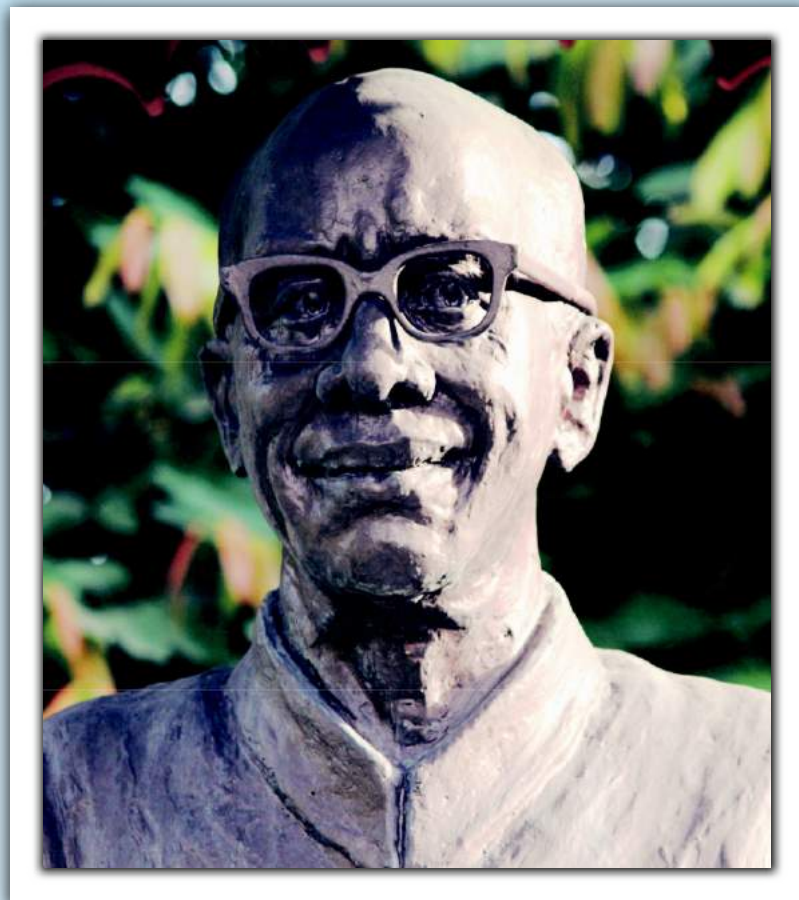

# *Daulat Ram College*

Daulat Ram College (DRC), University of Delhi is a premier educational institute for women founded by an educationist, late Shri Daulat Ram Gupta in 1960. Originally started as “Pramila College” at 22 Tilak Marg with 13 members of teaching staff and about 350 students, the college in 1964 shifted to its present premises in North Delhi University Campus and was re-named as “Daulat Ram College”. The institution since then has acquired a strong identity and has evolved into a prestigious women's college with its own distinct culture and traditions. It is engaged in imparting holistic and quality education at undergraduate level in all disciplines, Science, Commerce, and Humanities to about 3600 students via distinguished faculty. It is the only women's college in North campus, University of Delhi that offers Psychology (Hons) to students. It also enrolls students at the Masters level and holds M.A. tutorials. Besides, it offers add-on courses in foreign languages which are open to public. The college was accredited with 'A' Grade by National Assessment & Accreditation Council (NAAC) in April 2017. It was awarded Star status by Department of Biotechnology (DBT), Government of India (GOI) for undertaking innovative practices in science department.

The college has well-equipped laboratories, computer laboratories with internet facilities, besides Wi-Fi enabled lecture theatres/classrooms with LCD projectors. It also has a well-resourced Conference Hall. It has fully air- conditioned library with over 1,20,000 titles and numerous subscribed journals with computerized data base and access. The library also has two Braille computers and one Braille printer for the visually challenged students. Furthermore, the college is well-equipped in sports facilities.

The college not only excels in academics but has acquired a leading position in University of Delhi in different co- curricular activities such as debates, dramatics, music and dance, NSS, NCC and sports. It has various interest clubs, societies, Subject associations, which help in comprehensive development of the personality of our students. Every academic session college organises Conferences (National and International), Seminars, Workshops, Faculty Development Programmes, In-house Skill Development Programmes and talks on important issues/subjects that further helps in the growth of students. The highly qualified and experienced teaching faculty of the college is not just limited to class room teaching but also in taking up various prestigious research projects from organizations like DRDO, ICSSR, UGC, University of Delhi, etc. that provide students opportunities to gain additional experience.

The college has been awarded many research projects under Star Innovation Projects, Cluster Innovation Centre, University of Delhi. In addition the college has remarkable facilities such as Psychology Resource Centre, Drosophila Resource Centre and ZebraFish Lab facility. The college also has a well-maintained hostel facility extended to outstation students on the basis of merit .

Thus, the College provides a holistic experience to its students, by working on their intellectual, physical, emotional, ethical and moral development.

## The Chairperson's Message



Daulat Ram College is a premium college for women in Delhi University, founded by the individualistic educationist, Late Shri Daulat Ram Gupta in 1960. The institute, a large constituent college of University of Delhi, originally started as 'Pramila College' and was renamed as Daulat Ram College in 1964 as it grew into a full fledged extended college of University of Delhi. It imparts education at the Bachelors level in Arts, Science and Commerce. It also enrolls students at the Masters Level and holds M.A. Tutorials. At present the College has 18 departments, over 3546 students on rolls, 185 teaching staff and 71 non-teaching staff. The courses in Science were introduced in 1968 which led to the construction of the Science Block and Science laboratories. The Commerce and M.A. courses as well as new Courses in B.A. (Hons.) and B.A. Programme were added simultaneously. Further expansion occurred with the introduction of B.Sc. (Hons.) in Bio-Chemistry, Chemistry and addition of Nutrition and Health Education (NHE), and Mathematics (Hons.).

Foreign language as an add-on Course in the college is open to the public. It offers Certificate/ Diploma/ Advanced Diploma courses in French/ German/ Spanish/ Italian/ Chinese/ Japanese and Korean languages. The College building also houses a block of tutorial rooms, an imposing seminar hall, Computer laboratories with internet facilities and a well- equipped library with around 1,20,000 titles. The college holds a leading position in sports and was developed as a training venue for the Commonwealth Games, 2010. It boasts of a State-de-arte multi-sports Academy and compendium of latest sports facilities. Co-curricular activities like Societies, Departmental Associations, the Women's Development Centre, Eco- Club, N.S.S and N.C.C. are available. For the old students to connect to their alma mater, the college has an active Alumni Association.

The college students' hostel has an intake capacity of nearly 204 students. The intensely cherished dream of the founder Shri Daulat Ram Gupta was finally given expression in 1990 by the then Chairperson late Shri Mahendra Nath Gupta (his son) who called upon Shri Rajiv Gandhi to lay the foundation stone of what stands today as an imposing multi-purpose auditorium in the frontage of the college. On the spur of the moment it was named 'Sadbhavana Bhawan'. From 1990 onwards, Shri Mahendra Nath Gupta relentlessly pursued its construction. In 1997, the 'Sadbhavana Bhawan' was inaugurated to articulate the talent and the creative genius of the students in Arts, Culture, Sports & Drama. It has a seating capacity of over 1400 persons.

The vibrant mix of the co-curricular and extracurricular activities both at the intra college and inter college levels adds to the multidimensional character of the college. I feel privileged to be the Chairperson of such an institution and carrying forward the vision of its founder Daulat Ram Gupta, as his descendant.

## Message from Principal's Desk



It is my pleasure to welcome a new batch of students in a very different situation arising out of Pandemic Covid-19. The college will admit all its students purely online and the academic session will also begin through online teaching mode till further orders from University of Delhi. The students will be given dedicated college email IDs through which online classes on Google Classroom platform will be conducted seamlessly. I must congratulate all of you to be part of Daulat Ram College for the next three years. The college has a star status and is accredited by NAAC with 'A' grade. The college is placed at 26th rank by MHRD in National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF). It is ranked among the top 20 colleges by India Today survey. The college is located at the heart of University of Delhi's North Campus and is known for its sound academic practices as well as vibrant extracurricular activities. This year College is offering nearly 1300 seats at the first year undergraduate level and in addition more than 200 supernumerary seats for Students falling under PwD, Sports, ECA, Children of War Widows, Kashmiri migrants and Sikkimese and other foreign nationals etc. Daulat Ram College (DRC) offers undergraduate courses in 18 subjects in all three fields viz humanities, commerce and sciences and post graduate courses in seven humanities subjects. In addition, the College has a Center for Foreign Languages where certificate, diploma and advanced diploma is offered in seven foreign languages viz. Japanese, Korean, Chinese, German, Spanish, French and Italian. Foreign students from different countries- Afghanistan, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Tibet, Uzbekistan, Mauritius, Bangladesh etc. are enrolled in the college.

The College has 188 teaching staff supported by equal number of non-teaching staff. The faculty is actively engaged in research and publications in addition to their regular teaching and evaluation work. Senior faculty members are also engaged in supervising Ph.D. students under them. In the last academic year more than 150 research articles were published by them. The College has an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) which formulates the academic calendar and is responsible for monitoring the academic events. Approximately 92 eminent professors, scientists, Speakers, Judges, Administrators visited College in different programs during the year and enriched the students with their wisdom. College follows Choice Based Credit System wherein the best possible combinations are offered to students under generic electives, skill enhancement courses, and discipline specific elective courses which are detailed in following pages.

College organizes extracurricular activities for students. The events like Miss DRC, Talent Hunt, Manjari, Hostel Night, Sports Meet, societies like Annhad, Alahyaa, Zenith, Spectra, Sepia etc. provide platform where students can participate and showcase their talent. Self-Defense training camps and Yoga training camps are organized regularly for physical and mental well-being of students. The Equal Opportunity cell looks after the academic and extracurricular activities of the differently abled students. The College has a North East Cell which was established in 2014. The Cell has been active in sensitizing students towards the culture and



traditions of students belonging to the North East. The cell has been working closely with local police and DCW for helping the students. The College has a recycling unit on campus which recycles the paper and other organic waste. The aim of this unit is to make campus Zero waste discharge Unit with active participation of students. Thus, students are trained to keep campus clean and green through three R's initiatives taken by Eco club Dhara, recycling unit, NSS and NCC. Students organize tree plantation drives and Swachata Abhiyan under various programs. College has NCC unit consisting of 165 cadets.

The college houses several summer programs such as in-house skill development programs, life skill programs and exchange programs. A number of students of this College have been awarded University Meritorious Award 2019-20 by University of Delhi. In addition, College has instituted 101 proficiency prizes, 47 instituted prizes, 21 merit scholarships and 8 instituted scholarships for its meritorious students. College offers 100% scholarship to all its PwD including VH students. Poor and needy students are helped through the student aid fund and other organizations. After completing their graduation at Daulat Ram College, a number of students are pursuing higher education in IITs, AIIMS and foreign universities. The college has a very strong Alumnae base comprising Scientists, Psychologists, Judges, Civil servants, Vice Chancellors, Professors etc.

The Placement Cell of college is very active. Students across the disciplines are encouraged to get themselves enrolled in the Placement Cell through their coordinators. The profiles offered provide opportunities to students from all courses possessing diverse skill sets. The notable companies offering placement opportunities were Deloitte, GDS, KPMG India, Teach for India, NIIT, Trevista, Finedge, CVENT, Genpact, S & P Global, Elements HR Service Pvt Ltd etc. Nearly 300 students got Placement/internship in these companies. Many students are offered internships in various Govt and semi Govt organizations as well. Internship fair organized by Placement cell gives opportunity to thousands of students who are exposed to various career opportunities and openings/internships in industry. This year the Placement Cell also offered a wide range of internship opportunities with organizations like Hindustan Times, Zomato, Vivo India, ED Times, Urban Clap, Qversity, Mazars etc. There were over 45 companies which participated in the fair. The companies offering recruitment included Teach for India, Dhvani RIS, My First Boss; organizations offering internships included Outlook, Toplurn, Young Engine, IGIA, Lakshay Consultants, Atex Consulting Pvt. Ltd. A few not for profit organizations like Umeed, Sharp NGO, Feeding India also took part in the fair.

