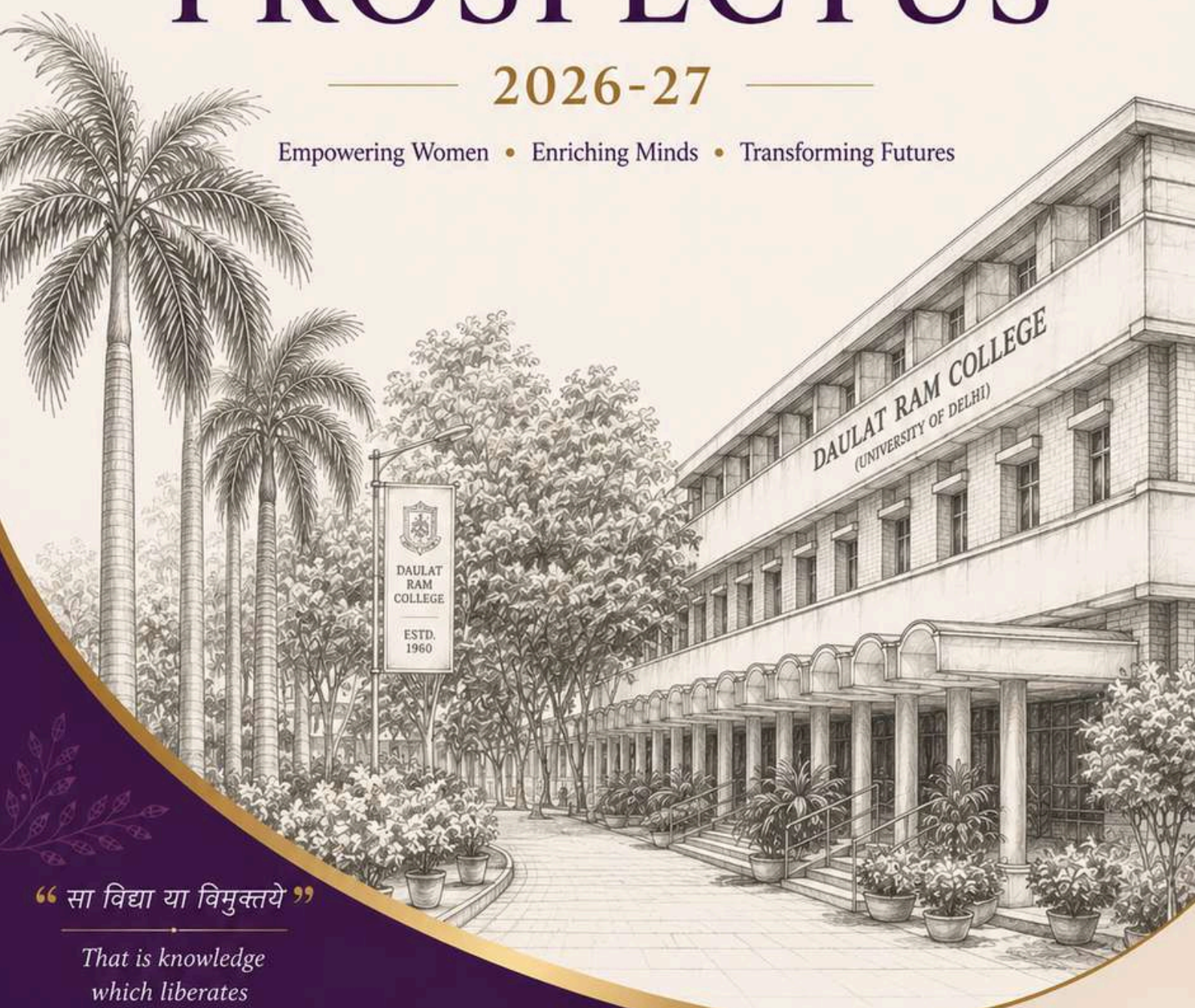

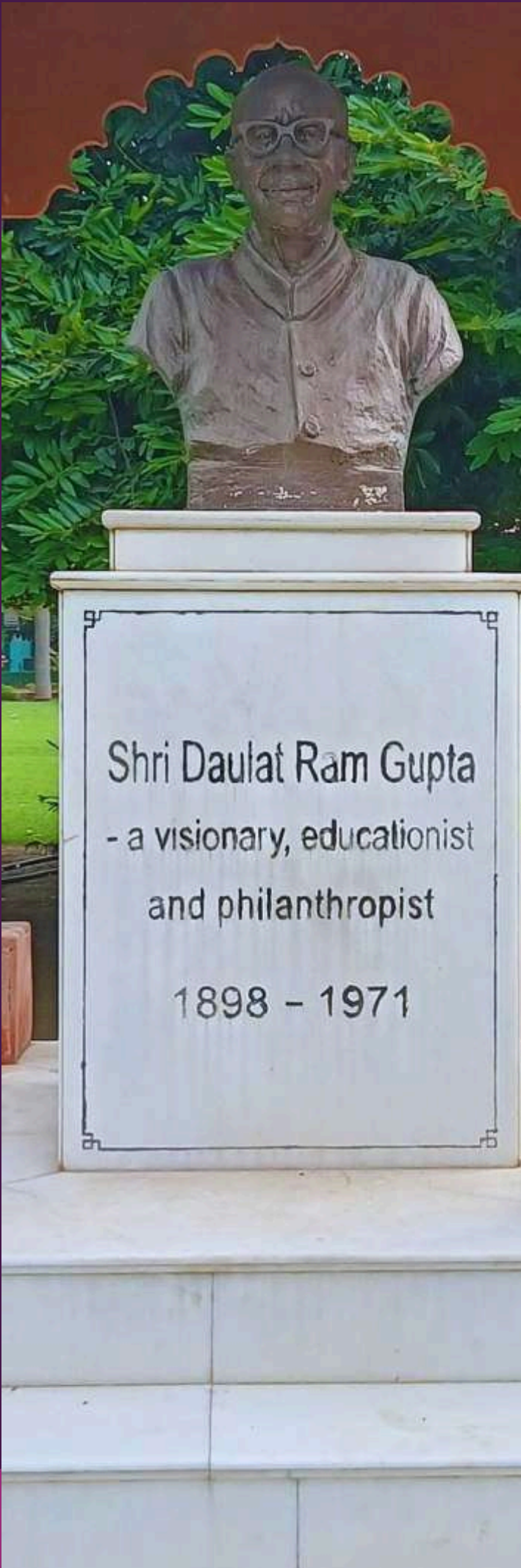

# About the College

## Mission

The goals and objectives of Daulat Ram College are to educate, engage, inculcate, and instill moral values with modern education in students, to help develop their personality and interpersonal skills.

## Vision

The vision of Daulat Ram College is enshrined in its motto 'ऋते ज्ञानान्न मुक्तिः' that translates into 'Salvation through Knowledge'. The college seeks to disseminate knowledge in science, commerce, and liberal arts among girl students to make them empowered women capable of bringing societal change.

Daulat Ram College has established itself as a premier institution of higher education for women, renowned for its commitment to academic excellence, innovation and holistic development. Founded in 1960 by the visionary educationist, the late Shri Daulat Ram Gupta, as Pramila College at Tilak Marg, the institution was relocated to the North Campus of the University of Delhi in 1964 and renamed Daulat Ram College.

Shri Daulat Ram Gupta envisioned the college as a centre of inclusive and value-based education for women. Beginning with approximately 350 students, 13 faculty members, and six departments, the college has grown into a vibrant academic institution with more than 4,000 students from across India and abroad, around 188 faculty members, 130 non-teaching staff, and 19 departments offering a diverse range of undergraduate and postgraduate programmes. The institution is dedicated to nurturing academic excellence, critical thinking, ethical values and holistic development across the disciplines of Science, Commerce and Humanities.

Recognised for its outstanding academic achievements and vibrant co-curricular culture, Daulat Ram College has consistently remained at the forefront of higher education. The college has been awarded the prestigious Star College Status by the Department of Biotechnology (DBT), Government of India, in recognition of its innovative contributions to science education and research. Set amidst a lush green campus, the college provides an intellectually stimulating environment supported by modern infrastructure and distinguished faculty. It houses advanced research facilities, including the Zebrafish Laboratory, Drosophila Resource Centre and Psychology Resource Centre, which facilitate major research projects funded by agencies such as ICSSR, ICPR, UGC, CSIR and DRDO.

The college continues to strengthen its academic infrastructure with the addition of a new academic block, equipped with state-of-the-art laboratories, spacious classrooms and a modern conference hall, providing students with an enhanced teaching, learning and research environment. Complementing these facilities are Wi-Fi-enabled classrooms with LCD projectors, well-equipped computer laboratories and robust ICT-enabled teaching resources. Innovation Projects and Star Innovation Projects funded by the University of Delhi, along with international collaborative research initiatives involving institutions in the USA, Canada, France, Finland and Poland, have significantly enriched the college's academic ecosystem.

