SKILL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM LIFESTYLE DISORDERS



A skill development program was organised by the Department of Zoology from 20th January to 3th February 2024. The SDP started with the inaugural talk by Dr. Arpita De (Associate Professor in Charge- Uro-gynaecology Hamdard Institute of Medical Sciences& Research New Delhi) discussing **Fighting PCOD: How & Why?**

The SDP was coordinated and co-coordinated by Dr. Neha Niharika and Dr. Jyoti Singh respectively.

The first session was about Case study of PCOD and its management by Dr. Jyoti Taneja discussing the causes and pathophysiology, investigations and management of PCOD followed by another session on smoking and alcohol abuse by Dr. Pallavi Sethi conferring about Deleterious effects of addiction on social health and PCOD. On 26th January session started with Dr. Meenakshi Thakur dealing with Factors affecting PCOD (Obesity) using anthropometric measurement, indicators of health (BMI waist to hip ratio, skin fold test).

Subsequently, another session on lifestyle and well-being by Dr. Anju Jain deliberating lifestyle factors and psychological well-being. Wrong food choices another factor affecting PCOD was discussed by Dr. Sunita K Yadav elucidating about balancing nutrition, exercise and wellness: Key component for a healthy lifestyle. Ms. Rohini Arya expounded about remedies to adopt a better lifestyle elaborating on various measures taken by WHO, Fit India movement. Risk group and various tests associated with Diabetes and hypertension were elucidated by Dr. Madhu and Dr. Sonika. Following that Dr. Pooja Vijay and Miss. Ritu elaborated on Endocrine disruptors and their effect on reproductive health. Summing up Dr. Jyotsna and Dr. Anna Senrung expounded on detection method of adulterants in foods.

The SDP gave the students an opportunity to gain more knowledge and insight about the prevailing lifestyle disorders and their management. The students were asked to submit assignment after each session in order to help them understand better. The SDP stimulated young minds to comprehend better about the prevailing lifestyle disorders.