At Daulat Ram College, we believe in imparting holistic education in addition to formal education that we impart within the existing University framework, we also engage our students in connecting themselves to grass root level. National Social Service (NSS) organized for its students Self Defence Workshop, Senior Citizen Day, National Unity Day, Swachta Pakhwada, Blood Donation Drive, Voters Forum Campaign. The students rendered their services in Youth for Seva movement, Bharat Uday Abhiyan, plantation drive.

College boasts of a well-stacked library including braille library, the science laboratories & their museums, computer labs, state of art Gymnasium, Conference Halls, amphitheatre etc. The entire campus is Wi-fi enabled and under CCTV surveillance. Our commitment is to provide a safe, positive and intellectual learning environment that will empower students to become creative problem solvers, thinkers and inspired learners prepared to embark in the twenty - first century. This booklet provides information that is key to your successful navigation of the Undergraduate program you have chosen. We want you to thrive and succeed here, academically, socially and personally.

In case seats are still vacant, further Cut-Offs may be announced by the University to fill the same. If needed, the University may also conduct special drive in order to fill vacant seats against reserved category.



### 1. Step I: Approval of the candidates

Upon declaration of a Cut-Off list, the applicants will log in to their Dashboards and choose one course and one college in which they wish to claim admission.

- a. Colleges would be allowed to filter the applicant list as per their cut-off list. This would help in removing the spurious list of applicants.
- b. Details of the candidates will appear on the Dashboard of the college Course-wise.
- c. Course in-charge/ Teacher in-charge to verify the minimum qualifications/eligibility, cut-off requirement and certificates uploaded by the applicants.
- d. Convenor, Admission Committee to check and Recommend/Not-Recommend the cases for admission.
- e. Principal to finally Approve/Decline the admission for cases recommended by the Convenor.
- f. For all Declined/Pending cases, remarks will have to be made citing the reason for the same. These remarks will reflect on the Dashboard of the applicants.
- g. The list of Approved/ Declined cases to be uploaded by the college on their respective website on a daily basis.
- h. All cases within a cut-off will have to be closed before the declaration of the next cut-off.

This process is to be completed on the day of closing the admission to a respective cut-off. For example, for First Cut-off, the colleges will upload and inform the status of all approved/declined cases by 1:00pm 15th, October, for second Cut-off the approval/declined cases must be completed by 1:00pm 22nd, October, 2020 and so on.

### 2. Step II: Online verification of documents by respective colleges

The College shall verify the documents uploaded by the applicant for eligibility and meeting the required Cut – Off.

- a. The uploaded documents will be verified online by the respective colleges within 24 hours after the applicant applies.
- b. In case of lack of necessary document(s)/ difficulty in reading the document(s)/ and such, the candidate to be contacted on email/phone so that the same may be provided by him/her to the college directly for quick action. Please note, in case the applicant has studied from C.B.S.E. Board and his/her marksheet is not uploaded for whatever reasons, the Colleges are requested to access the marksheet directly from the CBSE portal/Digilocker, as past practice.
- c. Colleges can set up procedures for contacting such candidates. The list of such candidates to be uploaded on the College website on daily basis.
- d. In case the candidate does not respond within the stipulated time, or where documents remain insufficient even after sending reminders, the admission may be Declined citing reason.
- e. No application to be left undecided. It has to be either Approved or Declined before declaring the next cutoff.
- f. The applicant to be communicated the status of the application on their dashboard.
- g. Those Approved will pay the fee and receive a confirmation of their admission.

### 3. Step III: Payment of fees to confirm admission

Once the Principal of the College approves the admission, the applicant will receive a link on their Dashboard through which they will submit the college/course fees due. This fee can be paid only through the online mode from the University of Delhi's UG portal.

- a. The applicant will have to pay the fee within the stipulated time after getting approval by the Principal of the College. An acknowledgement slip bearing transaction ID, Credit Card/ Debit card/ Netbanking

- details and date of transaction will be generated as a proof for future reference. On successful payment of fees, the applicant is granted provisional admission to the said college.
- Payment of admission fees will confirm the provisional admission of the candidate to a course in a college. Once an applicant has paid the course fees in a particular course, his/ her name from all other courses/ colleges will be removed in that particular cut-off.
  - The confirmed cases will also reflect on the College Dashboard.
  - It is extremely important that applicants pay the fee within the timeframe allocated, failing which it will be concluded that the applicant is not interested in the course of study at that college, and the admission will not be offered to the applicant.
  - Once the applicant has gained admission, they will have to sign an online declaration stating, "I shall abide by all the rules and regulations laid down by the University and the College."

#### **4. Step IV: Process for change of course/college in subsequent Cut-Offs**

- If, in subsequent cut-off lists, an applicant finds himself/herself eligible for admission to any other colleges/courses, s(he) can withdraw admission in the course/college s(he) had gained admission/ approval has been granted to in the previous list.
- Withdrawal fee of Rs 1000.00 will be levied, and the applicant may now choose new combination of courses/ colleges, subject to eligibility and meeting the course-specific requirements.
- Once an applicant has withdrawn his/ her admission, he/ she cannot be re-admitted to that course in that particular college at any time. S(he) will have to undergo the admission process anew, subject to availability of seats and the applicant meeting course-specific eligibility requirements.
- Through a centralised process the admission fee will be adjusted automatically and the applicant will have to pay only the balance fee if it is more than the fees already paid at the previous college. If the fee in the latter college is less, the balance will be refunded to the applicant's account or to an account declared by the applicant as per the College/University rules after the admissions are closed.

#### **Steps I-IV Will have to be followed for five Cut-offs Admissions Under Special Cut-Offs**

- The Special Cut-Off will be declared for only those candidates who could not/ did not take admission in the previous Cut-Offs for whatsoever reasons.  
Deciding the cutoff for Special Cutoff: The Special Cut-Off for a course will be the last declared cut-off of the course. That is, if a college declared 3rd Cut – Off for a particular course and no further cut-offs were declared then after, but it was later found that some seats remained vacant after the 5th cut-off due to movement of students; the Special Cut-Off will be the one declared in the 3rd Cut-Off for that particular course.
- The colleges will declare the number of seats left vacant in each course after the 5th Cut – Off.
- There will be no movement allowed during the Special Cut – Off.
- The applicant gives his/ her preferences of the available course (A) and available colleges (B).The allotments to the course and the colleges, only for the Special Cut- Off, will be made centrally using the formula (min A + min B) where A is the preference to a course and B is the preference to a college, B will be dependent on A.

### **Additional Information**

#### **1. Certain Suggestions**

- Only for the current year 2020 – 21 due to the unprecedented situation that has emerged because of COVID 2019, no additional eligibility criteria for any course, except those already mentioned in the BOI
- Colleges may take additional information from applicants only through online mode and no additional fees to

- be charged from the applicants.
- c. In case of mismatch of names in the Certificates (SC, ST, OBC and EWS) occurring due to abbreviation of names, benefit may be given to applicants if his/ her abbreviations match with the names provide in other supporting documents/ certificates. The candidate may submit an affidavit to support his/her claim.
  - d. In case of any discrepancy in the submitted certificates/ documents of the applicant he/ she must be contacted for clarification.
  - e. No deduction in BA (Prog.) for change in stream

## 2. Certificates SC/ST Certificates

**The following are empowered to issue the requisite SC/ST certificate:**

- a) District Magistrate/ Additional District Magistrate/ Collector/ Deputy Commissioner/ Addl. Deputy Commissioner/ Deputy Collector/ 1st class Stipendiary Magistrate/ City Magistrate/ Sub-Divisional Magistrate/ Taluka Magistrate/ Executive Magistrate/ Extra Assistant Commissioner.
- b) Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Addl. Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Presidency Magistrate.
- c) Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar.
- d) Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the Applicant and/ or his family normally resides.
- e) Administrator/ Secretary to the Administrator/ Development Officer (Lakshadweep Islands).

The applicant must note that the SC/ ST Certificate from any other person/ authority shall not be accepted in any case. If the applicant happens to belong to SC or ST, applicant's caste/ tribe must be listed in the appropriate Govt. of India Schedule.

The Caste Certificate should clearly state: (a) Name of his/ her caste/ tribe (b) whether applicant belongs to SC or ST (c) District and the State or Union Territory of applicant's usual place of residence, and (d) the appropriate Govt. of India Schedule under which his/ her caste/ tribe is approved as SC or ST. If the applicant does not have their SC or ST caste/tribe certificate at the time of registration/applying, they may upload the acknowledgement slip of the SC or ST caste/tribe certificate application. However, at the time of admission, the applicant will have to produce the valid original SC or ST caste/tribe certificate.

### **OBC, Non-Creamy Layer, Central List**

The OBC applicants who belong to the "Non-Creamy Layer" and whose caste appears in the Central List of the OBCs only, shall be eligible to be considered for admission under the OBC category (Validity period of OBC certificate in respect of "non-creamy layer" status of the applicants as per DOPT Office Memorandum No. 36036/2/2013-Estt. (Res- I) dated 31 March 2016). The validity of the non-creamy layer certificate shall be for the financial year 2019-2020, issued on or after 31st March, 2020.

### **EWS**

As per the University of Delhi notifications (Reference No. Aca. I / Reservation of EWSs /2019/63 Dated 28th March 2019 and Reference No. Aca. I / Reservation of EWSs / 2019 / 101 Dated 15th May 2019), for the reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) Category, the University Departments / Centres / Colleges have reserved 10% seats for admission for the same in the Academic Year 2020-21. The eligibility of such applicants will be decided on the basis of fulfilling criteria prescribed in the above notifications, and subject to submission of documents, issued by the competent authority, in the format provided in Appendix V of BOI.

1. Rules for Refund of Fee on Account of Withdrawal/Cancellation of Admission
  - a. When a student applies for withdrawal of admission up to last date of admission - Full fee including examination fee after deduction of Rs 1000.00

  - d. When a student of Self-Financing course applies for withdrawal of admission on or before the last date of admission - Full fee including examination fee after deduction of Rs1000.00

## ADMISSION PROCESS

- i. Applicants who have applied on university portal and meet the requisite cut-off should login to the UG admission portal through their registration account and select college/course where the applicant wishes to take admission.
- ii. Please note selection of applicant's college and course can be made only online through their own Dashboard on the UG admissions portal. There will be no physical visit to the colleges at this point in the process.
- iii. The procedure for choosing the course and the college by the applicant must be completed within the stipulated time interval. Within a cut-off the applicant will not be allowed to change his/ her choice of course and college.
- iv. The College shall verify the documents uploaded by the applicant for eligibility and meeting the required Cut-Off through online mode.
- v. In case of lack of necessary documents, candidate to be contacted on email/phone so that the same may be provided. In case the candidate does not respond, or where documents remain insufficient, the admission to be declined citing reason. The applicant will be communicated the status of the application on their dashboard.
- vi. Those approved are required to pay the fee and receive a confirmation of their admission. Those declined admission are provided a link to raise any objection with the Grievance Committee.
- vii. Once the Principal of the College has approved their admission, the applicant will receive a link on their Dashboard on the UG Admissions portal through which they must submit the college/course fees due. This fee can only be paid online through the portal. The applicant is advised to pay the fee without delay within 24 hours of the approval of admission by the Principal of the College, and save the acknowledgement slip bearing transaction ID, Credit Card/ Debit card/ Net banking details and date of transaction as a proof for future reference. On successful payment of fees, the applicant is granted provisional admission to the said college.
- viii. It is extremely important that applicants pay the fee within the time frame allocated, failing which it will be concluded that the applicant is not interested in the course of study at that college, and the admission will be automatically cancelled.
- ix. Once the applicant has gained admission, they will have to sign an online declaration stating, **"All the information provided by me are correct. In case any information provided by me is found to be false and/ or is not supported by the documents presented by me, I understand that the admission will be immediately cancelled and no fees will be refunded. I shall abide by all the rules and regulations laid down by the University and the College."**
- x. The uploaded documents will be verified by the respective colleges within the stipulated time period. If at this stage it is found that the information given by the applicant is false and/ or is not supported by the documents presented, the admission will be immediately cancelled. No fees will be refunded in such cases.
- xi. If, in subsequent lists, the applicant finds themselves eligible for admission to any other colleges/courses, they should ensure their eligibility by carefully examining the eligibility requirements of the Course/College/ Department.
- xii. Applicants are advised to exercise extreme care to ensure that they meet the requirements for the Course/College. Once they are certain they wish to cancel admission in the course/college they initially had gained admission to in the previous list, the applicant must log in to the UG Admissions portal to cancel their admission through their Dashboard.
- xiii. A cancellation fee will be levied, and they may now choose a new combination of course and college, subject to eligibility and meeting course-specific requirements. Once again, the applicant must complete steps i-vii.

