ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Daulat Ram College, a constituent college of the University of Delhi, continues to be a leading institution in women's higher education. Established in 1960 and incorporated into the University of Delhi in 1964, the college has steadily grown into a multidisciplinary institution offering programmes in Arts, Commerce, and Science.

In national rankings, the college recorded a major achievement. In the latest results released by the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF), Daulat Ram College secured Rank 26 among colleges across India. This progress reflects focused efforts in academic quality, research, student progression, and institutional governance.

The institution continues to strengthen its academic and research environment through funded projects, modern laboratories, ICT-enabled classrooms, and library resources. Student societies, cultural activities, sports, and outreach initiatives remain integral to campus life, supporting holistic development.

The institution provides extensive infrastructure to support academic and co-curricular engagement. The campus houses a well-equipped auditorium, an open-air amphitheatre (Rangshala), multiple conference halls, and a seminar hall that facilitate lectures, conferences, cultural programmes, and institutional events. Laboratories, ICT-enabled classrooms, library resources, and dedicated research spaces contribute to an active learning environment.

Student life at the college is supported by numerous societies, cells, committees, and departmental associations. Under these bodies, student unions function actively and organize a wide range of events throughout the year. These include academic conferences, seminars, workshops, cultural festivals, literary events, sports competitions, outreach initiatives, and student development activities. Such platforms enable students to participate in leadership roles and collaborative learning beyond the classroom.

The college actively fosters personal and professional growth for both its faculty and students. For faculty members from across universities, the college organizes refresher courses, workshops, and faculty development programmes to enhance their teaching skills and academic expertise. Meanwhile, for students, the college offers add-on certificate courses and skill development programmes that broaden their academic and professional horizons. By providing these targeted opportunities, the college supports a culture of continuous learning and holistic development for all. These initiatives not only strengthen academic excellence but also prepare students and faculty to meet the evolving demands of higher education and society.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

On behalf of the College Governing Body and staff, I welcome Shri Neeraj Raizada, Shri Ashwani Kumar Chand, and our two distinguished alumnae, Ms. Asha Agarwal and Ms. Priyanshi Sharma on the occasion of the 64th Annual Day of Daulat Ram College. The year 2025-26 was marked by significant achievements, institutional growth, and a continued commitment to excellence in academics, research, and community engagement for the holistic development of students that is reflected in the All India 25th rank awarded to the college by the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF), Ministry of Education, in the current academic year.

During the academic year 2025-26, the college admitted 1,514 students across undergraduate programmes, 181 at the postgraduate level, and nearly 600 students under seven foreign language add-on courses. With the implementation of the fourth year under NEP 2020, the overall student strength has risen to 5,000, reflecting the institution's expanding academic engagement and growing opportunities for advanced learning. Eighty percent of the students are from states other than Delhi, and 72 international students hailing from different countries including Nepal, Bangladesh, Tibet, Sri Lanka, South Africa, Mauritius, and the UAE speak of the rich diversity among the student body.

The students of the college have given an exemplary performance not only in academics but also in other spheres. The pass percentage in different programmes for the year falls in the range of 98–100%. Moreover, we have completely transitioned from a 3-year to a 4-year UG programme.

I have the pleasure to announce that this year 92 students have received proficiency prizes, 24 instituted prizes, 16 Silver Jubilee Scholarships, and 33 Meritorious Awards. The Best Student in NCC award is conferred upon SUO Nitya, B.A. (H) Political Science, III Year. The Best Student in Sports award is presented to Hiteshi Bansal, B.Com. (H), III Year, for excellence in Fencing. The Best Student in NSS award goes to Khushi Pandey, B.A. (H) English, III Year, in recognition of her dedicated 287 hours of service under the NSS programme. Many congratulations to all the prize winners.

A total of 321 students were given fee concession by the college purely on a need-cum-merit basis. A total of 468 merit scholarships were bagged by students from government, non-government, and private organizations. Our students brought laurels to the institution through outstanding performances in sports. Ms. Khushi (B.A. Program, II Year) represented India at the Shooting Ball World Cup Championship (February 2026) and secured first position. Ms. Manu (B.A. Program, III Year) represented Delhi at the 38th National Games in Uttarakhand, securing third position. Students also excelled in university-level trials in Fencing, Kabaddi, and Judo, with several being selected to represent the University of Delhi in All India Inter-University Games/Sports. These achievements reflect the college's commitment to nurturing excellence in both academics and sports.



Daulat Ram College Hostel, under its Warden, Dr. Vidhi Chaudhary, is a prestigious residential facility accommodating its maximum capacity of 213 undergraduate students, marking the highest occupancy since its inception. The hostel serves as a home away from home, fostering a safe, inclusive, and conducive environment for both academic and personal growth.

I take great pride in noting that on 4 April 2025, Smt. Rekha Gupta, an alumna of Daulat Ram College and the Chief Minister of Delhi, was jointly felicitated by the University of Delhi and Daulat Ram College at the Vice-Chancellor's Lounge. Subsequently, on 28 August 2025, the Hon'ble Chief Minister visited Daulat Ram College, where she inaugurated the relaunch of the University's special bus service, a student-centric initiative aimed at enhancing safe, sustainable, and accessible transport for University of Delhi students through a modern fleet of electric buses. The occasion reflected the convergence of educational legacy and public leadership, reaffirming the enduring bond between the institution and its distinguished alumna.

The college Alumni Association continued to play an important role in strengthening the bond between the college and its former students. Through various events and outreach initiatives, alumni remained actively engaged in supporting and contributing to the development of the college community.

The college continues to serve as a vibrant academic hub through several dedicated Centres. The Centre for Foreign Languages offers Certificate, Diploma, and Advanced Diploma programmes that help students develop linguistic skills and intercultural competence, thereby enhancing their employability. The Psychology Resource Centre promotes mental health awareness through lectures, discussions, and outreach initiatives. The Skill Enhancement Centre strengthens the college's commitment to skill-based and experiential learning. The Skill Development Centre for Drosophila and Zebrafish Model Organisms continues to receive support from the University of Delhi and conducts skill enhancement courses. The Zebrafish laboratory has evolved into an active research facility where several PhD scholars are engaged, leading to research publications and capacity-building workshops, with institutions including IITs approaching the college for training programmes. The Drosophila Resource Centre also organizes various academic and training activities throughout the year.

In addition, the college houses a Skill Enhancement Centre for Aquaculture with a well-equipped fish laboratory, and the Hydroponics and Aeroponics Centre established by the Department of Botany, which promotes sustainable farming and hands-on learning. The Centre for Happiness, supported by the Rekhi Foundation, conducts workshops and well-being programmes for students, and due to its growing popularity, the course offered by the Centre has now been introduced as a credit-based course.

During the academic year 2025-2026, the college achieved a significant milestone with the addition of a new academic building on campus. The building houses five modern lecture theatres with a seating capacity of 60-70 each, a spacious seminar hall, three specialized laboratories for NHE, Chemistry, and Physics, and a fully equipped computer laboratory with around 100 terminals. It also includes dedicated faculty-student interaction spaces to encourage mentoring and academic discussions. To enhance accessibility and ensure greater convenience, the building is equipped with an additional lift, making the facility more inclusive and student-friendly.

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) actively facilitated the implementation of the fourth year of the Undergraduate Curriculum Framework under the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. To streamline and strengthen research activities, the Research Coordination Committee (RCC) was constituted, along with Subject Research Committees and Advisory Research Committees, to mentor and guide fourth-year students undertaking dissertation work.



The college organized more than 30 academic programmes, including Faculty Development Programmes, Skill Development Programmes, seminars, webinars, workshops, conferences, and refresher courses for both students and faculty members, under the able supervision of Prof. Padamshree Mudgal, Coordinator, IQAC. Several talks, workshops, and capacity-building programmes were also organized for non-teaching staff to enhance professional competencies and strengthen the academic and administrative ecosystem of the institution.

Twenty-seven papers were published in Scopus- and Web of Science-indexed journals, more than fifty-two research papers in reputed, peer-reviewed, UGC-CARE listed journals, and thirty-one book chapters were published by the faculty of the college. The college received total external research grants of ₹35 lakhs for various projects during the year. In addition, the institution allocated ₹3 lakhs to support Navdhara Projects, a joint faculty-student research initiative aimed at promoting interdisciplinary research and innovation.

The college further strengthened its commitment to environmental sustainability through a series of eco-friendly initiatives. These included the Green Ride – Last Mile Connectivity Program in collaboration with UTU Mobility; the expansion of solar power infrastructure to reduce electricity consumption and promote renewable energy; the establishment of a recycling unit to encourage sustainable waste management and zero-discharge practices; and regular Clean Campus drives organized by the Garden Committee under the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan. Together, these initiatives contribute to maintaining ecological balance and fostering a clean, green, and sustainable campus environment.

Guided by the motto 'Not Me, But You,' the NSS unit organized a wide range of impactful initiatives throughout the year. These included the Nasha Mukti Abhiyan, Raktdan Jan Abhiyan (blood donation camps), International Yoga Day, the Swachhta Hi Seva Campaign, a Self-Defense Camp, observance of Senior Citizen Day, a Yamuna cleanliness drive, and several other community outreach activities.

The college remained committed to social responsibility through impactful community engagement initiatives. Under *Bhavishya Ki Ore Ek Udaan*, a four-day camp was organized in college for children of Allipur Village, Faridabad, in collaboration with Ekal Sansthan. It aimed at engaging children through creative learning activities and social awareness programs from 16 to 19 June 2025. A total of twenty-eight children from the village were hosted in the college hostel and provided with an immersive campus experience. The programme included interdisciplinary sessions, hands-on activities, educational games, and guided visits to the college's science laboratories and recycling units. The initiative aimed at fostering holistic development and educational empowerment among the participating children.

Under *Unnat Bharat Abhiyan*, the college adopted five villages in Faridabad. Between August and November 2025, teams of students conducted surveys and interacted with local stakeholders to identify developmental needs and explore possible institutional interventions. The outreach involved meetings with the Block Development Officer, as well as interactions with Sarpanches, Panchayat Secretaries, and Primary School teachers, to strengthen community engagement and support local development initiatives.

During the year, the college entered into and continued collaborations under 17 Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs) with various institutions and organizations. These partnerships aim to strengthen academic exchange, promote research collaborations, expand outreach initiatives, and encourage appreciation of cultural heritage among students. These partnerships enhance academic opportunities for students and contribute to the continued development of the institution.

The college undertook several initiatives to deepen understanding and effective implementation of NEP 2020: A National Conference in collaboration with ICSSR was organized for Academic administrators/



Principals on “Implementation of NEP 2020: Challenges and the Way Forward.” A Faculty Development Programme focusing on orientation and sensitization towards NEP reforms. A Refresher Course on NEP and Research Methodology for Scientific Excellence, aimed at strengthening faculty capacity and research competencies.

The Placement Cell – Vriddhi continued to facilitate diverse career opportunities for students: Over 1,600 students were registered for placements and internships. More than 30 reputed companies including Bank of America, PwC, KPMG, Accenture, Nestlé, and L&T participated in the placement drive. More than 30 students till date have secured final placements so far, with the highest package at ₹9.31 lakh per annum and an average package of ₹6 lakh per annum. More than 100 students were shortlisted for internships, with stipends reaching up to ₹25,000 per month.

Institutions are not built in a day. I would like to acknowledge with gratitude the valuable services rendered by the staff members who retired during the academic year. During the year, Prof. Rama Pasricha, Dr. Shuchi Sharma, and Prof. Rekha Kathal superannuated after dedicating several decades of distinguished service to the college. Four members of the support staff—Rakesh Vashisht, B. S. Negi, Parmod Kumar, and Aditya Narain Singh—also retired during the year after rendering long and dedicated service to the institution. The college expresses its deep appreciation for their commitment and wishes them a fulfilling and healthy life ahead.

Here I would be failing in my duty if I do not acknowledge the contribution of my entire faculty and other support staff especially Ms. Haritha P., Prof. Padamshree Mudgal, Dr. Moitree Bhattacharya, Prof. Meetu Khosla, Dr. Deepika Jindal, Ms. Saachi Bhutani, and Dr. Shikha Singh who were pillars of support in undertaking new academic initiatives and taking it forward despite all odds. They are a self-driven lot, and institutions are built because of the initiatives of such committed faculty.

I must also congratulate Dr. Vandana Lal and her team for compiling and editing the Annual Report and bringing it to this form.

I must also acknowledge the support extended by Vice Principal Prof. Priti Malhotra, Administrative Officers Ms. Vijayta Rana and Mr. Atul Bhaskar, and College Librarian Mr. Pawan Tripathi, in carrying out the administration of the college.

The academic year 2025-26 has been a testament to Daulat Ram College’s unwavering commitment to excellence in academics, research, sports, sustainability, and community engagement. The staff thanks our Chairperson, Shri Mukul Gupta, and the entire Governing Body for their continued support. THE INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Daulat Ram College works with the vision and mission of planning, guiding, and monitoring Quality Assurance (QA) and Quality Enhancement (QE) activities of the college. The IQAC works with the aim of channelizing and systematizing all efforts of the institution towards academic excellence.

The IQAC continuously strives for academic excellence and the improvement of sustainable infrastructure, facilities, and the scholastic environment for students to excel and achieve their goals.

It was a matter of great accomplishment that Daulat Ram College achieved a big leap in **NIRF ranking** from **72 to 26**.

With the aim of achieving the target of “One College, One Data” and adopting a systematic data management system, the college implemented the **ERP (Enterprise Resource Planning)** student-related modules, including attendance, AEC/GE/VAC/SEC course allotment, internal assessment (IA), and timetables, from the session 2024–25. In 2025–26, the college also made the faculty-related data modules functional on the ERP. This would enable proper assessment of academic progress and smoothen the process of navigating different ranking systems.

The fourth year (IV year) undergraduate research track guidelines were successfully implemented in the college. The **Research Committee of the College (RCC)** was put in place. For smooth implementation, in each department, a **Subject Research Committee (SRC)** was set up, and each student was under the mentorship of the **Advisory Committee for Research (ACR)**, consisting of a student supervisor and two additional members.

IQAC organized a Capacity Building workshop on **CCS Conduct Rules** and **Disciplinary Measures** by Mr. Virendra Kumar, Joint Registrar, School of Planning and Architecture, Delhi, on the 4th of July, 2025, for the **non-teaching staff** of Daulat Ram College. Mr. Virendra Kumar, very lucidly, with interesting anecdotes, made a very heavy and difficult topic of Disciplinary Measures simple to understand and grasp. The non-teaching staff greatly benefited from the session.

IQAC members attended a workshop titled **“Empowering College IQACs to Uphold Research Integrity: Addressing the Challenge of Predatory and Cloned Journals”** organized by IQAC, University of Delhi, on Nov. 13, 2025. A talk on **“Tools to identify cloned and predatory journals and why is it important?”** by IQAC Convener Prof. Padmshree Mudgal was then organized for the teaching faculty of DRC on 9th Dec. 2025, to guide faculty members to publish in **high-impact** journals.

The IQAC completed the screening process for the promotion of faculty members at various levels of promotion.

To promote a research environment and collaborative interactions in the college, the College launched the second round of **DRC Navdhara Research grants** in 2024. The **second instalment of grants to 15 projects** – 2 from the humanities, 2 from Commerce and Economics, and 11 from the science stream – was released in 2025–26.

The College received an additional grant of Rs. 15 lakhs from **the Skill Enhancement Courses Committee, University of Delhi**, for establishing new Skill Development Centres and upgrading the established Skill Development **Centres**. The College is setting up a new Skill Development **Centre** for Medical Diagnostics.

The College also initiated many new **extension and community outreach activities**. The College, in collaboration with **the Ekal Foundation**, organized a 4-day fun and learning camp: **“Bhavishya Ki Ore Ek Udaan”** for 30 children of Allipur village, Faridabad. The College has adopted 5 villages in Faridabad under the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan for community outreach activities.