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) plays a pivotal role in sustaining academic excellence through quality enhancement initiatives and systematic academic planning. The college's academic calendar is enriched with international and national conferences, seminars, symposia, colloquia and faculty development programmes, fostering a vibrant culture of research, innovation and interdisciplinary engagement.

The college library serves as a vital academic resource, housing over one lakh books, journals, periodicals, newspapers, digital resources and a well-equipped Braille section. To recognise academic excellence, the college annually awards numerous proficiency prizes, instituted awards and merit scholarships.

Skill development remains an integral component of the institution's educational philosophy. Through interdisciplinary in-house skill development programmes, students are equipped with life skills, digital competencies and professional capabilities. The College also established Skill Development Centres in Drosophila and Zebrafish Model Organisms, Ornamental Fish Culture, Hydroponics and Aerophonics and Medical Diagnostics to support Skill Enhancement Courses and impart skill training to students to enhance their employability. The Cyber Cell actively promotes awareness regarding responsible and safe engagement with cyberspace, while the Placement Cell works diligently to provide quality internship and employment opportunities through collaborations with leading organisations.

The vibrant academic culture is reflected in the publications brought out by various departments, societies, and cells. These include Expressions (English), Mansi (Hindi), Shreshtha (Women Development Cell), Psytrack (Psychology), Math Punch (Mathematics), Naissance (Placement Cell), Optima (Economics), among several others. The college also publishes its annual magazine, Pramila, featuring contributions in English, Hindi and Sanskrit.

The Centre for Foreign Languages, established in 2005, offers certificate, diploma and advanced diploma programmes in French, German, Spanish, Italian, Chinese, Japanese and Korean in collaboration with the Department of Germanic and Romance Studies and the Department of South Asian Studies, University of Delhi. In addition, the college offers several value-added certificate programmes in collaboration with reputed institutions, enabling students to develop interdisciplinary knowledge and professional competencies.