- xiv. Only one cancellation is allowed per Cut-off list. Cancellation for readmission in another merit-based college/course will not be possible in the first Cut-off list. Such cancellations wherein the applicant seeks readmission in another merit-based college/ course option may be attempted only in subsequent list onwards. Within a cutoff the applicant will not be allowed to change his/ her choice of course and college.
- xv. The total number of cancellations will be restricted to (n-1) where "n" is the total number of Cut-off Lists. Once an applicant has cancelled his/ her admission, he/ she cannot be re-admitted to that course/college automatically, and must undergo the admission process anew, subject to availability of seats and the applicant meeting course-specific eligibility requirements.
- xvi. When the applicant cancels their previous admission in the subsequent Cut-Off List, the refunded fee amount will be visible in the "Wallet" section of the Dashboard. A cancellation fee of Rs. 1,000 (Rupees One thousand only) will be deducted and this will be reflected in the refunded amount visible in the "Wallet".
- xvii. Through the Dashboard after the subsequent admission is approved, the admission fee will be adjusted automatically and the applicant will have to pay only the balance fee if it is more than the fees already paid at the previous college. If the fee in the latter college is less, the balance will be refunded to the applicant's account or to an account declared by the applicant as per the College/University rules after the admissions are closed.
- In case of any change in the admission process for Merit based UG admission, it will be notified on the website of the University of Delhi. All aspirants must register online as per the procedure and schedule that will be notified on the University of Delhi website ([www.du.ac.in](http://www.du.ac.in)).

## Relaxations in Course-specific Eligibility Criteria

- ❖ To determine their eligibility and merit, applicants from the SC/ST categories shall be given a relaxation to the extent of 5% in the respective eligibility criteria and merit for admission pre-scribed for applicants from the UR category. If, after giving 5% relaxation, these reserved seats still remain vacant, further relaxation would be given to the extent required in order to fill all the reserved seats in the course concerned. Eligibility in such cases is pass percentage.
- ❖ To determine the eligibility and merit, applicants from the OBC category shall be given a relaxation in the respective eligibility in the qualifying examination to the extent of 10% of the eligibility marks prescribed for applicants from the UR Category. For example, if the minimum eligibility for admission to a course is 40% for the UR Category applicants, the minimum eligibility for the OBC category will be 36% (i.e. 40% minus 10% of 40%).
- ❖ Applicants from the PwBD category shall be given a relaxation in the respective eligibility for the course concerned in the qualifying examination to the extent of 5%. For example, if the minimum eligibility for admission to a course is 40% for the UR Category applicants, the minimum eligibility for the PwBD category will be 38% (i.e. 40% minus 5% of 40%).
- ❖ Applicants from the CW category shall be given a relaxation of 5% in the respective eligibility for the course concerned in the qualifying examination. For example, if the minimum eligibility for admission to a course is 40% for the UR Category applicants, the minimum eligibility for the CW category will be 38% (i.e. 40% minus 5% of 40%).
- ❖ Eligibility Criteria for merit-based admissions under the EWS category shall be identical to that of UR category.

The University may define any other relevant subjects as academic/elective for a particular course. In case an applicant has studied elective and core languages, the core/elective language subject will be treated as language, while elective language can be considered as academic/elective subject.

Merit is calculated through course-specific combinations of marks obtained in the qualifying examination in the “Best Four” subjects for admission to courses through the faculties of Arts, Commerce, Mathematical Sciences, Music, Social Sciences, Applied Social Sciences & Humanities, and course-specific combinations of “Three Subjects” for admission to courses under the faculties of Sciences and Applied Sciences.

### 2.1.3 Special Instructions for Boards other than CBSE

1. If a paper’s title does not match with what is specified in List A and List B above, it is mandatory for the applicant to provide a content equivalence certificate from the Principal/Head of the Institution last attended, certifying that the paper’s content is equivalent to NCERT Class XII syllabus for that paper. This equivalence certificate must be accompanied by a copy of the syllabus of the paper attested by the Principal/Head of the Institution. However, the University of Delhi’s decision on the matter will be final and binding.
2. If the applicant has studied “Botany” and “Zoology” separately, the total of marks in both these papers must be entered in the respective fields for theory and practicals under the heading “Biology” in the field provided in your admission form.
3. If the applicant’s mark sheet contains both Class XI and XII marks, the applicant must enter only the Class XII marks in the respective fields provided in the admission forms.
4. Applicants should have passed theory and practical separately. Any paper with both theory and practical component will be considered only in the ratio 70 (theory) : 30(practical) if the theory component of the paper is less than 70%. The applicant should separately fill into the online Admission Form the marks obtained and maximum marks for theory and practical each, and the totals, as per their mark sheet. In case the theory/practical breakup is not specified, the applicant will be required to enter only their total marks in the first field (“Theory”) for that paper in the online Registration Form.
5. “Internal Assessment” marks, if any, mentioned in the mark sheet will not be used for any calculations.
6. Any discrepancy in the entry of marks pertaining to theory, practicals or totals will be the sole responsibility of the applicant. Applicants are advised to exercise utmost care in filling up the registration form as errors in entry may lead to summary rejection of the form.

## Reservations for SC/ST/OBC/EWS

The merit list for the unreserved category (UR) seats will comprise all the applicants in order of merit. No one will be excluded from the same. **In other words, the merit list will also include SC/ST/OBC / EWS applicants, irrespective of category, if they meet the criterion of merit for UR category.**

**No applicant can be excluded from the UR category merit list just because the applicant belongs to or has applied under SC/ST/OBC/EWS category.** Such an applicant is entitled to be considered under the UR category, as well as under the reserved category. Admission to UR category seats will be strictly in order of merit without excluding SC/ST/OBC/EWS applicants.

**Discrimination on the basis of category/ caste is completely unlawful.** The University of Delhi does not tolerate discrimination against any applicant/student on this basis. Strict action will be taken against any violations.

Applicants seeking admission under SC/ST/OBC/EWS category will have to produce for verification certificates in their own names.

### Reservation of Seats for Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) applicants

22.5% of the total numbers of seats is reserved for applicants belonging to Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes (15% for Scheduled Caste and 7.5% for Scheduled Tribes, interchangeable if necessary).

It is a statutory obligation on the part of Colleges to fill all seats reserved for Scheduled Caste / Scheduled Tribe applicants.

Colleges shall not refuse admission to any SC/ST applicant on the basis of medium of instruction. Any deficiency in the knowledge of any particular language should be addressed; for this purpose remedial classes may be arranged by the College by utilizing grants available from University Grants Commission.

Relaxation to the extent of 5% in the minimum marks shall be given to the applicants belonging to SC and ST to determine their eligibility and merit for admission to the course concerned.

In case, after giving 5% relaxation, the reserved seats still remain vacant, further relaxation would be given to the extent required in order to fill all the reserved seats. (AC Resolution A88, 14.6.1983) (EC Resolution 157, 24.12.2001). It is obligatory for all Colleges/Departments to fill all the seats reserved for SC/ST applicants. Eligibility in these cases is pass percentage.

### The following are empowered to issue the requisite SC/ST certificate:

- a) District Magistrate/ Additional District Magistrate/ Collector/ Deputy Commissioner/ Addl. Deputy Commissioner/ Deputy Collector/ 1st class Stipendiary Magistrate/ City Magistrate/ Sub-Divisional Magistrate/ Taluka Magistrate/ Executive Magistrate/ Extra Assistant Commissioner.
- b) Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Addl. Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Presidency Magistrate.
- c) Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar.
- d) Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the Applicant and/ or his family normally resides.
- e) Administrator/ Secretary to the Administrator/ Development Officer (Lakshadweep Islands).

The applicant must note that the SC/ ST Certificate **from any other person/ authority shall not be accepted in any case. If the applicant happens to belong to SC or ST, applicant's caste/ tribe must be listed in the appropriate Govt. of India Schedule.**

The Caste Certificate should clearly state: (a) Name of his/ her caste/ tribe (b) whether applicant belongs to SC or ST (c) District and the State or Union Territory of applicant's usual place of residence, and (d) the appropriate Govt. of India Schedule under which his/ her caste/ tribe is approved as SC or ST.

If the applicant does not have their SC or ST caste/tribe certificate at the time of registration/applying, they

may upload the acknowledgement slip of the SC or ST caste/tribe certificate application. However, at the time of admission, the applicant will have to produce the valid original SC or ST caste/tribe certificate.

However, if an SC/ST Applicant seeks admission under some other category (for example: PwBD/Employee Ward, etc.) the applicant should satisfy the minimum eligibility requirement for that particular category.

**Note: SC/ST applicants who get admission under open merit (unreserved) shall not be included in the reserved quota, i.e. 22.5% (15% for SC and 7.5% for ST).**

It is obligatory for all Colleges/Departments to fill all the seats reserved for SC/ST applicants. Minimum Eligibility in these cases is pass percentage.

## Reservation of Seats for Other Backward Classes (OBC, Non-Creamy Layer, Central List)

27% seats will be reserved for the applicants belonging to Other Backward Classes (OBC) (non-creamy layer, central list). At the time of giving admission to an OBC applicant, the College will ensure that the caste is included in the Central List of OBC (the OBC status is to be determined on the basis of the Central (Govt. of India) List of OBCs notified by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment on the recommendations of the National Commission for Backward Classes available at the website <http://ncbc.nic.in/backward-classes/index.html>.)

The certificate must mention non-creamy layer status of the applicant (Non-creamy layer status issued by an authority mentioned in DOPT Office Memorandum no. 36012/22/93-Estt. (SCT) dated 15.11.1993).

The OBC applicants who belong to the 'Non-Creamy Layer' and whose caste appears in the Central List of the OBCs only, shall be eligible to be considered for admission under the OBC category (Validity period of OBC certificate in respect of 'non-creamy layer' status of the applicants as per DOPT Office Memorandum No. 36036/2/2013-Estt. (Res-I) dated 31 March 2016). The validity of the non-creamy layer certificate shall be for the financial year 2019-2020, issued on or after 31st March, 2020.

If the applicant does not have the OBC non-creamy layer certificate of the latest financial year 2019-2020 at the time of registration, the applicant may upload the previously issued (older) OBC non-creamy layer certificate or the acknowledgement slip of OBC non-creamy layer certificate application. However, at the time of admission, the applicant must produce the recent financial year's (2019-20) OBC non-creamy layer certificate, issued by the same competent authority. This additional certificate must have reference of the applicant's already issued original caste certificate.

The OBC applicants shall be given a relaxation of 10% in the minimum eligibility marks of the said course and for the admission entrance test a relaxation of 10% of the minimum eligibility marks prescribed for General/UR Category applicants. For example, if the minimum eligibility for admission to a course is 40% for the UR Category applicants, the minimum eligibility for the OBC category will be 36% (i.e. 40% minus 10% of 40%). It is a statutory obligation on the part of Colleges to fill all the seats reserved for OBC applicants.

## Reservation policy for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS)

As per the University of Delhi notifications (Reference No. Aca. I / Reservation of EWSs / 2019 / 63 Dated 28th March 2019 and Reference No. Aca. I / Reservation of EWSs / 2019 / 101 Dated 15th May 2019), for the reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) Category, the University Departments / Centres / Colleges have reserved 10% seats for admission for the same in the Academic Year 2020-21. The eligibility of such applicants will be decided on the basis of fulfilling criteria prescribed in the above notifications, and subject to submission of documents, issued by the competent authority, in the format provided in Appendix V.

# Reservation for Persons with Benchmark Disability; for Children/Widows of Personnel of the Armed Forces; Kashmiri Migrants; PM's Special Scholarship for J&K; nominated Sikkimese Students; Ward Quota

## Reservation of Seats for Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD)

As per the provisions of Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, not less than five percent (5%) seats are reserved for Persons with Benchmark Disabilities. "Person with benchmark disability" means a person with not less than forty percent (40%) of a specified disability where specified disability has not been defined in measurable terms and includes a person with disability where specified disability has been defined in measurable terms, as certified by the certifying authority. It may be noted that the erstwhile Persons with Disability Act, 1995, under which reservation for Persons with Disabilities in admissions was provided earlier has now been repealed.