The IQAC will continue its endeavour for scholastic excellence following the best practices.

CENTRES

1. Centre for Foreign Languages

The college offers part-time Certificate, Diploma, and Advanced Diploma courses in Foreign Languages to women and men who wish to develop their skills and fluency in both speaking and writing in a language of their choice. In addition, the college offers add-on courses in French, German, Spanish, Italian, Chinese, Japanese, and Korean.

Advanced Diploma courses are offered only to students who have completed the Diploma Course in the relevant language, and Diploma courses are open to those who have passed the Certificate Course in the concerned language.

Students seeking admission to the Advanced Diploma in German, Spanish, French, or Italian who have completed the Certificate or Diploma course from institutions other than the University of Delhi, as well as gap-year candidates, are required to clear the entrance test conducted by the Department of Germanic and Romance Studies, University of Delhi.

All these Certificate, Diploma, and Advanced Diploma courses are conducted in collaboration with the Department of Germanic and Romance Studies and the Department of South Asian Studies, University of Delhi.

2. Psychology Resource Centre

The Psychology Resource Centre organized a series of events during the academic year 2025–2026.

Mental Health Centre: Manotsav 2025 was organized on 14 October 2025 as a day-long event to mark World Mental Health Day. The programme featured a distinguished keynote address, an engaging Paper Presentation Competition on the theme **“Building Resilient Mental Health Systems,”** and various student activities. The event focused on developing inclusive and adaptive frameworks that ensure accessibility, community support, and evidence-based preventive care.

Coordinated by the Psychology Resource Centre under the convenorship of Prof. Meetu Khosla and Co-convenor Dr. Suparna Jain Thakur, the competition witnessed enthusiastic participation from undergraduate and postgraduate students across Delhi University colleges. Participants presented research on diverse and relevant topics such as digital mental health interventions, mindfulness and resilience, art-based therapy, and community well-being. Each paper demonstrated originality, critical thinking, and an understanding of psychology’s vital role in strengthening mental health systems. The best papers were recognized for their innovative perspectives, analytical depth, and meaningful contribution to the theme.

The event also featured a compelling keynote address by **Dr. Updesh Kumar, Scientist ‘G’ (Retd.) and former Head** of the Mental Health Division, Defence Institute of Psychological Research (DIPR), DRDO, Ministry of Defence. Drawing upon his extensive experience in military psychology and personality assessment, Dr. Kumar addressed common misconceptions about mental health, emphasized the importance of emotional adaptability, and highlighted resilience as a mindset that enables individuals to overcome adversity and thrive.

Four interactive workshops were organized to bridge theory with practice: *Creative Strokes: Art for Enhancing Emotional Well-being* by Prof. Meetu Khosla, *Inculcating Mindfulness* by Prof. Pooja V. Anand, *Building Resilience* by Dr. Sandhyarani Hawbam, and *Through the Rabbit Hole: Self and Conflicts* by Dr. Kshitija Wason. These workshops witnessed enthusiastic participation from students across Delhi University colleges.

Each session offered **hands-on learning experiences**, encouraging participants to develop self-awareness and promote mental well-being through creative and reflective approaches. Manotsav 2025 successfully integrated academic inquiry, skill-based learning, and emotional insight, embodying the Department’s commitment to fostering resilience, creativity, and holistic growth.

Value Engagement and Mental Health Centre:

3. Centre for Legal Literacy, Awareness and Aid

The Centre for Legal Literacy, Awareness and Aid, Daulat Ram College, successfully organised the inaugural session of its flagship initiative titled “**Voices in Law: A Comprehensive Legal Session Series**” on **12 November 2025**. This programme marked the launch of a pioneering academic and outreach platform in the form of an interactive **legal podcast-cum-dialogue session**, conceived as the **first initiative of its kind** in the history of the college. The session also witnessed the official unveiling of the Centre’s logo, symbolising its motto, “*Striving Inclusivity: Unfolding the Blindfold*”. The event was graced by the Chairman, Mr. Mukul Gupta, Principal, Prof. Savita Roy, Vice Principal, Prof. Priti Malhotra, and brought together students, faculty members, non-teaching staff, alumni, and members of the wider academic and legal community, creating a vibrant intellectual space for dialogue between law, society, and lived experience.

Distinguished Speaker and Alumna of the College: The inaugural session was graced by Hon’ble Dr. Justice Swarnkanta Sharma, Judge of the Delhi High Court, as the chief guest. A distinguished judicial officer and alumna of Daulat Ram College, her journey from the college to the higher judiciary inspired students and highlighted the transformative power of education and perseverance. Her interactive address, “Chai & Challenges,” offered valuable insights into judicial life, constitutional values, and the evolving challenges of the legal system.

Theme and Intellectual Orientation: The session, “**Voices in Law,**” aimed to highlight diverse perspectives in legal discourse and bridge the gap between theory and real-life legal practice. Hon’ble Dr. Justice Swarnkanta Sharma spoke about the ethical responsibilities of the judiciary, the role of law in protecting constitutional values, the challenges of a rapidly changing society, and the need for legal awareness among youth. Moderated by Prof. (Dr.) Sonia Mehta, the interactive session allowed participants to engage directly with the speaker, making legal concepts more practical and relatable.

Unveiling of the Centre’s Logo: A key highlight of the programme was the unveiling of the official logo of the Centre for Legal Literacy, Awareness and Aid. The logo reflects the Centre’s vision of justice, inclusivity, and empowerment, marking the formal launch of its mission to promote legal literacy and a culture of rights and responsibilities within the college. The Hon’ble Justice praised the Centre’s proactive efforts to foster legal awareness in the community.

Uniqueness of the Initiative: This podcast marked a distinctive pedagogical innovation, adopting an interactive and conversational format that made legal discussions more accessible and engaging than traditional lectures. As the college’s first legal podcast, it reflects the Centre’s commitment to interdisciplinary engagement, experiential learning, bridging theory with practice, and promoting critical awareness. The initiative reimagines legal education as not just technical training, but ethical and civic learning.

Contemporary Relevance: In today’s complex socio-political climate, marked by pressing questions of justice and rights, the session held special relevance. It enabled participants to reflect on the role of law in a democracy, its connection with social justice, and the importance of informed citizenship. The inaugural legal podcast of the Centre for Legal Literacy, Awareness and Aid, featuring Hon’ble Dr. Justice Swarnkanta Sharma, successfully blended academic insight with social relevance. It marked the start of an ongoing dialogue between legal thought and everyday life on campus. The programme strengthened legal awareness among students and staff and set a model for future interdisciplinary initiatives, enriching the intellectual and civic culture of Daulat Ram College.



Legal Services Clinic: Outreach Initiative and Regular Services: Extending its commitment to accessible justice, the Centre has established a Legal Services Clinic at its office located on the first floor of Sadbhavna Bhawan. Inaugurated on 20 February 2024 in collaboration with the Delhi State Legal Services Authority (DSLSA) and the Central District Legal Services Authority, the Clinic functions every Wednesday. It offers free legal guidance and information on government welfare schemes to students, faculty, and non-teaching staff. 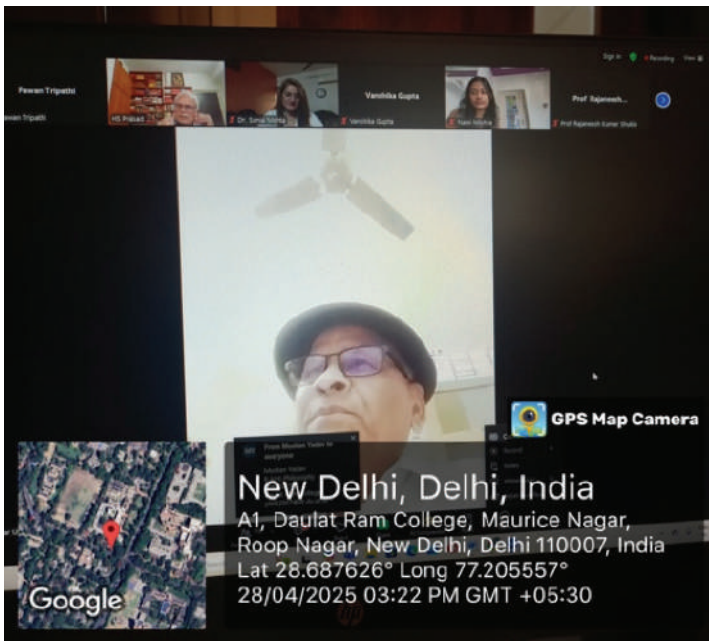


Research Methodology Workshop

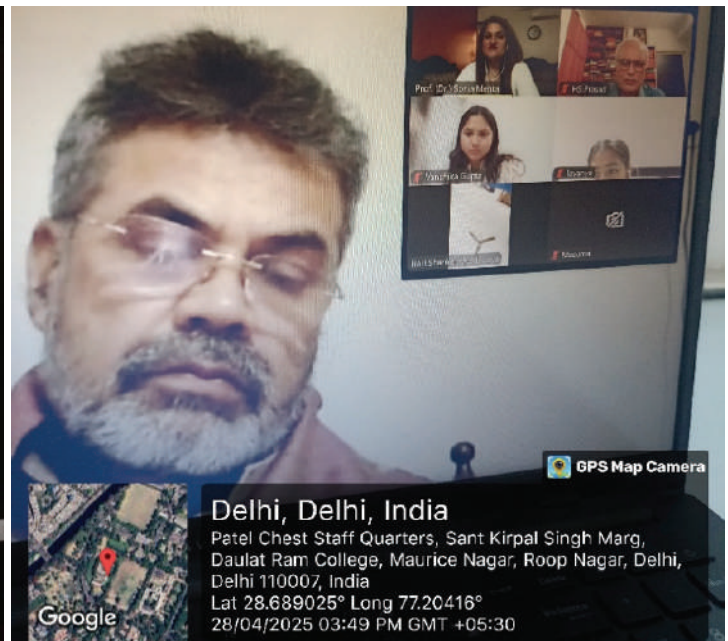

One-Day Workshop on “Divine Healing with the Power of Meditation”

5. Skill Development Centres

Skill Development Centre in Drosophila and Zebrafish Model Organisms

Faculty and Staff Associated with Skill Development Centre: Prof. Padmshree Mudgal, Dr. Neeru Dhamija, Dr. Anita Garg Mangla, Dr. Radhika Gupta, Dr. Anita Goel, Mr. Vikas, Mr. Lalit, Mr. Chaman, Mr. Ashish, Mr. Ravi

This centre was established in 2023 with the seed grant received from Skill Enhancement Courses committee (SEC), University of Delhi. The aim of the centre is to skill-train students in animal husbandry, breeding, handling and application of Drosophila, and Zebrafish model organisms as research models. A skill-trained pool of students will be empowered to embark on a career path in biomedical research labs, and the Pharma and Biotechnology Industry. The centre also serves as a central resource centre providing technical support, bio-materials, and tool kits to other colleges and institutes to perform advanced experiments in Cell Biology, Developmental Biology, neurobiology, genetics, toxicology, Molecular Biology, and drug discovery.

The centre offers an SEC paper: “Drosophila and Zebrafish model organisms in biological studies” and has been successfully running it since 2023. The centre regularly organizes capacity building workshops and training programs in Drosophila and Zebrafish model organisms. More than 1000 students have been trained at the centre. Many visitors including a Russian Delegation visited the centre.

The Zebrafish lab facility in Daulat Ram College was set up in October 2015, jointly by Biochemistry and Zoology Departments in collaboration with CSIR-IGIB, Mathura Road, Delhi, and Sansriti Foundation Delhi. The facility has been funded by Star Innovation projects DU, Star College project DBT, Govt. of India, and Innovation projects DU. It was developed with the aim of providing an alternative *in vivo* non-invasive model system for science education, teaching and research.

Established in 2012 under the aegis of the **DBT Star College Project**, the Drosophila Resource Centre at the Biochemistry Department serves as a premier hub for genetics education. By utilizing *Drosophila melanogaster* as a primary model organism, the Centre bridges the gap between theoretical genetics and hands-on biological research. To date, the Centre has empowered over **500 undergraduate and postgraduate students** across various disciplines, fostering a legacy of academic excellence and institutional collaboration.

The centre acts as a vital resource node, providing essential fly stocks and technical expertise to a network of institutions, including colleges of **DU, MDU, Manav Rachna University, and Sanatan Dharm (P.G.) College**.

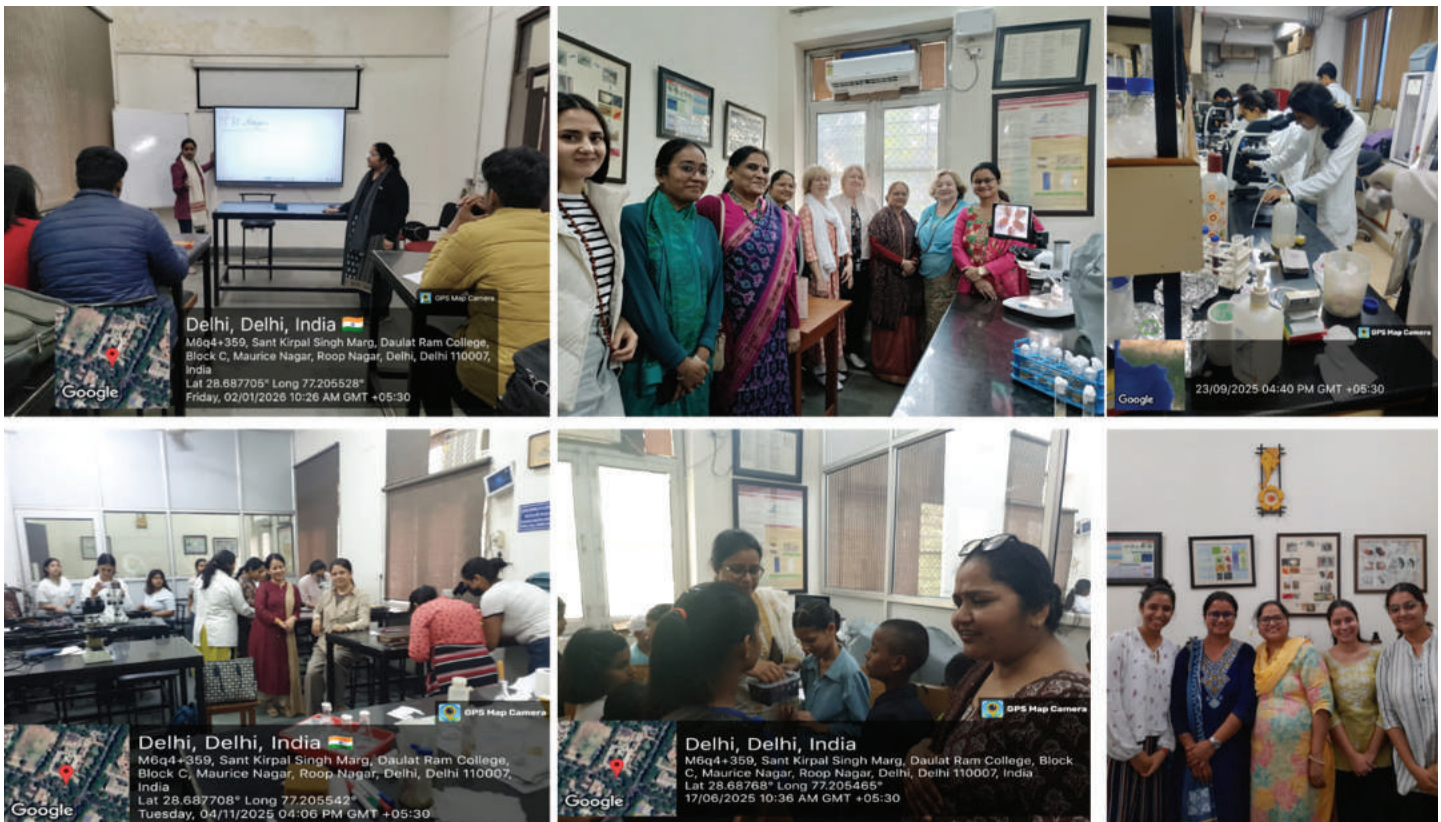

c. Skill Enhancement Centre in Aquaculture

Facility In-charge: Ms. Rohini Arya

Aquaculture Lab is well-designed fish lab facility that integrates advanced fish technology with biological techniques to support diverse skill enhancement papers.