Committed to inclusive education, the college hostel, established in 1974, provides a nurturing residential environment for students from diverse cultural backgrounds. The campus also features Sadbhavana Bhawan, one of the finest auditoriums in the University, which hosts conferences, cultural programmes, theatre productions and Manjari, the college's annual cultural festival. The centrally located open-air amphitheatre, Rangshala, serves as a vibrant venue for theatrical, literary, musical and cultural events.

The multipurpose sports complex and fitness centre offer excellent facilities for a wide range of sports and have nurtured athletes who have excelled at state, national, and international levels. The college's annual Paralympics exemplify its commitment to inclusive participation. Accessible infrastructure, together with the Equal Opportunity Cell and Enabling Unit, ensures an inclusive and supportive environment for students with disabilities.

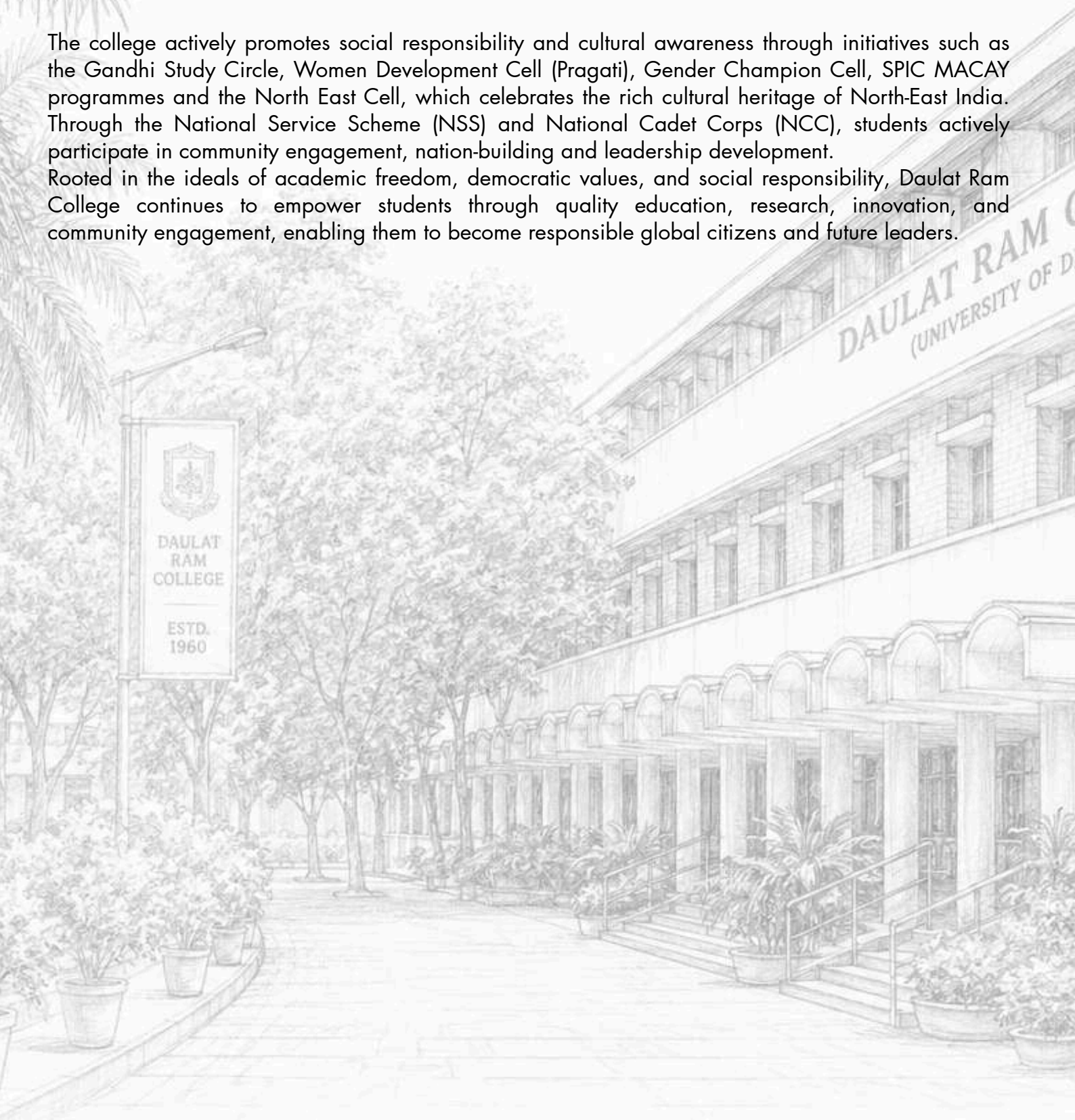

### Payment of Fees

All fee receipts should be preserved for scrutiny and should be produced at the time of filling up the examination forms and refund of caution money. Notice regarding payment of College/Examination fee will be put up on the notice board.

### Identity Card

Every student is issued an identity card by the College. It is mandatory for students to carry it every day. In case of any kind of indiscipline, the I-card will be confiscated. In case of loss of I-card the students are advised to intimate the college office immediately. Duplicate I-card will be issued on payment of Rs. 500/- Any change of address or phone no. should also be notified by the student.

### Discipline

Students will be governed as per Ordinance XV-B of the University Calendar.