PwBD applicants shall be given a relaxation in the course-specific eligibility in the qualifying examination and in the admission entrance test to the extent of 5%, till seats are filled. For example, if the minimum eligibility for admission to a course is 40% for the UR Category applicants, the minimum eligibility for the PwBD category will be 38% (i.e. 40% minus 5% of 38%).

The following specified categories of disabilities as mentioned in the Schedule to the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 [See clause (zc) of section 2 of Act of Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016] are eligible to get the benefit of the said reservation.

## I. Physical disability

### A. Locomotor disability

1. Locomotor disability (a person's inability to execute distinctive activities associated with movement of self and objects resulting from affliction of musculoskeletal or nervous system or both), including—
2. "Leprosy cured person" means a person who has been cured of leprosy but is suffering from—
  - (i) Loss of sensation in hands or feet as well as loss of sensation and paresis in the eye and eye-lid but with no manifestation of deformity;
  - (ii) Manifest deformity and paresis but having sufficient mobility in their hands and feet to enable them to engage in normal economic activity;
  - (iii) Extreme physical deformity as well as advanced age which prevents him/her from undertaking any gainful occupation, and the expression "leprosy cured" shall construed accordingly;
3. "Cerebral palsy" means a Group of non-progressive neurological condition affecting body movements and muscle coordination, caused by damage to one or more specific areas of the brain, usually occurring before, during or shortly after birth;
4. "Dwarfism" means a medical or genetic condition resulting in an adult height of 4 feet 10 inches (147 centimetres) or less;
5. "Muscular dystrophy" means a group of hereditary genetic muscle disease that weak-ens the muscles that move the human body and persons with multiple dystrophy have incorrect and missing information in their genes, which prevents them from making the proteins they need for healthy muscles. It is characterised by progressive skeletal muscle weakness, defects in muscle proteins, and the death of muscle cells and tissue;
6. "Acid attack victims" means a person disfigured due to violent assaults by throwing of acid or similar corrosive substance.



## B. Visual impairment

7. "blindness" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, after best correction -
  - (i) total absence of sight; or
  - (ii) visual acuity less than 3/60 or less than 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible correction; or
  - (iii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 10 degree.
8. "low-vision" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, namely:
  - (i) visual acuity not exceeding 6/18 or less than 20/60 upto 3/60 or upto 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible corrections; or
  - (ii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 40 degree up to 10 degree.

## C. Hearing impairment

9. "deaf" means persons having 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;
10. "hard of hearing" means person having 60 DB to 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;
11. "speech and language disability" means a permanent disability arising out of conditions such as laryngectomy or aphasia affecting one or more components of speech and language due to organic or neurological causes.

**II. Intellectual disability**, a condition characterised by significant limitation both in intellectual functioning (reasoning, learning, problem solving) and in adaptive behaviour which covers a range of every day, social and practical skills, including—

12. "specific learning disabilities" means a heterogeneous group of conditions wherein there is a deficit in processing language, spoken or written, that may manifest itself as a difficulty to comprehend, speak, read, write, spell, or to do mathematical calculations and includes such conditions as perceptual disabilities, dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia, dyspraxia and developmental aphasia;
13. "autism spectrum disorder" means a neuro-developmental condition typically appearing in the first three years of life that significantly affects a person's ability to communicate, understand relationships and relate to others, and is frequently associated with unusual or stereotypical rituals or behaviours.

## III. Mental behaviour

14. "Mental illness" means a substantial disorder of thinking, mood, perception, orientation or memory that grossly impairs judgment, behaviour, capacity to recognise reality or ability to meet the ordinary demands of life, but does not include retardation which is a condition of arrested or incomplete development of mind of a person, specially characterised by subnormality of intelligence.

## IV. Disability caused due to

### (a) Chronic neurological conditions, such as—

15. "multiple sclerosis" means an inflammatory, nervous system disease in which the myelin sheaths around the axons of nerve cells of the brain and spinal cord are damaged, leading to demyelination and affecting the ability of nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord to communicate with each other;
16. "Parkinson's disease" means a progressive disease of the nervous system marked by tremor, muscular rigidity, and slow, imprecise movement, chiefly affecting middle-aged and elderly people associated with degeneration of the basal ganglia of the brain and a deficiency of the neurotransmitter dopamine.

### (b) Blood disorder—

17. "haemophilia" means an inheritable disease, usually affecting only male but transmitted by women to their male children, characterised by loss or impairment of the normal clotting ability of blood so that a

minor wound may result in fatal bleeding;

18. "Thalassemia" means a group of inherited disorders characterised by reduced or ab-sent amounts of haemoglobin.
19. "Sickle cell disease" means a haemolytic disorder characterised by chronic anemia, painful events, and various complications due to associated tissue and organ damage; "haemolytic" refers to the destruction of the cell membrane of red blood cells resulting in the release of haemoglobin.

## V. Multiple Disabilities (more than one of the above specified disabilities)

20. Multiple disabilities including deaf blindness which means a condition in which a person may have combination of hearing and visual impairments causing severe communication, developmental, and educational problems.
21. **Any other category as may be notified** by the Central Government.

Applicants must furnish a valid disability certificate issued by a recognized Government hospital, bearing a photograph of the applicant.

### Concessional/Waiver of fees in respect of Persons with Disabilities (PwBD)

- a) Applicants with physical disabilities pursuing various courses of study in the Faculties, Departments, Centres, and Institutions / Colleges of the University shall be **exempted from payment of fees, including examination fee and other University fees, except Admission fee**, subscription towards Delhi University students' Union and Identity Card fee (As per amendment to Ordinance X(4) of the University).
- b) **PwBD** applicants who meet the cut-off for the unreserved category and will take admission in the unreserved category (UR) will pay the fee relevant for **PwBD** applicant.
- c) As per the Executive Council Resolution No. 50 dated 03.11.2012, students with physical disabilities residing in different Hostels / Halls of the University are **exempted from payment of all hostel fees and charges** except refundable caution fee and the mess fees. Persons with Physical Disabilities who are students shall pay 50% of the Mess fee and the remaining **50% of their Mess Fee** will be met by the University of Delhi. **Similar norms are to be adopted by the Colleges in respect of PwBD Students residing in various hostels of the Colleges.**
- d) PwBD students who are getting fellowships / financial assistance shall be exempted from payment of fees / charges / mess fees subject to the following conditions. **All admitted SC/ST, OBC, EWS, PwBD students in colleges who are eligible for fellowships should submit their scholarship forms to the requisite office by February for timely processing.**

- Five percent (5%) of seats are reserved for applicants under this category, course-wise in all colleges.
- All such applicants have to upload the Educational Concession certificate (as per the format **provided in Appendix VII**) to be issued by **any of the following authorities** on the proper letterhead:

- Secretary, Kendriya Sainik Board, Delhi.
- Secretary, Rajya Zila Sainik Board.
- Officer-in-Charge, Record Office.
- 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate.
- Ministry of Home Affairs (For Police Personnel in receipt of Gallantry Awards)

**No other format shall be permissible. Proofs of the CW category in the form of ID card of parent or dependent, Medical card, Ration card, CSD card, etc. are not admissible in lieu of certificate in correct format. The priority must be clearly mentioned in the certificate. Certificates that do not mention the relevant priority will not be considered.**

Admission may be offered to the Children/Widows of Personnel of the Armed Forces (**Priority I to IX**) including Para-Military Personnel (**only Priority I to V**), in the following order of preference:

**Priority I:** Widows/Wards of Defence personnel killed in action;

**Priority II:** Wards of Defence Personnel disabled in action and boarded out from service with disability attributable to military service;

**Priority III:** Widows/Wards of Defence Personnel who died while in service with death attributable to military service;

**Priority IV:** Wards of Defence Personnel disabled in service and boarded out with disability attributable to military service;

**Priority V:** Wards of Ex-servicemen and Serving personnel, including personnel of police forces who are in receipt of Gallantry Awards;

- ParamVir Chakra
- Ashok Chakra
- MahaVir Chakra

## Reservation of Kashmiri Migrants (KM) (Supernumerary Seats)

1. All the wards (sons/daughters) of Kashmiri Migrants who wish to be considered for admission to various undergraduate courses of the University have to register online as per the schedule notified by the University.
2. Up to 5% seats are reserved course-wise in all colleges for the wards of Kashmiri Migrants.
3. All the wards of Kashmiri Migrants will have to upload a certificate of registration as Kashmiri Migrants issued by Divisional Commissioner/ Relief Commissioner.
4. Admission of Wards of Kashmiri Migrants will be based on cut-offs to be announced by the Colleges. A concession of maximum 10% in the last cut-off marks fixed for unreserved category applicants shall be extended to the Kashmiri Migrants.
5. Reservation under this category is not available in courses where admission is based on entrance tests.

## Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme for J&K students

The applicants selected under Prime Minister's special scholarship scheme for J&K students will be admitted directly to the Colleges. Reservation under this category is not available in courses where admission is based on entrance tests. Applicants must register on the University Portal as per schedule to be announced on University website.

## Nomination of Seats for Sikkimese Students

Sikkimese students nominated by the Govt. of Sikkim shall be considered for admission by the University in Colleges where hostel facilities are available (AC Resolutions 51 dated 05/06/1980 and 122 dated 17/12/1990). The allocation of Sikkimese students for admission as well as for hostel accommodation in respective colleges be made by the Vice-Chancellor at his discretion. ## Seats for Ward Quota

Admission to the wards of University and College permanent in-service employees, both teaching and non-teaching, to the various undergraduate courses, excluding professional courses and other courses where admission is made on the basis of entrance test, is to be made according to the following criteria:

1. Admission to wards (children) of the permanent in-service employees at the college where employees are working will be given on the basis of merit among such applicants subject to ordinarily one seat for every unit of up to sixty students in a course and subject to fulfilment of course-specific eligibility conditions.
2. For admission of the wards (sons/daughters) of the permanent in-service employees of the University/other colleges (teaching/non-teaching) the total number of seats for admission will not exceed six (three for the teaching and three for the non-teaching employees) on the basis of merit among such applicants subject to a maximum of ordinarily one seat for every unit of up to sixty students in a course and subject to fulfilment of course-specific eligibility conditions.
3. The admissions on the above norms will be against seats over and above the normal strength.
4. Applicants who wish to apply for admission under ward quota must fill the online registration form on the university portal. They must choose the colleges they wish to apply to from the list provided at the time of registration. The schedule and process for admission under this quota will be notified on the University website.

## Extra-curricular and Sports Quota (Supernumerary Seats)

Due to the unprecedented situation of COVID -19 pandemic and prevailing public health guide-lines, admission based on ECA will take place through online trials and admission based on Sports will take place without the conduct of Sports Trial.

1. Colleges must provide sports facilities and encourage all students to participate in Sports and Extra-Curricular Activities (ECA) by introducing inter-class competitions and mass sports. Representation of at least 1% each (of total intake capacity of the college) of ECA and Sports is mandatory for all colleges, subject to a ceiling of 5% (of total intake capacity of the college) in total for ECA and Sports together.
2. The actual number of seats to be filled based on ECA and Sports is decided given the facilities available, the requirement of the colleges and other relevant factors.
3. Admission based on ECA and Sports is not available in courses where admission is based on the entrance test.
4. The allotment of course and college to the applicant on the basis of ECA and Sports will be done in a centralized manner by the University. There will be no restriction of course (subject wise).
5. Additional information regarding the schedule of ECA and Sports and availability of seats will be notified on the DU website.
6. An applicant submitting false/fake certificates for seeking admission on the basis of ECA and Sports shall be debarred from admission to any College for three years. Such admissions will be cancelled and FIR will also be registered.

## Guidelines for Admissions through Extra Curricular Activities (ECA)

**Applicable for the category of National Cadet Corps (NCC), MoD and National Service Scheme (NSS), MYAS**

The Colleges shall communicate on the DU UG Admission portal the number of seats under ECA Quota



(Supernumerary) concerning NCC/NSS in Men/Women as applicable. The admission on the basis of ECA shall be administered through centralized ECA Merit List based on the Highest Marks obtained in the uploaded NCC/NSS Certificates and order of their preferences of courses and colleges as indicated by the applicant.