The lab is specialized to teach skill papers, namely: Ornamental fish culture, Fish Feed formulation, Fish breeding and larviculture, Aquaculture entrepreneurship and Pearl Culture. Key components of the Lab facility include aquarium construction and tank designing, maintenance of more than 25 varieties of ornamental fish, incubation tanks, maintenance of brooders, hatchling rearing, water quality management and health monitoring of fish, nutrition and feeding strategies. The lab also focuses on sustainable aquaculture practices.

Lab has recently been awarded Potential for Excellence award by University of Delhi for its efforts in Skill Enhancement Facility.

d. Skill Development Centre on Hydroponics and Aeroponics

Facility In-charge: Dr. Vidhi Chaudhary

The Skill Development Centre on Hydroponics and Aeroponics, established by the Department of Botany, continues to promote the principles of sustainable farming and experiential learning. The primary objective of the facility is to educate students through Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) papers, enabling them to develop practical expertise and entrepreneurial skills in soilless cultivation technologies.

The Centre is equipped with three horizontal units based on the Nutrient Film Technique (NFT), one vertical grow tower, and ten grow bags to provide hands-on training in hydroponic and aeroponic systems. The training includes hands-on experience in media preparation, instrumentation, and knowledge of certification and marketing, which will prove highly beneficial for their future prospects. During the academic session 2025–26, the SEC paper on Hydroponics and Aeroponics was offered in both semesters.



Semester I (August–December 2025):

A total of 40 second-year students from diverse disciplines, including English, Hindi, Economics, B.A. Programme, Mathematics, Botany, Psychology, and Chemistry, were trained. Students gained practical exposure to cultivation techniques, nutrient management, and crop production. During this semester, different varieties of Lettuce were cultivated using the NFT system and the vertical grow tower. Tomato, basil, beetroot, zucchini and tori were cultivated in grow bags. Coco peat was used as the primary growing medium.

Semester II (January–May 2026):

In the ongoing semester, 42 third-year students from various disciplines are undergoing training. This semester places greater emphasis on cultivating plants such as Rocket (Arugula), Coriander and Parsley using multiple growing media including vermiculite, perlite, rockwool, and clay balls in the NFT system and the vertical grow tower. The focus is on the comparative analysis of media performance and enhancing technical understanding of soilless farming systems. Through structured practical sessions and interdisciplinary participation, the Centre continues to strengthen students' technical competencies and encourage innovation and entrepreneurship in sustainable agriculture.

6. Centre for Happiness

The Centre for Happiness, Daulat Ram College, is dedicated to promoting emotional well-being, self-awareness, and holistic development. Through interactive workshops, expert-led sessions, and research-based initiatives, it creates a supportive space where students can explore mental health, understand the science of well-being, and develop practical tools for balanced living.

As part of its November 2025 initiatives, the Centre organised two enriching sessions focused on understanding and experiencing happiness. On 7 November 2025, a Dance Movement Therapy Workshop was conducted by Ms. Radhika Goel, an experienced practitioner. Through guided movement exercises integrating music, dance, and reflection, participants developed greater body awareness, expressed emotions non-verbally, and experienced movement as a therapeutic process.

On 24 November 2025, the Centre hosted a session on the Neuroscience of Happiness, led by Dr. Pooja Swami Sahni, Principal Research Scientist, Mind Lab, IIT Delhi. She presented an accessible, science-based explanation of how the brain processes happiness, highlighting the role of neurochemicals, neural pathways, environment, and daily habits in shaping emotional well-being.

Together, these sessions blended experiential therapy with scientific insight, reinforcing the Centre's commitment to fostering emotional resilience, self-awareness, and holistic well-being among students.

ACADEMIC LABORATORIES OF DEPARTMENTS

The college takes pride in providing well-equipped and carefully maintained laboratories to support all science disciplines, including Biochemistry, Botany, Chemistry, Mathematics, Physics, and Zoology. Additionally, the Departments of Nutrition & Health Education, Mathematics, Commerce, and Psychology have dedicated laboratories designed to meet their specific academic requirements. These facilities create a dynamic practical learning environment that promotes academic excellence and hands-on experience for students.

Biochemistry Laboratory:

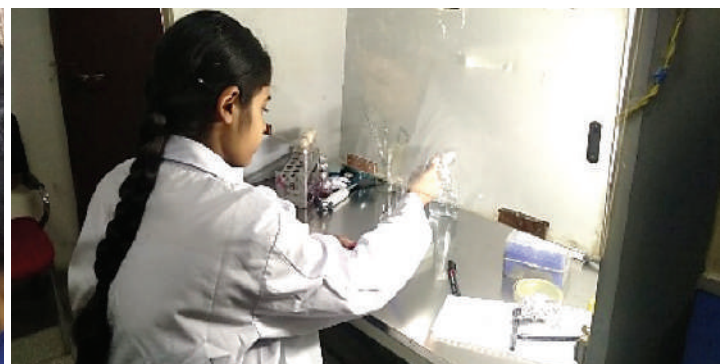
The department has continuously upgraded its infrastructure through various grants received over the years, including DST-FIST (2003–2008), DBC Special Grant (DU-2010), Star College Project (2012–2018), Innovation Projects (2015), Star Innovation Projects (2016), and the Skill Development Grant (2023).

The departmental instrumentation room is equipped with advanced instruments such as a UV-Visible spectrophotometer, ELISA reader, inverted microscope with video screen, multiple binocular and stereo zoom microscopes, and a digital stereo microscope with LCD display. Facilities for DNA and protein electrophoresis with transilluminators, high-speed refrigerated Centrifuges, an ice-making machine and PCR machines are also available.

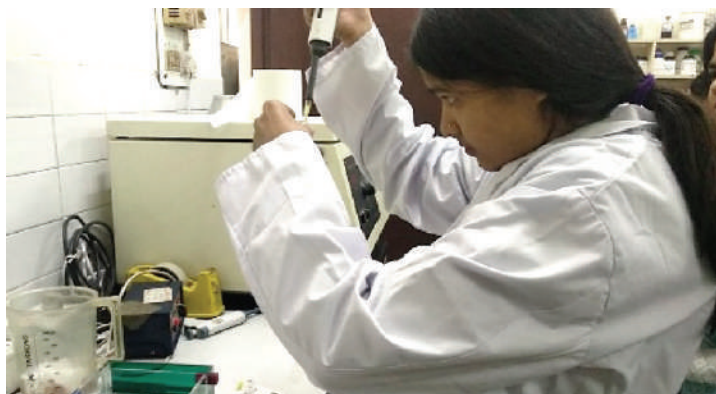

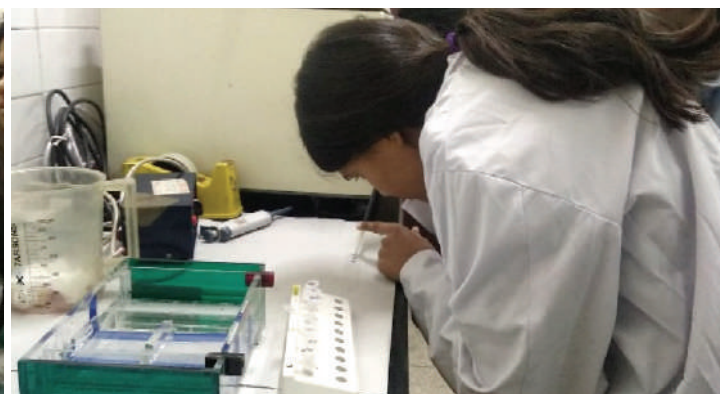

Botany Laboratory:

The laboratories in Botany Department feature cutting-edge equipment such as PCR machines, spectrophotometers, horizontal gel electrophoresis units, UV transilluminators, BOD incubators, plant growth chambers, tabletop centrifuges, binocular microscopes, autoclaves, pH meters, vortexers, micro and macro weighing balances, micropipette sets, glassware, permanent slides, and more. These resources enable students to perform a wide range of experiments with precision.

Among the laboratories, Lab A, Lab B, and the Honors Lab are exclusively dedicated to practical sessions in Metabolism, Plant Physiology, Plant Diversity, Biotechnology, Genetics, Reproductive Biology, Anatomy, Ecology, and other specialized topics. A significant addition to the department's infrastructure is the Bioinformatics Laboratory, which is equipped with computers and specialized software designed to support bioinformatics practicals. This facility empowers students to explore computational applications in biology, enhancing their research and analytical skills.

Plant Tissue Culture Laboratory:

The Tissue Culture Research Lab is mainly used for training the final year students to micro-propagate species of elite trees and also for research projects based on micropropagation of rare and medicinally important plants.

The Culture Room has Horizontal Laminar-air-flow cabinet to raise in vitro Plant Tissue Cultures under sterile conditions, Room Thermometer, Hygrometer and Culture Rack Trolleys fitted with fluorescent lights and automatic timer.

Hydroponics Skill Centre: The centre is designed and maintained under the Skill Development Programme of the university as a part of NEP curriculum. This centre is a dedicated resource aimed at promoting sustainable and soil-less farming techniques. It functions as a hub for both academic training and practical research.

The Instrument cum Preparation Room has basic equipment like High Precision Digital Balance, pH meters, Orbital Shakers, Hot Plates, BOD, Ultra Centrifuge machines, Double Distillation Unit, Hot Air Oven, Vertical and Horizontal Autoclave, Refrigerator and Deep Freezer, Microtome, Simple, Compound, Dissection and High-Resolution Microscopes with In-built Camera, and Inverted Binocular.

The Green House Facility is equipped with controlled conditions of light, humidity and temperature for establishment of in vitro grown plantlets in soil. There is scope for further improvement of the Tissue Culture Research Facilities in the near future.

Chemistry Laboratory:

The chemistry laboratory is a well-equipped facility designed to foster academic excellence and research innovation. It features advanced analytical instruments such as UV-Vis spectrophotometer, Flame Photometer, Rotary Evaporator, Muffle Furnace, centrifuge machine, ice making machine, pH meters, conductivity meters, colorimeters, high-precision electronic balances, desktops, UV light chamber, Hydrothermal autoclave reactor etc. Dedicated research spaces support both undergraduate experiments and faculty-led investigations, ensuring a seamless integration of theoretical knowledge with practical applications. A strong emphasis is placed on laboratory safety, with rigorous protocols in place to maintain a secure working environment. A Fume hood is installed to manage volatile substances. Fire extinguishers are strategically positioned for immediate accessibility. Personal protective equipment like lab coats, gloves and safety goggles are mandatory for all students to minimize exposure risks. Separate bins/containers are installed for waste glass, chemicals and paper to facilitate proper waste disposal.

Physics Laboratory:

The Physics Department has three laboratories, viz. Physics Laboratory – 01 (PL-01), Physics Laboratory – 02 (PL-02), and Physics Laboratory – 03 (PL-03). These laboratories are the hub where students can apply the physics concepts they have learned through theory. PL-01 includes experiments related to the following branches of physics: Mechanics and Thermal Physics. Adjacent to PL-01, the Physics department has a dark room used to conduct experiments on waves and optics, including measurements of various light parameters. PL-02 serves as a vibrant hub for exploring the intricate world of electricity, magnetism, light and matter, and modern physics. PL-03 is a well-equipped space designed to support learning in electrical circuits, waves, and oscillations, analog electronics, and digital electronics. This laboratory is equipped with a wide range of tools and equipment, including breadboards, wires, CROs (Cathode Ray Oscilloscopes), function generators, LEDs, and more. Students can design, build, and test various circuits and systems.

Mathematics Laboratory:

The Department of Mathematics has a computer lab with a total capacity of 25 desktops which are connected via the main server. The lab has the facility of printers on LAN, a projector and a white board. The desktops are well equipped with mathematical softwares such as Mathematica XI, Statistical open-source software R, Latex and Operational Research softwares such as TORA. The department also has a dedicated lab staff for the proper functioning of the lab. Ten new, high-performance desktops with Windows 10 were installed in the lab by the department two years ago and one new AC is installed in the lab in the year 2025. Moreover, the college library has approximately 3,000 books on Mathematics available.

The Computer Laboratory of the Department of Commerce has been meticulously designed to meet the academic and research requirements of both students and faculty. It offers state-of-the-art technology and resources to facilitate their educational pursuits and scholarly projects.

Modern Infrastructure: The laboratory is furnished with high-performance workstations equipped with essential software for commerce education. These include tools for statistical analysis, financial modelling and accounting applications such as Microsoft Excel, Tally and R.

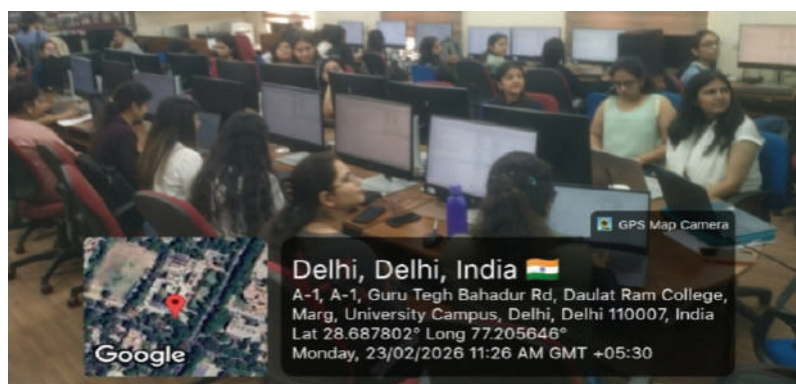
Connectivity and Facilities: High-speed internet access ensures uninterrupted connectivity to online databases, e-learning platforms and scholarly resources. Printing and scanning services are available to support academic documentation needs, while designated collaboration areas promote group discussions, project teamwork and interactive learning.

Technical Assistance: Dedicated technical staff provide reliable support to all users helping them optimize the use of laboratory facilities.

Academic and Research Role: The laboratory serves as a central hub for advancing departmental activities. It offers the following facilities:

- Infrastructure for Research and Academic projects enabling in-depth analysis and innovative contributions to the discipline.
- Facilities for students to utilize digital resources supporting practical experimentation, data analysis and project development essential for academic success and research innovation.

Access Policy: The facility is accessible to all Department of Commerce students and faculty from 8:00 AM to 5:20 PM, Monday to Saturday. This schedule accommodates diverse user requirements effectively.

Neuropharmacology, Drug Delivery & Cancer Research Laboratory (NDCRL):

Neuropharmacology, Drug Delivery and Cancer Research Laboratory (NDCRL) formerly known as Neuropharmacology and Drug Delivery Laboratory (NDDL) is one of the advanced laboratories in the field of cancer research. This lab was established in 2018 by Late Dr. Amar Jyoti. This laboratory provides research training/internship programs for undergraduate, postgraduate and Ph.D. Scholars on “Fundamental Techniques in Cancer Research” (e.g. cancer cell lines culture, 2D/3D culture, cytotoxicity assays, tissues embedding, sectioning, H&E/IHC/IF, microscopy, RNA/Protein expression etc.) as an introduction to experimental research in cancer biology.



Currently, three Ph.D. scholars, Nikita Sharma, Manish Kumar & Simran Rathore are working on pancreatic, colorectal & lymphoma cancers focusing on molecular mechanisms, therapeutic targets, and translational cancer research in the laboratory. Students from different universities also come to NDCRL for summer internships and M.Sc. dissertation work.