### Concession/Waiver of Fees for Persons with Disabilities (PwBD)

Candidates with physical disabilities pursuing various programmes of study in the Faculties, Departments, Centres, and Institutions/Colleges of the University shall be exempted from payment of fees, including examination fees and other University fees, except Admission fees, subscription towards Delhi University Students' Union and Identity Card fees (As per amendment to Ordinance X(4) of the University).

a) PwBD Candidates who meet the cut-off for the unreserved category and will take admission in the unreserved category (UR) will pay the fee relevant for PwBD Candidate.

b) As per the Executive Council Resolution No. 50 dated 03.11.2012, students with physical disabilities residing in different Hostels/Halls of the University are exempted from payment of all hostel fees and charges except refundable caution fees and the mess fees. Persons with Physical Disabilities who are students shall pay 50% of the Mess fees and the remaining 50% of their Mess Fees will be met by the University of Delhi. Similar norms are adopted by our college in respect of PwBD students residing in the hostel.

c) PwBD students who are getting fellowships/financial assistance shall be exempted from payment of fees/charges/mess fees subject to the following conditions. All admitted SC/ST, OBC, EWS, PwBD students in colleges who are eligible for fellowships should submit their scholarship forms to the requisite office by February for timely processing.

## Relevant University Ordinances

Successful Candidates will be required to abide by the Ordinances of the University and will be required to provide a written undertaking to this effect at the time of admission. A few extracts of important ordinances are reproduced here.

### ORDINANCE XV-B: Maintenance of discipline among Students of the University

1. All powers relating to discipline and disciplinary action are vested in the Vice-Chancellor.
2. The Vice-Chancellor may delegate all or such powers as he/she deems proper to the Proctor and to such other persons as he/she may specify on this behalf.
3. Without prejudice to the generality of power to enforce discipline under the Ordinance the following shall amount to acts of gross indiscipline:
  - a. Physical assault, or threat to use physical force, against any member of the teaching and non-teaching staff of any Institution/Department and against any student within the University of Delhi
  - b. Carrying of, use of or threat to use of any weapons
  - c. Any violation of the provisions of the Civil Rights Protection Act, 1976
  - d. Violation of the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes
  - e. Any practice-whether verbal or otherwise-derogatory of women
  - f. Any attempt at bribing or corruption in any manner
  - g. Wilful destruction of institutional property
  - h. Creating ill-will or intolerance on religious or communal grounds
  - i. Causing disruption in any manner of the academic functioning of the University system;
  - j. Prohibition of Ragging as per Ordinance XV-C.
4. Without prejudice to the generality of his/ her powers relating to the maintenance of discipline and taking such action in the interest of maintaining discipline as may seem to him/her appropriate, the Vice-Chancellor, may in the exercise of his/her powers aforesaid order or direct that any student or students -
  - a. be expelled; or
  - b. be, for a stated period rusticated; or
  - c. be not for a stated period, admitted to a programme or programmes of study in a College, Department or Institution of the University; or
  - d. be fined with a sum of rupees that may be specified; or
  - e. be debarred from taking a University or College or Departmental Examination or Examinations for one or more years; or that the result of the student or students concerned in the Examination or Examinations in which he /she or they have appeared be cancelled.
5. Institutions, Halls and teaching in the concerned Departments may exercise their authority through, or delegate authority to such of the teachers in their Colleges, Institutions or Departments as they may specify for these purposes.

6. Without prejudice to the powers of the Vice-Chancellor and the Proctor as aforesaid, detailed rules of discipline and proper conduct shall be framed. These rules may be supplemented, where necessary, by the Principals of Colleges, Heads of Halls, Deans of Faculties and Heads of Teaching Departments in this University. Each student shall be expected to provide himself / herself with a copy of these rules. At the time of admission, every student shall be required to sign a declaration that on admission he /she submits himself / herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice-Chancellor and several authorities of the University who may be vested with the authority to exercise discipline under the Acts, the Statutes, the Ordinances and the rules that have been framed therein by the University.

### **ORDINANCE XV-C: Prohibition and Punishment for Ragging**

1. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, within the premises of College/ Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.
2. Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
3. Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students; and includes individual or collective acts or practices which:
  - a. Involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force.
  - b. Violate the status, dignity and honour of women students.
  - c. Violate the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled caste and tribe.
  - d. Expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem.
  - e. Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behaviour.
4. The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department or an Institution, the authorities of College, or University Hostel or Halls of Residence shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
5. Notwithstanding anything in Clause above, the Proctor may also suo moto enquire into any incident of ragging and make a report to the Vice-Chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.
6. The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.
7. If the Principal of a College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an enquiry, he/she may so advise the Vice-Chancellor accordingly.
8. When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his/her decision shall be final.
9. On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3(a), (b) and (c), the Vice-Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a student or students for a specific number of years.



10. The Vice-chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not for a stated period, admitted to a programme of study in a college, departmental examination for one or more years or that the results of the student or students concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared be cancelled.
11. In case any students who have obtained degrees or diplomas of the University of Delhi are found guilty; under this Ordinance, appropriate action will be taken under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees or diploma conferred by the University.
12. For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging whether by way of any act, practice or incitement of ragging will also amount to ragging.
13. All Institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instructions / directions issued under this Ordinance, and to give aid assistance to the Vice-Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance.
14. As per UGC guidelines, Anti Ragging Day would be observed on 12th August followed by Anti Ragging week from 12 August to 18 August.
15. MHRD, Government of India has launched a 24x7 toll free anti ragging helpline No. 1800-180-5522 and an email facility at [helpline@antiragging.in](mailto:helpline@antiragging.in) to curb the practice of ragging.
16. A control room, jointly manned by Delhi Police and University Officials at Room No. 13, 1st floor, Proctor's office, Conference centre, Opposite Department of Botany, University of Delhi, Delhi-7 would function to deal with any untoward incident of ragging. Telephone number of Joint Control Room in North Campus is 27667221 and of South Delhi Campus is 24119832.
17. Students can download Anti-Ragging App designed by UGC and Himmat App from Delhi Police website to report any incident of ragging.