1. The applicant seeking admission on the basis of ECA is required to register online on the DU UG Admission portal.
2. They should also register for a maximum of five courses and colleges in order of their preference where they wish to get admitted. These preferences will be utilized later in the allotment of course and college.
3. An additional registration fee of Rs. 100 will apply in the ECA category in addition to charges for (UR/OBC/SC/ST/PwBD/EWS) registration.
4. Applicants are required to upload self-attested copies of five NCC/NSS Certificates issued between May 01, 2017, to April 30, 2020, they wish to apply for as a proof of their involvement in the relevant category.
5. Not more than 15% concession in academic merit vis-a-vis, Unreserved Category applicants from the last relevant cut-off may be given for admission to a course.
6. Allotment of course to the applicant will be subject to fulfilment of specific minimum eligibility criteria and conform to University regulations.
7. Applicant must secure minimum 04 Marks in the Marking of the uploaded NCC/NSS Certificates to be eligible for Admission on the basis of ECA.

volunteer/cadet for the College and University as determined by College/University failing which the College has the right to cancel the admission if the applicant violates the Undertaking during their entire period of Undergraduate course of study.

### **Additional guidelines for Admission on the basis of Extra Curricular Activities (ECA)**

1. Applicants may register for a maximum of three ECA categories.
2. Admissions under ECA will be done based on the Merit/ Participation certificates of the Applicants. Applicants would be required to upload a maximum of Best Five certificates of preceding three years (1<sup>st</sup> May 2017 – 30<sup>th</sup> April 2020). Undated certificates will not be considered for marking.
3. Certificates uploaded by the applicant shall be scrutinized and evaluated out of a maximum of 100 marks. Applicants scoring 20 marks and above in uploaded certificates (except for NCC and NSS category) shall be eligible for final merit list of admission on the basis of ECA. The marks under ECA category will be awarded based on sum of the total marks awarded in the three best certificates uploaded by the candidate.
4. The forensic examination of certificates of all admitted candidates under the ECA category will be done.
5. Not more than 15% concession in academic merit vis-à-vis, Unreserved Category applicants from the last relevant cut-off will be given for admission to a specific course subject to course-specific eligibility criteria. The specific concession shall be declared by each college.
6. The Colleges will be asked to provide their requirement in each activity and subcategory for admission under the ECA.

- i. The applicant with a higher percentage of marks (aggregate of best four subjects including one language) in the qualifying examination will be considered first for allotment/admission.
- ii. The applicant with higher percentage of marks (aggregate of best five subjects including one language) in the qualifying examination will be considered first for allotment/admission.
- iii. The applicant with the earlier date of birth (as mentioned in class X certificate) will be considered for allotment/ admission.

1. The applicant seeking admission on the basis of Sports is required to register online on the DU UG Admission portal.
2. Applicant can register for a maximum of three Games/Sports.
3. They should also register/their preference of colleges and courses/ for a maximum of five colleges and courses in order of their preference/ where they desire to get admitted. These preferences shall be utilized later in the allotment of college and course.
4. An additional registration fee of Rs. 100 will apply in the Sports category in addition to charges for (UR/OBC/SC/ST/PwBD/EWS) registration.

- 5) In Case of Tie: Applicants securing same marks in the Merit/Participation Sports Certificate in the same Game/Sport and eligible for admission in the same College and same Course may be resolved as follows:

- 8) The College shall maintain a proper record of the documents of the applicants admitted on the basis of Sports.
- 9) The list (soft copy) of finally admitted applicants on the basis of Sports shall be sent to the Dean, Admissions and Director, DUSC by the Colleges within seven days of the last date of admission of the University.
- 10) An applicant, as per their age must be eligible to participate in Inter-University competitions for the next three years and should not be employed on Part-time / Full-time basis anywhere

## Tie Breaking Criteria for Sports

In case of Tie: Applicants securing same marks in Merit/Participation Sports Certificate in the same Game/Sport and eligible for admission in the same College and same Course may be resolved as follows: -

- i) Applicant uploading Merit/Participation Sports Certificate of the same level of Sports Competition as a category in which the Applicant Sports Certificate has been marked as Highest Merit/Participation Sports Certificate will be given one mark and half mark for uploaded Merit and Participation Sports Certificate respectively.
- ii) Applicants having a higher score in the second best certificate shall be considered for allotment/ admission to break the tie.
- iii) Applicants having a higher score in the third best certificate shall be considered for allotment/ admission to break the tie.

In case the tie still persists then the following tie –breaking rule adopted for admission to entrance based courses will be adopted:

- i. The applicant with a higher percentage of marks (aggregate of best four subjects including one language) in the qualifying examination will be considered first for allotment/admission.
- ii. The applicant with higher percentage of marks (aggregate of best five subjects including one language) in the qualifying examination will be considered first for allotment/admission. The applicant with the earlier date of birth (as mentioned in class X certificate) will be considered for allotment/ admission.

## Academic Requirements

The students of the College are governed by the rules and regulations of the University of Delhi as laid down in Ordinance VII of the University Calendar. The students are required to attend all lectures, tutorials/ preceptorials and practicals regularly. **As per University rules a student is required to attend not less than two thirds of total lectures and practicals, separately, held in the college in each academic year/semester (67% in each year/semester). Students not fulfilling the attendance requirement may be debarred from appearing in the University examination.**

Students selected/deputed to participate in annual **NCC camp or NSS assignments or inter-college/ national/international sports or extra-curricular activities approved by the Principal may be condoned up to a maximum of one third lectures and practicals held.** In case of illness the leave application must be accompanied by a medical certificate and fitness certificate which should be submitted to the college office after getting the

signature of the teachers concerned. Please note that shortage of attendance will not be condoned for attending other courses of study outside the college.

### University Examination and Promotions

1. The University examination schedule and rules of promotions as prescribed by the University of Delhi will be applicable.

### Internal Assessment Scheme

As per decision of University of Delhi 25% of the total marks in each paper will be allotted for the internal assessment as per Ordinance-VIII-E of the University Calender.

### Guidelines for Under-Graduate Courses in CBCS Semester Mode Internal Assessment as per Ordinance VIII-E

Internal Assessment shall carry 25% weightage and End Semester Examination 75% weightage the distribution of Internal Assessment marks shall be as follows:

At the end of the semester, the attendance of every student in each paper in lectures and tutorials be summed up, converted into percentage, and marks awarded for Internal Assessment by the teacher.

With the introduction of Internal Assessment, the maximum marks for the University Examination in each paper shall stand reduced accordingly. For Example: for a 100 marks paper, the University shall be of 75 marks. for a 75 marks paper, the University Examination shall be of 55 marks. for a 50 marks paper, the University Examination shall be of 38 marks. for 53 marks paper, the University Examination shall be of 25 marks.

In the case of a student who is selected as a member of the N.C.C. to participate in the annual N.C.C. Camps or is deputed to undertake Civil Defence work and allied duties, or in the case of a student who is enrolled in the

National Service Scheme and is deputed to various public assignment by or with the approval of the Head of the institution concerned, or a student who is selected to participate in sports or other activities organized by the Inter-University Board or is selected to participated in sports or other activities organized by the Vice-Chancellor, or a student who is required to represent the University at the Inter University Youth Festival, or a student who is required to participate in periodical training in the Territorial Army, or a student who is deputed by the College to take part Inter-College sports, fixtures, debates seminars, symposia a social work projects, or a student who is required to represent the College concerned in debates and other extra-curricular activities held in other Universities or such other activities approved by the Vice-Chancellor, the following provision will apply:

- (i) A student in the categories listed above, will have to fulfill the requirement of written assignments and projects/term papers/seminars/field-work with the flexibility, however that she may, if necessary, be allowed additional time for submission of written assignments.
- (ii) A student in the categories listed above, will get the benefit or attendance for internal Assessment for the classes missed as per the existing provisions of Ordinance VII.2 (9) (a) (i).

**The University reserves the right to review, and if necessary moderate the marks in any paper / papers in any College / Department.**

Medical certificates shall be excluded while calculating credit towards marks to be awarded for regularity, though such certificates shall continue to be taken into account for the purpose of calculating eligibility to appear for examinations as per the existing provisions of Ordinance VII.2.9.(a)(ii).

### **Payment of Fee**

**All fee receipts should be preserved for scrutiny and should be produced at the time of filling up the examination forms and refund of caution money. Notice regarding payment of College/Examination fee will be put up on the notice board.**

### **Identity Card**

Every student is issued an identity card by the College. **It is mandatory for the students to carry them every day. In case of any kind of indiscipline, the I-card will be confiscated.** In case of loss of I-card the students are advised to intimate the college office immediately. Duplicate I-card will be issued on payment of Rs. 100/- Any change of address or phone no. should also be notified by the student.

### **Discipline**

Students will be governed as per Ordinance XV-B of the University Calendar.

### **Choice Based Credit System (CBCS): Guidelines**

1. One credit is equivalent to one hour of teaching(Lecture/tutorial) or two are of practical of field work per week. The duration of classes may be decided according by the principals of colleges.
2. The number of papers under core course, elective course and ability enhancement courses and their respective credits for different undergraduate programmes is as per UGC's guidelines.
3. The examination scheme as approved by the Academic Council and Executive Council for the undergraduate courses under CBCS by amending Ordinances VIII(2) and ordinance IX.
4. As per standard, the size of the tutorials is 10-15 students. The Principals of the respective Colleges may decide about the class size and tutorial size as per their requirement according to prescribed stanadards.
5. The gender elective courses offered by the departments will be taught by teachers of the same departments.



6. The Principals of the colleges may take decision for offering more than one general elective papers to be opted by the students in each semester.
7. A student admitted in a particular department can opt for general elective courses offered by the other department, for example, a student admitted under B.A. (Hons.) History programme cannot opt for general elective courses offered by the department of history.
8. The general elective papers as prepared by departments and approved by the academic council and executive council of the University of Delhi can be offered in the academic year 2020-21.
9. The core papers of English/Hindi/MIL as part of two languages required to be studied is different from the courses of English/Hindi/MIL under Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC).
10. The student of B.Sc. (Hons.) Botany and B.Sc. (Hons.) Zoology must opt one or two General Elective papers offered by Department of chemistry so that their eligibility for admission in various Institutions is not hampered.
11. Similarly, students admitted under B.Sc. Programme and willing to pursue post -graduation in Physics/Chemistry/Electronics must opt a paper of Mathematics as General Elective, if Mathematics is not one of the core discipline being studied.

The student of B.Sc. (Hons.)/B.A. (Hons.)/B.Com. (Hons.) in order to be eligible for post-graduate in another discipline may opt for the General Elective of a particular subject in each semester to earn 24 credits in the concerned discipline.

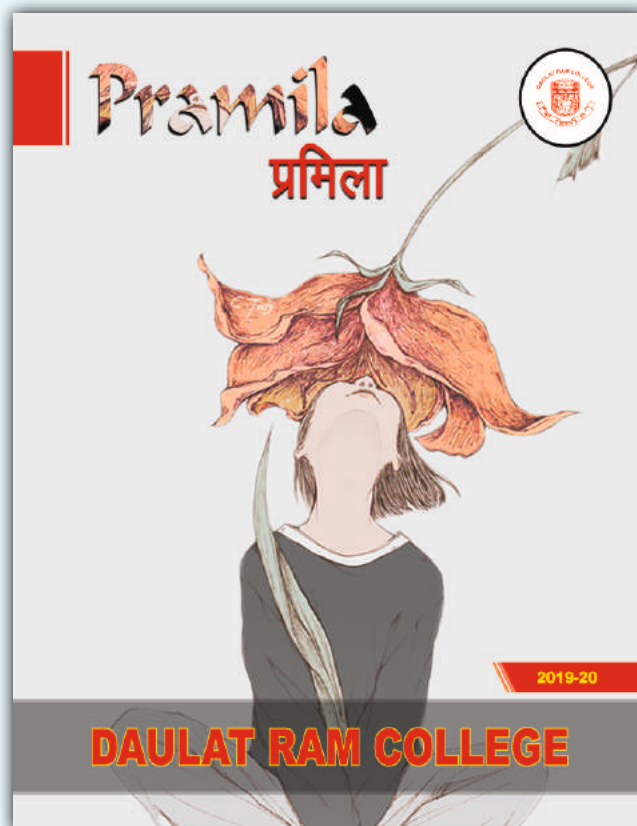

# Departmental Profile

## DEPARTMENT OF BIOCHEMISTRY

The Department of Biochemistry was started in the year 1988 and offers a BSc (Hons) course. This course covers areas in basic and advanced Biochemistry. The department has well equipped laboratories wherein all modern biology experiments can be conducted. Department also has Drosophila Resource Centre , Zebra fish lab facility, Recycling Unit and Bioinformatics centre to impart short term training, and research internships to the students. The department is the recipient of Star Status Award by the Department of Biotechnology, GOI. Students are exposed to scientific research conducted in various prestigious institutes like IISER Pune, IISER Mohali, NBRC, NIN Hyderabad, CDFD, RCB, BHU, IGIB by taking them on either educational trips or open days conducted by these institutes. Eminent scientists are invited to the



department under a programme called 'Meet the scientist' where students get a one to one chance to interact with the scientists. Students are even encouraged for off-campus internships at these scientific institutions in summer break. The department has the distinction of having over 90% first classes as well as University positions every year. They have been bagging University gold medal for securing first position in University, KVBY fellowship, DRC silver jubilee merit scholarships, all rounder awards and proficiency prizes. Graduates from the department have been selected for integrated Ph.D. and MSc programmes through entrance exams in Biochemistry, Biotechnology, Molecular Biology, Neurosciences, Genetics and other Life Science courses in leading scientific Institutions such as IISc (Bengaluru), TIFR-NCBS, IISER (Pune), AIIMS, JNU, UDSC as well as Cambridge and Universities in the US and Germany.