This year we trained an International Ph.D. Scholar, Ms. Renu Kushwaha from Palacky University, Czech Republic, Olomouc, Europe. We also trained five M.Sc. students, Purvi Bindal, Nikita Yadav, Ritika Sharma from Kurukshetra University during their summer internship program, one M.Sc. student, Diksha from Amity University completed her six-months dissertation work from NDCRL in June 2025, and another M.Sc. student, Rakshita from Jamia Millia Islamia University joined our Lab in Jan 2026 for her six-month dissertation work.

We also trained undergraduate students (Nidhi Bharadwaj, Samya Jain, Anushika Koul, Poorva Patkar) from Daulat Ram College, University of Delhi, Nidhi Singh from Mata Vaishno Devi University, Jammu & Kashmir and one B. Tech. (Biotechnology) student Surabhi Mudgal from Amity University. We hope that through this laboratory we will not only encourage the students of Daulat Ram College (DRC) but also other universities to achieve greater heights in the field of Cancer Research.

Zoology Laboratory:

The Department of Zoology is equipped with modern laboratories, a dedicated reading room and Zoology Museum that enriches student learning. It also maintains its own library with a strong collection of books and hosts a Drosophila Resource Center, providing hands-on research opportunities for students in genetics and developmental biology. The centre provides internship to graduate students and Dissertation to Post graduate students who intend to have exposure to experimental biology. The Department is also equipped with Aquaculture Lab, a well-designed fish lab facility that integrates advanced fish technology with biological techniques to support diverse skill enhancement papers. The lab is specialized to teach skill papers namely: Ornamental fish culture, Fish Feed formulation, Fish breeding and larvae culture, Aquaculture entrepreneurship and Pearl Culture. Lab has recently been awarded Potential for Excellence award by University of Delhi for its efforts at the Skill Enhancement Facility. Zoology department with its blend of academic rigor, research facilities, and practical exposure fosters a strong foundation for students aspiring to careers in biological sciences.

Psychology Laboratory:

In the year 2025-26, Psychology department has purchased two 65 inches Vgyaan Display Interactive panels with CPU from the upgradation fund. Now, the department has four such interactive panels to equip the labs with latest technology. This helps teachers use visual aid while teaching papers such as Biopsychology, Cognitive-Neuroscience, Clinical Psychology and so on. The students are able to present their work in a more expressive manner. Further, the funds from the operational and maintenance heads are also being utilized judiciously.

NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

The National Cadet Corps (NCC) at Daulat Ram College continues to stand as a symbol of discipline, unity, and purposeful training, with over 50 first-year cadets enrolled and more than 100 cadets receiving structured preparation for the B and C Certificate Examinations during the academic session 2025–26. The year reflected tangible success through exceptional individual achievements, including former Cadet Jyoti Devi who cleared the CISF examination with an All-India Rank of 185, and Cadet Ganga Mehta earning selection into the Indian Naval Academy (INA) through the Cadet Entry Scheme Examination. These milestones reaffirm the unit’s role in shaping cadets into service-oriented leaders with competitive excellence and unwavering commitment.

NCC DRC hosted *Buland '25* on 14 April 2025, a vibrant celebration that strengthened the spirit of patriotism and collective motivation through tributes to military operations and meaningful motivational sessions. The programme was enriched by a captivating Bharatanatyam performance and creative contests such as poster-making and face painting on the occasion of NCC Day. Patriotic engagements, including the ‘Har Ghar Tiranga’ Rally and Republic Day celebrations, reinforced national pride and disciplined participation.

The unit also demonstrated strong civic responsibility through impactful outreach initiatives, including a Swachh Bharat Abhiyan Nukkad Natak at Old Delhi Railway Station and a Nukkad Natak on Sickle Cell Anaemia awareness ensuring social awareness remained central to cadet engagement. Throughout the year, cadets contributed actively to national and community-focused initiatives. Seventy-one cadets participated in the Nationwide ShramDaan Programme, while seventy-five cadets strengthened constitutional awareness through the Preamble Recitation Programme. An Environment Day Rally witnessed the participation of eighty cadets, and a Mass Singing of Vande Mataram was conducted with forty-five cadets, reflecting unity and reverence for national heritage.

The NSS Unit of Daulat Ram College serves as a dynamic platform for empowering youth to actively contribute to society while fostering compassion, inclusivity, and community engagement. Guided by the motto “Not Me, But You,” the unit organizes impactful social initiatives including medical camps, plantation drives, cleanliness campaigns, self-defence training, and awareness programmes. The unit also extends essential support to Visually Challenged Students (VCS), promoting equity and empowerment. Through dedicated volunteers and transformative programmes, NSS DRC continues to inspire meaningful social change.

1. **Nation First: Social Media Campaign** (11/05/2025): The campaign was organized in light of Operation Sindoor, an initiative reflecting the courage displayed by the Indian Armed Forces and encouraging a spirit of patriotism among students. The initiative created a sense of unity and national pride among the youth.

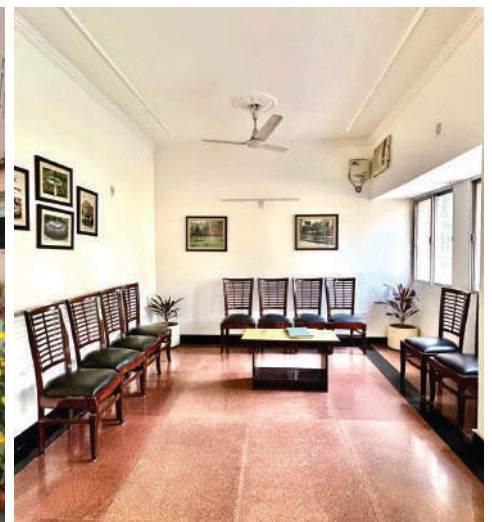

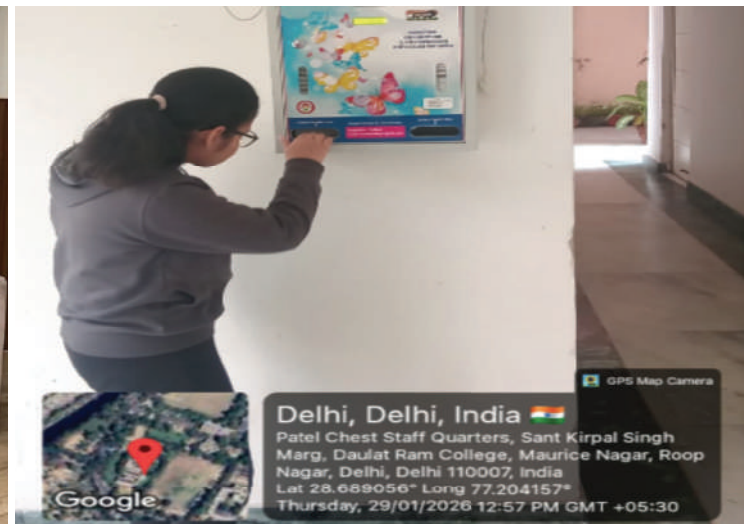

LIBRARY

The College Library functions as a vibrant and dynamic knowledge centre, committed to the effective dissemination of information and the fulfilment of the diverse academic and research needs of its users. It strives to ensure timely access to accurate, relevant, and reliable information, delivering the right information to the right user at the right time.

- **Collection:** The library houses a rich and extensive collection of over one lakh books, complemented by subscriptions to 27 magazines and 11 newspapers. This diverse range of resources effectively supports the academic, research, and intellectual interests of its users across disciplines.
- **Rare Books:** A dedicated section showcases over 530 rare books spanning diverse subjects and disciplines, which have drawn significant interest from users.
- **Special Collection:** A specially curated section features over 410 publications, including noteworthy works related to Daulat Ram College. Highlights include *Shrimad Bhagwat Geeta* in 13 Indian languages and illustrated Kangra paintings, enhancing the user experience.
- **E-Resources and Institutional Memberships:** The library provides access to One Nation One Subscription (ONOS), INFLIBNET, DELNET, and the e-library of the Delhi University Library System (DULS), enabling users to explore e-resources, e-databases, e-books, and e-journals.
- **Infrastructure Development:** Two new wooden gates have been installed in the library on the ground and first floors.
- **Internship Programme:** Under the Library Internship Programme, 12 students from the University of Delhi's School of Open Learning (SOL) and IGNOU completed their internships in the library and gained valuable hands-on experience in library functioning.
- **New Initiatives:** The library has established two new special sections, namely the Indian Knowledge Systems Section (भारतीय ज्ञान परम्परा विभाग) and the North-East Literature Section (उत्तर-पूर्व साहित्य विभाग), for its users.
- **Braille Collection:** A book on the Constitution of India in Braille and a calendar in Braille have been added to the collection.
- **Promotion and Awareness of Research Tools:** The library actively supports research activities and promotes them among students and faculty. The library has introduced hands-on training for students in online reference management tools such as Zotero and Mendeley. Thirty students of the college were trained in the use of the plagiarism detection software "Turnitin" in an International Workshop organised under the IQAC.
- **Orientation Programme:** The library conducted various orientation and interaction programmes during students' library visits and on a request basis regarding the use of the library, its resources, and services.
- **Services for Divyaang:** Upholding the principles of inclusive education, the library subscribes to Braille magazines such as *Jigyasa*, *Mahila Munch*, and *Braille Digest*. Additionally, a Braille edition of the Constitution of India is available for Divyaang students. Linked sites and applications related to Divyaang students are available on the library webpage.



- **Library Automation and Digital Initiative: KIBO Software:** The library has subscribed to advanced KIBO software to create an audio library for Divyaang students. KIBO supports text translation and audio conversion in over 100 languages, facilitating seamless access to study materials. The library promoted access to e-resources and listed various relevant e-resources and tools for library users.

Significant Visits:

- Under the collaborative initiative, namely “एक उड़ान भविष्य की ओर,” of Daulat Ram College and Ekal Sansthan, 30 students of different age groups visited the library. They were oriented to the library resources and services and were also told about the importance of the library in students’ lives.

Navdhara Projects: Promoting Interdisciplinary Research and Innovation

The Navdhara projects undertaken at our institution are visionary initiatives of our dynamic Principal, Prof. Savita Roy, whose vision and leadership continue to inspire excellence across all domains. With her guidance, challenges are consistently transformed into opportunities, fostering innovation and growth. Each initiative reflects her unwavering commitment to nurturing creativity, critical thinking, and collaboration among students and faculty alike. These projects are not merely academic exercises; they symbolize the importance of interdisciplinary research as a cornerstone for advancing knowledge, developing solutions, and driving meaningful progress. The first cycle of projects was initiated during the academic session 2023–2024, marking a significant step in fostering research and innovation within the institution. Looking ahead, the upcoming cycles will also aim to promote student-driven research and continue to emphasize on interdisciplinary collaboration, innovation, and societal relevance. By encouraging diverse participation and supporting projects with strategic funding, the institution seeks to cultivate a robust research culture that not only advances academic knowledge but also generates practical solutions to pressing challenges. With each cycle, the vision is to strengthen the foundation of research excellence, empower researchers, and position the institution as a leader in fostering transformative ideas that contribute meaningfully to societal progress.

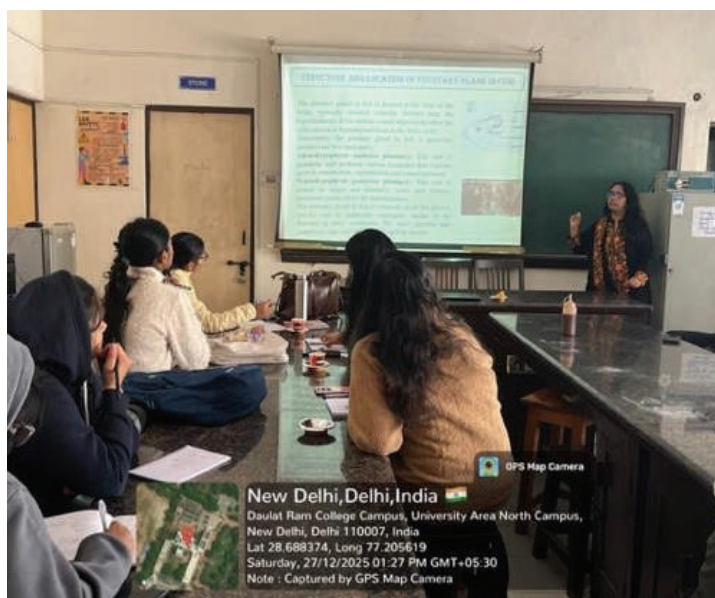
Daulat Ram College has been a pioneer in initiating Skill Development Programmes for over a decade. The programme aims to provide vocational and technical training, foster innovative thinking through multidisciplinary engagement, and facilitate skill upgradation among students. The theme for the academic year 2025–2026 is **“Building Skills for Sustainable Community Development and Enhancing Employability.”**

Various departments proposed skill development courses focusing on community development by promoting skills related to community wellness, social engagement, lifestyle practices, and health awareness. In addition, courses aimed at enhancing professional competency for employability were offered, covering areas such as videography, academic writing, data analysis, psychometry, teamwork, circuit designing, and self-management skills. A total of 1,028 first-year students from 16 departments participated in the Skill Development Programme on ICT Tools held on 11–12 August 2025.

Mentor-Mentee Scheme

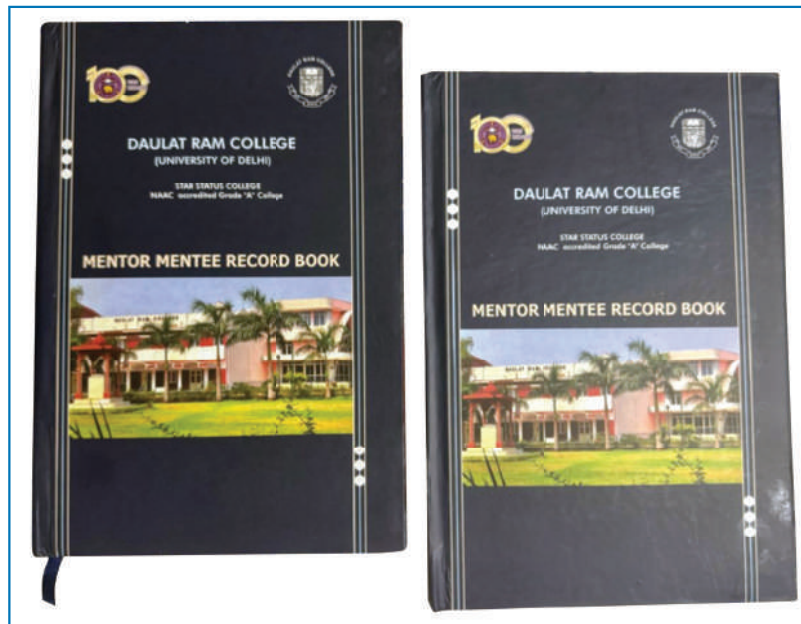
During the academic year, the institution continued the implementation of the Mentor–Mentee Scheme with the objective of providing structured academic guidance, career counselling, and holistic support to students. The scheme is designed to enhance students’ academic performance and encourage their active participation in co-curricular and extracurricular activities, thereby promoting overall personality development.

Under this initiative, each faculty member is assigned a group of 25–30 students to ensure individualized attention and regular academic monitoring. Mentors closely observed students’ academic progress, attendance, participation in activities, and overall well-being. Guidance was provided regarding subject selection, skill enhancement, career planning, and effective adaptation to the Four-Year Undergraduate Curriculum Framework (UGCF) in alignment with the National Education Policy (NEP).

For the current academic session, new mentor–mentee groups were constituted for first-year students to provide personalized guidance from the commencement of their academic journey. The mentor–mentee groups formed in the previous academic year for second- and third-year students continued without interruption to maintain consistency and sustained support.