Order of the Vice-Chancellor in pursuance of Ordinance XV-C: Where incident(s) of ragging are reported to the Vice-Chancellor by any authority under this Ordinance, the students(s) involved in ragging, shall be expelled for a specified term, designated in the order. Non-students involved in reports of ragging will be proceeded with under the criminal law of India; they will also be rendered ineligible for a period of five years from seeking enrolment in any of the institutions of the University of Delhi. Students against whom necessary action is taken under this note, will be given post decisional hearing, with strict adherence to the rules of natural justice.

**ORDINANCE XV-D/The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 (MINISTRY OF LAW AND JUSTICE)**

An Act to provide protection against sexual harassment of women at work place and for the prevention and redressal of complaints of sexual harassment and for matters connected there with incidental thereto.

WHEREAS sexual harassment results in violation of the fundamental rights of a woman to equality under articles 14 and 15 of the Constitution of India and her right to life and to live with dignity under article 21 of the Constitution and right to practice any profession or to carry on any occupation, trade or business which includes a right to a safe environment free from sexual harassment;

AND WHEREAS the protection against sexual harassment and the right to work with dignity are universally recognized human rights by international conventions and instruments such as Convention on the Elimination of all forms of discrimination against Women, which has been ratified on the 25th June, 1993 by the Government of India.

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to make provisions for giving effect to the said Convention for protection of women against sexual harassment at workplace.

## Internal Complaints Committee

Under Gazette notification of Government of India, University Grants Commission (Prevention, prohibition and redressal of sexual harassment of women employees and students in higher educational institutions) Regulations, 2015 has been notified which is binding University and Colleges.

The Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India has also published a "Handbook on Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace" which describes the issues like what is workplace sexual harassment, its prevention, prohibition and redressal along with the global norms and good practices following in this regard.

With reference to UGC letter No.F.91/9/2015 (GS/MHRD) dated 5th July 2016, College has constituted an Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) through a written order under the above Regulations.

## Under-Graduate Curriculum Framework (UGCF – 2022)

Keeping in mind the underlying principles of National Education Policy 2020, the Undergraduate Curriculum Framework-2022 (UGCF-2022) of the University of Delhi has been structured to provide opportunities to students across disciplines to pursue research, innovation, apprenticeship, social outreach, entrepreneurship and many similar areas of knowledge and creativity.

Every discipline offers five categories of courses of study, viz. Discipline Specific Core courses (DSCs), Discipline Specific Electives (DSEs), Generic Electives (GEs), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and Value Addition Courses (VAC) with multiple exit options as per NEP 2020.

Discipline Specific Core is a mandatory course of study to be pursued by a student. For award of single discipline specific Honours degree DSCs shall be the core courses of that discipline. To pursue an Honours degree programme in a 'Field of Multidisciplinary Courses of Study' the DSCs shall comprise of core credit courses of more than one discipline. In the fourth year of such honours degree programmes students will study only one discipline and hence the DSC courses in the VII and VIII semesters shall be of one discipline and not a combination of these three disciplines. Please refer to the framework given as Illustration –I in Table-6 of UGCF 2022 Based on NEP 2020.

Generic Electives shall be a pool of courses which is meant to provide multidisciplinary or interdisciplinary education to students. GE shall consist of a pool of courses offered by various disciplines of study (excluding the GEs offered by the parent discipline), in groups of odd and even semesters, from which a student can choose. In case a student opts for DSEs beyond her discipline specific course(s) of study, such DSEs shall be treated as GEs for that student.

Ability Enhancement course (AEC), Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) & Value Addition Course (VAC) are a pool of courses offered by all the Departments in groups of odd and even semesters from which students can choose. A student who desires to make Academic Project/Entrepreneurship as Minor has to pick the appropriate combination of courses of GE, SEC, VAC, & Internship/ Apprenticeship/Project/ Community (IAPC) which shall be offered in the form of various modules as specified in the scheme of studies.

A student pursuing four-year undergraduate programme in a specific discipline (Core course) shall be awarded an appropriate Honours degree with Major in a Discipline on completion of VIII Semester, if he/she secures in that Discipline at least 50% of the total credits i.e., at least 88 credits in that Discipline out of the total of 176 credits. He/she shall study 20 DSCs and at least 2 DSEs in eight semesters. A student may be awarded Minor in a discipline, on completion of VIII Semester, if he/she earns minimum 28 credits from seven GE courses in that discipline. For example, if a student pursuing B.A. (Honours) History chooses seven GE courses of Political Science out of a total of ten GE courses and writes dissertation, she shall be awarded on successful completion of VIII Semester, Major in History and Minor in Political Science.

A student pursuing a four-year undergraduate programme in more than one discipline as Core Course (for example B.A. Social Sciences/ Humanities, B.Sc. Life Sciences, B.Sc. Physical Sciences, B.Sc. Mathematical Sciences, B.Com. and such other programmes) shall be awarded an appropriate Honours degree with Major in a Discipline on completion of VIII Semester, if he/she secures in that Discipline 80 credits out of a total of 176 credits. He/she shall study 6 DSCs and at least 3 DSEs in that discipline in the first six semesters and 2 DSCs, 6 DSEs and write a dissertation in that discipline in the VII and VIII semesters. A student may be awarded Minor in a discipline, on completion of VIII Semester, if he/she earns minimum 28 credits from six DSCs and one DSE of that



discipline. For example, a student pursuing four-year B.A. (Honours) Social Sciences/Humanities with Major in History (after securing at least 80 credits in History), may be awarded Minor in Hindi if she earns 28 credits from six DSCs and one DSE of Hindi (up to VI semester), on successful completion of VIII Semester.