Recently, DST Inspire was conducted by the department to educate various school students from Delhi/NCR to Biotechnology as a prospective future. The department is proud of its alumni who hold faculty/ scientific positions at prestigious US universities, JNU, DRDO, Delhi University Biochemistry Department, and many undergraduate Colleges.

Keeping in pace with the recent advancements in the field of plant sciences and the revised undergraduate curriculum thereof, the department regularly organizes workshops, seminars, conferences and skill enhancement courses for students as well as faculty members. As a part of **Golden Jubilee** celebration a Symposium on "Environment and Sustainable





Development- New Perspectives” was successfully organised on 14th February 2019. For a better and in-depth understanding of the subjects taught in classroom, the department organizes educational trips to various Research Institutes, Biodiversity Parks, and Industries for students. Apart from academics, the students are given a chance to showcase their talent and creativity by participating in various co-curricular and extra-curricular activities of the botanical society “Vasundhara”. The annual inter college botanical festival “Orchidz” is also celebrated with great enthusiasm. “Liana”, the botanical society magazine gives the student a platform to learn and contribute about interesting and latest events in the field of plant sciences. Thus, the three year CBCS course in B.Sc.(Hons) Botany and B.Sc. ## DEPARTMENT OF CHEMISTRY

Chemistry is one of the leading subject in pure sciences which offers the students an epitome platform to explore the fascinating world of atoms and molecules, their interactions as well as transformations. Chemistry is sometimes called the central science as it bridges other natural sciences like physics, geology and biology. The three year honours course is a fine balance of Inorganic, Organic and Physical Chemistry integrated with related fields like physics, Mathematics, Computer Applications, Biochemistry, Environmental Studies, Biology etc. which enables the students to create an awareness of issues within chemistry that overlap with other related disciplines.

After graduation, student can get enrolled in PG courses such as M.Sc. in Inorganic, Organic, Physical, Analytical Chemistry, Polymer Science, Forensic Science, Material Science, Biotechnology, Nanotechnology etc. They can also pursue MBA, MCA and B.Ed. A qualification in chemistry opens door to a wide range of careers that includes teaching, industry (both chemical and pharmaceutical) and research.

The department has highly qualified, dedicated and experienced faculty. Department has well equipped laboratories for regular practical classes as well research activities. Department has been awarded star status by DBT. It has been running DBT star college project since 2011. Department has also completed nine innovation projects out of which one of them was awarded best innovative idea award for the year 2014-15 by University of Delhi.

National and International conferences were organized (November 2016 and March 2018) to make participants aware about new scientific developments and to provide connect with other attendees from different perspectives and views. Faculty Development Programme (June 2017) was organized to benefit the faculty members of different colleges to enrich their knowledge, diverse skills and ability to integrate technology into teaching, learning and research activities. Department also organizes skill development programmes for students during summer and winter breaks to enhance the learning by hands on experiences with various analytical techniques and green methodologies which helps them in pursuing careers in academics, research and industry.

## DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE



The Department of Commerce which completed its 50 years in 2019-2020, offers two courses **B.Com. (Hons.)** and **B.Com.** Through subjects like Accounting, Taxation, Marketing, Finance, Law, Computers etc., students gain not only disciplinary knowledge but also develop critical thinking, communication skills, moral & ethical awareness, digital literacy, reflective thinking and a problem-solving approach. This provides the foundation for students to pursue **professional courses** such as C.A., CS, ICWA, L.L.B, and MBA. The Department also offers **Entrepreneurship and Small Business**

**Development (ESB)** as a discipline option to the B.A Programme students. This course inculcates in students, the intricacies of starting their own business ventures by developing analytical and managerial skills. Generic Elective Papers offered to students of other departments such as Investing in Stock Market, Business Management, Advertising, Insurance and Risk Management, Entrepreneurship etc. provide a holistic view about the evolving business world.

In order to nurture the intellectual, personal, interpersonal and social skills of students, the Department through Commerce Association and specialised cells like Cyber Cell, Finance and Investment Cell and Smarketing Cell conducts events throughout the year. The Annual Commerce Fest 'Comvision', provides students with a platform to showcase and develop their talent and creativity by organising and participating in events such as Case Study, Business Plan, Debate, Group Discussion, Ad-Mad etc. 'Combuzz' is the annual newsletter of the department where the students share their thoughts, innovative ideas and perspectives about the commerce landscape. The Department also organises skill development programmes, seminars and workshops for students on various contemporary topics such as Startups, Goods and Services Tax, Research Methodology, Career Prospects etc. This year, the Department organised a National Conference jointly with the Economics Department on "Income Inequality, Protectionism and International Trade in Digital Age: With reference to India". The Department was awarded DU Innovation Project in 2013 and Star Project in 2015 to pursue field and research work.

Final year students in high numbers get placed in reputed companies such as EY, KPMG, Deloitte, Finedge, S&P Global, Genpact etc through the college Placement Cell, while those in first and second years are provided internship opportunities in companies like Global Arcus, Reliance, Zomato, Outlook etc. to get exposure of the corporate world.

## DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS



The Department of Economics of Daulat Ram College was established in 1960. The Department offers a complete three-year undergraduate B.A.(Hons) Economics course. Further, it offers interdisciplinary courses (like Introductory Micro and Macroeconomics, Indian Economy, Money and Banking, Public Finance etc.) and skill enhancement courses (like Research Methodology, Contemporary Economic Issues etc.). The papers and the course offered, aims to provides a theoretical and practical understanding of the core economic principles both, at micro and macro level and enables one to understand what, 'being developed'

entails in this globalized world and what policy initiatives can be taken to make India a developed nation. The cut-off for admissions to the BA (Hons) Economics course for the last 5 years has been in the range of 95%-97%.

The department comprises of a team of dedicated faculty members to guide and support students at every stage. The faculty has vast experience in the field of teaching and research, with a number of research papers published in various national and international journals. The department as a whole comprising of both, teachers and students has been one of the most proactive and innovative departments of the college.

The department members are also members of the Economics Association, 'Éclat' which apart from organising activities like freshers welcome and farewell for the students of Economics, conducts several seminars, national and international conferences to enlighten them about the possible future prospects they may have and to provide them a clear understanding of all the possible post graduate courses that the students can pursue in future. Further, the association organises 'Mutasir', a youth conference, in which prominent economists are invited to talk about contemporary economic issues. This helps in broadening the scope and understanding of the students regarding the discipline. The association also launches the annual publication 'Optima', which is an interesting mosaic of ideas and understanding of various topics of economics, by the students and the faculty members. Further, the annual economics festival

'Economania', is organised by the association. In the festival, events like debate, paper presentations, MUNs or Modelling United Nations and so on, are conducted to keep up the competitive spirit among the students. The students of the discipline are also encouraged to be active members of the Entrepreneurship Cell and Finance and Investment Cell of the College (Co-convened by the Economics Department). Overall, the department, through regular classes and associations and cells activities aim to equip the student with tools to harness future career opportunities in fields of Academics, Consultancy, Think-Tanks, Policymaking, Analysts, Research, Business Administration, Banking, Government Administration, Corporate consultants, among others. Students can bag various prestigious fellowships like the Young India Fellowship, LAMP Fellowship (Legislative Assistant to Member of Parliament), Gandhi fellowship (social sector fellowship), Teach for India fellowship. Students with an economics background usually avail of various internship prospects with Niti Aayog, Ministry of Finance, Ministry of External Affairs, Corporates etc.

## DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH

The weekly Study Circle, held every Wednesday in the Activity Slot involves students in paper presentations, panel discussions, workshops and other interactive sessions. The Department of English believes in an interdisciplinary pedagogical approach and encourages the students to step out of the classroom and engage with literary texts as performances, book readings, film screenings and talks. Interactions with authors, scholars, critics, theatre personnel and performance artists, proves to be a very enriching experience for the students, as literature too, comes alive for them in the process.

The department holds an Annual Literary Festival and releases its magazine, Expressions, comprising students' contributions. In April 2018, the Department released the first ever digital version of its magazine.

In addition, the Department conducts regular tutorials for M.A. students of the Previous and Final years, starting with an Orientation session.

हिंदी साहित्य में ऑनर्स पाठ्यक्रम महाविद्यालय में 1964 में विधिवत आरंभ हुआ था। उसके पहले 1960 से 1963 तक हिंदी विषय पासकोर्स का अभिन्न अंग था। तब से लेकर अब तक हिंदी साहित्य और भाषा से जुड़े इस पाठ्यक्रम समय के साथ नए विकल्पों और विषयों को भी अपने में समाहित किया है, ताकि छात्राएं भविष्य में बेहतर रोजगार के अवसरों का लाभ उठा सकें।

हिंदी भाषा और साहित्य का अध्ययन जनसम्पर्क का, भारतीय समाज की विचारशक्ति को गहराई से जानने का अवसर देता है। यह अध्ययन जड़ों से जोड़ता है, ज्ञान क्षेत्र का विस्तार करता है। मानव प्रकृति को समझने की प्रेरणा देता है। सृजन, विवेचन और मूल्यांकन की क्षमता का विकास करता है। भाषा प्रयोग की दक्षता बढ़ाता है। हिन्दी स्नातक के लिए स्नातकोत्तर अध्ययन, टीचर ट्रेनिंग, भाषा-शिक्षण, मीडिया, (टी वी, रेडियो) जनसंचार और पत्रकारिता, अनुवाद, सृजनात्मक लेखन, रंगमंच, विज्ञापन, हिन्दी कम्प्यूटिंग, हिन्दी अधिकारी, जनसम्पर्क

अधिकारी आदि कार्यक्षेत्र खुले हैं। हिन्दी का स्नातक प्रशासनिक सेवा की परीक्षा भी दे सकता है।

साहित्य अध्यापन का कार्य शोध कार्य में रुचि रखने वाले समर्पित अनुभवी प्राध्यापकों द्वारा किया जाता है, जो स्वयं को क्रियाशील बनाये रखने के साथ-साथ विभिन्न कार्यशालाओं, राष्ट्रीय और अंतर्राष्ट्रीय संगोष्ठियों में भाग लेते रहते हैं। इसके साथ साहित्य परिषद् द्वारा विभाग की हस्तलिखित पत्रिका 'मानसी' का विमोचन भी प्रतिवर्ष होता है। और विभिन्न प्रतियोगिताओं का आयोजन करके छात्राओं का अंतर्मुखी एवं बहिर्मुखी विकास किया जाता है। हिन्दी विभाग, हिन्दी विशेष और बी० ए० प्रोग्राम दोनों से संबन्धित पाठ्यक्रम प्रस्तावित करता है। हिन्दी विशेष के तीन वर्षीय पाठ्यक्रम में भाषा और साहित्य के विविध पक्षों की जानकारी दी जाती है। साथ ही हिन्दी भाषा से जुड़े रचनाकार और उनकी कालजयी कृतियाँ पाठ्यक्रम में शामिल हैं, वहीं अन्य भारतीय भाषाओं के रचनाकारों की विशिष्ट कृतियाँ भी पाठ्यक्रम का हिस्सा हैं, जो समय, समाज और ज्वलंत विषयों पर गहन संवेदनशीलता के साथ विचार करने को प्रेरित करती हैं। बी० ए० प्रोग्राम में हिन्दी अनिवार्य, मुख्य तथा वैकल्पिक विषय के रूप में पढ़ाई जाती है। अन्य विषयों के ऑनर्स में यह जैनरिक, हिन्दी कौशल संवर्द्धक और एम०आई०एल० कम्प्यूटिकेशन के रूप में पढ़ाई जाती है।

The department of History was set up in the year 1960, when the discipline was offered in the B.A. Programme course. Subsequently, it was upgraded as a full fledged Honours course. Today the department also offers many interdisciplinary papers to students from other departments in the form of general elective and skill enhancement courses. The syllabus offered by the department covers both Indian and World History from antiquity to the contemporary period. The department has dedicated and qualified teachers, with a variety of research and teaching specialization. The teaching methodology is interdisciplinary with a hands-on

The course structure allows the students to develop conceptual and geometrical understanding and a deeper approach to learning via the use of advanced softwares such as Mathematica, R, Latex, TORA etc. The teaching methodology lays emphasis on interactive classes, skilful problem-solving techniques and uses various available e-resources.