To strengthen communication and systematic documentation, mentor–mentee diaries were distributed to first-year students. These diaries facilitate regular interaction, record-keeping of meetings, identification of academic concerns, and monitoring of students’ progress throughout the year.

The mentor–mentee scheme continues to serve as an effective mechanism for fostering a supportive academic environment and ensuring the comprehensive development of students. Students pursuing research in the fourth year under the UGCF are also guided by their mentors, who provide academic and personal support alongside the supervision of their research supervisors. This coordinated mentoring helps students navigate the research process effectively and strengthens their academic engagement.

ECO-FRIENDLY INITIATIVES:

i. Green Ride – Last Mile Connectivity

The **Green Ride initiative** is a structured public bicycle-sharing programme introduced by Daulat Ram College (DRC) in collaboration with UTU Mobility Pvt. Ltd., as part of the College's ongoing commitment to environmental sustainability and responsible campus development. The initiative encourages cycling as a healthy, affordable, and eco-friendly mode of transportation for students, faculty, and visitors within the Delhi University North Campus.

Green Ride helps reduce dependence on motorized vehicles, thereby lowering carbon emissions and supporting the College's broader environmental and climate action objectives. It facilitates convenient intra-campus mobility, enabling students to move easily between academic blocks, laboratories, libraries, and other institutional facilities. By incorporating sustainable transportation into campus infrastructure, the College continues to promote a cleaner and greener academic environment.

Under this programme, **twenty bicycles** have been deployed within the College premises. Provision has been made to expand the fleet in response to growing demand, ensuring scalability and uninterrupted service. The operating partner provides concessional usage plans for students, including discounted ride charges, subsidized subscription models, and complimentary rides for durations of up to fifteen minutes, thereby enhancing accessibility and encouraging greater participation.

Designated docking and service stations have been established within the campus to facilitate systematic parking, regular maintenance, and efficient operations. These facilities ensure that the bicycles remain safe, functional, and readily available for use.

Overall, the Green Ride initiative represents an important step toward sustainable campus practices by promoting eco-friendly mobility, encouraging physical well-being, and strengthening the College's commitment to environmental responsibility and sustainable development.

ii. Solar Power Integration for Lower Electricity Usage

Building upon its continued commitment to sustainability and responsible energy management, Daulat Ram College maintains the successful operation of its **333 kWdc rooftop solar photovoltaic power plant**, commissioned in collaboration with Talf Solar India Pvt. Ltd. This significant initiative marks the College's steady transition toward clean and renewable energy sources and remains a cornerstone of its environmental strategy.

The installation continues to contribute substantially to reducing the College's annual electricity expenditure, resulting in considerable long-term financial savings. Alongside economic benefits, the solar power plant offsets approximately **150–160 metric tonnes of CO₂ equivalent (tCO₂e)** emissions annually, reaffirming the institution's active role in climate change mitigation and environmental responsibility.

Integrated with the grid infrastructure, the system enables the export of surplus electricity, ensuring optimal utilisation of generated power and improving overall energy efficiency within the campus.

With the addition of a **new academic building on campus**, the overall electricity consumption of the College is expected to increase. However, the existing solar power infrastructure will continue to play a crucial role in meeting a significant portion of the energy demand, thereby reducing dependence on conventional electricity sources and supporting sustainable energy use.

The continued functioning of this solar energy infrastructure underscores the College's enduring commitment to sustainable development, energy efficiency, and environmentally responsible practices. Through this initiative, Daulat Ram College continues to set a progressive benchmark for sustainability in higher education.

iii. Recycling Unit: Promoting Zero-Discharge and Sustainable Practices

Established in 2015, the Recycling Unit at Daulat Ram College was created with the vision of achieving zero-



discharge from the institution. The unit focuses on the collection, segregation, and recycling of institutional waste, including leaf litter, waste assignments, cardboard packaging materials, and plastic bottles.

Waste Management and Recycling Practices: The unit is equipped with the following advanced machinery to manage and recycle waste efficiently:

- A leaf shredder machine that cuts leaf litter into smaller pieces, which are then composted in bins using essential microbes. The mature compost is ready within 3–4 weeks and is used as fertilizer.
- Paper recycling machinery-including pulp makers, univats, hydraulic presses, and a calendaring machine which enables the production of white recycled paper from waste paper and brown paper from cardboard.

The recycled materials are transformed into useful resources such as biocomposts, carry bags, folders, and paintings. These products are sold in the market, and the proceeds are reinvested to enhance recycling activities.

New Initiatives and Developments

- An aerobin was recently acquired to compost green canteen waste, turning fruit and vegetable peels into manure within 40 days.
- The unit maintains a herbal garden, cultivating medicinal and air-purifying plants like aloe vera, tulsi, and brahmi.
- An incinerator donated by Ramky Foundation (concessionaires of MCD) under CSR scheme was installed in new building girl's washrooms.

Skill Development and Internships The unit employs two workers and conducts hands on workshops to teach recycling processes. It also offers internships for Daulat Ram College students, providing them with valuable training through skill development workshops. These programs help students learn effective recycling techniques and ways to create useful items from waste. A paper making workshop was held on 10th January 2026 for students in collaboration with the Eco club.

Collaborations and Awareness Campaigns A workshop on 26th June 2025 was conducted for the Safai Karmachari's of the Daulat Ram College by MCD officials in Collaboration with recycling unit to spread awareness about waste segregation. In August 2025 students participated in an awareness session conducted by MCD along with recycling unit to educate students about the reduction and segregation of waste. On 9th February 2026 an awareness program with Nukkad Natak was conducted by MCD officials for students on waste segregation and management.

Through these initiatives, the Recycling Unit continues to promote a culture of sustainability, innovation, and responsibility, setting a benchmark for zero-discharge practices within educational institutions. A tour of the recycling unit was conducted for the students from Ekal foundation as a part of community outreach program entitled 'Bhavishya ki aur ek Udan' was organized on 16th June 2025.

Awards: Green campus award by National Edu Trust of India was awarded to Daulat Ram College to recognize its outstanding contribution to sustainability on 10th June 2025.

iv. Green Campus Initiative

The Garden Committee of Daulat Ram College continues to play a vital role in sustaining and enhancing the ecological landscape of the campus. The Committee actively oversees tree plantation drives, lawn development, seasonal landscaping, and the maintenance of the campus green cover, thereby ensuring a clean, aesthetically appealing, and environmentally sustainable environment.

The Committee also participates annually in the prestigious **Annual Flower Show organized by the University of Delhi**. At the **68th Annual Flower Show (2026)**, the Garden Committee achieved remarkable success by securing **twelve prizes across various competitive categories**, reflecting its horticultural excellence and dedicated efforts toward campus beautification.



In collaboration with **Ekal Sansthan**, the College organized a four-day outreach programme from **16–19 June 2025**, aimed at promoting educational and holistic development among village students. As part of this initiative, the Garden Committee conducted a **plantation drive on 19 June 2025 at the College Sports Complex**. During the drive, **twenty-eight children aged 6–13 years** actively participated in planting saplings, fostering environmental awareness and community engagement at an early age.

Further strengthening its commitment to sustainable practices, the Garden Committee, in association with **Vasundhara – The Botanical Association**, organized an event titled **“Grow What You Throw” on 15 January 2026**. The programme witnessed the participation of **more than twenty-five students** and aimed to promote sustainable living through waste management and the creative reuse of discarded materials. The activity provided students with practical insights into environmental conservation and resource optimization.

Subsequently, on **28 January 2026**, the Garden Committee, in collaboration with **Vasundhara – The Botanical Association**, conducted a workshop titled **“Kokedama: An Introduction to Living Art.”** The workshop introduced students to the Japanese Kokedama gardening technique, a sustainable and container-free plant-growing practice that promotes eco-friendly alternatives to plastic pots and conventional horticultural methods. **More than sixty students** participated in the workshop, which emphasized hands-on horticultural training and experiential learning.

Through these initiatives, the Garden Committee continues to strengthen environmental stewardship, promote sustainable practices, and cultivate ecological awareness among students and the wider academic community.

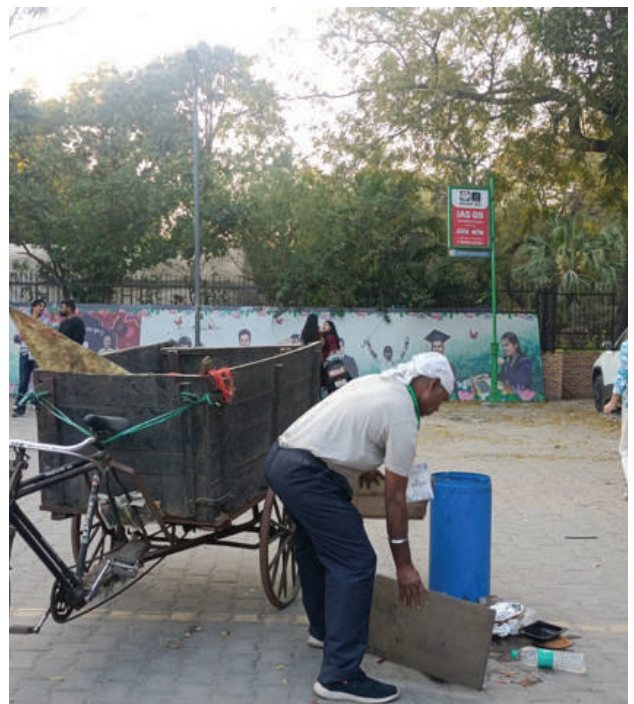

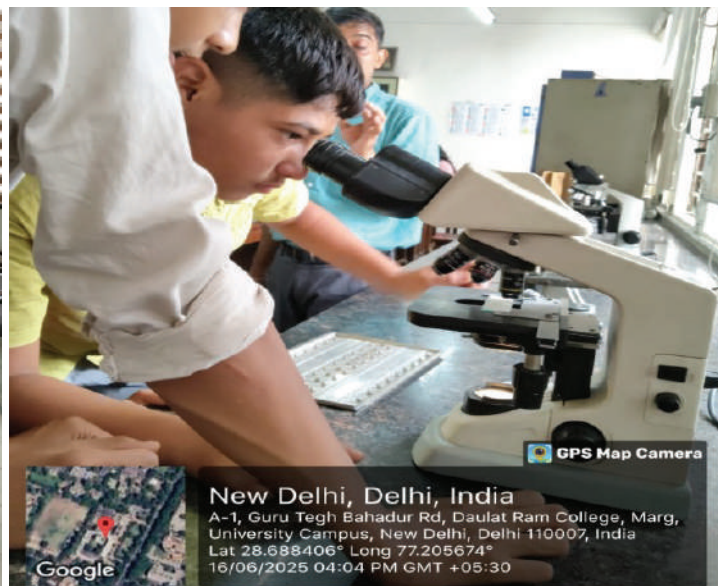

Need assessment surveys were conducted to identify areas where the villages are progressing well and those where further guidance and support may be required. Prior to initiating work in the villages, the team also met with the **Block Development Officer** to discuss the objectives and scope of the outreach activities.

Department of Biochemistry, Daulat Ram College organized an Outreach Program, on the topic '**Role of Model Organisms in Research**' in collaboration with **Sardar Patel Vidyalaya**. The main objective of the three-day program was to introduce the basics of research and model organisms to the students, and build their interest in the research field.

The programme was conducted over three days and provided students with hands-on exposure to important model organisms and fundamental molecular biology techniques. On the first day, students were introduced to the model organisms *Danio rerio* (zebrafish) and *Caenorhabditis elegans* (roundworm). The lecture sessions focused on their biological significance, life cycles, advantages as model organisms, and their role in studying diseases such as cancer. Students were also given the opportunity to handle the fish and observe live zebrafish eggs and embryos under the microscope, where they could clearly see stages of cell division and developing organs.

On the second day, the sessions introduced students to *Escherichia coli* and bacterial differentiation. They learned the technique of Gram staining and participated in practical demonstrations of major biochemical and molecular biology techniques such as Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) and Gel Electrophoresis, gaining direct exposure to these laboratory methods.

On the third day, students were introduced to another widely used model organism, *Drosophila melanogaster* (fruit fly). They studied its life cycle, observed different genetic mutations, and learned how to differentiate between male and female flies through microscopic observation. The day also included an interactive discussion session where students presented their own research ideas and findings. They were encouraged to explore further reading



and design potential research projects. Throughout the programme, the students displayed great enthusiasm and curiosity, actively engaging with the sessions and raising thoughtful questions that were addressed in detail by the faculty members. The programme concluded with the distribution of certificates to all participants.

An Outreach Programme – “FLOW TO GROW”

“Flow to Grow,” an outreach programme under **WINGS: A Navdhara Project**, was organized on March 30, 2025, to promote menstrual hygiene and awareness among underprivileged women and girls. The event aimed to break social taboos surrounding menstruation and encourage healthy practices through education and community engagement. Key activities included the distribution of sanitary pads to promote safe menstrual practices, awareness sessions on menstrual health, prevention of urinary tract infections (UTIs), and reproductive health, as well as discussions on simple home remedies for common health issues. A total of 50 women and girls participated in the programme, which helped strengthen self-confidence and encouraged openness in discussing sensitive health topics. The programme successfully contributed to breaking taboos, promoting awareness, and empowering participants with knowledge for better health management.

Key Outcomes:

1. Distribution of sanitary pads, helping reduce stigma associated with menstruation.
2. Awareness and education on the prevention and management of UTIs.
3. Sharing simple and effective home remedies for common health concerns.
4. Promotion of openness and awareness regarding menstrual health.



Participants appreciated the programme for the valuable information, resources, and support provided, and expressed gratitude for the opportunity to discuss menstrual health openly. By fostering health awareness and challenging existing taboos, the initiative empowered women and girls by enhancing their confidence, dignity, and self-care practices. This effort marks an important step toward improving community health and promoting positive social change.

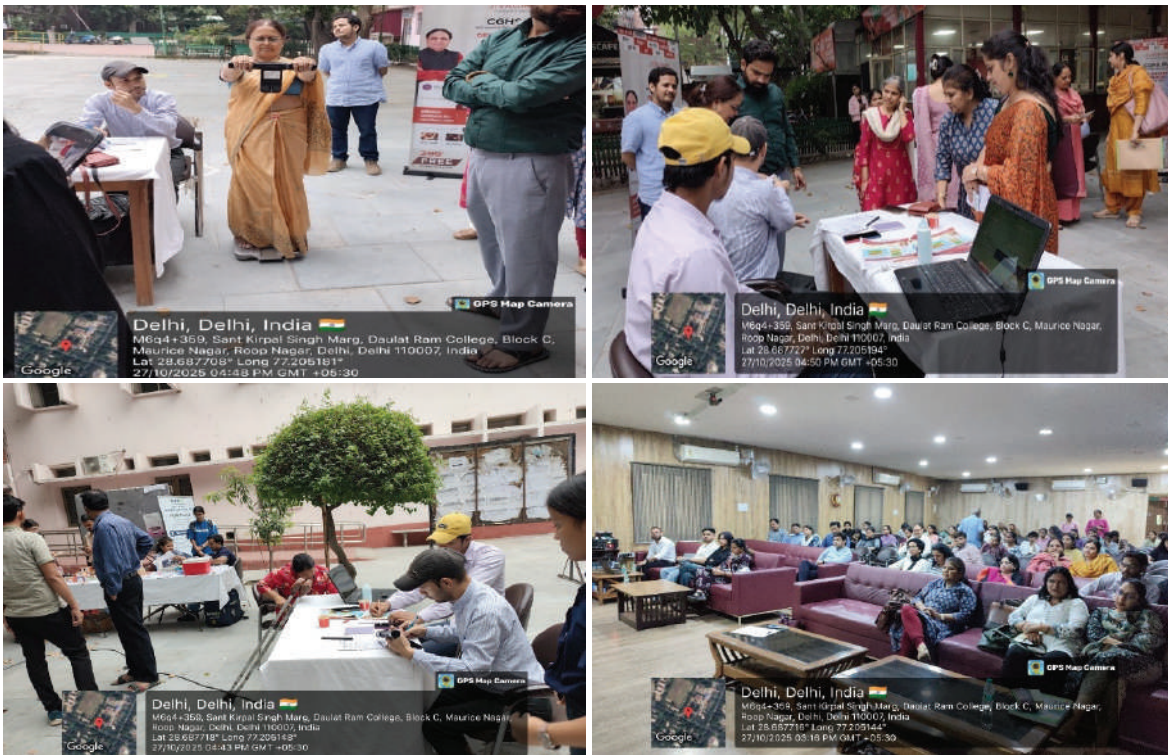
Empowering women through health education, hygiene awareness, and the distribution of essential resources

b. Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) and Agreements

The College has entered into several Memoranda of Understanding and collaborative agreements with organizations, institutions, and individuals. These partnerships aim to foster academic exchange and contribute to the continuous enhancement of institutional infrastructure, facilities, and student opportunities.