# Library



The college library holds over 1 lakh books on various subjects and interests of its users. The advanced-level software, namely KOHA (Library automation and management system), is used for library management and creating a digital platform for library users. # Research Facilities and Laboratories





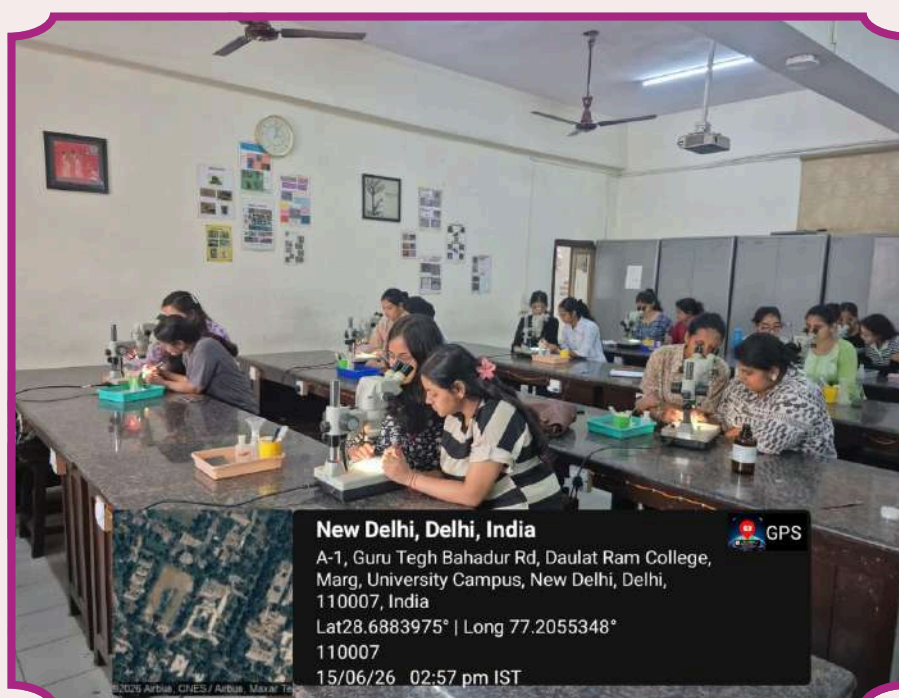
## Drosophila Resource Centre, Zoology Department



Since its inception in 2013 the centre has been providing hands-on training to undergraduate students to introduce the students to this interesting insect- *Drosophila*. It is a favourite model organism and is used extensively to study genetics and developmental biology. Students also learn the nuisances of setting up and maintaining stocks in the lab and food preparation. The basic aim of this centre is to provide laboratory exposure to students interested in pursuing research.

The center also provides internships to graduate students who intend to have exposure to experimental laboratories.

## The Drosophila Resource Centre: Nurturing the Geneticists of Tomorrow Biochemistry Department



Established in 2012 under the aegis of the DBT Star College Project, the Drosophila Resource Centre at Biochemistry Department serves as a premier hub for genetics education. By utilizing *Drosophila melanogaster* as a primary model organism, the Centre bridges the gap between theoretical genetics and hands-on biological research. To date, the DRC has empowered over 500 undergraduate and postgraduate students across various disciplines, fostering a legacy of academic excellence and institutional collaboration.

The Centre has proven its role as a thought leader in pedagogy through two landmark publications:

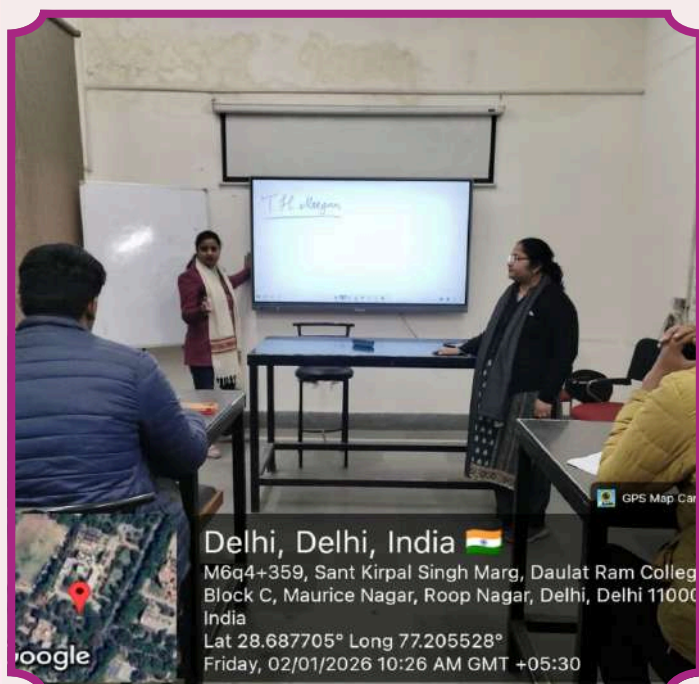
- 'Rediscovering Genetics' (2016): A foundational lab manual now integrated into the suggested readings for Delhi University, AIIMS, and GITAM.
- 'Drosophila and Zebrafish Model Organisms in Biological Research' (2024): A specialized manual designed for Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), widely adopted by students pursuing the course.