“Affine”, the Mathematics association organises various lectures by eminent Professors throughout the year. An inter-college annual festival “Shoonya” is organised wherein several competitions related to Mathematics are held. In addition to it, annual newsletter “Mathpunch” is launched, which brings forth the creative talent of the students. To motivate the students to excel in academics, the college awards Proficiency Prizes( for securing highest marks in each year), Silver Jubilee Merit Scholarship (for securing I,II or III rank at university level in Ist or IInd year) and Teachers Memorial Prize (for securing I, II or III rank at university level, all three years combined). Apart from this, students can also apply for various scholarships such as NBHM scholarship, Inspire program etc during or after their B.Sc. or M.Sc. Course in Mathematics.

An undergraduate degree in Mathematics enables students to go for masters in Mathematics, Statistics, Operational Research, MBA, MCA, Actuarial Sciences etc. Mathematics offers a huge variety of career opportunities like in Accountancy, Banking, Computing and ICT, Statistical Research and Teaching.

## DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICS

Physics is basic among all natural sciences. It encompasses the study of universe from largest galaxies to smallest subatomic particles. Physics Department of Daulat Ram College is 43 years old and has well equipped laboratories and a well-stocked library. The college started Honors course in Physics from academic session 2017-18. The course not only provides an in-depth knowledge of core topics of physics but also integrates them with mathematics and chemistry. A physicist has the ability to synthesize and analyze large quantity of data and present their analysis in an easily understandable form. After graduating in Physics, student can pursue post-graduation in courses such as Physics, Geophysics, Electronics, Material Science, Nanotechnology, Biophysics, Computational Physics, Data Science etc. This further opens a plethora of career opportunities to students in Academics as teachers/professors, in research institutes as scientists, in industries such as semiconductor, electronics, analog instrumentation industries etc., and in defense and banking sectors as well. ## DEPARTMENT OF POLITICAL SCIENCE

Thus our graduates/post graduates become influential performers in a range of professional settings.

Republica, the Political Science Association provides a forum to the students to engage in critical thinking, debates and discussions on important issues and predicaments. In addition, it organises its intercollege festival, METAMORPHOSIS, based on a theme on issues and concerns that are relevant, in which the students across colleges and departments participate in various academic activities that unfold the complexities and multiplicities of ideas and interpretations, which contributes towards an adequate and comprehensive understanding of the discipline. Every year interactive career counselling sessions are held with students. Our alumni go to study at esteemed Universities across the country. The student Discussion Group, Politics on Toast, meets every week to discuss and analyse issues of contemporary politics. Students from our department actively participate in inter-college competitions across disciplines and have won prizes in debates and paper presentation. They also intern with various institutions such as Parliament and Ministry of External Affairs, Department of External Publicity and Public Diplomacy. ## DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHOLOGY

The department which has a history of over five decades is well-equipped with state-of-art laboratories, latest psychological tests and equipment. It has an active Psychology Association which organizes several academic and co-curricular activities including Conferences and a Departmental magazine "PsyTrack". The department is also the first in the University to have a 'Psychology Resource Centre' which is actively involved in working towards positive self-development, mental health enhancement, etc. The Counselling Centre is also being run in the department for students, teaching and non-teaching staff. The dedicated faculty uses latest teaching methods such as multimedia preparations, role-play and experimental training. Our faculty also actively participates in academic pursuits such as publication of research papers, attending conferences and supervising doctoral work. In keeping with the demands of the contemporary world and the emphasis on skills, the department regularly organizes skill development and value engagement programs.

The Psychology association organized various activities in the session 2019-2020. On 6th April 2019, a talk on 'Exploring the Vulnerabilities of the LGBTQIA+ Community in India' was organized. On 11th April 2019, farewell for the outgoing batch was organized, and on 6th September, 2019, the inaugural function and fresher's welcome for the first-year psychology students was held. On 26th August 2019, movie screening and analysis workshop under the title 'A Transformation from Loneliness to Solitude' by Mr. Sourav Sarkar was organized. On August 28, 2019, a workshop for





final year students titled 'Perceptive Leader' was conducted by Mr. V. Shri Hari. The Fifth Value Engagement Program on "Values enhancing Well-Being" was organised from 16th August to 30th September, 2019 for first year undergraduate Psychology students. On October 1st, 2019, World Mental Health Day was organized. The highlight of the day was a panel discussion on the theme 'Promoting Eudaimonia: A State of Happiness and Satisfaction'. ## DEPARTMENT OF ZOOLOGY



Zoology department of Daulat Ram College (DRC) was established in 1968 and currently holds Star department status by Department of Biotechnology (DBT) of Government of India. Department supports undergraduate teaching of Zoology (Honours) and life science (program) courses. In the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS), department is offering generic elective course for Botany, Biochemistry and Chemistry departments & Skill-enhancement courses for DRC students. Department introduces its students to the fascinating world of animals and facilitates learning in classical and modern systematic aspects of animal diversity and help them to

learn its relationship within natural environment. Students seeking skills in fields of Immunology, Biotechnology, Medical diagnostics, Research methodology and various fields of Applied Zoology are greatly benefited by this course.

The department has an active Zoological Society which organises special lectures, debates, excursions to wild life

National Parks, Sanctuaries, national laboratories and academic Institutions. Zoological society with the help of volunteers from department organises Freshers welcome, farewell and Zoological department festival every year. Students often manage to get sponsorship from various companies. Each year department chooses faculty advisor on rotation basis, who help them in organising these events. Department of zoology students apply & receives various scholarships by Government of India to pursue their undergraduate course from Daulat Ram College. Among scholarships students often receive DST-inspire fellowship, ISHAN-UDAY fellowship, POSE-DBT scholarship by Government of Haryana. Many of our students receive Delhi University meritorious award Daulat Ram College offers proficiency award to individual and combined as well as university topper for honours students. Apart from this university gives meritorious award to the toppers of each year. DRC also have three constituted prize for scoring highest marks in first and second year combined and maximum marks in ecology and zoogeography.

On completion of undergraduate course, students have the choice to pursue a post-graduate degree in fields like Biomedical sciences, zoology, Immunology, Biotechnology, Entomology, Fisheries, Agriculture, Genetics, Molecular Biology, Microbiology, Environmental Management or Bioinformatics and pursue Ph.D. Programs. Our students have great success stories, many of them have become professors at different central universities and CSIR laboratories. Many of our students have also joined Indian Administrative Services or US federal services and settled abroad. Other than these areas, students can also enter into inter-disciplinary careers like Dietics and Nutrition, Health and Life- style management, Pathology etc.

Department of Zoology faculties are also involved in performing basic research, mentoring students to undertake projects and present their work in national and international conferences. Students from the department often gets opportunity to train in Drosophila Resource centre, e-literacy facilities, Neuropharmacology & Drug Delivery research laboratory and Zebra fish facility of Biochemistry department. The department provides facilities like Zoology museum, well equipped spacious laboratories and research labs for our students. The department maintains a rich library and help students with the resource material required during their course of study. Entrants can explore their talents through various academics and extra-curricular activities organised by active Zoological Society "Koshika". Various seminars, conferences and workshops are regularly conducted in the department at National and International level, encouraging the students to organise and participate in the mentorship of teachers. Overall, Department of zoology has experienced faculties with several years of teaching and research experience therefore, it is one of the most sought after department of our college.

# FACILITIES @ DRC

## Library and Reading Room

Library and Reading Room facilities are open only to students and staff of the college. The College Library possesses an excellent collection of more than 1,20,000 books and journals/ periodicals. The Library is open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on week days i.e. Monday to Friday. On Saturday, library is open for students but books issue and return facility is not available. The Library is completely digitalized with latest soft wares. Library boasts of a separate Braille Section with soft wares such as (Angel: Talking Digital Pocket Daisy Player, E-Book Reader, MP3 Player, Radio cum voice Recorder) for the benefit of differently-abled students, especially Visually Handicapped.

## Terms and Conditions for Issuing of Books

1. Before leaving the counter, the member should ensure that the book lent to her is in sound condition, if not, she should immediately bring it to the notice of the Librarian. Otherwise she would be liable for any loss/damage and required to replace it with a sound/fresh copy.
2. Periodicals, directories, encyclopaedias, which might be difficult to replace and other books that are declared reference books by the Librarian would not be lent out.
3. Members are not allowed to sub-lend the books of the library.
4. Students who return books later than the due date will be liable to pay a fine as decided by the College authorities from time to time.
5. At present the fine for general section books is -1 per day for first fifteen days of delay. Thereafter, it will be -5 per day for one month, after which the fine will be -10 per day. Fine for Reserved Section books is -2 per day for first week and thereafter it is -10 per day.
6. Any infringement of the rules will deprive the member of the privilege of admission to and of borrowing books from the Library.
7. Each student of M.A. course is entitled to borrow six books at a time.
8. The Library membership will be valid till the student leaves the college.
9. Timings for Issue and Return of Books:
  - i. Books from General Section are issued and returned from 9.00 a.m. to 4.00 p.m.
  - ii. Timings for issue of books from Reserved Section are from 12.30 p.m. to 4.00 p.m.
  - iii. Books from Reference Section are only issued for consultation in the Library against Reference Card from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

## Teachers Study Room

The college has a well-maintained teachers study room adjacent to library which is equipped with computer facility and lockers. The study area is WiFi enabled, promoting easy access to research and study material.

## Laboratories

The College has well equipped and well managed laboratories for all the Science Courses offered, viz. Bio-Chemistry, Botany, Chemistry, Physics and Zoology. The Departments of Nutrition & Health Education, Maths and Psychology also have separate well equipped labs.



### Computer Lab

The College has well equipped Computer Labs with Pentium machines powered by the latest configuration. The Labs have connectivity with the Delhi University intranet with access to the internet. The main computer lab has 38 computers and there is an additional computer lab for Commerce and Mathematics students which has 25 computers with internet facility. The Commerce computer lab and Maths computer lab has 40 computer terminals each. The Maths computer lab has licensed UBUNTU version 8.1 and licensed SPSS for students and faculty.



### College Auditorium-Sadbhavna Bhawan

The college auditorium, Sadbhavna Bhawan is a proscenium hall with a large stage and a seating capacity of over 1,400, ideally suited for theatre activities and dramatics with plays having large cast. All major intra-college and inter-college events also take place in the auditorium.



### Conference Hall

The Conference Hall has a capacity of 200. Since its inception in October 2016 it has been venue of a large number of academic workshops, seminars and conferences. The hall is fully air-conditioned, Wi-Fi enabled with digital projection and best audio facility. The college hosts inter-college, intra-college and departmental activities in this hall. It has been a big asset for the college.

### Seminar Hall

The Seminar Hall of the college is the place for multifarious activities throughout the year. The activities in the seminar room range from curricular and co-curricular seminars, lectures, debates, discussions and workshops to Student Union functions, NSS and Women Development Centre activities. It serves as a perfect venue for hosting departmental farewell and freshers' programs. It is air conditioned, with a seating capacity of 200 people. Its wooden panels allow space division making the large area convenient to be used for simultaneous multipurpose activities.