1. An MOU was signed on 20th September 2025 between Daulat Ram College and Tihar Jail Factory for the procurement of furniture and stationery manufactured by Tihar Jail Factory; to support rehabilitation and skill development programs at Tihar Jail while fulfilling DRC's furniture and stationery requirements.
2. On 12th April 2025, an MOU was signed between the college and Ekal Sansthan for setting up Campus Ekal Study Circle on DRC campus to provide opportunities for students to learn about rural & tribal India challenges through seminars, debates, and field visits under Ekal Rural Immersion Program (ERI).
3. An MOU was signed on 12th November 2025 between the college and Autocraft Towers Pvt Ltd for the establishment of "Mushroom Culture Skill Enhancement Project" - a Mushroom Unit within DRC premises for academic, training, and research purposes; to facilitate hands-on training for faculty, students, and researchers in mushroom cultivation techniques.
4. The College maintains an active Memorandum of Understanding with NIELIT Delhi Centre to facilitate access to skilled and technically proficient IT professionals for institutional requirements. The collaboration supports capacity building and strengthens the technological ecosystem of the College.
5. The Western Dance Society continues its professional collaboration with Mr. Bhomik Gaba for Annual Dance Production performances at major IIT events, University of Delhi festivals, and other prestigious institutional platforms. This partnership enhances student exposure to high-calibre cultural circuits and professional performance spaces.
6. The College sustains its collaboration with Vardhman Mahavir Medical College and Safdarjung Hospital for organising health check-up camps, affordable diagnostic screenings, counselling services, and educational sessions on reproductive health. The initiative aims to promote health awareness and reduce stigma surrounding reproductive health concerns within the campus community.
7. Women's Development Cell actively collaborates with Jove Conscious Foundation under the project Kalakriti, facilitating structured skill-based training programmes such as knot-making, crochet products, and creative crafts, along with workshops and documentary initiatives.
8. The College continues its academic partnership with Sahayata – Nutrition, Health, Education & Research Foundation to enable student participation in Public Health and Community Nutrition activities. The collaboration also supports academic staff involvement in Continuing Nutrition Education (CNE), research initiatives, and the organisation of joint seminars, conferences, and scientific events.
9. The College maintains an ongoing Agreement for Sale and Supply with Moon Beverages Limited to ensure the regulated availability of beverages within the campus, contributing to student and staff convenience.
10. An operational License Deed with GCMF Ltd. (Amul) facilitates the functioning of an Amul Parlour within the College premises, providing dairy and allied food products to students and staff.



11. An MOU was signed on 4th August 2025, between Daulat Ram College and NRAI School of Mass Communication, New Delhi, to promote academic collaboration, training, workshops, and industry-oriented learning opportunities in the field of media and communication.
12. On 22nd November 2025, a Lease/Rent Agreement (less than one year) was executed between Daulat Ram College and Mr. Prajwal Chauhan for short-term rental arrangements as per mutually agreed terms.
13. On 1st January 2026, an Agreement was signed between Daulat Ram College and M/s U.S. Infotech for providing manpower/services support to the college as per agreed contractual terms.
14. The Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) signed on 7th March 2024 between Daulat Ram College and Rekhi Foundation for Happiness, University of Delhi, for the establishment of the Rekhi Centre of Excellence for the Science of Happiness, continues to remain in force during the academic year 2025–26. The collaboration sustains its commitment to promoting academic engagement, research, training programmes, workshops, and capacity-building initiatives in the field of the Science of Happiness and well-being.
15. The Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) entered into during the academic year 2024–25 between Daulat Ram College, University of Delhi, and TALF Energy India Private Limited for the establishment of a grid-connected rooftop solar photovoltaic power plant under the RESCO model continues to be operational in the academic year 2025–26. The initiative remains focused on advancing renewable energy adoption on campus, reducing the institution's carbon footprint, and ensuring sustainable and cost-effective energy consumption.
16. A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was executed on 1st November 2025 between Daulat Ram College, University of Delhi, and UTU Mobility Private Limited, with the objective of providing vehicle-sharing, primarily electric mobility services, within the college campus for the benefit of students.
17. On 7th July 2025, an E-Stamp paper (Stamp Duty ₹100) was issued by the Government of NCT of Delhi for an agreement executed between Daulat Ram College (First Party) and Madan Tent and Light House (Second Party). The agreement, executed under Article 6(2)(a), pertains to the provision of services, with no consideration amount involved and no deposit of title deeds applicable.

c. Orientation Programme for Freshers (2025–26)

Session I: “From Classrooms to Boardrooms: Uncover the Power of AI and its Real-World Impact”

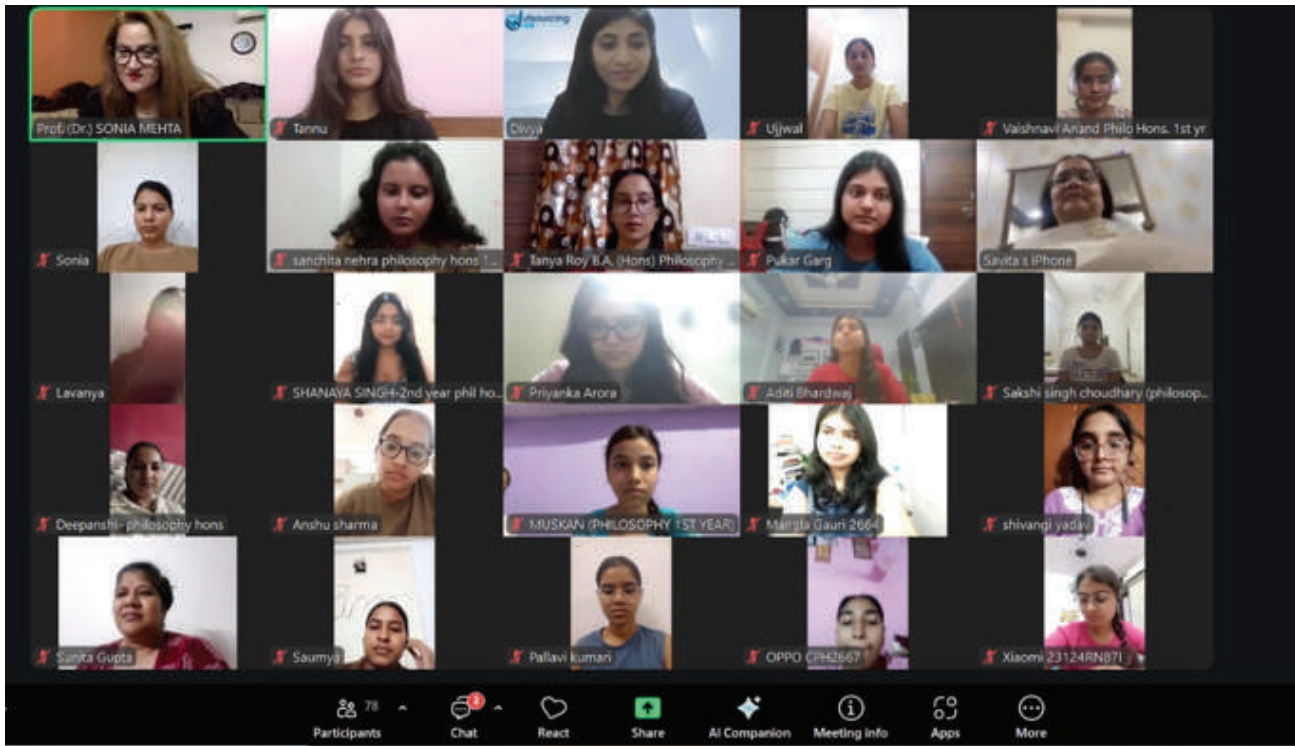

ECA Admissions 2025–26: July 2025 Daulat Ram College served as the University Nodal Centre for ECA Admissions in the Quiz category for the academic year 2025-26. The ECA Admissions Committee efficiently screened and evaluated applicants' certificates in accordance with university guidelines.

On July 22, 2025, the entrance test was conducted at the college premises with the assistance of an extended faculty committee and administrative staff. Around 1,000 students had applied for the exam, and approximately 150 of those declared eligible by the screening committee took it. The documents/certificates of the eligible candidates verified virtually earlier were physically verified on the day of the written exam, and all the grievances were resolved in accordance with the defined parameters. The evaluation of answer scripts and document verification were completed seamlessly. The results of the entrance test, along with certificate screening outcomes, were promptly submitted to the university within the stipulated time.

Visit of the Russian Delegation to Daulat Ram College On December 6, 2025, a delegation from Russia visited Daulat Ram College, University of Delhi, New Delhi, India. दौलतराम महाविद्यालय की दूरदर्शी प्राचार्या प्रो. सविता रॉय के कुशल मार्गदर्शन एवं संरक्षण में 5 अप्रैल, 2023 को 'राजभाषा प्रकोष्ठ' का विधिवत गठन किया गया। इस प्रकोष्ठ की स्थापना का मूल ध्येय राजभाषा हिन्दी की संवैधानिक मर्यादा को अक्षुण्ण बनाए रखना, कार्यालयी हिन्दी की प्रासंगिकता को प्रतिपादित करना तथा प्रशासनिक कार्य-संस्कृति में भाषाई चेतना का प्रसार करना है। महाविद्यालय अपने शुरुआती दौर से ही राजभाषा हिन्दी के संवर्धन हेतु पूर्णतः प्रतिबद्ध रहा है। जहाँ प्रारंभिक वर्षों में प्राशासनिक कार्यों का निष्पादन मात्र पच्चीस प्रतिशत ही हिन्दी में होता था, वहीं निरंतर प्रयासों और भाषाई निष्ठा के फलस्वरूप वर्तमान में यह गौरवशाली आँकड़ा साठ प्रतिशत की सीमा को पार कर चुका है। संस्थान का चरम लक्ष्य भविष्य में समस्त आधिकारिक एवं प्रशासनिक कार्यों को शत-प्रतिशत हिन्दी में संपन्न करना है। राजभाषा प्रकोष्ठ द्वारा आयोजित विविध कार्यशालाओं और गतिविधियों के माध्यम से न केवल शैक्षणिक व गैर-शैक्षणिक कर्मचारियों की कार्य-दक्षता में अभूतपूर्व वृद्धि हुई है, अपितु प्रशासनिक पत्राचार में हिन्दी के प्रयोग के प्रति एक सकारात्मक एवं ऊर्जावान परिवेश का सृजन हुआ है।

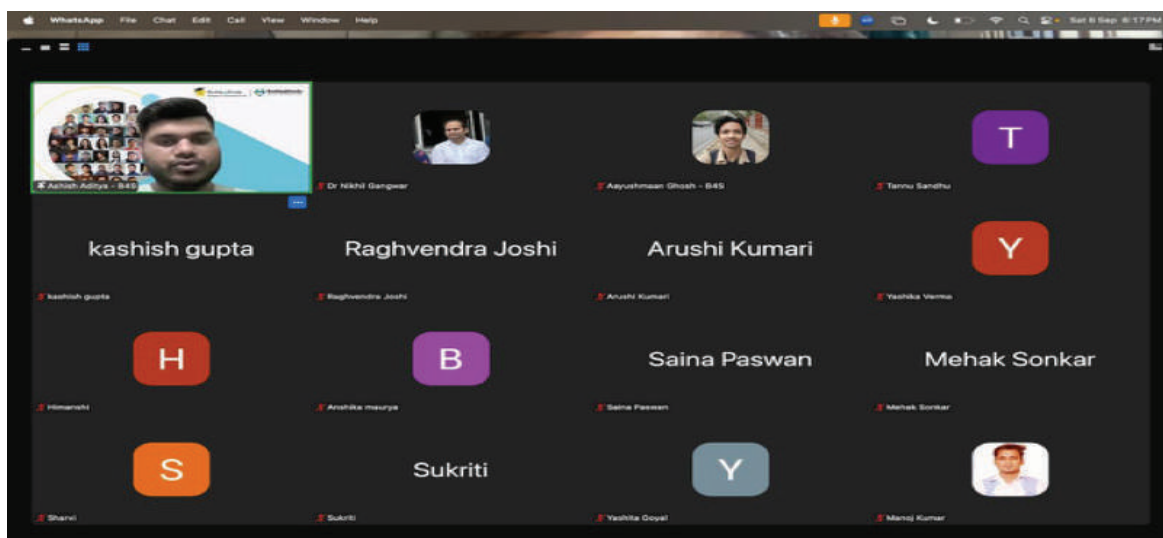
h. Student Amenities Committee

The Student Amenities Committee is committed to ensuring essential amenities and comprehensive support for students. It functions through four key sub-committees: **Scholarships, Fee Concession, Medical Room, and Water & Sanitation**. These sub-committees work collectively to promote student welfare by addressing medical needs, maintaining hygiene standards, providing financial assistance, and awarding scholarships based on merit, socio-economic background, category, and need. The Committee regularly monitors facilities, makes recommendations, and oversees implementation to foster an inclusive and supportive academic environment.

Fee concession forms were issued to provide financial support to economically disadvantaged students. This year, a total of 220 undergraduate and postgraduate students were selected for fee waivers, out of which 4 students received full-fee waivers. The remaining eligible students were granted concession amounts according to the existing institutional policy, which considers factors such as family income and special circumstances. Scholarship-related activities were supervised by the Institutional Nodal Officer, Dr. Nikhil Gangwar, with assistance from Mr. Kailash Kumar from the Accounts Department. Beneficiaries of various scholarship schemes submitted their renewal applications, and the majority of students have already received their scholarship amounts for the current financial year.

The Student Amenities Committee works proactively to strengthen student support systems and ensure that no student is deprived of opportunities due to financial or infrastructural constraints. Students are guided to benefit from various scholarship schemes, including those offered through the **National Scholarship Portal (NSP)**, the **INSPIRE Scholarship**, the **Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme (PMSSS)** for Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, the **Uttar Pradesh Government Scholarship**, the Scholarship by the **Welfare of Scheduled Caste and Backward Classes Department**, Government of Haryana, the SC/ST/OBC Scholarship of the Government of the **National Capital Territory of Delhi**, the **Help the Blind Foundation** Scholarship, the **Central Sanskrit University** Scholarship for the Development of Sanskrit Education, along with other private scholarships. In collaboration with Buddy4Study, the Committee organized a webinar on the Raman Kant Munjal Scholarships (2025-26) on 6th September 2025 to guide students about eligibility, application procedures, and benefits.

i. Anti-Ragging Committee

As part of the nationwide observance of Anti-Ragging Week (12–18th August 2025), the Anti-Ragging Committee of Daulat Ram College, University of Delhi, observed Anti-Ragging Day with a day-long programme on **19th August 2025**. The initiative aimed to sensitize students, especially first-year entrants, as well as faculty and staff, about ragging, its consequences, and the legal framework to prevent it. The programme was graced by Shri Anant Mittal, IPS, Addl. DCP, North District, Delhi Police, as the Distinguished Speaker, accompanied by ACP Maurice Nagar, Shri Vikas (IPS).