The center acts as a vital resource node, providing essential fly stocks and technical expertise to a network of institutions, including colleges of DU, MDU, Manav Rachna University, and Sanatan Dharm (P.G.) College. Core Competencies imparted are media preparation and culture maintenance, male female differentiation and mutant identification, performing genetic crosses to analyze inheritance patterns, behavioral studies.

Recent Milestones include Russian delegation visit and Drosophila developmental biology workshop conducted for Shaheed Rajguru College IV year students. Community outreach work include visit of students from Alipur village under Ekal foundation and three-Day outreach programme on 'Role of model organisms in research' for students of Sardar Patel Vidhyalaya.

Under the National Education Policy (NEP), a new skill enhancement course on Drosophila and Zebrafish as model organisms in biological studies has been introduced, drawing strong enrollment from students across various streams. To support this initiative, a grant of ₹10 Lakhs was sanctioned in 2024 to establish a dedicated Skill Development Center at Daulat Ram College. The success of the Centre is reflected in the high placement rate of its alumni in prestigious global genetics programs. By adapting to new educational frameworks like the National Education Policy (NEP), the center continues to be a cornerstone of innovation in life sciences. The Centre remains committed to expanding its footprint through collaborative research.

# Zebrafish Lab Facility



The Zebrafish Lab facility was set up in October 2015, jointly by the Biochemistry department and Zoology department in collaboration with CSIR-IGIB, Mathura Road, Delhi, and Sansriti Foundation Delhi. The facility has been funded by Star Innovation projects DU, Star College project DBT, Govt. of India, and Innovation projects DU. It was developed with the aim of providing an alternative in vivo non-invasive model system for science education, teaching and research. The state-of-the-art temperature and photo-period controlled facility houses an automated re-circulatory fish habitat system, stereo-microscopes, inverted microscope with digital display screen (Evos) and fluorescent microscope (Nikon). Apart from ongoing research projects, the facility provides training in zebrafish model system to faculty and students. Till date ~ 150 faculty members and ~1500 students from various science streams from different Delhi University Colleges have participated in various workshops and training programs conducted by the zebrafish lab facility. Summer internship/ training programs, skill development programs are available to under-graduate and postgraduate students to get hands-on training and research experience. Zebrafish lab facility also serves as a resource center to provide zebrafish and embryos to other colleges/ departments and research institutes to support teaching and lab practicals.

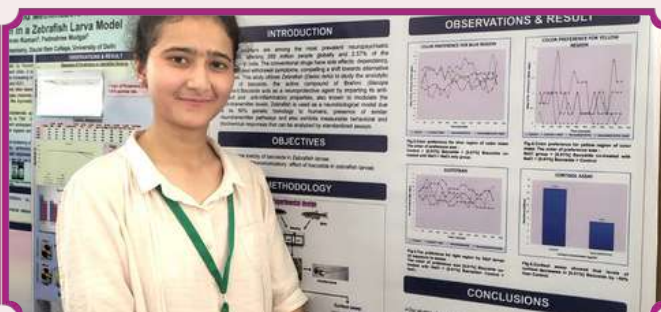

## Plant Tissue Culture Research Facilities



The Department of Botany has a well equipped Tissue Culture Lab maintained for more than two decades. The Tissue Culture Research Lab is mainly used for training the final year students to micropropagate species of elite trees and also for research projects based on micropropagation of rare and medicinally important plants. Teachers and trained Lab staff help to carry out experiments smoothly.

Culture Room with Horizontal Laminar- air-flow cabinet to raise in vitro Plant Tissue Cultures under sterile conditions, Room Thermometer, Hygrometer and Culture Rack Trolleys fitted with fluorescent lights and automatic timer.

Instrument cum Preparation Room with basic equipments like High Precision Digital Balance, pH meters, Orbital Shakers, Hot Plates, BOD, Ultra Centrifuge machines, Double Distillation Unit, Hot Air Oven, Vertical and Horizontal Autoclave, Refrigerator and Deep Freezer, Microtome, Simple, Compound,, Dissection and High Resolution Microscopes with In-built Camera, Inverted Binocular, Separate Wash Area for washing and rinsing of glasswares, Green House Facility with controlled conditions of light, humidity and temperature for establishment of in vitro grown plantlets in soil.



## Neuropharmacology, Drug Delivery and Cancer Research Laboratory (NDCRL)

Neuropharmacology drug delivery and cancer research laboratory (NDCRL) at Daulat Ram College, University of Delhi, was established in 2018 to provide research training in cancer biology techniques including animal cell culture, C.elegans culture, cytotoxicity assay, histology, microscopy and molecular analyses. The laboratory provides hands-on research training to undergraduates, post graduates students through internships and dissertation. Currently three registered Ph.D scholars are working on pancreatic and colorectal cancer in this lab. NDCRL also trained students from various National and International Institutions, fostering scientific skills and promoting excellence in Biomedical science research.

## CENTRES

### Centre for Foreign Languages

International integration arising from the interchange of world news, products, ideas and culture helps in generating interdependence of economic and cultural activities. By offering courses in foreign languages the Centre at DRC aims to equip young women and men to be multilingual.

The college offers part time Certificate/ Diploma/Advance Diploma Courses in Foreign Languages to women and men who wish to develop their skills and fluency in both speaking and writing in a language of their choice. The College offers add-on courses in French, German, Spanish, Italian, Chinese, Japanese and Korean languages.