### Amphitheatre

The open-air amphitheatre, namely Rangshala, offers a stage to the young students to hone their talent, communication and performing skills. It has been witness to many famous events and has provided a forum to many burgeoning artists. It is the perfect spot for nukkadnatak, societies' practice, dance performances. It has been a venue for hoisting national flag during Republic Day and Independence Day celebrations.



### Medical Room



Medical room with an attendant nurse and first aid facilities is available from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The students can also



avail of the World University Health Service of the University of Delhi against the nominal annual fee of Rupees five.

### College Canteen

The College canteen offers a varied menu at subsidized rates. The College Canteen provides healthy and nutritious food for students. A range of cuisines are freshly and hygienically prepared and made available for breakfast and lunch. Apart from cooked choices, students can buy branded packed snacks too.



### Nescafe Corner



Located amidst the bank and canteen, the Nescafe corner serves as a serene space for out-of-the-classrooms brainstorming sessions. The kiosk provides a range of hot and cold beverages and accompaniments. The outdoor benches and circular tables add to the charm of the place.

The College has banking facilities on its premises. The University Branch of Indian Overseas Bank operates in the College. It also has an ATM facility for students.

### Placement cell





The Placement Cell of Daulat Ram College lives by its motto **“If one dreams to do it, one can do it, and we vow to provide all the aid we can”**. The Placement Cell works with dedication and enthusiasm to provide the best internship and recruitment opportunities to the students.

### Psychology Resource Centre

The Psychology Resource Centre (PRC) addresses the psycho-social needs of the students, teachers and non-teaching staff, that is, to be aware of and effectively manage with everyday life issues and stressors which include self-growth and development, handling stress and emotions, relationship issues, academic pressures, constant worry and anxiety. With changing times, human life has become increasingly stressful making it imperative for people to be aware and develop a psychological understanding of themselves and their surroundings. This is achieved by PRC provides counseling services, Faculty Development Programs, functions and events that address the mental health and well-being of all stakeholders. PRC includes: Mental Health Center, Value Education Center, Positive Psychology Centre and Capacity Building Centre.

### Drosophila Resource Center

Drosophila Resource Centre was set up in Department of Biochemistry almost 10 years ago. The centre is funded by DBT Star College Project. It aims to teach the basic principles of genetics using Drosophila as model system. Almost 250 students have been trained since its inception. Students of different life science streams such as Botany, Biochemistry, Life Sciences and Zoology from DU and Punjab University have been trained at the centre. A lab manual on





'Rediscovering Genetics' has been published in 2016 that covers the range of experiments performed by the students at the centre. The students have been immensely benefited by this training which is reflected in their selection and perusal of higher education in genetics from prestigious places. The centre also provides stocks and support to many colleges of Delhi University and AIIMS.

### Zebrafish Lab Facility

The zebrafish lab facility was set up in October 2015, jointly by Biochemistry department and Zoology department in collaboration with CSIR-IGIB, Mathura Road, Delhi, and Sansriti Foundation Delhi. The facility is funded by Star Innovation projects DU, Star College project DBT, Govt. of India, and Innovation projects DU. It was developed with the aim of providing an alternative in vivonon –invasive model system for science education, teaching and research. The facility provides training in zebrafish model system to faculty and students. Till date ~ 50 faculty members and ~500 students from various science streams of different Delhi University Colleges have participated in several workshops conducted for training in zebrafish lab facility. The state of the art temperature and photo-period controlled facility houses automated re-circulatory fish habitat system, RO water plant, stereo-microscopes, inverted microscope with digital display screen ( Evos) and fluorescent microscope ( Nikon). The facility have been hosting summer internship program for students (under-graduate and post graduate) to get hands on training and research experience. zebrafish lab facility also serves as a resource center to provide zebrafish and embryos to other colleges/ departments and research institutes to support teaching and lab product.



### RO Water

Cold and purified drinking water is supplied to the students through the RO system. Upgraded from bulky water coolers, the water is dispensed through seamless junction of taps located in a clean area dedicated for this purpose. Located on ground and first floors, the area is beautifully lit up by posters signifying the importance of water conservation.

### Wi-Fi Connectivity

The College is fully Wi-Fi enabled. Keeping in mind the advanced technological demands of the students, the college provides this facility to all the students by sharing a secure password to be used within the college premises.

### CCTV Surveillance

Closed-Circuit Television Units, 50 approx. in number, are strategically installed in the college and hostel premises to ensure that proper discipline is maintained. It is also useful for safety concerns of students.



## Hostel

Daulat Ram College Hostel established in 1974, is the accommodation facility exclusively meant for 200 undergraduate students of the College. The hostel is equipped with various modern facilities and amenities, viz., air-conditioned rooms, laundry, free Wi-fi, computer room, medical room etc. to ensure a comfortable and happy stay for the resident students. The hostel has pleasing ambience with well laid out lawns and gardens which help in providing a peaceful and conducive atmosphere for studies. It has been winning acclaim and awards for the best maintained environment in Delhi University. The hostel also has its own kitchen garden. Active participation of resident students in all co-curricular, extra-curricular and cultural events of college and hostel help in their holistic development. It is proud of its successful and illustrious alumnae for whom it was always a 'home away from home'. Admission to the hostel is strictly on the basis of merit. All admission related information is displayed on the hostel notice board from time to time.

## Green Ride: (Last Mile Connectivity)

Introduced in 2017, it is a public bicycle sharing system which is one of the unique features of DRC. Promoting healthier lifestyle and everyday practices, this is an initiative which is environmental friendly. Students can hire bicycles for rides within the university campus. Once the ride is complete, the bicycles can be deposited at any of the five such centres located in North Campus. Please contact the centre for more details.

## Sports Complex and Gymnasium

The college has a state-of-the-art gym complete with latest fitness equipment and machinery including treadmills, cross-body trainer, exercising bike, weight trainer etc. Promoting a healthy and active lifestyle, it caters to the students and staff who wish to avail the facility.

## Recycling Unit

College aims to become zero discharge campus. Thus it has set up a recycling unit on campus which houses a paper recycling machines and leave shredder machine. This machines help to make recycled paper and leave shredder machine helps to make manure. The functioning of recycling unit is improving day by day with manufacture of tons of fertiliser which is used in house or sold outside, preparation ceramic pots with medicinal/antipollution plants, making of white and brown recycled paper, use of these papers for painting. Ceramic pots and paintings made here are used as gifts for our guests in the college. Students can do their internship here and can earn NSS hours by participating in its functioning. Ever since its inception in 2016 this unit has processed tons of shredded leaves into manure, recycle paper and cartons, provide potted plants for gifting and also provide folders, paintings, carry bags made from recycled paper. Training workshops help to train the students and community members regularly.

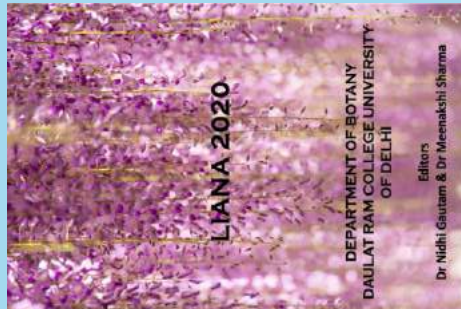

# Annual News Letters



## Relevant University Ordinances:

### ORDINANCE XV-B

Maintenance of discipline among Students of the University

1. All powers relating to discipline and disciplinary action are vested in the Vice - Chancellor.
2. The Vice-Chancellor may delegate all or such powers as he /she deems proper to the Proctor and to such other persons as he/she may specify in this behalf.
3. Without prejudice to the generality of power to enforce discipline under the Ordinance the following shall amount to acts of gross indiscipline:
  - a. Physical assault, or threat to use physical force, against any member of the teaching and nonteaching staff of any Institution /Department and against any student within the University of Delhi
  - b. Carrying of, use of or threat to use of any weapons
  - c. Any violation of the provisions of the Civil Rights Protection Act, 1976
  - d. Violation of the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes
  - e. Any practice-whether verbal or otherwise-derogatory of women
  - f. Any attempt at bribing or corruption in any manner
  - g. Willful destruction of institutional property
  - h. Creating ill-will or intolerance on religious or communal grounds
  - i. Causing disruption in any manner of the academic functioning of the University system;
  - j. Prohibition of Ragging as per Ordinance XV-C.
4. Without prejudice to the generality of his/her powers relating to the maintenance of discipline and taking such action in the interest of maintaining discipline as may seem to him/her appropriate, the Vice-Chancellor, may in the exercise of his/her powers aforesaid order or direct that any student or students -
  - a. be expelled; or
  - b. be, for a stated period rusticated; or
  - c. be not for a stated period, admitted to a programme or programmes of study in a College, Department or Institution of the University; or
  - d. be fined with a sum of rupees that may be specified; or
  - e. be debarred from taking a University or College or Departmental Examination or Examinations for one or more years; or that the result of the student or students concerned in the Examination or Examinations in which he /she or they have appeared be cancelled.
5. Institutions, Halls and teaching in the concerned Departments. They may exercise their authority through, or delegate authority to such of the teachers in their Colleges, Institutions or Departments as they may specify for these purposes.
6. Without prejudice to the powers of the Vice-Chancellor and the Proctor as aforesaid, detailed rules of discipline and proper conduct shall be framed. These rules may be supplemented, where necessary, by the Principals of Colleges, Heads of Halls, Deans of Faculties and Heads of Teaching Departments in this University. Each student shall be expected to provide himself / herself with a copy of these rules. At the time of admission, every student shall be required to sign a declaration that on admission he /she submits himself / herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice-Chancellor and several authorities of the University who may be vested with the authority to exercise discipline under the Acts, the Statutes, the Ordinances and the rules that have been framed therein by the University.

## ORDINANCE XV-C

### Prohibition and Punishment for Ragging

1. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, within the premises of College/Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.
2. Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
3. Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students; and includes individual or collective acts or practices which
  - a. Involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force.
  - b. Violate the status, dignity and honour of women students.
  - c. Violate the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled caste and tribe.
  - d. Expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem.
  - e. Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behaviour.
4. The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department or an Institution, the authorities of College, or University Hostel or Halls of Residence shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
5. Notwithstanding anything in Clause (4) above, the Proctor may also suo motu enquire into any incident of ragging and make a report to the Vice-Chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.
6. The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.
7. If the Principal of a College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an enquiry, he/she may so advise the Vice-Chancellor accordingly.
8. When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his/her decision shall be final.
9. On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3(a), (b) and (c) the Vice-Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a student or students for a specific number of years.
10. The Vice-chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not for a stated period, admitted to a programme of study in a college, departmental examination for one or more years or that the results of the student or students concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared be cancelled.
11. In case any students who have obtained degrees or diplomas of the University of Delhi are found guilty; under this Ordinance, appropriate action will be taken under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees or diploma conferred by the University.
12. For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging whether by way of any act, practice or incitement of ragging will also amount to ragging.
13. All Institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instructions/directions issued under this Ordinance, and to give aid assistance to the Vice-Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance.

*Note: Order of the Vice-Chancellor in pursuance of Ordinance XV-C:*

Where incident(s) of ragging are reported to the Vice-Chancellor by any authority under this Ordinance, the



students(s) involved in ragging, shall be expelled for a specified term, designated in the order. Non- students involved in reports of ragging will be proceeded with under the criminal law of India; they will also be rendered ineligible for a period of five years from seeking enrolment in any of the institutions of the University of Delhi. Students against whom necessary action is taken under this note, will be given post decisional hearing, with strict adherence to the rules of natural justice.

### **ORDINANCE XV-D**

The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 (Ministry of Law and Justice)

An Act to provide protection against sexual harassment of women at workplace and for the prevention and redressal of complaints of sexual harassment and for matters connected there with incidental thereto.

WHEREAS sexual harassment results in violation of the fundamental rights of a woman to equality under articles 14 and 15 of the Constitution of India and her right to life and to live with dignity under article 21 of the Constitution and right to practice any profession or to carry on any occupation, trade or business which includes a right to a safe environment free from sexual harassment.

AND WHEREAS the protection against sexual harassment and the right to work with dignity are universally recognized human rights by international conventions and instruments such as Convention on the Elimination of all forms of discrimination against Women, which has been ratified on the 25th June, 1993 by the Government of India.

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to make provisions for giving effect to the said Convention for protection of women against sexual harassment at workplace. For details, please see the website <http://www.shebox.nic.in/assets/site/main/imges/Sexual/Harassment-at-Workplace-Act.pdf>