Proceedings: Shri Anant Mittal keynote speaker clarified that ragging is not tradition but a criminal offence. Citing real-life cases, including the Aman Kachroo case of 2009, he explained the psychological, social, and legal consequences of ragging. He sensitized students on the UGC Regulations, punishments, and safety measures, and highlighted police initiatives such as Vamika Van, dedicated PCR vehicles, and the upcoming Booth at Faculty Gate 4 staffed by women officers. His talk strongly conveyed the message of vigilance, accountability, and the necessity of raising one's voice. Students and staff engaged in a lively dialogue, raising concerns about perceptions of bias against police, online reporting mechanisms, response times, and campus safety. Shri Mittal encouraged open questioning, remarking, "To find the truth, you need to ask questions." Memesis, the theatre society of DRC, staged a compelling performance portraying the emotional and psychological impacts of ragging. The act served as a strong call to action, urging students to stand against intimidation and harassment. A documentary on anti-ragging was screened, reinforcing the message through visual storytelling along with a short video highlighting the initiatives and efforts of the Anti-Ragging Committee in sensitizing students. Members of the Anti-Ragging Committee introduced themselves along with the student members to familiarise students with points of contact for guidance and reporting. An interactive quiz tested participants' awareness of anti-ragging laws, punishments, and preventive measures.

A creative selfie booth was placed at campus allowing students to pose with anti-ragging pledge messages, making the campaign both engaging and memorable. The programme concluded with a collective pledge by students, faculty, and staff to uphold dignity, inclusivity, and zero tolerance against ragging, reaffirming the college's commitment to a safe and empowering campus.

In her closing note, Dr. Mangla reminded students that if they face any issue or concern, they should not hesitate to approach the Anti-Ragging Committee members as well as student representatives for support, guidance, and timely redressal. She reiterated that the committee stands committed to ensuring that every student feels safe, respected, and empowered on campus. The event was covered by FM radio on FM gold where Dr. Mangla shared insights with their team.

j. National Conference on “NEP-2020: Implementation, Challenges and Way-Forward” held on 19th – 21st December 2025

Daulat Ram College organised the first-ever Conference for Principals on “NEP-2020: Implementation, Challenges and Way-forward” in collaboration with the **Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR)** from 19th–21st December 2025 under the esteemed guidance of our Principal, Prof. Savita Roy. The inaugural session was graced by our Hon’ble Chairperson, Sh. Mukul Gupta, Vice-Principal Prof. Priti Malhotra, and IQAC Convener Prof. Padmshree Mudgal. Principals and Directors from 38 colleges and institutes of higher education from all over India actively participated in the conference. The sessions focused on the challenges associated with the implementation of NEP-2020, deliberated on emerging opportunities, and explored ways to strengthen its structure. k. Faculty Development Programme: NEP Orientation & Sensitization

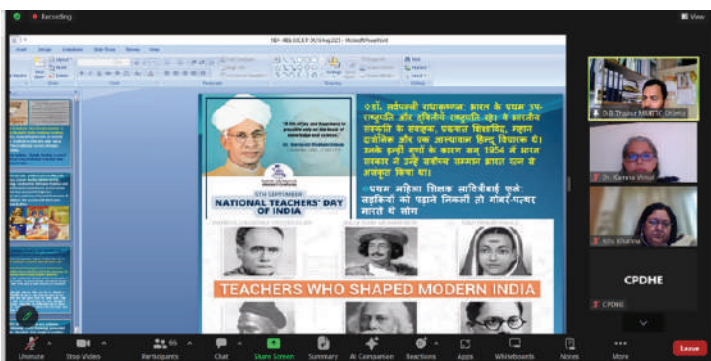

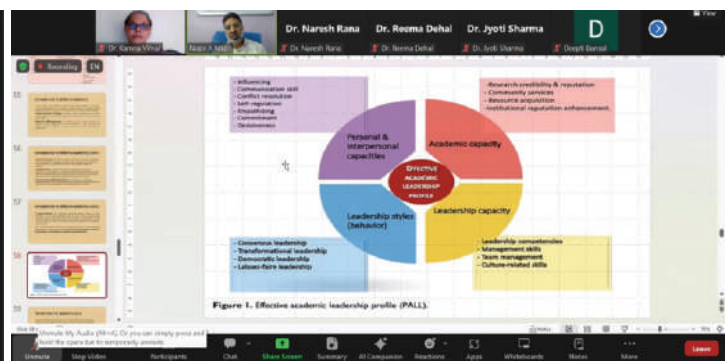

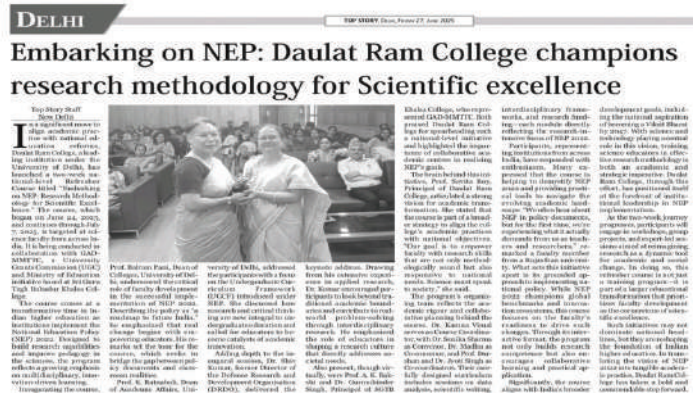

CYBER CELL

The **Cyber Cell** of Daulat Ram College continued its efforts during the academic session **2025–26** to promote cyber awareness, responsible digital behaviour, and interdisciplinary learning within the college community. Established in 2016, the Cell functions as a proactive platform that encourages students to become informed digital citizens while engaging ethically with emerging technologies. Through seminars, webinars, and collaborative initiatives, the society worked to sensitise students about contemporary cyber challenges and opportunities. The academic year began with an **Online Orientation on 8 August 2025**, which introduced newly admitted students to the objectives, organisational structure, and activities of the Cyber Cell, while emphasising the importance of cyber awareness and responsible digital practices. This was followed by the **Fresher’s Connect Meet on 19 August 2025**, an interactive gathering designed to foster community building and encourage meaningful interaction between new members and the existing team. The event helped strengthen peer networks and provided freshers with insights into the society’s ongoing initiatives and areas of engagement.

As part of its academic outreach, the Cell organised an interdisciplinary **webinar** titled **“From Hackers to Helices” on 12 September 2025** in collaboration with the BioSoc of Delhi Technological University. The session explored the growing interface between cybersecurity and bioinformatics, encouraging students to think beyond traditional disciplinary boundaries and appreciate the role of digital security in emerging scientific domains. Shortly thereafter, the **seminar “From Bazaar to Bytes: India’s Digital Commerce Revolution & Asia’s E-Frontier”** was held on **17 September 2025**, providing analytical insights into the rapid expansion of India’s digital economy and the transformation of commerce through technological innovation. Participants were introduced to key trends in e-commerce, entrepreneurship, and digital transformation, enabling them to understand the broader socio-economic implications of technological advancement.

The Cyber Cell also focused on promoting legal awareness and ethical digital conduct among students. In this regard, a **“Seminar on Cyber Laws and Ethics of Using Social Media”** was organised on **7 October 2025** in collaboration with O. P. Jindal Global University. The session highlighted important aspects of cyber legislation, responsible social media usage, and the significance of digital accountability in an increasingly connected world. Another **webinar** titled **“Hack the Hacker: Mastering the Attacker Mindset”** was organised in collaboration with the Incubation Cell of Motilal Nehru College. The discussion introduced students to the fundamentals of ethical hacking and cyber defence strategies, helping them understand how cybersecurity professionals analyse potential threats and develop preventive measures. Additionally, the **seminar on “Digital Patriarchy: Exposing the New Age Bully,”** held on **8 November 2025** in collaboration with SRM University, addressed issues related to gender bias and online harassment while emphasising the need to create safer and more inclusive digital spaces.

The Cyber Cell concluded the year with its **flagship annual fest, “Encrypt’26,”** held on **24 February 2026**. The event served as an inter-college platform bringing together students from various institutions to engage in competitions, discussions, and interactive sessions centred on cybersecurity awareness and technological innovation. By combining academic engagement with practical exposure, the fest provided students with an opportunity to showcase their knowledge, develop problem-solving skills, and interact with peers who share similar interests in the field of technology and cybersecurity.

DEBATING SOCIETY – DEBSOC

The **Debating Society** of Daulat Ram College remained actively engaged during the academic session **2025–26**, promoting a culture of informed dialogue, critical thinking, and articulate expression among students. Through a series of academic sessions, training workshops, and competitions, the society provided students with platforms to develop their public speaking abilities, logical reasoning, and awareness of contemporary social and political issues. These activities also encouraged students to participate in structured discussions and debates, thereby strengthening their analytical and communication skills.

At the beginning of the session, the society organised a series of orientation and training sessions aimed at familiarising new members with different debate formats and their rules. Online workshops were conducted on **Hindi Parliamentary Debate**, **Conventional Debate**, and **Asian Parliamentary Debate** formats, introducing participants to the structure of debates, the roles of speakers, and the methods of constructing persuasive



arguments. Additionally, a session on **Model United Nations (MUN)** was organised to acquaint students with diplomatic simulations, committee procedures, and the skills required for effective participation, including research, negotiation, and policy formulation.

The society's first major competition of the year, **Controversus**, was held on **11 November 2025** as a bilingual **Freshers' Debate Competition**. The debate was based on the motion **"This House Believes That Moral Progress Lags Behind Scientific and Technological Advancement."** The competition witnessed enthusiastic participation from first-year students, with more than twelve teams engaging in thoughtful discussion and argumentation. The event successfully provided a platform for freshers to demonstrate their debating abilities while fostering confidence and intellectual engagement.

To further enhance members' knowledge and debating skills, the society organised several academic sessions during the second semester. These sessions focused on areas such as **philosophy, political science,** and **debate motion analysis**, helping students develop deeper understanding of ideological frameworks and critical thinking approaches commonly used in debates. Such initiatives enabled participants to strengthen their analytical abilities and engage more effectively with complex debate topics.

The Debating Society also collaborated with other academic departments to create interdisciplinary learning opportunities. On **21 February 2026**, the society organised a **one-day Model United Nations event** in collaboration with the Department of History of Daulat Ram College. The event featured a **Historical Crisis Committee**, providing participants with an immersive experience in diplomacy, historical analysis, and crisis management. Students engaged in simulated discussions and decision-making processes based on historical scenarios, gaining valuable insights into international relations and collaborative problem-solving.

Through these initiatives, the Debating Society continued to contribute significantly to the intellectual and co-curricular environment of the college by encouraging students to engage in meaningful discussions, develop confidence in public speaking, and cultivate informed perspectives on contemporary issues.

Udyam – The Entrepreneurship and Innovation: Startup Cell of Daulat Ram College – remained actively engaged during the academic session **2025–26**, with the objective of fostering entrepreneurial awareness, innovation, and leadership among students. The cell continued to promote a culture of creativity and enterprise by organising a variety of academic and interactive initiatives designed to expose students to the fundamentals of entrepreneurship and the practical aspects of starting and managing ventures. Through workshops, competitions, and experiential learning activities, Udyam sought to encourage students to develop entrepreneurial thinking and gain valuable insights into the dynamics of the startup ecosystem.

One of the key initiatives of the year was a **speaker session** organised on the occasion of World Entrepreneurs' Day on **21 August 2025**, which focused on the theme of entrepreneurship, its evolving opportunities, and the challenges faced by emerging entrepreneurs. The session provided students with an opportunity to understand the practical realities of building and sustaining entrepreneurial ventures while also encouraging them to explore innovative ideas and career pathways in the field of entrepreneurship. As part of the event, student-led startup stalls were also organised, allowing participants to showcase entrepreneurial concepts and gain preliminary exposure to product presentation and audience engagement.

Udyam also participated in **Seva Sankalp Mahotsav: Daulatnama** on **13 October 2025**, where members of the cell engaged in an experiential learning activity involving the design, marketing, and sale of custom-made merchandise. This initiative provided students with practical exposure to key entrepreneurial processes such as branding, marketing strategy, sales management, and customer interaction. The activity allowed participants to apply theoretical concepts of entrepreneurship in a real-world setting, thereby strengthening their understanding of business operations and teamwork.

Another important academic engagement during the session was a **Journey of a Student Entrepreneur'** held on **10 November 2025**, which featured an alumna entrepreneur who shared her journey of establishing a sustainable and ethically driven brand. The interaction offered valuable insights into the challenges and opportunities encountered in the entrepreneurial journey and encouraged students to consider innovative, socially responsible approaches to business development.

Through these initiatives, Udyam continued to play a significant role in promoting entrepreneurial learning and innovation within the college. The Film and Photography Society of Daulat Ram College – continued to provide a creative platform for students to explore visual storytelling, filmmaking, and photography during the academic session **2025–26**. The society aims to nurture artistic expression and technical skills among students by encouraging them to experiment with visual narratives, collaborate on creative projects, and engage with contemporary media practices. Through workshops, exhibitions, film productions, and inter-college competitions, the society enabled members to develop their creative abilities while contributing to the cultural life of the college.

During the year, the society organised a range of academic and creative activities to enhance students’ exposure to filmmaking and photography. An orientation session was conducted at the beginning of the academic session to introduce new members to the society’s objectives and activities, followed by a recruitment process to induct students interested in visual media. A **film screening** of *Toba Tek Singh* was organised as part of the Har Ghar Tiranga initiative on 8th August, 2025 to encourage students to engage with cinematic representations of history and literature. The society also organized a seminar focused on professional growth, featuring the T.I.M.E. Institute to provide insights on CAT preparation and comprehensive career guidance for students.

A significant creative initiative undertaken by the society during the year was the **in-house film production titled Aks**, conceptualised and executed by student members. The film reflected the collaborative efforts of the society’s members and provided them with practical experience in scripting, cinematography, direction, and editing. The film also achieved notable recognition by securing **Second Position in the Kahani Film Competition** at **Antaragni**, the annual cultural festival of Indian Institute of Technology Kanpur, thereby bringing distinction to the college.



The society also organised a **“Storytelling in the Digital Era: From Photo Essays to Docu-Series” on November 14, 2025.**, which introduced participants to evolving forms of visual narration such as photo essays and documentary-style storytelling. In addition, a photowalk was conducted on January 31st, 2026 to help students explore the techniques of street photography and develop observational and compositional skills through practical engagement with urban spaces.

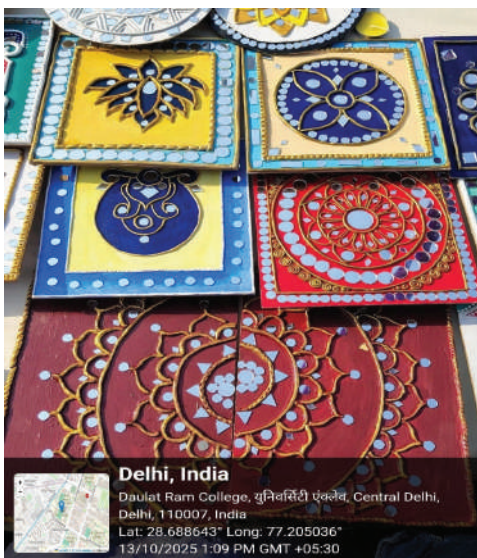
Through these activities, Spectra strengthened collaborations, enhanced artistic skills, and promoted social awareness, cultural participation, and active student engagement within the college community.

Vriddhi, the Placement Cell of Daulat Ram College, continued its mission of “*Maximizing Stellar Growth*” during the academic year **2025–26** by facilitating numerous placement opportunities, skill-development initiatives, and career-oriented programmes for students.