Advance Diploma Courses are offered only to those who have qualified the Diploma Course in the relevant language and Diploma Courses are open to those who have qualified the Certificate Course in the concerned language. Students who are seeking admissions in Advance Diploma in German/Spanish/French/Italian language and have passed the Certificate/Diploma Course from Institutions other than Delhi University/Gap year cases are required to clear the entrance test conducted by the Department of Germanic and Romance Studies, Delhi University.

All these Certificate, Diploma & Advance Diploma Courses are conducted in collaboration with the Department of Germanic and Romance Studies, Department of South Asian Studies, University of Delhi.

### Skill Development Centre in Ornamental Fish Culture



The Aquaculture Laboratory maintains 25 ornamental fish varieties, supporting species-specific husbandry and selective breeding programs. We develop and test balanced feed formulations tailored for lifecycle stages and breeding performance. Facilities include controlled aquaria, water-quality monitoring, and juvenile rearing systems employing modern aquaculture techniques (biofiltration, recirculation, and enrichment). Research focuses on reproductive biology, diet optimization, and disease prevention to enhance survival, coloration, and market quality. The lab provides training, student projects, and outreach to promote sustainable ornamental. It is the skill development centre for ornamental fish culture.

The Daulat Ram College Skill Development Center in Drosophila and Zebrafish Model Organisms was established in 2023 with a seed grant of ₹10 lakhs from the Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) Committee, University of Delhi.

## Vision and Mission of the Centre:

- Create skill trained pool of students who are future ready to embark on a career path in biomedical research labs, and Pharma and Biotechnology Industry.
- Skill trained in animal husbandry, breeding, handling and application of Drosophila, and zebrafish model organisms as research models.
- Provide research Internship opportunities to students to gain research experience and upgrade skill sets in research methodologies and Data analysis and presentation.
- Develop commercially viable tool kits for Bio-materials and technology transfer.
- To develop and maintain stocks and mutant strains of animal model systems.
- Center would serve as a Central resource center providing technical support, bio-materials, and tool kits to other colleges and institutes to perform advance experiments in Cell Biology, Developmental Biology, Neurobiology, Genetics, Toxicology, Molecular Biology, and Drug Discovery.

# Skill Development Centre on Hydroponics and Aeroponics



The Skill Development Centre on Hydroponics & Aeroponics, established by the Department of Botany, provides students with hands-on training in modern soilless cultivation technologies, promoting sustainable agriculture, innovation, and experiential learning. Equipped with Nutrient Film Technique (NFT) systems, vertical grow towers, and grow bags, the Centre offers practical exposure to crop production, nutrient management, growing media, and specialised instrumentation.

The Centre supports the Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) on Hydroponic & Aeroponic Farming, fostering interdisciplinary learning and skill development. Students cultivate crops such as lettuce, tomato, basil, beetroot, zucchini, rocket (arugula), coriander, and parsley using advanced hydroponic systems. Through its focus on sustainability, technology and skill-based education, the Centre equips students with future-ready skills for modern agricultural practices.

# Medical Diagnostics Skill Development Center



The Medical Diagnostics Skill Development Centre was established in 2025 with a SEED grant from the Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) Committee, University of Delhi. The Centre aims to develop an industry-ready workforce for careers in Medical and Clinical Diagnostic Laboratories, Biomedical Research Laboratories, and the Pharmaceutical and Biotechnology sectors.

The Centre provides skill-based training in laboratory safety, biosafety, sample collection, processing, preservation, record keeping, and biomedical waste management. Students receive hands-on training in haematological investigations, including RBC count, ESR, PCV, total and differential leukocyte count, absolute eosinophil count, clotting time, and blood group determination. The programme also covers biochemical investigations of disease biomarkers in serum, sputum, and urine samples, along with modern immunodiagnostic techniques such as Rapid Antigen Assays and RT-PCR.

Since its inception, the Centre has been successfully offering the Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) in Medical and Clinical Diagnostics under UGCF-2020, equipping students with technical competencies, practical laboratory skills, and industry exposure for careers in healthcare, research, and biotechnology.

To promote accessible justice, the Legal Services Clinic was inaugurated on 20 February 2024 along with the installation of the Delhi State Legal Services Authority (DSLISA) Information Board, reflecting DSLISA's motto, "Sewa, Samadhan, Samarpan." The Clinic offers legal guidance, information on government welfare schemes, and free legal aid (Muft Kanooni Sahayta) every Wednesday from 2:00 PM to 4:00 PM for students, teaching and non-teaching staff, and their family members. On 12 November 2025, the Centre launched its flagship series, Voices in Law: A Comprehensive Legal Session Series, with an interactive podcast featuring Hon'ble Dr Justice Swarana Kanta Sharma, Judge, Delhi High Court and distinguished alumna of the College. The event also marked the unveiling of the Centre's official logo, symbolising its motto, "Striving Inclusivity: Unfolding the Blindfold."

Students who are seeking admissions in Advance Diploma in German/Spanish/French/Italian language and have passed the Certificate/Diploma Course from Institutions other than Delhi University/Gap year cases are required to clear the entrance test conducted by the Department of Germanic and Romance Studies, Delhi University.

All these Certificate, Diploma & Advance Diploma Courses are conducted in collaboration with the Department of Germanic and Romance Studies, Department of South Asian Studies, University of Delhi.

The college will follow the University calendar in all matters related to academics. The annual examination is held as per the schedule announced by the University of Delhi and the students are required to fulfil all criteria laid down by the respective department.

There are 50 seats in the college. A minimum of 20 students will be deemed to constitute a section to start a course. The college reserves the right to withdraw a course if a sufficient number of students have not applied for it.
