1. BADGING CEREMONY

2. Speaker Session: Future of Work and Management Education

Concluding the session, he invited students to visit Sparsh Business School in Greater Noida. The seminar helped students broaden their perspectives on career growth and management, preparing them for future challenges.





3. Seminar: Aviation, Hospitality, Travel and Tourism, Customer Services by Amigo Academy

On December 1, 2023, Daulat Ram College's Commerce Association, Comneur, organized a seminar on Aviation and the Hospitality Industry. The event began with warm greetings from TIC Dr. Reema Dehal, Dr. Sunita Gupta, Dr. Kanika Verma & Mr. Ravinder Kumar. The guest speaker, Miss Priyadarshini Sharma from Amigo Academy, shared her educational and professional experiences. She discussed major global events like the G20 Summit and Chandrayaan launch, linking them to job opportunities in aviation. She also highlighted Project UDAN, the growing demand for new airports, and the resulting career opportunities. The commerce department expressed her gratitude, honoring Miss Priyadarshini for her insights, followed by a badging ceremony to recognize the contributions of the Commerce Union and Team Heads.

This seminar also highlights the introduction of courses offered by Amigo Academy in Aviation, Hospitality, Travel & Tourism, and Customer Service. The speaker explained how growing airports and expanding industries are increasing job prospects in these fields. Students gained valuable insights into career options and had the opportunity to ask questions. The event concluded with discussing career growth in these industries. The seminar emphasized the importance of such sessions in helping students explore career paths, understand job prospects, and make informed decisions for the future.





4. Interactive Session on The Problem Of Managing Unconscious Bias

On February 13, 2024, COMNEUR, the Commerce Association of Daulat Ram College organized an interactive session on “The Problem of Managing Unconscious Bias”, led by Dr. Mike Noon from Queen Mary University of London. The event began with a warm welcome, where Dr. Noon expressed gratitude for the opportunity to engage with students. He introduced the concept of unconscious bias, explaining that while it cannot be completely eliminated, it can be reduced. The seminar focused on understanding bias, exploring strategies to minimize it, and examining its impact within organizations. Dr. Noon elaborated on different types of biases—gender, regional, caste-based, linguistic, and more—shaped by upbringing, socialization, and media. He emphasized that unconscious bias poses challenges in workplaces and advocated for bias training as a key management solution.

Dr. Noon also shared insights on higher education opportunities at Queen Mary University of London, encouraging students to consider international career prospects. A Q&A session allowed students to engage directly with him, fostering an interactive discussion. The event concluded with Honorable Principal Dr. Savita Roy thanking Dr. Noon for his insightful session and presenting him with a potted plant as a token of appreciation. A group picture with the Commerce Department and audience marked the end of the seminar. The session reinforced the importance of raising awareness, fostering inclusion, and implementing strategies to manage unconscious bias effectively.





5. COMVISION 2024: An Inter-College Departmental Annual Fest

The Commerce Association of Daulat Ram College, University of Delhi, hosted its annual fest, Comvision, on March 5, 2024. The event featured a variety of competitions and speaker sessions. 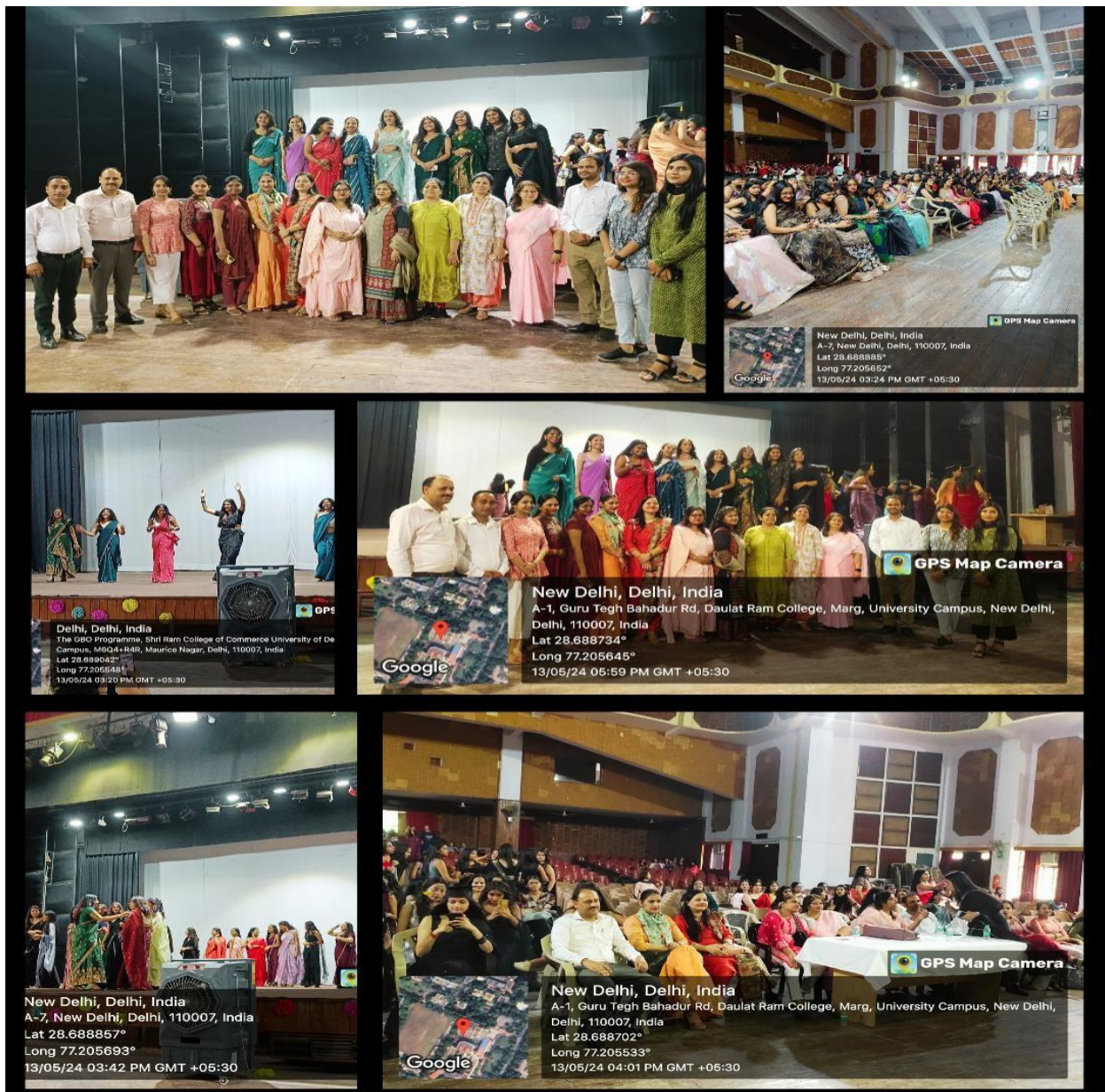