Throughout **2025–2026**, the cell successfully conducted **Annual Recruitment and Internship Drives**, facilitating extensive career opportunities for students. The placement season witnessed **over 1,600 student registrations** and participation from **more than thirty companies**, including Bank of America, PricewaterhouseCoopers, KPMG, Urban Company, Larsen & Toubro, Accenture, Nestlé, and Navikenz, among others. Over **30 students secured placements**, with the **highest package reaching ₹9.31 LPA**, an **average package of ₹6 LPA**, and a **total gross package of ₹1.67 crores**. Additionally, **more than 100 students were shortlisted for internships**, with the highest stipend reaching ₹25,000 per month. As the placement season is ongoing, further successful outcomes are anticipated.

To bridge the gap between academic learning and professional requirements, Vriddhi also organized a range of **Skill Enhancement Workshops and Career Series throughout the year**. These initiatives included



CV-building and vetting sessions, career counselling programmes, and informative webinars on topics such as “*Internships under NEP*” and “*Actuarial Sciences.*” The cell also strengthened its **digital outreach** through engaging Instagram series like “*Career Spotlight*” and “*Pick Your Perspective,*” providing students with modern and focused career guidance.

The Women Development Cell (WDC) of Daulat Ram College organised a series of awareness programmes, seminars, and student engagement activities during the academic session **2025–26**. The Cell organised several seminars addressing issues such as peer pressure, gender equality, menstrual health, and mental well-being. Biochemistry Association – Biochemica

Biochemica, the Biochemistry Department Association of Daulat Ram College, serves as a vibrant platform for students to organise and participate in a variety of scientific and co-curricular activities. The association provides opportunities for students’ holistic development by encouraging academic engagement, scientific curiosity, and collaborative learning. The association commenced its activities with the democratic selection of the student union, held on 10 November 2025.

The Department of Biochemistry also actively participated in the nationwide cultural initiative **“Viksit Bharat Ke Rang, Kala Ke Sang”** held at Kartavya Path, New Delhi. As part of this large-scale event, students and faculty members visited Kartavya Path to contribute to a collective artistic expression celebrating



creativity, diversity, and social awareness. Representing Daulat Ram College, the department created paintings on the theme of *Women Empowerment – from the Vedic era to the modern age*. Department of Botany – Vasundhara

During the academic year 2025–26, the department organised several insightful events aimed at enhancing students' academic understanding, environmental awareness, and career preparedness. The inaugural talk of *Vasundhara*, held on 15 October 2025, focused on raising students' awareness of the **ecological impact and role of invasive species in the plant world**. Delivered by **Prof. Gyan Prakash Sharma**, the session encouraged students to engage in thought-provoking discussions on the ecological challenges posed by invasive plant species.

On 19 January 2026, a Career Counselling Session conducted by Ensure IAS aimed to guide students in career planning and personal development. Mr. Siddharth Kumar provided practical insights and guidance to approximately 150 participants, motivating them to pursue their goals with clarity and determination. A workshop titled “**Kokedama: An Introduction to Living Art**” was organised on 28 January 2026, introducing students to the traditional Japanese gardening technique that uses moss and coir to grow indoor and outdoor plants. Led by Ms. Neha Verma, the session witnessed enthusiastic participation from 30 students, who created their own Kokedama plants while learning about this unique and sustainable gardening practice.

A career counselling session titled “**Career Options for Botany Graduates: UPSC Examination and Beyond**” was held on 29 January 2026. Dr. Abhishek Kumar delivered an inspiring lecture highlighting diverse career opportunities available to Botany graduates, including prospects in civil services and other competitive



examinations. The session saw active participation from 122 students, many of whom interacted with the speaker to seek guidance regarding their career aspirations and future pathways.

The department also organised the **International Symposium on Environmental Biotechnology and Water Sustainability (ISEBWS-2026)** to provide a platform for discussion on sustainable development and to encourage students to present their research work. The symposium featured distinguished speakers including Dr. Raj Morya from the Environmental Biotechnology Laboratory, INRAE, France, and Dr. Pankaj K. Gupta, Ramanujan Fellow at IIT Delhi and Adjunct Assistant Professor at the University of Waterloo, Canada. The event aimed to sensitise young minds to pressing environmental challenges while fostering research-oriented thinking and enhancing the knowledge and skills of emerging scholars.



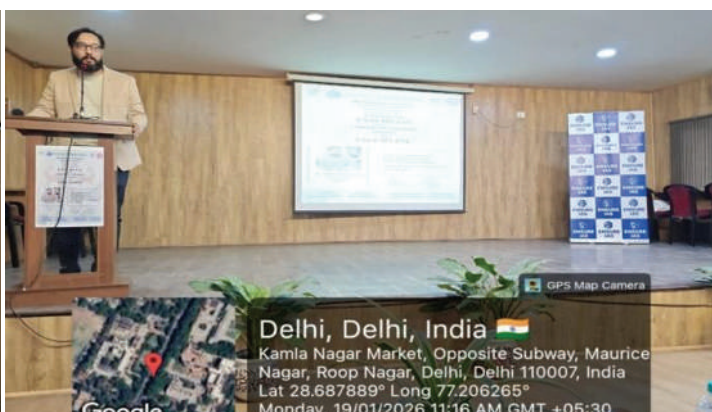

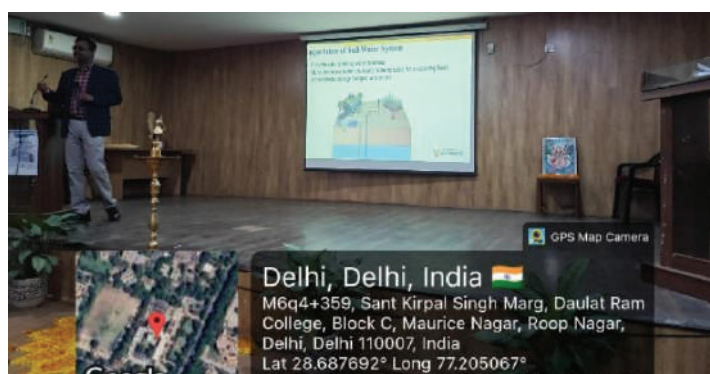

Department of Chemistry – Chemphoria

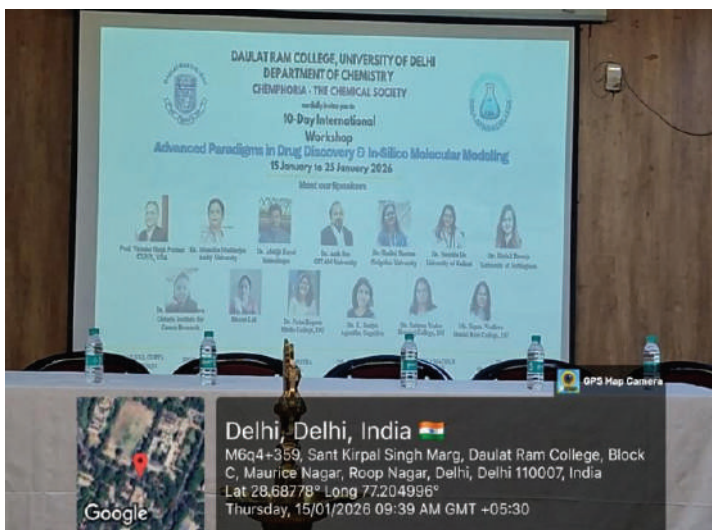
The Chemical Society, *Chemphoria*, of the Department of Chemistry, Daulat Ram College, organised several significant academic initiatives during the academic year 2025–26. A major highlight was the **10-day International Workshop titled “Advanced Paradigms in Drug Discovery and In Silico Molecular Modeling”** held from **15–24 January 2026**, which brought together **160 participants** from diverse academic backgrounds. The workshop focused on the rapidly evolving interface of computational chemistry and pharmaceutical research, providing participants with a comprehensive understanding of the drug discovery process—from lead identification to advanced molecular simulations. The programme commenced with a **Keynote Address by Prof. V. S. Parmar (City University of New York, USA)**, setting the academic tone for the workshop. The sessions featured an eminent panel of **international and national experts**, including **Dr. Smriti Srivastava (Ontario Institute for Cancer Research, Canada)** and **Dr. Shefali Baweja (University of Nottingham, UK)**, along with leading researchers and industry professionals. Participants also received hands-on training in advanced computational tools such as Swiss ADME, AutoDock, and GROMACS, culminating in a capstone assignment that strengthened their practical research skills in in silico drug discovery.

The **Chemphoria Inaugural Lecture**, delivered by **Prof. Monalisa Mukherjee (Amity University)** on **15 January 2026**, focused on the topic “*Propene-bridged cyanurate tetramers decorated on carbon nanosheets with antibacterial activity: insights from molecular modeling and in vitro studies.*” The lecture highlighted innovative research on the development of next-generation antibacterial materials, providing students with valuable insights into the journey of scientific research from conceptual design to practical application.

Another significant academic event was organised during the **Quanta Annual Fest on 12 February 2026**, which featured a distinguished lecture by **Prof. Sanjay V. Malhotra (Oregon Health & Science University, USA)** titled “*A Molecule’s Journey: From a Himalayan Plant to a Cancer Therapeutic.*” The session traced the discovery and development of a bioactive compound derived from Himalayan flora, illustrating the transformative potential of chemical research in advancing global healthcare and drug development.

Éclat – The Economics Association, Daulat Ram College, organised a range of academic and career-oriented activities during the academic year 2025–26 to broaden students' academic exposure and support informed career choices. A series of expert lectures enriched students' understanding of economics and its real-world applications. **Prof. Chetan Ghate**, Member of the Economic Advisory Council to the Prime Minister (EAC-PM), delivered a lecture on macroeconomic modelling, highlighting how economists use models to analyse issues related to monetary policy, employment, growth, and inflation. In addition, an **Evaluation Capacity Building Workshop**, organised in collaboration with UNICEF, introduced students to Monitoring, Evaluation, and Learning (MEL) frameworks through development-focused case studies, demonstrating the role of evaluation in policymaking and programme design.

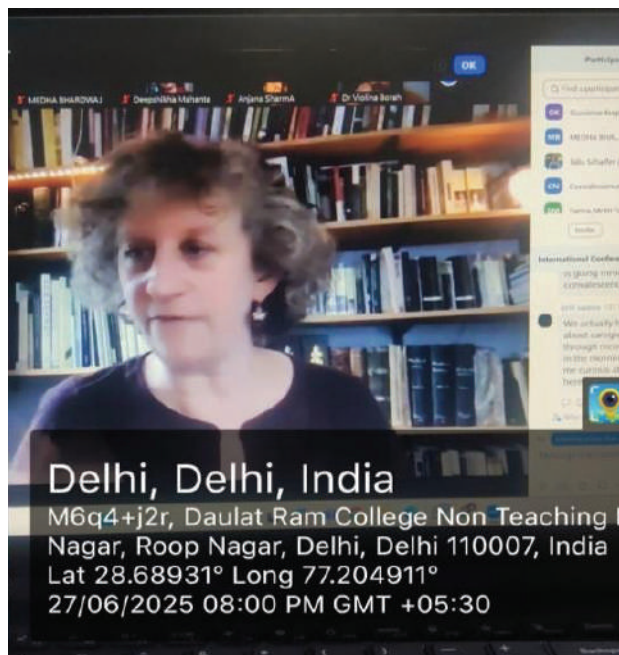

The conference brought together scholars and researchers from several countries including Finland, Austria, the United States, Poland, China, Spain, and France. The event featured keynote lectures by **Dr. Hosanna Krienke (University of Wyoming)** and **Prof. Talia Schaffer (Queens College, CUNY)** and included multiple technical sessions exploring themes such as women's convalescence narratives, ecological recovery, modernist depictions of illness, and nonfictional accounts of recovery in diaries and essays. Faculty members and students of the department actively participated in organising and coordinating the sessions, contributing to meaningful international academic exchange.

The Association also organised several academic lectures and **workshops** during the year, including **“The Art of Storytelling,”** which introduced students to the processes and professional practices involved in editing and publishing; **“Translating a Classic: Theory and Praxis,”** which explored the theoretical and practical dimensions of literary translation; **“Introduction to Research Methods,”** which familiarised students with essential research practices; and **“Research and Publishing with Digital, Interactive and Synthetic Media,”** which highlighted emerging trends in contemporary research and academic publishing.

Itivritta, the History Association of the Department of History, Daulat Ram College, organised a number of academic and student engagement activities during the academic year 2025–26. The association conducted a **turncoat debate on “This House Rejects the Idea of Choice Feminism under the stream of Feminism,”** where participants critically examined questions of individual agency, structural inequality, and the broader debates within feminist thought.

Students of the department also participated in the national cultural initiative “Viksit Bharat ke Rang, Kala ke Sang” at Kartavya Path, New Delhi, where they contributed artworks highlighting themes of **women’s leadership, empowerment, and political participation**. 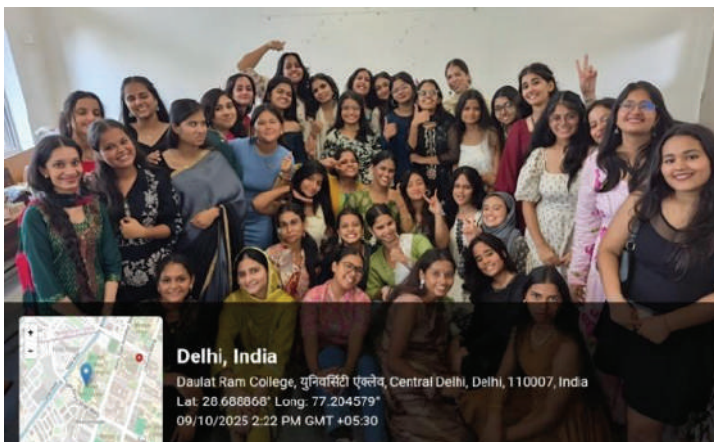

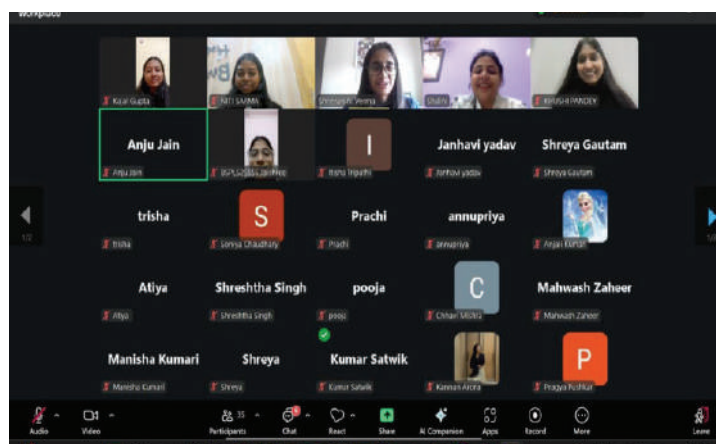

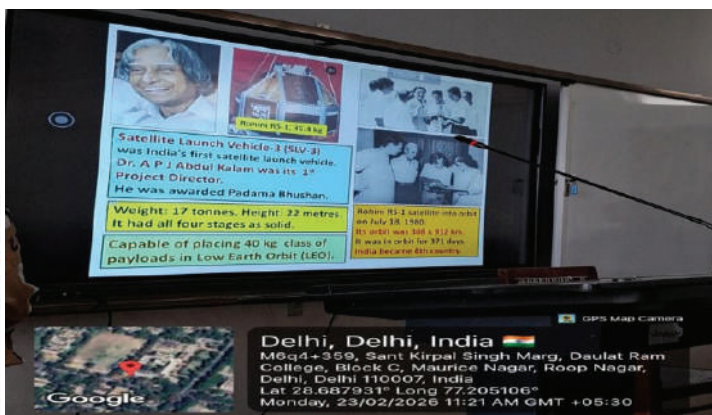
