary), along with Heads, Senior Executives, and Junior Executives.

This year, 1710 students registered with the Placement Cell to take advantage of its recruitment and internship initiatives. Over 40 companies, including Urban Company, Accenture, Navikenz, Jaro Education, and DeltaX, participated in on-campus and off-campus recruitment drives. To date, 150 students have secured internships, and 46 students have received placements with packages as high as ₹9 LPA, an average package of ₹6.61 LPA, and a total gross package of ₹2.37 crores. The ongoing recruitment and internship season is expected to bring more positive results.

To enhance student employability and skill development, Vriddhi organized an array of seminars and webinars, including CV-building workshops, career counseling sessions, CV vetting sessions, and programs such as *Internships under NEP*, *Personal Branding*, *Guesstimates*, and *Decoding the Hiring Process*. Additionally, digital initiatives like *Mythbuster 2.0* and *Course Compendium 2.0* on Instagram provided valuable insights into the corporate world.

Looking ahead, Incrementum 8.0 is scheduled for March 4, 2025, building on the success of Incrementum 7.0, which attracted 1,500+ students and featured 35+ companies, resulting in 387 recruitment and internship opportunities.

Pragati aims to sensitize society on gender-related issues and create a respectful, inclusive environment for women, including students and staff. *Personal Effectiveness and Grooming Session* on 6th September 2024, in collaboration with Right Side Story, hosted a session under BYOB: Be Your Own Boss, sponsored by Whisper and Gillette India. 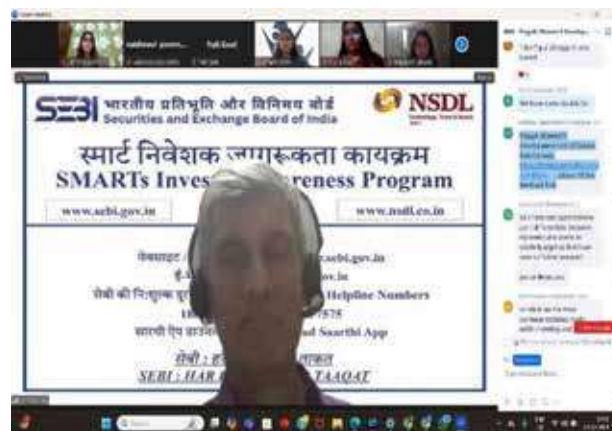

**Key highlights** of the talk included an in-depth discussion on the function and importance of the lymphatic system and the use of transgenic reporter lines. The talk emphasized how Zebrafish has emerged as a vital model for studying the vascular system and its applications in vascular biology. It also explored the role of organ-associated vascular specializations in maintaining health and how their dysfunction can contribute to various diseases. Additionally, Zebrafish’s unique regenerative abilities and transparent vasculature were highlighted as exceptional tools for gaining insights into vascular biology, understanding disease mechanisms, and exploring potential therapies.

The talk ended with an Interactive Q&A session, where students discussed career opportunities, research challenges, and future trends. The session inspired students to explore research careers and higher studies.

Both events were a great success, fostering student leadership and academic enthusiasm. The department looks forward to more engaging sessions and activities to enhance the learning experience for students.

**PERSPECTIVE**, the annual academic and cultural event of ITIVRITTA, is an exciting celebration that blends intellectual discussions, engaging activities, and vibrant cultural performances. It continues to attract enthusiastic participation from both students and faculty year after year.

This year's event, held on 28th February 2025, focused on the theme "*History Through Her Eyes: Women Who Shaped India*". The highlight of the day was an insightful lecture by the distinguished Dr. Pankaj Jha on "*Gender Discourse in Pre-modern Sanskrit, Persian, and Vernacular Literary Traditions in North India*." He explored the ways in which ancient texts constructed masculinity and femininity, portraying masculinity as tied to power and control, while femininity was associated with virtue, devotion, and subservience. Dr. Jha also shed light on how class distinctions influenced gender roles, shaping societal expectations for men and women based on their social status. The thought-provoking session encouraged participants to reflect on the nuanced interplay of fluidity and rigidity in gender norms throughout history.

The Department organized a range of engaging events during the academic session. On 10th February 2025, a seminar on "*Strategic Approach towards UPSC CSE and Other Competitive Examinations*" was held in collaboration with CORE IAS, providing valuable insights for aspiring candidates. Earlier, on 3rd February 2025, a speaker session on UPSC-CSE Examinations was conducted in collaboration with SRIRAM'S IAS, where Dr. Dipanwita Chakravarty, senior faculty at SRIRAM'S IAS, enlightened students on key aspects of UPSC preparation and effective strategies.

On 25th October 2024, the Department organized a special lecture titled "*Popular Culture of Paris on the Eve of the French Revolution*", delivered by Prof. Arvind Sinha. 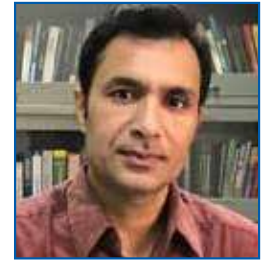
